Bahraini boat robbed by pirates near northern maritime border

The Coast Guard has announced that a Bahraini boat carrying a 43-year-old Bahraini seaman and two Asian nationals aged 36 and 38 was subjected to a robbery by pirates near the Kingdom's northern maritime border.

It explained that upon receiving the case from the Main Operations Room regarding the incident, immediate action was taken and coordination with the relevant authorities was initiated.

The pirates had removed the seamen from their boat and taken them into Iranian territorial waters, seizing the boat's contents, before returning them to their vessel three hours after the incident occurred.

The Coast Guard affirmed that it is closely following up on the incident.

Sovereignty issue

'Dangerous, inflammatory'

Arab, Muslim countries slam US ambassador's remarks on Israel's right to Mideast land

Arab and Islamic countries issued a joint condemnation yesterday of remarks by US ambassador to Israel Mike Huckabee, who suggested Israel had a biblical right to a vast swath of the Middle East.

Huckabee, a former Baptist minister and a fervent Israel supporter, was speaking on the podcast of far-right commentator and Israel critic Tucker Carlson.

In an episode released on Friday, Carlson pushed Huckabee on the meaning of a biblical verse sometimes interpreted as saying that Israel is entitled to the land between the river Nile in Egypt and the Euphrates in Syria and Iraq.

In response, Huckabee said: "It would be fine if they took it all."

When pressed, however, he continued that Israel was "not



asking to take all of that", adding: "It was somewhat of a hyperbolic statement."

Backlash

The backlash widened sharply yesterday as more than a dozen Arab and Islamic governments - alongside three major regional organisations - issued a joint statement denouncing the US diplomat's comments as "dangerous and inflammatory".

The statement, released by the United Arab Emirates' for-

The foreign ministries of Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, the UAE, Qatar, Indonesia, Pakistan, Egypt, Turkey, Syria, Palestine, Kuwait, Lebanon and Oman issued a joint statement together with the GCC, Arab League and OIC.

eign ministry, was signed by the UAE, Egypt, Jordan, Indonesia, Pakistan, Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Kuwait, Oman, Bahrain, Lebanon, Syria and the State of Palestine, as well as the Organization of Islamic Cooperation

(OIC), the Arab League and the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC). They said the comments contravene the UN Charter and efforts to de-escalate the Gaza war and advance a political horizon for a comprehensive settlement.

Iran joined the chorus with its foreign ministry accusing Huckabee on X of revealing "American active complicity" in what it called Israel's "expansionist wars of aggression" against Palestinians.

Earlier, several Arab states had issued unilateral condemnations.

Saudi Arabia described the ambassador's words as "reckless" and "irresponsible", while Jordan said it was "an assault on the sovereignty of the countries of the region".

Kuwait decried what it called a "flagrant violation of the principles of international law", while Oman said the comments "threatened the prospects for peace" and stability in the region.

Sovereignty

Egypt's foreign ministry reaffirmed "that Israel has no sovereignty over the occupied Palestinian territory or any other Arab lands".

As the sun begins to set and the final minutes before Maghrib quietly approach, a different scene unfolds across Bahrain's streets.

At busy traffic lights and crowded junctions, volunteers move swiftly between cars, offering small boxes and water bottles to drivers waiting for the call to prayer.

The initiative, widely known as "Iftar on the Road", has become one of the Kingdom's most touching Ramadan traditions.

Its purpose is simple yet powerful: to ensure that no

fasting person breaks their fast alone or without food, even if they are stuck in traffic or far from home.

Unity

Volunteer teams, charitable societies, government entities, universities and even individual families take part.

In many cases, coordinated campaigns are organised by community groups, banks or private companies, distributing hundreds and sometimes thousands of ready-to-eat meals shortly before sunset. Locations are carefully selected, often near major intersections or congestion points where commuters are likely to be waiting.

'Redundant' proposal

Shura Council rejects draft law on Bahraini teacher hiring priority

A proposal to require private educational institutions to give priority to hiring qualified Bahrainis for teaching posts was rejected by the Shura Council yesterday.

The decision followed advice from the Services Committee, which urged members not to support the proposal in principle, noting that the legal provisions it sought to amend have already been repealed.

The committee said the outcome the bill aimed for was already in place in much of the sector.

Data

It cited Ministry of Labour data showing Bahrainis made up 93.12 per cent of licensed trainers in private training institutions in 2024, with Bahrainis accounting for 74 per cent of licensed managerial staff.

During the debate, Shura Council member Dalal Al Zayed said the aim behind the bill was shared across government and lawmakers, but questioned what its wording would actually change.

"The aim is one shared by the legislative and executive authorities," she told the cham-

ber, adding that "the wording did not set any effect on private educational institutions" if they failed to hire Bahrainis.

She pointed instead to wage support through Tamkeen as a key reason the numbers have risen.

