Lebanese President Joseph Aoun is set to meet His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa today to discuss pressing regional and international developments. President Aoun arrived in the Kingdom of Bahrain yesterday on an official visit aimed at strengthening bilateral relations.

HM the King is scheduled to meet him today at Al Qudaibiya Palace, where an official recep-

Mutual concern

The high-level talks are expected to focus on strengthening political, economic, and cultural cooperation between the two countries, as well as exchanging views on matters of mutual concern across the Middle East and beyond.

Upon his arrival, President Aoun was warmly received by His Highness Shaikh Abdullah bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Personal

Brotherly ties

Expressing his appreciation for the invitation extended by HM King Hamad, President Aoun described the visit as a testament to the longstanding

and brotherly ties between Lebanon and Bahrain.

He emphasised the importance of this opportunity to deepen collaboration in key sectors including economy, investment, and tourism, particularly at a time when the region faces evolving challenges requiring unified and strategic responses.

"The visit reflects our mutual desire to expand strategic partnerships that serve the interests of both nations," President Aoun stated. "Lebanon deeply values Bahrain's support at various international and regional platforms, and its continued efforts in promoting peace, stability, and development across the Arab world."

President Aoun noted that his meetings with His Majesty and senior Bahraini officials would help lay the groundwork for enhanced cooperation and shared prosperity, while reaffirming Lebanon's commitment to Arab solidarity.

Kingdom condoles with Bangladesh over plane crash

Bahrain's new initiative adds 23 dedicated classrooms for students with autism and intellectual disabilities, marking the largest single-year inclusion effort in its public school history.

Public schools across Bahrain will witness the country's largest ever expansion in inclusive education this September, with new infrastructure, dedicated classrooms for students with disabilities, and sweeping upgrades in school services, the Minister of Education confirmed yesterday.

His Excellency Dr Mohamed bin Mubarak Juma said the 2025-2026 academic year will be "qualitatively different" due

to major reforms targeting students with autism, intellectual disabilities, and other special needs. The initiative, backed by His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince and Prime Minister, aims to improve support services across all government schools.

As part of this reform, 23 fully equipped and furnished classrooms dedicated to students with autism and intellectual disabilities will be opened. This marks the biggest such expansion in Bahrain's education history.

"These new classrooms come in addition to the existing ones and reflect our growing commitment to inclusive learning," Dr Juma said.

He added that comprehensive educational plans are being developed to better support students with special needs, underlining the ministry's par-

allel focus on inclusive and high-quality education delivery.

The ministry has also finalised plans to increase the number of school buses for students with special needs, with each bus fully equipped to meet safety and accessibility standards.

Transport lines are also being expanded for the general

student population, including new routes serving recently developed urban areas. These changes will raise the number of students benefiting from government transport services to more than 50,000 across the Kingdom.

To improve school environments, nearly 6,000 new

air-conditioning units are being installed in public schools. This adds to the 5,000 units already fitted last year. Special teams have been assigned to inspect and ensure the efficient operation of cooling systems before the new term begins.

Another major upgrade involves increasing the number of cleaning staff in every public school. From the upcoming year, each school will have four to nine cleaners, up from just two to four in previous years. This change is expected to significantly improve hygiene standards and the overall school environment.

Dr Juma praised the ministry's internal teams for accelerating preparations ahead of the new academic year. He said ongoing maintenance and preventive checks are under way at all government schools, with further details on the school year's launch expected soon.

Food fraud fallout

Two distribution companies fined and closed, 23 jailed in expiry date scandal

Two food distribution companies have been fined and ordered to close, with prison sentences handed to their owners and staff, following one of Bahrain's largest commercial fraud trials involving falsified expiry dates.

The Sixth Minor Criminal Court sentenced the owner of the first company to three years in prison and fined him BD100,000.

The second was fined BD101,000.

A senior employee received a three-year term, while 19 workers were each sentenced to two years.

All foreign defendants are to be deported upon completing their sentences.

Suspension

Both companies were fined BD10,000 and ordered to suspend operations for six months.

The court also ordered the destruction of expired and adulterated food products, along with the equipment, chemicals and materials used to alter the dates.

The case revolved around large quantities of expired



goods being reintroduced into the market with forged shelf-life labels.

Original dates were either removed or concealed beneath newly printed ones to give the appearance that the products remained safe to consume.

Complaint

The matter came to light when a worker filed a complaint at Khamis Police Station (A) in the Northern Governorate.

Having recently arrived in Bahrain and taken a job at one of the company's warehouses, he reported that he was instructed to repackage expired food with forged expiry dates.

He refused to participate, recorded video evidence of the practice, and submitted a formal

report.

Following the complaint, the Ministry of Industry and Commerce ordered the immediate closure of the warehouse and its affiliated shops. Prosecutors visited the premises the same day.

On-site inspection

A team from the Public Prosecution conducted an on-site inspection, questioned 29 individuals comprising owners, supervisors and workers, and ordered their detention pending investigation.

The warehouse and all outlets belonging to the company were placed under judicial custody.

Inspectors from the ministry carried out a full inventory.

They seized over 14,000 ex-

pired food items, along with various chemical substances used to erase original markings.

Counterfeit dates

Additional products originating from the same company and bearing counterfeit dates were discovered on sale in local markets.

A forensic specialist from the Criminal Evidence Directorate examined samples and confirmed the expiry dates had been falsified through removal and relabelling.

Eyewitness statements and police investigations supported the findings.

Judgements

Once the investigation concluded and evidence was secured, the Public Prosecution referred the matter to court. Judgements were issued shortly thereafter.

Counsellor Wael Rashid Bualay, Assistant Attorney General, called on all food sector operators to comply fully with Bahrain's legal and regulatory requirements.

He stated that any endangerment of public health constitutes a criminal offence and will be dealt with through strict legal measures.

No power, no water

Ras Raya jetty, Bahrain’s fish hub, left high and dry for 17 years

Ras Raya jetty in Muharraq, a landing site that supplies most of Bahrain’s fish markets, remains without electricity or running water 17 years after its opening. The jetty, which opened in 2008, was intended to support local fishermen with service buildings and mooring space. While the buildings were constructed, none are in use due to the absence of power and water connections. Fishermen say this has left them struggling to maintain their boats, store equipment safely, or even carry out repairs.

