King Faisal Highway project tender launched

Electric bus pilot approved

Bahrain is accelerating its push to modernise public transport after a high-level government committee approved a pilot programme to introduce electric buses onto the Kingdom's roads—part of a broader infrastructure agenda that stretches from new interchanges to a dedicated marine cargo berth.

The Ministerial Committee on Development Projects and Infrastructure, chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Shaikh Khalid bin Abdulla Al Khalifa at its 312th meeting, renewed the operating concession

of the Bahrain Public Transport Company until 2030, while simultaneously approving the phased introduction of electric buses—two vehicles initially this year, scaling to 35 by the decade's end.

In a separate directive, the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications was tasked with establishing a new marine berth designed to receive construction material shipments, a move expected to ease pressure on existing port facilities as major development projects continue to ramp up across the island.

On the roads, the committee

instructed the Ministry of Works to open the northern Isa Town Interchange Bridge to traffic within days. The 840-metre dual bridge is now structurally complete, though wider project works remain ongoing on schedule.

A public tender has been launched for the King Faisal Highway Development Project—a 4.1-kilometre corridor stretching from Al Farooq Junction to Al Fateh Junction. The scheme involves road widening and constructing multi-level interchanges aimed at relieving chronic congestion along one of the capital's key arterial routes.

900 ships, 450m barrels moved since May, says CENTCOM

The US Central Command (CENTCOM) has carried out its 11th consecutive evening of strikes against Iran, targeting facilities linked to Tehran's military operations and maritime capabilities.

CENTCOM said its forces struck Iranian military operations centres, maritime infrastructure, aircraft hangars, drone storage facilities and military logistics sites as part of efforts to reduce Iran's ability to threaten commercial shipping in the strategic Strait of Hormuz.

The command said Iran has attacked more than 30 commercial vessels travelling through the vital international waterway over the past three months, putting hundreds of mariners

at risk and affecting freedom of navigation.

Despite the reported attacks, CENTCOM stated that the Strait of Hormuz remains open to commercial shipping, with its forces supporting the safe passage of around 900 commercial vessels and the transit of approximately 450 million barrels of crude oil since early May.

Shaikh Ahmed praised the officer's vigilance, professionalism and quick action, saying his efforts reflected the readiness and commitment of customs personnel in protecting society and national security.

Kingdom Expresses Solidarity With India

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Delivery App Fee Cap Proposed

MP seeks legal framework to curb high commissions and protect small businesses

A proposal to cap the cut taken by food delivery apps has been put forward after claims that fees of up to 30% are squeezing small firms and driving up prices for customers.

MP Jaleela Alawi submitted the parliamentary plan, which calls for new rules to govern delivery apps and shield small, medium-sized and micro businesses from excessive charges. It urges the government to draw up a full legal framework for the sector, covering commissions, contracts and complaints.

The plan calls for curbs on the sums taken from restaurants, cafés and shops, along with a study into a fixed ceiling on commissions or another form of price control. Apps would have to tell traders about every fee, commission and method of calculation before any deal is signed. Contracts containing unfair terms or clauses that curb fair competition would also be banned.

A watchdog would hear complaints from businesses, look into claims of unfair conduct and have the power



to step in and take action.

Alawi said delivery apps had become a key route to market for restaurants, cafés and shops as growing numbers of customers order meals and goods through their phones. But business owners say some firms take between 25% and 30% from each order. For small traders working on thin margins, that can strip away much of their earnings.

The proposal warned that steep fees leave firms with less cash to hire staff, invest or grow. Some raise menu prices to cover the cost, passing the bill on to customers.

Many businesses now rely heavily on the apps to reach buyers, leaving them with little bargaining power and few choices when faced with costly terms. Alawi said the proposal was not aimed at holding back the digital

economy or stopping delivery firms from making money. She said app firms should earn a fair sum for linking traders with customers and handling orders and deliveries.

But small firms must also be able to keep enough of each sale to stay open, grow and compete. The proposal said clear rules would curb unfair fees, protect local firms and help keep prices in check.

Energy Efficiency

Gulf Security Tied to Global Tensions

Derasat CEO Speaks at Cambridge Gulf Research Meeting

Regional security concerns took centre stage as Abdulla Mohamed Al Ahmed, CEO of Bahrain’s Derasat think tank, addressed the 16th Gulf Research Meeting at Cambridge University, warning that Gulf security cannot be separated from wider global instability.

Around 50 policymakers and experts from the Gulf, Europe and Asia attended the closed-door event. Al Ahmed told a high-level roundtable that recent geopolitical shocks had tested – and proven – GCC defence systems and partnerships. He called for deeper cooperation, including joint defence industries and shared investment in research and technology.

In a separate opening panel on how conflicts strain Gulf



societies, Al Ahmed said disruptions to shipping lanes and supply chains exposed vulnerabilities, making Gulf unity essential to keeping goods flowing.