"Tamkeen is putting dedicated funds today to support Bahraini wages," Al Zayed said, adding that the approach had lifted the share of Bahrainis in private educational and training institutions "as trainers or managers".

She also urged private schools that rely on teachers for certain languages to keep pushing in the same direction.

tions that bring in teachers for certain languages should also seek Bahrainisation," she said.

The bill, based on a proposal submitted by Parliament, would have amended Article 11(1) and Article 12(1) of Decree-Law No. 25 of 1998 on private educational and training institutions.

The Services Committee said the change had been overtaken by Law No. 4 of 2026 on private educational institutions, issued on 28 January 2026.

Provisions

It pointed to provisions stating that the rules relating to private educational institutions in Decree-Law No. 25 of 1998 are repealed, along with any provision that conflicts with the newer law, leaving the draft amendments aimed at articles

that no longer apply to private schools.

In its account of the bill's purpose, the committee cited a memorandum from the Legislation and Legal Opinion Commission saying the draft was meant to give priority to Bahrainis with the qualifications needed for teaching roles in the private sector, after an increase in the number of graduates seeking teaching jobs in the public sector.

The committee said the ministry's capacity did not match demand, which was put forward as a reason to draw private schools into employing more graduates.

Policies

The committee also cited a Ministry of Education letter dated 28 July 2025, in which the ministry said the aim of giving Bahrainis priority in hiring was already being met through policies and steps in place across both the public and private sectors.

The Shura Council had sent the draft back for further study after discussing an earlier report on 4 May 2025.

Yesterday, it followed the Services Committee's latest recommendation and rejected the bill.

Deepfake offence proposal returned to panel for further study

A deepfake proposal was withdrawn from debate in the Shura Council yesterday and sent back to committee for further study, with Dr Ebtessam Al Dallal casting the lone vote against the move.

Members agreed to return the draft to the Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee for a fresh review before it comes back to the chamber at a later sitting.

The proposal would add a new Article 10 bis to Law No. 60 of 2014 on Information Technology Crimes.

It would punish anyone who produces or falsifies audio or visual material using an information technology system, then shares, publishes, transmits, distributes, sends or makes it available in a way that could make another person a target for contempt or punishment, violate honour, tarnish families' reputations, or serve an unlawful purpose.

Fine

The draft sets a fine of between BD3,000 and BD10,000 and allows for imprisonment, with courts able to impose either penalty or both.

The proposal was submitted by Ali Al Shihabi, First Dep-

uty Chairman Jamal Fakhro, Dr Mohammed Ali Hassan, Khalid Al Maskati and Dalal Al Zayed.

The committee had urged members not to pass it in its current form, saying existing criminal laws already cover the harm caused by fabricated audio and video and raising concerns about proof and practical enforcement.

Speaking for the committee, rapporteur Ali Al Aradi said the draft aimed to criminalise the use of information technology systems to produce or falsify audio or visual material and then circulate it in ways that harm others.

He said the committee's view was that the criminal texts already in force are enough to deal with misuse, without creating a new offence tied to a single technique.

The committee described deepfakes as content made using artificial intelligence and machine learning to create, alter or combine audio or video so that a real person or event is made to appear real but untrue, in a form that can be hard to spot, with words or acts attributed to someone other than their true source.

In the chamber, the proposers argued that the absence of recorded cases was not a reason to wait.

At this meeting, the Board took several decisions, including the approval of the Compa-

ny's financial statements for the year ended 31st December 2025.

Mr. Al Saie extended his sincere thanks and gratitude to the Board of Directors, the Executive Management and all the company employees for their support and continuous endeavors to achieve the best results, wishing Al-Matahin further progress and prosperity.

Q4 Financial Results:

The Bahrain Flour Mills Company (BFM) announced its financial results for the year ended 31 December 2025, including the results of the last quarter. Bahrain Flour Mills Company achieved a net loss for the fourth quarter of BD (40,140), compared to a net loss

of BD (95,653) in 2024.

The recorded loss for the fourth quarter of the year is attributed to the decrease in investment valuation from listed securities alongside booked depreciation for the new production line at the mill, and new mill project lease provisions.

Accordingly, the Company reported Basic and Diluted loss per Share of 1.61 fils for Q4 2025 versus Basic and Diluted loss per Share of 3.86 fils for the same period in 2024.

Operating profit for Q4 2025 was BD 358,354 versus BD (322,841) loss for the same period in 2024. The improved operating profits for the period is driven by compensation for the increase in conversion cost per ton.

With regards to sales in Q4 2025, BFM generated BD 2,036,468 versus BD 1,868,459 in Q4 2024 - increased by 9%, driven principally by the market demand on Company's products ahead of Holy Month of Ramadan.

The Company recorded Basic and Diluted Earnings per Share of 47.33 fils for the year ended 31 December 2025 versus 17.43 fils for 2024.

Operating profit for the year 2025 was BD 1,293,975 versus a loss of BD (208,663) for 2024 for the same reasons mentioned above.