Visit

Muharraq Municipal Council member Fadhil Al Oud, who represents the Sixth Constituency, visited the site to meet fishermen and inspect conditions.

He said the port continues to lack the basics such as lighting, washrooms, drinking water and a mosque.

He called for a budget to be set aside for repairs and service upgrades.

Fishermen from Dair and Samaheej said the jetty’s condition affects both their earnings and safety.

Boats

Some have had to move their boats away from the main dock, known locally as ‘the jetty’, as it

has been submerged for years. Rising tides, they say, could soon engulf other sections of the port, damaging engines that rely on freshwater cooling.

Others recounted the closure of a small ice and water factory once set up by a private investor.

It allowed fishermen to stock up near the jetty rather than travel to Hidd or further.

But the operation folded, they said, due to the high cost of fuelling diesel generators.

Generators

Since then, some have paid as much as BD20 a day to run their own generators while working. There are no working storage sheds either.

Earlier attempts by the authorities to install metal cabins failed.

The interiors became unbearably hot, there was no shelter above, and the units were prone to leaks.

Theft

Many fishermen now leave their tools in the open or risk theft.

Several have reported ropes, traps and other gear going missing.

Fishermen have suggested allowing small personal storage cabins and fitting cameras at the jetty’s entrance to help reduce theft.

They also called for a review of the current penalties for marine infractions, saying fines starting from BD300 are too high given the nature of their work and income.

Proposal

Al Oud added that he had submitted a proposal four years ago to fix the problem and followed up with the authorities.

The matter, he said, has yet to move.

He said fishermen continue to face daily trouble, and many have been left to work in unsuitable conditions despite the jetty’s role in meeting most of the local demand for fish.

Dumistan site added to national marine development plan

Dumistan’s coastal site in Block 1017 has been included in Bahrain’s national plan for developing marine landing points, according to a formal response from the Director-General of Marine Resources at the Supreme Council for Environment.

The step follows a proposal submitted by Northern Municipal Council member Zainab Al Durazi, who called for a purpose-built facility to serve the area’s fishermen.

The proposal concerns two government-owned plots near the country’s western shoreline.

Value

The land, already allocated to Marine Resources, is viewed

as having historical and social value and has long been linked to Dumistan’s fishing trade.

Al Durazi’s proposal was backed unanimously during a regular meeting of the Northern Municipal Council.

The council then wrote to the relevant authorities, including the Marine Resources Directorate, which confirmed the site had been added to the development plan.

opment plan.

Support

She said Dumistan had supported generations of fishermen, yet residents still lack a proper landing point, despite the availability of suitable government land.

Al Durazi added that the proposal responded to repeated calls from locals and aimed to preserve the area’s maritime heritage while offering a working base for the fishing community.

The directorate stated that the project’s execution depends on approval from higher authorities responsible for carrying out the national programme, which includes new landing points in several parts of the country, Dumistan among them.

Bahrain is set to become the region’s new epicentre for cybersecurity innovation, with the third Arab International Cybersecurity Conference & Exhibition (AICS 2025) unveiling the launch of the Arab world’s first DEF CON Villages.

The announcement was made yesterday at a press conference held under the patronage of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince, Deputy Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces, and Prime Minister. The event, scheduled for 5 to 6 November at Exhibition World Bahrain, is organised for the third consecutive year by Faalyat.

DEF CON Villages debut

The National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC), in collaboration with DEF CON, one of the world’s most iconic hacker communities, confirmed that the Villages will focus on artificial intelligence, space, cloud

security, and industrial control systems. Interactive Demo Labs will accompany the Villages, offering hands-on tech experiences to researchers, startups, and students.

Shaikh Salman bin Mohammed Al Khalifa, CEO of the NCSC, said the collaboration with DEF CON represented a leap forward in positioning Bahrain as a global cybersecurity hub. “It’s a platform to exchange global expertise, showcase innovation, and prepare the region for evolving cyber threats,” he said.

Youth front and centre

The event will include a youth empowerment programme, mentorship initiatives, and a Capture the Flag (CTF) cyber contest to spotlight local and international talent. The NCSC also announced a strategic partnership with the Bahrain Institute of Banking and Finance (BIBF) to deliver specialised training for emerging cybersecurity professionals.

A new local community initiative, DEF CON Group Bahrain, was also launched to unite experts, students, and enthusiasts focused on defensive cybersecurity practices and digital resilience.

Building cyber leadership

More than 10,000 participants from 50 countries are expected to attend, alongside 100 international speakers and experts. The programme includes pavilions, technical workshops, cyber competitions, and a global tech exhibition.

H.E. Shaikh Salman praised the ongoing collaboration with Faalyat, which continues to bring world-class stakeholder engagement and experiential design to the region’s most prominent cyber event.

The third edition of AICS builds on Bahrain’s commitment to secure digital transformation and cyber innovation, reinforcing its vision to lead the Arab world in shaping future cyber ecosystems.

With Argentina's football legacy commanding deep loyalty among Bahraini expats, the brand is now positioned not just as a remittance provider, but as a cultural connector. The partnership opens a unique space where financial services meet football glory.

AFA President Claudio Tapia called the partnership a strategic step in strengthening Argentina's ties with international fans. "We share the same values and the importance of teamwork," he said. Leandro Petersen, AFA's Commercial and Marketing Director, added that the deal helps build visibility in regions with strong support for the Argentine national team.

Countdown to 2026

With the next FIFA World Cup on the horizon, the timing of the partnership is critical. The agreement covers Argentina's run-up to the tournament, offering Bahraini fans and customers

Bahrain gains visa-free entry to China in global mobility shift

Visa-free entry now extended

● China grants visa waiver

● GCC countries climb index

● Bahrain joins strategic list

Bahrain has been added to China's visa-free list in a move that strengthens the Kingdom's global mobility and reflects broader gains by Gulf passports. The announcement was made in the latest Henley Passport Index report, which highlights growing international openness and strategic diplomacy shaping the future of travel.

Bahrain joins its GCC neighbours, Kuwait, Oman, and Saudi Arabia, on the list of countries whose citizens can now enter China without a prior visa. The development means that all six Gulf Cooperation Council countries now enjoy visa-free access to the world's second-largest economy.

