Dr Hatem Aly, the UNODC Representative for GCC, said that they have been working with the National Committee to Combat Trafficking in Persons (NCCTIPs) in the Kingdom for several years, and that the establishment of this centre will be a quantum leap in the field of combating trafficking in persons for the MENA Region.

Residents who avail the Monline services offered by the General Directorate of Traffic stand a chance to win BD50 every week from next month onwards, it is learnt.

"The General Directorate of Traffic has announced the allocation for one year a weekly prize of BD50, starting July for the users of the traffic e-services through the national portal Bahrain. bh or e-traffic application available to be downloaded in the smartphones," the traffic directorate stated.