The Company generated sales of BD 7,554,661 in 2025 versus BD 7,605,900 in 2024 - decrease slightly by 0.7%.

Financial Position

The Company's total equity increased by 2% to BD 27,392,871 as of 31 December 2025 compared with BD 26,863,596 as of 31 December 2024.

The total assets for the year ended 31 December 2025

reached BD 40,694,535 compared to BD 39,713,717 at the end of the same period in 2024, being an increase of 2% due to subsidy receivable from the Government.

Dividend Distribution

In line with results, the Board of Directors has recommended the distribution of a cash dividend of BD 620,620 equivalent to 25 fils per share or 25% of its paid-up capital, subject to approval by the General Assembly and regulators.

Brazil's Lula urges Trump to treat all countries equally

Brazil's President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva urged Donald Trump on Sunday to treat all countries equally after the US leader imposed a 15 percent tariff on imports following an adverse Supreme Court ruling.

"I want to tell the US President Donald Trump that we don't want a new Cold War. We don't want interference in any other country, we want all countries to be treated equally," Lula told reporters in New Delhi.

The conservative-majority Supreme Court ruled six to three on Friday that a 1977 law Trump has relied on to slap sudden levies on individual countries, upending global trade, "does not authorize the President to impose tariffs".

Lula said he would not like to react to the Supreme Court decisions of another country, but hoped that Brazil's relations with the United States "will go back to normalcy" soon.

The veteran leftist leader is expected to travel to Washington next month for a meeting with Trump.

EU 'expects' US to honour trade deal as Trump hikes tariffs

The European Commission called yesterday for Washington to abide by the terms of the trade deal struck last year with the EU, as President Donald Trump announced new global tariff hikes a day after an adverse Supreme Court ruling.

"A deal is a deal. As the United States' largest trading partner, the EU expects the US to honour its commitments set out in the Joint Statement -- just as the EU stands by its commitments," said a commission statement.

"The European Commission requests full clarity on the steps the United States intends to take following the recent Supreme Court ruling on the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA)," it said.

Trump temporarily raised the global duty on imports into

the United States to 15 percent on Saturday, delivering a fresh jolt of uncertainty just a day after the Supreme Court ruled much of his international tariffs campaign illegal.

The EU and United States last year struck an agreement setting US tariffs at a maximum 15 percent on most European goods.

"EU products must continue to benefit from the most competitive treatment, with no increases in tariffs beyond the clear and all-inclusive ceiling previously agreed," the commission said.

It warned that "when applied unpredictably, tariffs are inherently disruptive, undermining confidence and stability across global markets and creating further uncertainty across international supply chains".

The EU executive said it remained "in close and continuous contact" with Trump's administration and that EU Trade

commissioner Maros Sefcovic had spoken with US Trade Representative Jamieson Greer and Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick on Saturday.

The European Parliament's trade committee is due to approve the EU-US deal on Tuesday -- but the Supreme Court judgment casts doubt on that now happening.

The committee's head, Bernd Lange, said he would call during a meeting of parliament's political groups on Monday for putting "legislative work on hold until we have a proper legal assessment and clear commitments from the US side".

"Pure tariff chaos from the US administration. No one can make sense of it anymore -- only open questions and growing uncertainty for the EU and other US trading partners," Lange wrote.

"Clarity and legal certainty are needed before any further steps are taken," he added.

◆ **Danish forces evacuated** crew member from a US submarine off the coast of Greenland on Saturday after the sailor required urgent medical treatment, authorities said. Denmark's Joint Arctic Command, which oversees Danish operations in the region, said in a post on Facebook the crew member was flown to a hospital in Nuuk after a medical emergency on board the vessel. Officials did not disclose the nature of the medical issue or give details about the submarine's mission. Images posted online appeared to show the sail of a submarine surfacing in Nuuk's bay, though AFP could not immediately verify the footage. Since returning to the White House last year, US President Donald Trump has argued that Washington needs to control mineral-rich Greenland -- an autonomous Danish territory -- for American national security.

◆ **'No thanks', Greenland PM says of Trump offer to send US Navy hospital ship**

◆ **Greenland's prime ministry** yesterday flatly rejected a proposal by Donald Trump to send a US Navy hospital ship to the Arctic island coveted by the US leader. "That will be 'no thanks' from us," Jens-Frederik Nielsen, who heads the government of the autonomous Danish territory, wrote on his Facebook page. "President Trump's idea to send a US hospital ship here to Greenland has been duly noted. But we have a public health system where care is free for citizens," he said.

◆ **A Pakistani security source** told AFP yesterday that airstrikes on neighbouring Afghanistan killed "more than 80" militants. The source told AFP that the death toll was expected to rise following the overnight strikes, which Islamabad said were targeting Afghanistan-based militant groups in response to suicide bombings in Pakistan. AFP journalists in Afghanistan were not able to verify the toll. The Taliban government has previously denied harbouring militants.