Gulf gains

The July 2025 report underscores a broader shift in the

global mobility landscape. Asian nations now dominate the top of the index, with Singapore, Japan, and South Korea leading the way. At the same time, Gulf countries are strengthening their global reach through reciprocal visa agreements and growing diplomatic engagement.

Bahrain's inclusion in China's visa-free list reflects this rising Gulf momentum. The development comes as part of a broader regional pattern in which countries within the GCC are actively negotiating new mobility corridors and benefiting from deeper

international cooperation.

Saudi Arabia made the largest gain in visa-free access among GCC countries in 2025, adding four new destinations and rising four places on the index to reach 54th. This progress reflects Riyadh's push to broaden international partnerships and diversify its global footprint.

The UAE remains a standout, having climbed 34 positions over the past decade. It moved from 42nd to 8th place, making it the only major riser to break into the index's top 10. This long-term leap is attributed to sustained

visa diplomacy and rapid international outreach.

Diplomatic dividends

The visa waiver is part of China's broader openness strategy, which has expanded visa-free access from fewer than 20 countries five years ago to 75 nations in 2025. Analysts say China's decision to open its borders to GCC countries reflects growing economic and political alignment with the Gulf.

While Bahrain's exact ranking was not disclosed in the report, its inclusion in China's visa-free

policy marks a strategic milestone for the Kingdom. The expansion of visa-free corridors is increasingly seen as a measure of a nation's diplomatic weight and international relevance.

Bahrain's growing access to major markets like China offers new opportunities for business, tourism, and cultural exchange. It marks a positive step in the Kingdom's international engagement.

Top rankings shift

According to the index, Singapore now holds the world's most powerful passport, with visa-free access to 193 destinations. Japan and South Korea follow in joint second place, each granting access to 190 destinations. A strong European contingent shares third place, including France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Denmark, Finland, and Ireland, all with access to 189 destinations.

The UK and US continue their long-term decline. The UK is now ranked sixth with access to 186 countries, while the US has dropped to tenth place with 182 destinations. The report notes that the US is on the verge of exiting the top ten for the first time in the index's 20-year history.

India recorded the largest jump over the past six months, rising eight places from 85th

to 77th. China, meanwhile, has climbed 34 ranks over the past decade to reach 60th, driven by its growing visa reciprocity and global connectivity strategy.

Asia-Pacific surges

The Asia-Pacific region continues to power global mobility trends. Alongside Singapore's rise to the top, China's expanding openness and regional partnerships are fuelling higher rankings across the continent.

This momentum, combined with the steady climb of Gulf nations, reflects a shift in global mobility where proactive diplomacy and regional cooperation increasingly shape access and influence.

Coca-Cola plans US cane sugar alternative after Trump push

Coca-Cola on Tuesday said it would release a version of Coke in the United States made with US-grown real cane sugar, a move requested by President Donald Trump.

"We're going to be bringing a Coke sweetened with US cane sugar into the market this fall, and I think that will be an enduring option for consumers," said CEO James Quincey on a call with analysts.

The company currently uses high-fructose corn syrup (HFCS) for many of its US products -- a sweetener that has long drawn criticism from Health Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. and his "Make America Healthy Again" agenda. Trump last week said that

the company had agreed to use cane sugar in the United States version of Coke.

"This will be a very good move by them -- You'll see. It's just better!" Trump wrote on Truth Social.

Coca-Cola at the time did not confirm the move even if it said it appreciated Trump's "enthusiasm" for its brand.

In announcing the new option, Quincey insisted that the main Coke product would still be made with corn syrup, with the cane sugar version offered as an alternative.

Mexican Coke -- which is made with cane sugar -- is often sold at a premium in US stores and prized for its more "natural" flavor.

The US president did not explain what motivated his push for the change.

US Treasury chief says no reason for Fed chair to step down

US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said Tuesday that he did not see a reason for Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell to resign immediately, a day after calling for a sweeping review of the Fed.

Bessent's comments in a Fox Business interview come as Powell faces growing pressure from Donald Trump's administration to slash interest rates, with the president recently ramping up attacks against the independent central bank chief over the Fed's \$2.5 billion renovation project.

"There's nothing that tells me that he should step down right now," Bessent said, referring to Powell.

He noted that Powell's term

as Fed chair ends in May 2026, and that Powell should see out his full term if he wants to.

But if the Fed chief wanted to leave early, he should as well, Bessent added.

Late Monday in a social media post, Bessent called for the Fed to conduct an "exhaustive internal review of its non-monetary policy operations," accusing the central bank of mission creep.

Bessent, in his post on X, said the Fed's "independence is a cornerstone of continued US economic growth and stability."



Bessent eyes China tariff deadline extension in talks next week

US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said Tuesday that he would meet his Chinese counterparts in Stockholm next week for tariff talks, eyeing an extension to a mid-August deadline for levies to snap back to steeper levels.


Bessent told Fox Business that he will be speaking with Chinese officials on Monday and Tuesday for a third round of high-level negotiations, to work out what he said would be a likely postponement of the deadline.

Washington and Beijing slapped escalating, tit-for-tat levies on each other's exports earlier this year -- reaching triple digit levels -- stalling trade between the

world's two biggest economies as tensions surged.

But after top officials met in Geneva in May, both sides agreed to temporarily lower their tariff levels in a de-escalation set to expire next month. Officials from the two countries also met in London in June. "That deal expires on August 12, and I'm going to be in Stockholm on Monday and Tuesday with

my Chinese counterparts, and we'll be working out what is likely an extension then," Bessent said in the interview.

News in brief

◆ **Portugal yesterday** became the latest nation to back Morocco's plan to give autonomy under Moroccan sovereignty to the disputed Western Sahara territory. Portugal considers the plan "serious, credible and constructive" for the resource-rich north African territory, where the Algerian-backed Polisario Front rebel group has campaigned for an independent state. Morocco moved in to control most of the sparsely populated territory after former colonial ruler Spain withdrew in 1975. The United Nations considers Western Sahara a "non-self-governing" territory and has had a peacekeeping mission, MINURSO, there since 1991 with the official aim of holding a self-determination referendum. Morocco has however refused to allow a vote where independence could be an option. In recent years, France, the United States, Spain, Germany and last month Britain have all backed the Moroccan autonomy plan.