He urged Gulf states to shift from reacting to crises toward early preparedness – stronger logistics networks, early-warning systems, and follow-through on commitments made at the Extraordinary Jeddah Summit to shore up regional stability.

Shura Member Urges Asian Parliaments to Condemn Iranian Attacks

Bahrain official calls for firm stance at ASEAN assembly

Talal Mohammed Al Mannai, Deputy Chairman of the Shura Council’s Services Committee, called on Asian parliaments to adopt a unified stance rejecting Iranian attacks on infrastructure and civilian facilities, and to condemn interference in the internal affairs of states.

He spoke during the 17th Meeting of the ASEAN Inter-Parliamentary Assembly, held online under the theme of parliaments’ role in tackling global challenges. Bahrain’s delegation was led by Ahmed Abdulwahid Qarata, First Dep-

uty Speaker of the Council of Representatives.

Al Mannai said parliamentary diplomacy should build consensus around sovereignty and international law. He linked Bahrain’s approach to peace, dialogue and coexistence to the vision of King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, citing the Bahrain Declaration and the King Hamad Global Centre for Peaceful Coexistence.

He accused Iran of interference and attacks using missiles and drones against Bahrain and regional states, endangering civilians. He said actions affecting shipping in the Strait of Hormuz violate the UN Con-

vention on the Law of the Sea, threatening global maritime security.

Bahrain Joins UN Push to Halve Road Deaths by 2030

Kingdom cites 50% drop in traffic accidents, calls for global cooperation

Bahrain participated in a United Nations General Assembly meeting in New York focused on improving global road safety, held under the theme of cutting road traffic deaths and injuries in half by 2030.

Major Hamad Khalil Al Mair, Security Attaché at Bahrain’s Embassy in the US, outlined the Kingdom’s road safety initiatives. He said the country’s strategy, led by the Traffic Council under Interior Minister General Shaikh Rashid bin Abdullah Al Khalifa, centers on stricter law enforcement, improved road infrastructure, public awareness campaigns, and community partnerships.

Al Mair said these measures have helped reduce traffic acci-

dents by 50%. He also praised the Bahrain Motor Federation for advancing motorsport safety standards and creating safer conditions for young drivers.

He expressed hope the UN meeting would boost international cooperation and expertise-sharing to reduce road deaths and injuries worldwide.

Robots to dispense medication at Salmaniya pharmacy

Health Minister tours automation project bringing smart medicine tracking

Salmaniya Medical Complex is installing robots to dispense medication at its outpatient pharmacy, along with automated medicine dispensing cabinets in hospital wards and smart systems to manage and monitor the hospital's medicine stock, as part of a pharmacy automation project now under way. Health Minister Dr Jaleela bint Al Sayed Jawad Hasan toured the project, accompanied by Government Hospitals Chief Executive Officer Dr Mariam Athbi Al Jalahma and several officials, to review its progress and implementation phases. The visit was part of efforts to develop pharmaceutical services and strengthen digital transformation across the health sector.

During the tour, the minister was briefed on the project's components, which aim to build advanced infrastructure supporting the latest automation technologies in pharmacy services, and praised the efforts made to develop health services in line with the latest global techniques. Dr. Al Jalahma said the pharmacy automation project supports the health sector's development drive by reflecting a broader move toward adopting modern technology and innovation. This will strengthen health service efficiency, improve patient care quality, and achieve the highest levels of safety and operational efficiency. She said the project would raise the efficiency and speed of dispensing services, improve inventory management accuracy, and strengthen governance and



oversight over medicine movement, helping ensure optimal resource use while supporting patient safety and care quality. She added that the project is part of Government Hospitals' strategy to modernise pharmaceutical infrastructure and adopt digital solutions that support the continued development of the working environment and improve the patient experience. She described it as a step that will mark a qualitative shift in medicine management and dispensing.

Maintenance work at Souq Al Shaabi in Isa Town restored most of the market's lighting after the issue was raised in local media, though Southern Municipal Council member Mubarak Faraj says seven floodlights near the Ramez Mall complex remain out of service. Faraj, who represents the second southern constituency, said the market's surveillance cameras remain out of service, with more than a year having passed without repairs. He called for urgent maintenance and reactivation of the system, citing its role in strengthening security and protecting vendors and shoppers.

Garage Ordered to Pay for Car Fire

BD2,615 Awarded to Vehicle Owner

High Civil Appeals Court has upheld a ruling ordering a car repair garage to pay BD2,615 in compensation to a Bahraini woman after her vehicle caught fire due to faulty repair work. The woman had taken her car to the garage to fix an engine overheating problem. Two days after collecting the repaired vehicle, it caught fire. A technical expert found the blaze was caused by technicians incorrectly reinstalling the fuel pressure regulator without replacing sealing rings, resulting in a fuel leak that ignited on hot engine components. The fire destroyed the en-

gine, transmission, electrical systems and front body, leaving the vehicle beyond repair. The court also held the garage's manager responsible for the negligence and confirmed the compensation after finding a direct link between the repair error and the fire.