New York mayor orders citywide travel ban ahead of major storm

New York Mayor Zohran Mamdani ordered a shutdown yesterday of the city's entire traffic network to all but emergency travel ahead of a massive snowstorm expected to hit the northeast United States.

Starting at 9pm Sunday to noon Monday a "state of emergency" closes the streets, highways and bridges of New York City for all traffic, cars, trucks, scooters and E-bikes," Mamdani told reporters.

The ban will not affect essential workers or New Yorkers needing to travel due to emergencies, according to Mamdani. New York is home to over eight million people. "We are asking New Yorkers to avoid all non essential travel," the mayor said. "New York City has not faced a storm of this scale in the last decade."

The fast-developing storm is threatening to pummel the US East Coast with a foot or more of snow beginning Sunday, just weeks after the region recovered from another devastating weather system.

Meteorologists issued blizzard warnings for New York and parts of at least six states, warning Saturday that heavy snow and gale-force winds are forecast to slam all major cities along the densely populated Interstate 95 northeast corridor, including Boston, Philadelphia, and even Washington further south.

The NWS headquarters said snowfall rates of more than one inch (2.5 centimeters) an hour will occur at times along parts of the East Coast, with huge snow totals making travel nearly impossible. Power outages are likely.

The mega-storm that swept across the eastern half of the country in late January was linked to more than 100 deaths nationwide, and slammed some cities with heavy snow and sleet that froze into rock-hard ice.

New Jersey Governor Mikie Sherrill declared a state of emergency beginning midday Sunday, freeing up funds and allowing the swift deployment of resources to address the weather crisis.

US envoy says Trump questioning why Iran has not 'capitulated'

US envoy Steve Witkoff said on Saturday that President Donald Trump is questioning why Iran has not "capitulated" in the face of Washington's military build-up aimed at pressuring them into a nuclear deal.

The United States and Iran this week resumed Oman-mediated talks in Geneva aimed at averting the possibility of military action, after Washington dispatched two aircraft carriers, jets and weaponry to the region to back its warnings.

In a Fox News interview with Trump's daughter-in-law Lara, Witkoff said the president was "curious" about Iran's position after he had warned them of severe consequences in the event they failed to strike a deal.

"I don't want to use the word 'frustrated,' because he understands he has plenty of alternatives, but he's curious as to why they haven't... I don't want to use the word 'capitulated,' but why they haven't capitulated," he said.

"Why, under this pressure, with the amount of seapower and naval power over there, why haven't they come to us and said, 'We profess we don't want a weapon, so here's what we're prepared to do?' And yet it's sort of hard to get them to that place."

Iranian students rally for second day as fears of war with US mount

Iranian students gathered for fresh pro- and anti-government rallies Sunday commemorating those killed in recent protests, as fears loomed of renewed conflict with the United States over the country's nuclear programme.

The initial demonstrations were sparked in December by economic hardship in the sanctions-hit country, but quickly expanded into mass anti-government protests that marked one of the largest challenges to the Islamic republic's clerical leadership in years.

Following campus rallies commemorating the protest

dead on Saturday, the Fars news agency on Sunday published videos of fresh crowds of dozens of people waving Iranian flags and carrying memorial photographs at universities in the capital Tehran.

One showed a rowdy gathering at Sharif University of Technology shouting "death to the shah" -- a reference to the monarchy ousted by the 1979 Islamic revolution -- as they faced off with another group, with men in uniforms between them.

Fars said there had been "tensions" at at least three universities in Tehran where some students chanted "anti-establishment" slogans.

The US envoy also confirmed in the interview that he had met

with Reza Pahlavi, the exiled son of Iran's last shah and a critic

of the current authorities, who has not returned to the country since before the 1979 Islamic Revolution that ousted the monarchy.

"I met him at the direction of the president," Witkoff said, without providing further details. "I think he's strong for his country, cares about his country. But this is going to be about President Trump's policies."

US-based Pahlavi last week told a crowd in Munich that he was ready to lead the country to a "secular democratic future" after Trump said regime change would be best for the country.

Witkoff's comments come after Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said a draft proposal for an agreement with Washington would be ready in a matter of days.

Trump said on Thursday that Iran had at most 15 days to make a deal on concerns starting with its nuclear programme.

Iran says has right self-defence if US talks fail

Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi warned yesterday that his country would respond to any US attack, but held out hope for a diplomatic solution, saying he expected another round of talks in Geneva later in the week.

Speaking in an interview on the US network CBS, the minister said there was a "good chance" that talks with US negotiators would head off renewed military strikes.

He insisted, however, that Iran had a right to continued uranium enrichment for civilian purposes -- and to strike US interests in the Middle East in response to any aggression.

"If the US attacks us, then we have every right to defend ourselves. If the US attacks us, that is the act of aggression. What we do in response is an act of self-defence," Araghchi said.