◆ **The World Health Organization** warned yesterday a major chikungunya virus epidemic risks sweeping around the globe, calling for urgent action to prevent it. The WHO said it was picking up exactly the same early warning signs as in a major outbreak two decades ago and wanted to prevent a repeat. Chikungunya is a mosquito-borne viral disease that causes fever and severe joint pain, which is often debilitating. In some cases it can be deadly.

"Chikungunya is not a disease that is widely known, but it has been detected and transmitted in 119 countries globally, putting 5.6 billion people at risk," said the WHO's Diana Rojas Alvarez. She recalled how from 2004 to 2005, a major chikungunya epidemic swept across the Indian Ocean, hitting small island territories before spreading globally and affecting almost half a million people.

◆ **Russian lawmakers** advanced a bill yesterday that would fine internet users who search online for web pages, books, artworks or music albums that authorities have deemed "extremist" -- a move critics have called a dangerous attack on freedom. More than 5,000 entries are on the Russian justice ministry's list of "extremist materials", including songs praising Ukraine, blog posts by feminist rock band Pussy Riot and websites critical of Russian President Vladimir Putin. Deputies in the lower house State Duma backed the bill by 306 votes to 67 and the text will now be sent to Russia's upper house, where it is unlikely to face any major opposition. The legislation would impose fines of up to 5,000 rubles (\$64) on anyone found to have deliberately searched for or gained access to material on the list.

Humans beat AI gold-level score at
top maths contest

Humans beat generative AI models made by Google and OpenAI at a top international mathematics competition, despite the programmes reaching gold-level scores for the first time. Neither model scored full marks -- unlike five young people at the International Mathematical Olympiad (IMO), a prestigious annual competition where participants must be under 20 years old. Google said Monday that an advanced version of its Gemini chatbot had solved five out of the six maths problems set at the IMO, held in Australia's Queensland this month. "We can confirm that Google DeepMind has reached the much-desired milestone, earning 35 out of a possible 42 points -- a gold medal score," the US tech giant cited IMO

president Gregor Dolinar as saying. "Their solutions were astonishing in many respects. IMO graders found them to be clear, precise and most of them easy to follow." Around 10 percent of human contestants won gold-level medals, and five received perfect scores of 42 points. US ChatGPT maker OpenAI said that its experimental reasoning model had scored a gold-level 35 points on the test. The result "achieved a long-standing grand challenge in AI" at "the world's most prestigious math competition", OpenAI researcher Alexander Wei wrote on social media. "We evaluated our models on the 2025 IMO problems under the same rules as human contestants," he said. "For each problem, three former IMO medalists independently graded the model's submitted proof."

The UN yesterday said Israeli forces have killed over 1,000 Palestinians trying to get food aid in Gaza since the US- and Israel-backed Gaza Humanitarian Foundation started operations. An officially private effort, the

GHF began operations on May 26 after Israel halted supplies into the Gaza Strip for more than two months, sparking famine warnings. GHF operations have been marred by chaotic scenes and near-daily reports of Israeli forces firing on people waiting to collect rations in the Palestinian territory, where the Israeli military is seeking to destroy Hamas. "Over 1,000 Palestinians have now been killed by the Israeli military while trying to get food in Gaza since the Gaza Humanitarian Foundation started operating," UN human rights office spokesman Thameen Al-Kheetan told AFP.

"As of July 21, we have recorded 1,054 people killed in Gaza while trying to get food; 766 of them were killed in the vicinity of GHF sites and 288 near UN and other humanitarian organisations' aid convoys." Kheetan added: "Our data is based on information from multiple reliable sources on the ground, including medical teams, humanitarian and human rights organisations." The war in Gaza, sparked by Hamas's deadly attack on Israel on October 7, 2023, has created dire humanitarian conditions for the more than two million people who live in the coastal territory. Gaza's population faces severe

shortages of food and other essentials. GHF says it has distributed more than 1.4 million boxes of food-stuffs to date. "We're adjusting our operations in real time to keep people safe and informed, and we stand ready to partner with other organisations to scale up and deliver more meals to the people of Gaza," GHF interim director John Acree said Monday. The United Nations and major aid groups have refused to cooperate with the GHF over concerns it was designed to cater to Israeli military objectives and violates basic humanitarian principles.

Gaza hospital says 21 children died from
malnutrition and starvation in 72 hours

The head of Al-Shifa hospital in Gaza City said yesterday that 21 children had died across the Palestinian territory in the past three days "due to malnutrition and starvation". "These deaths were recorded at hospitals in Gaza, including Al-Shifa in Gaza City, Al-Aqsa Martyrs Hospital in Deir el-Balah and Nasser Hospital in Khan Yunis... over the past 72 hours," Mohammed Abu Salmiya told reporters. UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres warned on Monday evening that "the last lifelines keeping people alive are collaps-

ing" in Gaza, and that there were growing reports of children and adults with malnutrition. Abu Salmiya told reporters that new cases of malnutrition and starvation were arriving at Gaza's remaining functioning hospitals "every moment". After talks to extend a six-week ceasefire broke down, Israel imposed a full blockade on Gaza on March 2 this year, allowing nothing in until trucks were again permitted at a trickle in late May. But stocks accumulated during the ceasefire gradually depleted, leaving the territory's more than two million inhabitants experiencing the worst shortages since the start of the war in October 2023.

'Extremely high' risk of serious Gaza abuses

The United Nations warned yesterday that Israel's expanded operations in central Gaza created an "extremely high" risk of serious international law violations.

It also cautioned that permanently displacing Gaza's population would be a war crime and possibly a crime against humanity.

"These Israeli airstrikes and ground operations will invariably lead to further civilian deaths and destruction of civilian infrastructure," UN rights chief Volker Turk said in a statement.

"Given the concentration of civilians in the area, and the means and methods of warfare employed by Israel until now, the risks of unlawful killings and other serious violations of international humanitarian law are extremely high."

Deir el-Balah came under intense shelling on Monday, a day after Israel's military ordered residents to leave, warning of

imminent action in an area where it had not previously operated.

Between 50,000 and 80,000 people were in the area when the evacuation order was issued, according to initial estimates from the UN's humanitarian agency OCHA.

"The latest Israeli displacement orders, followed by intensive attacks on southwestern Deir el-Balah... have added more misery to the suffering of hungry Palestinians," Turk said. "It seemed the nightmare couldn't possibly get worse. And yet it does."

