Federer defeats Ebden to reach semi-finals in Halle

World number one Roger Federer was tested once again in Halle but did enough to overpower Australian Matthew Ebden 7-6(2) 7-5 in the 109th in the world, eased past quarter-finals yesterday.

Murray takes wildcard into Eastbourne

ndy Murray will play at Anext week's Eastbourne grasscourt championships in a bid to prove his fitness for Wimbledon.

The Briton returned to action at Queen's Club this week after almost a year away with a hip injury but lost in the first round of the Fever-Tree championships to Nick Kyrgios. "I'm looking forward to getting some more time on the grass courts at Eastbourne this week," the three-times Grand Slam champion, who had surgery in January, said in a statement. "I played Davis Cup there in 2006 and I know the courts and facilities there are excellent. It was good to get back to competition at Queen's this week, and I'm hoping to building on that next week at Devonshire Park." After defeat by Kyrgios, Murray cast doubt on his fitness for Wimbledon, saying he was unsure whether he would have been able to play a best-of-five-set match. He did impress, however, pushing the Australian to 3 sets and he will look to further test his movement and gain some match sharpness at the ATP 250 event on the south coast.