"It is justified, legitimate. So

our missiles cannot hit the American soil. So obviously we have to do something else. We have to hit, you know, the American base in the region."

Last year, in response to US strikes on its nuclear facilities, Iran fired missiles at the US airbase at Al-Udeid in Qatar. Iranian officials sometimes also refer to

Israel as a US base.

Araghchi, nevertheless, also said: "I believe that still there is a good chance to have a diplomatic solution which is based on a win-win game."

After a recent round of talks in Geneva, Iran said it was preparing a draft proposal for an agreement, which would be ready in a matter of days.

Araghchi said negotiations were continuing, and "we are working on the elements of a deal and draft of the text".

"I believe that when we meet, probably this Thursday in Geneva again, we can work on those elements and prepare a good text and come to a fast deal," he told CBS.


But, as for Iran's uranium enrichment, which the US opposes, Araghchi said: "As a sovereign country, we have every right to decide for ourselves, by ourselves."

Hamas official says group in final stage of choosing new chief

AFP | Cairo, Egypt

A senior Hamas official told yesterday that the Palestinian Islamist movement was in the final phase of selecting a new leader, with two prominent figures competing for the position.

Hamas recently completed the formation of a new Shura Council of more than 80 members, a consultative body largely composed of religious scholars, as well as a new 18-member political bureau, the official said.

Since the war in Gaza began after Hamas's October 7, 2023 attack on Israel, Israeli forces have killed several of the movement's leaders, including two former chiefs.

"The movement has completed its internal elections in the three regions and has reached the final stage of selecting the head of the political bureau," the official said, speaking on condition of anonymity as he was not authorised to speak

publicly.

He added that the race for the group's leadership was now between Khaled Meshaal and Khalil al-Hayya.

A second Hamas source confirmed the development.

Members of the council are elected every four years by representatives from Hamas's

three branches: the Gaza Strip, the occupied West Bank and the movement's external leadership.

Hamas prisoners in Israeli jails are also eligible to vote.

The council subsequently elects the political bureau, which in turn selects the head of the movement.

Russian missile barrage hits energy, railways across Ukraine

Russia fired scores of missiles and drones at targets across Ukraine on Sunday, crashing into energy and rail infrastructure and residential buildings, just two days before the fourth anniversary of Moscow's all-out invasion.

The capital Kyiv, regularly targeted by Russian missile and drone attacks since the start of the full-scale invasion, has faced waves of overnight strikes in recent weeks as Moscow has intensified assaults amid freezing winter temperatures.

"Moscow continues to invest in strikes more than in diplomacy," Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said of the attack on social media, adding that Russia launched about 50 missiles and 300 drones overnight.

"The main target of the attack was the energy sector. Ordinary residential buildings were also damaged, and there is damage to the railway."

The intense barrage came the same day Hungary said it would block the EU's latest package of sanctions against Russia, unless Ukraine re-opens a key oil pipeline that supplies the country.

Ukraine says the Druzhba pipeline that crosses its territory to deliver Russian oil to Slovakia and Hungary was damaged late January by Russian strikes.

In Kyiv and its region, the Sunday overnight strikes killed one man and wounded a dozen more, among them four children, Ukraine's national police said.

"I felt the building shaking. It was clearly a hit, and the force (of the explosion) was strong. I

jumped up because my dog got scared too," Olga, a 48-year-old woman who lives in the settlement, told AFP.

Anton, also from the area, said there were no military installations in Sofiivska Borschagivka.

Netanyahu says Modi to visit Israel Wednesday

India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Israel on Wednesday, his counterpart Benjamin Netanyahu said.

"The Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi, will arrive here; he will deliver a speech in the Knesset, and I'm sure you will all be there," Netanyahu said Sunday at the opening of a cabinet meeting, referring

to Israel's parliament. Netanyahu hailed growing ties between the two countries.

"The fabric of relations has grown tighter, and (Modi) is coming here so that we can tighten it even more," he said, mentioning cooperation in the economic, diplomatic and security spheres.

Modi previously visited Israel as prime minister in 2017, before Netanyahu made a reciprocal visit to India the following year.

US can access minerals, military bases in Somaliland, minister says

Somaliland is willing to give the United States access to its minerals and military bases, a minister has told AFP, as the breakaway region of Somalia seeks international recognition.

Israel became the only country in the world to recognise Somaliland's independence in December -- something the territory has been seeking since declaring its autonomy from Somalia in 1991.

The government in Mogadishu still considers Somaliland an integral part of Somalia even though the territory has run its own affairs since 1991, with its own passports, currency, army and police force.

"We are willing to give exclusive (access to our minerals) to the United States. Also, we are open to offer military bases to the United States," Khadar Hussein Abdi, minister of the presidency, told AFP in an interview on Saturday.


"We believe that we will agree on something with the United States."

Somaliland president Abdirahman Mohamed Abdullahi already suggested in recent weeks granting Israel privileged access to its mineral resources.