The UN high commissioner for human rights highlighted that the area targeted by the latest attacks was "also home to several humanitarian organisations, including clinics, other medical facilities, shelters, a community kitchen, guesthouses, warehouses and other critical infrastructure."

At the same time, he pointed out that "homes have already been destroyed, and thousands have been forced to flee the area

again".

"Their only choice is to go to the ever-shrinking areas of Gaza where hundreds of thousands are being forced to gather, rendering difficult any attempt to deliver humanitarian assistance," he said, stressing that "even these areas are not safe".

"I remind Israel that permanently displacing people living under its occupation would amount to unlawful transfer, which is a war crime, and in certain circumstances, may also amount to a crime against humanity."

Turk stressed that "Israel, as the occupying power, must ensure food, medical and other supplies are provided for the population".

"And instead of launching round upon round of new military attacks, there must be an immediate end to the killings, destruction and the wide scale violations of international law," he insisted.

"More and more countries are joining the calls to shake us out of this nightmare."

ISRO to launch NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar satellite on July 30

The Indian Space Research Organisation on Monday said that it will launch the NISAR, the first joint Earth observation satellite by ISRO and NASA, from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh on July 30 at 17:40 IST.

According to ISRO, the launch of the NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar (NISAR) satellite will mark a milestone in over a decade of collaboration between the two space agencies.

Additionally, ISRO stated that the satellite would provide high-resolution, day-and-night, all-weather data by scanning the entire world every 12 days, identifying minute variations in the Earth's surface, such as vegetation dynamics, ice sheet shifts, and ground deformation.

"On July 30, 2025 at 17:40 IST, ISRO's GSLV-F16 will launch NISAR, the first joint Earth observation satellite by ISRO & NASA, from Sriharikota. NISAR will scan the entire globe every 12 days, providing high-resolution, all-weather, day-and-night data. It can detect even subtle changes in Earth's surface--like ground deformation, ice sheet shifts, and vegetation dynamics," ISRO stated in a post on X.

"The mission will support many critical applications, including sea ice monitoring, ship detection, storm tracking, soil moisture changes, surface water mapping, and disaster response. A milestone in over a decade of collaboration between ISRO & NASA/JPL," it added.

2,392 kg

According to ISRO, the NISAR satellite, weighing 2,392 kg, will be injected into a 743 km Sun-synchronous orbit with an inclination of 98.40 degrees.

Equipped with dual-frequency Synthetic Aperture Radar--NASA's L-band and ISRO's S-band--NISAR features a 12-metre unfurlable mesh reflector antenna integrated into ISRO's modified I3K sat-

ellite bus. Utilising SweepSAR technology for the first time, the satellite will offer a 242 km swath with high spatial resolution, enabling comprehensive Earth observation.

"NISAR, weighing 2392 kg, is a unique Earth observation satellite and the first satellite to observe the Earth with a dual-frequency Synthetic Aperture Radar (NASA's L-band and ISRO's S-band), both using NASA's 12m unfurlable mesh reflector antenna, integrated to ISRO's modified I3K satellite bus. NISAR will observe Earth with a swath of 242 km and high spatial resolution, using SweepSAR technology for the first time," ISRO stated in a press release.

NISAR's ability to provide high-resolution, all-weather data every 12 days will support critical applications, from tracking climate change impacts to aiding disaster management.

"The satellite will scan the entire globe and provide all weather, day & night data at 12-day interval and enable a wide range of applications. NISAR can detect even small changes in the Earth's surface, such as ground deformation, ice sheet movement and vegetation dynamics. Further applications include sea ice classification, ship detection, shoreline monitoring, storm characterisation, changes in soil moisture, mapping & monitoring of surface water resources and disaster response," the release added.



NISAR will be the first satellite to use dual-frequency synthetic aperture radar (SAR) - operating in both L-band and S-band - to observe and measure changes on Earth's surface with unmatched precision.

Chinese state hackers targeting Microsoft

Chinese state-sponsored hackers are actively exploiting critical security vulnerabilities in users of Microsoft's popular SharePoint servers to steal sensitive data and deploy malicious code, the US tech giant warned Tuesday.

Microsoft said it has observed three threat groups -- dubbed Linen Typhoon, Violet Typhoon, and Storm-2603 -- targeting internet-facing SharePoint servers using two newly disclosed vulnerabilities that allow attackers to bypass



authentication and execute remote code.

SharePoint Server is Microsoft's collaboration and document management platform designed for businesses and organizations.

Many large organizations use SharePoint as their primary platform for internal collaboration and for storing documents, and is appreciated for working well with other Microsoft products like Office,

Teams, and Outlook.

The attacks, which Microsoft said began as early as July 7, affect only on-premises SharePoint installations and do not impact the cloud-based SharePoint Online service, the company said in a security bulletin.

Microsoft warned that it "assesses with high confidence" that the threat actors will continue their assault against vulnerable systems where companies haven't taken the necessary precautions.

The vulnerabilities allow attackers to spoof authentication credentials and execute malicious code remotely on vulnerable servers.

Microsoft has released comprehensive security updates to address the malware and urged customers to apply the patches immediately.

US to leave UNESCO, citing anti-Israel bias

UNESCO called the US departure -- which it said will take effect in December 2026 -- regrettable

The United States said yesterday it would quit UNESCO, saying the UN cultural and education agency, best known for establishing world heritage sites, is biased against Israel and promotes "divisive" causes.

President Donald Trump had already ordered withdrawal from the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation once before, in



2017 during his first term. President Joe Biden then reestablished US membership.

"Continued involvement in UNESCO is not in the national interest of the United States," State Department spokeswoman Tammy Bruce said.

UNESCO called the US departure -- which it said will take effect in December 2026 -- regrettable, but unsurprising, and said its financial impact would be limited.

"I deeply regret President Donald Trump's de-

cision to once again withdraw the United States of America from UNESCO," Director-General Audrey Azoulay said, adding the move contradicted fundamental principles of multilateralism.

"However regrettable, this announcement was expected, and UNESCO has prepared for it," she said.

In recent years, Azoulay said, UNESCO had "undertaken major structural reforms and diversified our funding sources", including with private and voluntary governmental contributions.