And Khadar Hussein Abdi said he could not rule out the possibility of also allowing Israel to set up a military presence.

Somaliland officials have said their soil is rich in lithium, coltan and

other sought-after resources, though independent studies are lacking.

Turkey plea

Shortly after Israel's recognition at the end of December, social media was flooded with photos of men and women displaying the Israeli flag -- one of them even using it as a hijab.

Somali President Hassan Sheikh Mohamud, on the other hand, denounced it as "the greatest violation of Somalia's sovereignty" and a "threat to the security and stability of the world and the region".

The African Union and most Arab countries threw their support behind Somalia and condemned the move.

The US, however, defended what it said was Israel's right to recognise Somaliland, although President Donald Trump said he was unlikely to follow suit, despite pressure from some within his Republican party.

Khadar Hussein Abdi reached out specifically to Turkey, another country that objected to Israel's move, telling AFP that Turkish officials "must talk to us, not to Mogadishu" as Somalia had no functioning state.

US says trade deals in force despite court ruling on tariffs

US trade deals with the European Union, China and other partners remain in force despite the Supreme Court ruling that struck down many of President Donald Trump's tariffs, a top official said Sunday.

"So we're having active conversations with them. We want them to understand that these deals are going to be good deals," US Trade Representative Jamieson Greer said on the CBS program "Face the Nation."

He added: "We expect to stand by them. We expect our partners to stand by them."

But European Central Bank

president Christine Lagarde said on the same show she is not sure what the consequences of the US court decision are.

"So I hope it's going to be clarified, and it's going to be sufficiently thought through, so that we don't have, again, more challenges, and the proposals will be in compliance with the constitution, in compliance with the law," said Lagarde.

Greer said a meeting planned for April between Trump and Chinese President Xi Jinping is "not to fight about trade."

"It's to maintain stability, make sure that the Chinese are holding up their end of our deal and buying American agricul-

tural products and Boeings and other things, and making sure they're sending us the rare earth that we need," Greer said on ABC.

On Friday the US Supreme Court ruled 6-3 that the president had exceeded his authority in imposing tariffs under a 1977 economic emergency powers act, saying Congress had to give its approval.

New tariffs

Trump reacted furiously and announced a new 10 percent global duty on imports under a different legal authority, then raised it to 15 percent on Saturday. It kicks in on Tuesday, is due to last 150 days and has

exemptions for some products. "It's important to understand that over the years, Congress has

delegated enormous tariff setting authority to the president," Greer said on CBS. He added

that tariffs imposed outside the authority struck down by the court remain in effect. Asked about Trump's decision to quickly raise the new tariff from 10 percent to 15 percent, Greer said the latter was the top level the president was allowed by law.

Greer was also asked about Trump's aggressive use of tariffs despite the fact that polls show most Americans disapprove of this policy.

"The president has been campaigning on tariffs and protecting American industry for many years, and he does what he says, he delivers on his promises," Greer said.

sanctions package will be rejected," Prime Minister Viktor Orbán posted on X. "Until Ukraine resumes oil transit to Hungary and Slovakia via the Druzhba pipeline, we will not allow decisions important to Kyiv to move forward," Foreign Minister Peter Szijjarto posted, also on X.

Ukraine says the Druzhba pipeline that crosses its territory to deliver Russian oil to Slovakia and Hungary was damaged January 27 by Russian strikes.

The European Union in early February proposed new sanc-

tions against Russia, targeting the banking and energy sectors, its 20th package since Russia's invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022.

The European Commission also intends to activate its anti-coercion tool, for the first time, to ban the export of all machine tools and radio equipment to countries where there is a high risk that these products will be re-exported to Russia.

All the EU's 27 member states must give their approval before the new sanctions can take effect.

Macron asks Trump to lift sanctions on European officials

French President Emmanuel Macron recently wrote to his US counterpart Donald Trump asking him to lift sanctions placed on several European figures, including former European commissioner Thierry Breton and ICC judge Nicolas Guillou, according to extracts of a letter seen by AFP.

In the letter, Macron says he is making a personal appeal to Trump to reconsider the sanctions, which he argues were

unjustly imposed. The letter's existence was first reported in La Tribune Dimanche.

Breton has been banned from entering the United States since December 2025 because of his work on regulating digital platforms in the European Union, which the Trump administration views as an infringement on freedom of expression. US Secretary of State Marco Rubio has denounced EU rules as "blatant acts of extraterritorial censorship."





Ramadan after dark: How the holy month transforms cities, culture and daily life


While Ramadan is often discussed mainly in terms of fasting, prayer and charity, another fascinating yet less explored dimension of the holy month is how it dramatically reshapes daily rhythms, urban life and even local economies. Across many Muslim-majority societies — and increasingly in multicultural cities around the world — Ramadan turns nights into vibrant hubs of activity while days become quieter, more reflective and slower paced. This distinctive reversal of routine offers a deeper understanding of how faith influences not only personal spirituality but also social habits, commerce, public life and cultural identity.

Cities Come Alive After Sunset

As the sun sets and the fast ends, cities that seemed calm during daylight hours suddenly come alive. Restaurants fill quickly, street vendors prepare traditional delicacies, families head out for evening shopping, and cafés extend their hours well into the night. In many places, authorities adjust public services during Ramadan, with extended transport schedules, late-night markets and seasonal bazaars offering festive goods, sweets and clothing. For businesses, particularly in food, retail and hospitality sectors, Ramadan can become one of the busiest and most economically significant periods of the year.

A Unique Night Culture

Nightlife during Ramadan develops its own cultural character, distinct from ordinary social evenings. Rather than focusing purely on entertainment, these gatherings combine spirituality with social connection. Families and friends meet after iftar for meals, conversations and reflection, while mosques and community centres host religious

talks, charity drives and Qur'an recitations. These interactions strengthen community bonds and preserve traditions that might otherwise weaken amid modern urban lifestyles. Younger generations are also reshaping these traditions through social media meetups, volunteering initiatives and food festivals, blending heritage with contemporary expression.

Food Traditions in Transition

Food remains a central cultural element of Ramadan, but evolving lifestyles are adding new dimensions. Restaurants create special Ramadan menus and elaborate iftar spreads, often mixing traditional recipes with modern culinary creativity. While dates, soups and regional sweets remain essential, chefs

increasingly experiment with healthier options and international influences. The growth of food delivery services has also transformed how people break their fast, allowing convenience to coexist with long-standing customs.

Changing Work and Lifestyle Patterns

Work patterns often adjust during Ramadan as well. Some organisations reduce working hours or introduce flexible schedules to accommodate fasting employees. Many people experience shifts in productivity, sometimes feeling more energetic at night than during the day. Sleep cycles may change due to late prayers, social gatherings and the pre-dawn meal, yet many individuals report

improved mental clarity and emotional balance, attributing it to the spiritual atmosphere and disciplined routine of the month. In diverse workplaces, there is also growing awareness of the need for cultural sensitivity during Ramadan, encouraging greater inclusivity and understanding.

The Digital Ramadan Experience

Technology has quietly transformed the Ramadan experience. Mobile applications now assist with prayer times, Qur'an recitations, charitable donations and even virtual iftar gatherings. Social media has become a powerful platform for sharing charity campaigns, religious lectures and community initiatives, while also helping diaspo-

Although the month emphasises moderation and gratitude, concerns about food waste during large iftar gatherings have prompted awareness campaigns. Many communities now promote responsible consumption, encourage donation of surplus food and advocate environmentally conscious practices. These initiatives align closely with Islamic teachings on balance, responsibility and stewardship of resources.

A Broader Social Impact

Beyond individual devotion, Ramadan often acts as a social equaliser. The shared experience of fasting fosters empathy for those facing hardship, encouraging generosity and social solidarity. Public charity in-

creases, volunteerism rises and community outreach expands. Even in multicultural societies where Muslims form a minority, Ramadan often becomes an opportunity for cultural exchange, with neighbours, colleagues and friends participating in shared meals and learning about each other's traditions.

More Than a Religious Observance

Ultimately, Ramadan's impact extends far beyond mosques and homes. It influences urban rhythms, economic patterns, cultural expression and social relationships. The holy month illustrates how faith can shape everyday life in profound yet practical ways, balancing spiritual devotion with community engagement and tradition with modern adaptation.

Perhaps this is what makes Ramadan truly remarkable. It is not only a fast observed from dawn to sunset, but a living social phenomenon that brings communities together, reshapes daily routines and encourages reflection, generosity and shared humanity for one meaningful month each year.

Ramadan Recipe

Cheese- or Walnut-Filled Crepes (Atayef)

Makes 24 crepes

Ingredients

Walnut Filling

- 1 cup walnuts, chopped coarsely
- 5 Tbsp sugar
- Zest of 1 orange
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- 2 Tbsp orange blossom water

Cheese Filling

- 10 oz akkawi cheese (desalted) or ricotta mixed with half of the mozzarella
- 3-4 oz fresh mozzarella cheese, grated
- 5 Tbsp sugar
- 1 Tbsp rosewater
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- Pinch of salt
- 1 Tbsp sugar
- 1 tsp instant dry yeast

- 3 cups lukewarm water
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 2 cups of rose syrup
- peanut oil, for deep-frying
- 1/2 cup ground pistachios, to garnish

Step 1

To prepare the walnut filling, mix the walnuts, sugar, zest, cinnamon and orange blossom water. Set aside. To prepare the cheese filling, I start the process the night before. Desalt the akkawi cheese by slicing thin and immersing in cold water, leaving it to soak. Drain and change the water again after 1 hour, repeating five or six more times to get rid of all the salt. Taste the cheese before using it to ensure no saltiness



remains. Mix the 2 cheeses, sugar and rosewater and set aside in a colander to drain any excess water.