The US share of UNESCO's total budget currently stands at eight percent, she said. This compares to an estimate of nearly 20 percent a decade ago, according to a UNESCO source who asked not to be named.

No staff redundancies were planned, Azoulay said.

Bruce described UNESCO as working "to advance divisive social and cultural causes" and being overly focused on UN sustainability goals, which she

described as a "globalist, ideological agenda".

'Same as seven years ago'

Bruce also highlighted what she said was the body's anti-Israeli position in admitting Palestine as a state.

"UNESCO's decision to admit the 'State of Palestine' as a member state is highly problematic, contrary to US policy, and contributed to the proliferation of anti-Israel rhetoric within the organisation," Bruce said.

The administration has also objected to UNESCO's recognition of heritage sites in the occupied West Bank and east Jerusalem as Palestinian.

Azoulay said the reasons put forward by the United States "are the same as seven years ago" although, she said, "the situation has changed profoundly, political tensions have receded, and UNESCO today constitutes a rare forum for consensus on concrete and action-oriented multilateralism".

Washington's claims "contra-

dict the reality of UNESCO's efforts", she added, "especially in the field of Holocaust education and the fight against antisemitism".

The source at UNESCO described the US move as "purely political, without any real factual base".

The organisation had already been "forced" to do without US money for several years after their departure in 2017, the source told AFP.

UNESCO adapted but new sources of funding would still need to be found, the source said.

'Always welcome'

Israeli Foreign Minister Gideon Sa'ar welcomed on X the US decision: "This is a necessary step, designed to promote justice and Israel's right for fair treatment in the UN system."

"The United Nations requires fundamental reforms in order to remain relevant," he said.

Israel's ambassador to the United Nations, Danny Danon,

called UNESCO "an organisation that has lost its way" and praised the US for demonstrating "moral clarity in the international arena".

French President Emmanuel Macron said on X that UNESCO had his "unwavering support" that would not weaken after the US departure.

The UN organisation describes its mission as promoting education, scientific cooperation and cultural understanding.

It oversees a list of heritage sites aimed at preserving unique environmental and architectural gems, ranging from Australia's Great Barrier Reef and the Serengeti in Tanzania to the Acropolis of Athens and Pyramids of Egypt.

Twenty-six world heritage sites are located in the United States.

The UNESCO source said that the United States will continue to be represented on the world heritage committee even after leaving the organisation formally, just as it had in 2017

Extreme weather misinformation 'putting lives at risk,' study warns

● Nearly all of the analyzed posts on Meta-owned Facebook and Instagram lacked fact-checks or Community Notes

Major social media platforms are enabling and profiting from misinformation around extreme weather events, endangering lives and impeding emergency response efforts, a research group said yesterday.

The report from the Center for Countering Digital Hate (CCDH) -- which analyzed 100 viral posts on each of three leading platforms during recent natural disasters including deadly Texas floods -- highlights how their algorithms amplify conspiracy theorists while sidelining life-saving information.

"The influence of high-profile conspiracy theorists during climate disasters is drowning out emergency response efforts," the report said, adding that the trend was "putting lives at risk."

Nearly all of the analyzed posts on Meta-owned Facebook and Instagram lacked fact-checks or Community Notes, a crowd-sourced verification system increasingly being adopted as an alternative to professional fact-checkers, the report said.



Elon Musk-owned X lacked fact-checks or Community Notes on 99% of the posts, while Google-owned YouTube "failed entirely," with zero fact-checks or Community Notes, CCDH said.

The report noted that well-known conspiracy theorist Alex Jones's false claims during the LA wildfires amassed more views on X throughout January than the combined reach of major emergency response agencies and news outlets, including the Los Angeles Times.

"The rapid spread of climate conspiracies online isn't accidental. It's baked into a business

model that profits from outrage and division," said Imran Ahmed, CCDH's chief executive.

During the wildfires, online scammers placed social media advertisements impersonating federal emergency aid agencies to steal victims' personal information, Ahmed said, citing local officials. "When distraught people can't distinguish real help from online deception, platforms become complicit in the suffering of innocent people," he said.

The tech platforms did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

'Dangerous' falsehoods

Following natural disasters, misinformation tends to surge across social media -- fueled by accounts from across the political spectrum -- as many platforms scale back content moderation and reduce reliance on human fact-checkers, often accused by conservative advocates of a liberal bias.

During Hurricane Milton, which struck Florida last year, social media was flooded with baseless claims that the storm had been engineered by politicians using weather manipulation.

Similarly, the LA wildfires were falsely blamed on so-called "government lasers," a conspiracy theory amplified by viral posts.

Augustus Doricko, chief executive of cloud seeding company Rainmaker, said he received death threats online after conspiracy theorists blamed him for the devastating floods in Texas.

The CCDH study found that the worst offenders spreading extreme weather misinformation were verified users with large followings, many of whom were attempting to monetize their posts.

Eighty eight percent of misleading extreme weather posts on X came from verified accounts, CCDH said. On YouTube, 73% of such posts originated from verified users, while on Meta, the figure was 64%.

Trump says confident US to reach Philippines trade deal

US President Donald Trump voiced confidence Tuesday at reaching a trade deal with the Philippines to ease his threatened tariffs as he welcomed his counterpart Ferdinand Marcos to the White House.

"We're very close to finishing a trade deal. A big trade deal, actually," Trump said as he met Marcos in the Oval Office. "He's a very tough negotiator. So far we're not there because he's negotiating too tough," Trump said.

But Trump, in response to questions, said he believed the two countries would ultimately reach an agreement.

"We'll probably agree on something," Trump said.

The Philippines, a former US colony and longtime ally, was among countries confronted by Trump with letters this

month warning of 20 percent tariffs on all their goods coming into the United States as of August 1 -- up from a previous threat of 17 percent.

The trade rift comes despite increasingly close defense relations between the United States and the Philippines, which has seen high tensions with China.

The United States last year under former president Joe Biden deployed ground-launched missiles in the Philippines. Washington has also eyed ammunition manufacturing in the Philippines, despite the closure in 1992 of the US naval base at Subic Bay due to heavy public pressure.

"All of what we consider part of the modernization of the Philippine military is really a response to the circumstances that surround the situation in the South China Sea," Marcos said.