Step 2

Put the flour into a large bowl. Mix in the salt, sugar and yeast. Pour in the

water gradually and beat vigorously with a whisk.

Step 3

Beat in the baking soda. The batter should be creamy and pourable. Cover and leave aside to rise for 1 hour. Spread a clean lint-free tea towel on a cookie sheet and set aside. Heat a nonstick heavy-bottomed frying pan. Whisk the batter a little before ladling 1/4 cup in the pan to make 4-inch disks. Cook only on one side. Bubbles will start to form; they are ready when there are no more shiny wet spots on the top (about 1-2 minutes). Place each atayef, browned side down, on the tea towel to cool completely.

Step 4

Take one atayef and cup it in your hand. Fill it with either one of the fillings. Bring the edges together to form a crescent, pinching around the edges with a little firmness to keep the filling enclosed. Fill the remaining and set aside while you prepare your "workstation." Pour 2 cups of rose syrup in a deep bowl. Line a plate with paper towels. Heat the oil in a heavy-bottomed saucepan to 350°F on the thermometer. Deep-fry the filled atayef no more than four at a time until golden brown on both sides. Remove with a slotted spoon and place on the paper towels. While hot, slide a couple at a time into the cool syrup for 1 minute to absorb. Remove with another slotted spoon. Serve hot, garnished with pistachios.

Liverpool late show floors Forest

Late rebound winner punishes Forest as Reds draw level on points with Chelsea and Man United

● **Mac Allister scores 97th-minute winner**

● **Liverpool beat Forest 1-0**

● **Champions League hopes strengthened**

Alexis Mac Allister's 97th-minute goal rescued Liverpool from a lacklustre performance to beat struggling Nottingham Forest 1-0 yesterday in a huge boost to their chances of Champions League football next season.

Forest's fourth manager of the season, Vitor Pereira, was taking charge for the first time in the league and his side looked set to earn a deserved point until a dramatic finale.

Mac Allister had a goal ruled out when he charged down Ola Aina's clearance in the closing stages.

The ball was deemed to have struck the Argentine midfielder on the arm.

However, to Pereira's fury, Forest did not heed the warn-

ing as they slipped to within two points of the Premier League relegation zone.

Mac Allister swept home a rebound after Virgil van Dijk's header was saved.

After another lengthy VAR review, this time the call went in

Liverpool's favour despite Hugo Ekitike standing in an offside position.

Liverpool remain in sixth but climb level on points with Chelsea and Manchester United and within six points of Aston Villa.

Thanks to the strong perfor-

mance of English sides in European competition this season, a place in the top five will almost certainly secure Champions League qualification.

Liverpool were dealt a blow before kick-off when Florian Wirtz picked up an injury in the



warm-up.

The German's ingenuity was badly missed in a performance badly lacking in attacking impetus until a late rally saved their blushes.

The pressure was on Arsenal in yesterday's later kick-off (1630GMT) at north London rivals Tottenham.

Spurs are under new management as interim boss Igor Tudor takes charge for the first time, tasked with guiding them away from the relegation zone.

Arsenal could have been out of sight in the title race but a run

of just two wins in seven league games has allowed Manchester City to close to within two points at the top.

Fulham climbed above Sunderland into the top half of the table after becoming just the second visiting side to win at the Stadium of Light this season.

Miller, Stubbs power South Africa to crushing win over India

David Miller's blazing half-century and a disciplined bowling display powered South Africa to a thumping 76-run win over India in their Super Eights Group 1 clash at the T20 World Cup in Ahmedabad yesterday.

Put in to bat after winning the toss, South Africa recovered from early blows to post a commanding 187 for seven, built around Miller's 63 off 35 balls and Dewald Brevis' 45 from 29 deliveries. The pair added 97 for the fourth wicket, lifting the Proteas from 20 for three to a position of strength before Tristan Stubbs chipped in with an unbeaten 44 off 24 balls in the closing overs. Jasprit Bumrah was the pick of the Indian attack with three for 15, while Arshdeep Singh took two wickets but the rest of the bowlers came in for punishment as South Africa scored at 9.35 runs per

over.

Chasing 188, India collapsed to 31 for three in the powerplay and never recovered, eventually folding for 111 in 18.5 overs. Only Shivam Dube offered resistance with a 37-ball 42, as wickets fell regularly against a relentless South African attack. Left-arm seamer Marco Jansen ripped through the line-up with figures of four for 22, while Keshav Maharaj's left-arm spin accounted for three middle and lower-order wickets to seal a comprehensive win.

The result ended India's winning streak in the tournament and gave South Africa two crucial points in the Super Eights, tightening their grip on a semi-final berth at the Narendra Modi Stadium. Player-of-the-match Miller, who struck seven fours and three sixes, was central to the Proteas' dominance with the bat and in swinging the momentum decisively their way.