The 60-year-old And Just Like That actress now has children James, 22, and 16-year-old twins Tabitha and Marion with husband Matthew Broderick.


Sarah recently admitted she thinks not being a "Hollywood couple" has helped her marriage.





our fans were looking forward to watching him," tournament director Karl Hale said.

"Although he has been on the scene for a while, he's still at the beginning of his career and there will be plenty of opportunities for Canadians to see him again in the future."

India weigh Bumrah fitness gamble

India risk Bumrah's fitness as England aim to clinch series at Old Trafford

- **Bumrah fitness decision crucial for India**
- **India trail 2-1 in five-Test series**

India must make a crucial call on the fitness of star pace bowler Jasprit Bumrah for the fourth Test against England at Old Trafford. England can clinch the series with a victory in Manchester but they have top order questions to resolve, while Ben Stokes and Ravindra Jadeja will be looking to repeat their third Test exploits. Here we look at three talking points ahead of the first day of the Test on Wednesday: **India weigh up Bumrah decision** Trailing 2-1 in the five-match series after their painful 22-run



loss at Lord's, India cannot afford other defeat if they are to win a Test trip to England for the first time since 2007. That perilous position has increased the pressure to make the right decision on the fitness of Bumrah. India coach Gautam Gambhir made it clear at the start of the series that Bumrah would only be available for three matches due to a nagging back injury. Bumrah, 31, played in the first and third Tests against England, with India losing both matches, and missed the second game, which the tourists won. If India opt to use the world's top ranked Test bowler in Manchester, it would likely rule him out of a potential series decider in the fifth Test. "We know we have got him for one of the last two Tests. It's pretty obvious that the series is on the line now in Manchester so there will be a leaning towards playing him," Gambhir's assistant Ryan

ten Doeschate said. The need to play Bumrah at Old Trafford has been heightened by injuries to India all-rounder Nitish Kumar Reddy and seamer Arshdeep Singh. **England's brittle top order** England may be within touching distance of winning the series, but questions about their fragile top order remain unsolved. Polarising opener Zak Crawley could only muster scores of 18 and 22 at Lord's. Ollie Pope, filling the number three spot, reached 44 in the

first innings but perished for just four in the second, while Crawley's opening partner Ben Duckett was dismissed for 23 and 12. England must decide whether to keep faith with Crawley, whose international career has been filled with highs and lows. Scores of 267 against Pakistan and 189 against Australia showcased Crawley's ability, but the 27-year-old's frustrating habit of surrendering his wicket cheaply has led to calls for a change at the top of the line-up. However, England have backed Crawley and Duckett to the hilt, and captain Stokes said: "They complement each other. Left-hand, right-hand. "One is a giant, one is not. It is very hard for bowlers to settle in." **Jadeja v Stokes** After England's Stokes rose to the occasion at Lord's and Jadeja nearly delivered a match-winning innings for India, the all-rounders will carry hefty expectations in Manchester. Stokes led by example in England's third Test triumph, scoring 77 runs in two innings, taking five wickets and producing a vital run-out of Rishabh Pant. Significantly, Stokes was able to push his body through 44 overs, including spells of 9.2 and 10 overs on the dramatic final day. Now 34, that was the most he has bowled in over six years after being plagued by injuries. "It was an incredible effort to be able to do that, but that's just how he's built, I guess. He's just desperate to be the man and make things happen," England batsman Joe Root said. Age was no barrier for the 36-year-old Jadeja either as he kept India in the Lord's Test until the last moments. Now an elder statesman of the team after the Test retirements of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma, Jadeja's gritty 61 not out from 181 balls took the tourists within a whisker of their 193-run target. He also scored 72 in the first innings and made 89 and 69 in the second Test at Edgbaston. "I always felt he has the ability to take pressure. With so much of experience, he normally comes with something that the team needs in any challenging conditions. Really, really valuable to the team," India batting coach Sitanshu Kotak said.

England won't play 'nice' against India warns Brook

- **Brook defends England's aggressive approach**
- **Teams resume hostilities at Old Trafford**

England batsman Harry Brook has warned India that his team "don't always have to be nice" as they prepare to resume hostilities at Old Trafford on Wednesday. After England battled to a fiery 22-run victory in the third Test at Lord's, the teams will lock horns again with the series on the line in Manchester. England on Monday named just one change to that side with Hampshire's left-arm spinner Liam Dawson making his first Test appearance in eight years at the expense of the injured Shoaib Bashir, while Jofra Archer remains in an unchanged pace attack. An England win would put them 3-1 up with one game to play, while India must take the last two matches to secure their first Test series triumph on English soil since 2007. It promises to be another fiercely-fought encounter after India's fielders clashed with England batsmen Zak Crawley and Ben Duckett in a time-wasting row at Lord's. That lit a fire under England when it was their turn to field,

with Archer giving a pumped-up send-off to India's Rishabh Pant. As the tension mounted in England's 22-run win, Brydon Carse and India all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja were involved in a mid-pitch collision. But Brook is adamant Ben Stokes' side did not go too far with their spikey approach in pursuit of victory. "I've had a lot of compliments. Everybody said it was awesome to watch. It was good fun, I have to admit. It was tiring but it made fielding a lot more enjoyable," he said on Monday. "I think it put them under a little bit more pressure. The opportunity that arose for us to not be the nice guys was because of what they did. We just thought 'we're not standing for that'.

India pace bowler Mohammed Siraj was fined 15 per cent of his match fee and given one demerit point for his angry send-off of Duckett during England's second innings, which ended with the pair brushing shoulders.

Brook re-

vealed it was at his urging after some choice words from head coach Brendon McCullum that they decided to fight back. Asked whether that aggressive approach will continue as England look to win the series, Brook said: "God knows. We'll see whether it happens again and whether it works. "I brought it up the night before the last day: 'Baz said the other day we're too nice, I think tomorrow is a perfect opportunity to really get stuck into them'." Bashir took the final wicket at Lord's but the Somerset spinner's broken finger has opened the way for Dawson's Test recall. The 35-year-old, who has starred in county action for Hampshire leapfrogging the centrally-contracted Jack Leach as the replacement for Bashir, played the last of his three Tests in 2017. He was a member of England's ODI World Cup winning squad in 2019 and was recalled to the T20 side against the West Indies in June. Apart from his bowling Dawson is a more than handy lower order batter with 18 first-class hundreds and an average of just over 35. "He is a wily, old fox, very experienced and a very skilful cricketer," Brook said. "He's willing to always fight for the team, he's very competitive and it's good to have him here."

Cameroon winger Bryan Mbeumo said he "grew up wearing" the Manchester United shirt on Monday after joining the club from Brentford on a deal until 2030, with an option for a further year. Mbeumo, 25, will reportedly cost the 20-time Premier League champions an initial £65 million (\$87 million) having scored 20 goals in 38 league games last season for the Bees. Tottenham, now managed by former Brentford boss Thomas Frank, were also chasing the France-born attacker before United's improved offer sealed the move. United's third bid, worth an initial £65m with £6m in additions, was accepted last week. "As soon as I knew there was a chance to join Manchester United, I had to take the opportunity to sign for the club of my dreams," Mbeumo said in a United statement. "The team whose shirt I wore growing up. "This is

a massive club, with an incredible stadium and amazing fans, we are all really determined to challenge for the biggest trophies," he added. United coach Ruben Amorim has signed two other players during this summer in an attempt to avoid a repeat of last season's catastrophic display. They lost to Tottenham in the Europa League final and a 15th-place finish in the top flight was their lowest since 1973-74. Wolves forward Matheus Cunha and teenage Paraguayan defender Diego Leon have also moved to Old Trafford.

Red streak continues

Undefeated Bahrain face Kuwait tonight as the WAVA Championship enters the knockout stage

The Bahraini juggernaut rolled through the group stage, untouched and unbothered. Their latest display on Monday, which was a 3-0 sweep of the UAE (25-15, 25-15, 25-18) on the final day of preliminary play, sealed their place atop Pool A and set the tone for today's quarter-finals at the WAVA Men's Volleyball Championship.

Led by head coach Arnaud Josserand, "Al Ahmar" once again showed why they've become the tournament's team to beat. By the second set, Bahrain were already rotating freely — not to recover, but to reassert dominance with fresh legs and fresh angles.

Three players — Mohamed Anan, Mohamed Yaqoob, and Mohamed Jassim — shared top-scoring honors with eight points apiece. The UAE's offensive threat, led by Mohamed Al Suwaidi (8 points), never truly sparked, as Bahrain's block-and-serve game smothered their rhythm from start to finish.

Complete Team Display

It wasn't just the scoreline that told the story. Bahrain posted 75 total points to UAE's 48, with a 6-0 ace serve advantage and twice as many blocks (6-2). Even the French Ambassador to Bahrain, Éric Giraud-Telme, made his appreciation known as he was seen applauding court-side and shaking hands with Josser-

Eyes on Knockouts

"Alhamdulillah for the win," said Bahraini attacker Ali Ebrahim post-match. "The prelims are done, and now we focus on the knockouts. With all respect to our opponents, this was our toughest game so far because the UAE's level is high. But we stayed calm and got it done."

Now, with the group stage wrapped, all eight teams march into tonight's quarter-finals. For Bahrain, the path to gold begins just the way they wanted.

Elsewhere in the championship

Jordan finally broke through with their first win of the tournament, beating Lebanon 3-1 with set scores of 25-20, 31-29,

19-25, and 25-17. Captain Hassan and Waleed's tactical guidance helped shore up the serve game, while Mahmoud Al Naqib starred with 18 points. Lebanon's Paul Bou Akl led all scorers with 19 points in a losing cause. Jordan now sit third in Pool A with three points; Lebanon remain winless.

"We were able to be at our best," said Al Naqib. "Our level keeps improving. This was a team win, and InshAllah we continue to raise the heads of Jordanians in this tournament."

Saudi Arabia found form at just the right time, picking up their first win in a tight match

against Oman. They won 3-0 with scores of 25-22, 25-23, and 28-26. Middle blocker Waleed Al Otaibi's standout blocking made the difference, as the Saudis recorded 12 blocks. Mohammad Adel (18 points) and Marwan Hawsawi (16 points) fueled the offense.

"It was a tough game," Hawsawi said. "But we found a way. The best is yet to come."

Qatar extinguished Kuwait's comeback hopes in a five-set thriller to top Pool B with 8 points. The match ended 3-2 in Qatar's favor, with set scores of 25-12, 23-25, 25-17, 22-25, and 15-11. Bilal Abu Naboot was immense, racking up 20 points including a staggering 11 blocks. Despite a solid effort from Rashid Anbar and the rest of Kuwait's squad, Qatar survived the scare and held firm in the final set.

"Three games in three days is not easy," said Qatar's Abdulrahman Bakri. "We stayed focused, and our goal hasn't changed because every match is a step toward the championship."

Paret-Peintre delivers Tour de France home win in Mont Ventoux thriller

● **Pogacar extended overall lead**

● **Vingegaard attacked relentlessly**

Valentin Paret-Peintre bagged a first home win on an enthralling stage 16 of the Tour de France yesterday pipping Ireland's Ben Healy atop the 1910m altitude Mont Ventoux finish line.

Behind them Jonas Vingegaard attacked overall leader Tadej Pogacar relentlessly but the defending champion tracked the

Dane all the way up the 15km ascent to extend his lead by two seconds.

Trailing by 4min 13sec at the start of this stage Vingegaard attacked with 9km to climb on Mont Ventoux, whose eery upper reaches resemble a lunar landscape

They were eclipsed, however, by a frantic fight for the line and the stage win between EF's Healy and Soudal Quick-Step's Paret-Peintre who relieved home hopes on a Tour raced entirely on French soil.

Vingegaard and his Visma team did everything they could to hurt the Team UAE leader Pogacar, but the 26-year-old resisted all they threw at him despite being isolated from his team-

lore after epic past battles.

Chris Froome ran part of the way up during a frantic wait for mechanical assistance, while even the great Eddy Merckx once needed oxygen at the summit.

Tom Simpson died here in 1967 after collapsing on a baking climb but asking to be helped back onto the saddle.

Stage 17 should be one for the sprinters as Tim Merlier hopes to add to his two stage wins and current green jersey Jonathan Milan also targets a second win at the 700m straight run to the finish line at Valence.

The weather however could rewrite the script with 50kph winds forecast along the 170km run.