Suspect Sent for Psychiatric Evaluation

Appeal Court Orders Mental Assessment

Fifth High Criminal Court of Appeal ordered a psychiatric evaluation of a Bahraini man convicted of fraud after he used a replacement SIM card to access a businessman's Benefit account and steal BD2,490. The 36-year-old was previously sentenced to three years in prison and fined BD3,000. Prosecutors said he exploited a limited power of attorney while the victim was abroad to

obtain a replacement SIM card linked to the businessman's phone number. He used verification codes received on the SIM to access the victim's bank accounts and transfer BD2,490 to his own account and his daughter's account. The appeal court ordered the psychiatric assessment to determine whether the defendant was criminally responsible for his actions before proceeding further.

India, Moldova discuss UNSC reforms, fight against terror

The President held bilateral discussions with her Moldovan counterpart Maia Sandu.

INDIA AND Moldova discussed reforms of multilateral organisations, including the UN Security Council, and cooperation in the fight against terrorism, as President Droupadi Murmu landed in Chisinau on her state visit to the country. Murmu is the first Indian head of state to visit the landlocked Eastern European country since the establishment of diplomatic relations in 1992.

The President held bilateral discussions with her Moldovan counterpart Maia Sandu, where the two leaders explored new avenues of cooperation in trade and investment, digital transformation, information technology, healthcare, pharmaceuticals, agriculture, education, culture and capacity building, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).

Briefing the media, MEA's Secretary (West) Sibi George said, "They also discussed cooperation in (the) fight against terrorism. Both sides discussed (the) importance of reforms of multilateral organisations, including the UNSC."

As a special gesture of friendship, Murmu presented a bust of Mahatma Gandhi to President Sandu. The President laid a wreath at the Monument of Stefan cel Mare

si Sfânt (Stephen the Great), paying tribute to one of Moldova's most revered national figures.

As part of her day-long visit, Murmu met Igor Grosu, speaker of the Moldovan parliament, and interacted with members of the India-Moldova Parliamentary Friendship Group.

Later, both Presidents jointly addressed the India-Moldova Business Forum, which brought together leading business representatives from both countries to explore fresh opportunities in trade, investment, innovation and technology.

Both countries are also exploring cooperation in digital public infrastructure, innovation, food processing, logistics and skills development, creating significant potential for mutually beneficial investment, employment and sustainable growth, the MEA official added.

The business delegation from India comprises around 20 members across various sectors including agritech, IT, consulting, defence, e-commerce, exports, engineering, construction, hospitality, human resource, manufacturing, pharmaceutical and healthcare. Around 2,000 Indian students are currently pursuing higher education in Moldova, particularly medical studies. Murmu also invited President Sandu to visit India at a mutually convenient date.

Trump vows tit-for-tat strikes on Iran power plants

President Donald Trump yesterday pledged that the United States would bomb Iranian civil infrastructure every time Tehran fires at ships in the strategic Strait of Hormuz.

"From this point forward, any time the Islamic Republic of Iran shoots at a ship in the Strait of Hormuz, whether it be by Missile, Rocket, Drone, or any other device or weapon, the United States will bomb and destroy ONE BRIDGE OR POWER PLANT," he wrote on his Truth Social network.

Trump said this included Iranian facilities "located next to, or in, the Capital City of Tehran."

Trump's threat came shortly before he headed to an airbase for the return of the remains of three US troops killed in Iranian attacks on American military facilities in the Gulf.

US plans to announce nuclear agreement with Saudi: media

The United States plans to announce a landmark deal with Saudi Arabia that would help establish a civilian nuclear programme in the kingdom, according to media reports.

The New York Times, citing two unidentified US officials, reported on Tuesday that the Trump administration planned to formally sign and announce the deal with the Saudis.

President Donald Trump's administration said the agreement would provide billions of dollars for the US nuclear industry.

A provision in the 30-year deal would potentially see US companies build a uranium enrichment facility in Saudi Arabia, the Wall Street Journal reported.

The deal is expected to be submitted to Congress in the coming days, but its approval is not required for it to go through.

The United States signed a nuclear agreement with the kingdom's neighbor the United Arab Emirates in 2009, although the country does not enrich its own uranium.

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio declined to confirm the Saudi Arabia deal in Manila on Wednesday, deferring to the White House, but dismissed fears it could lead to nuclear proliferation.

"Suffice it to say, the US is not going to reach any agreement with any country in the world that leads to the risk of proliferation," he told reporters on the sidelines of a summit of Southeast Asian foreign ministers.

The US military said the dignified transfer service at Dover airbase in Delaware was for two service members killed in an Iranian attack on a base in Jordan and a service member killed during a controlled detonation of a drone in Iraq.

A third service member remains missing from the Jordan attack.

Trump has vowed to avenge the deaths of all US troops "many times over" and stepped up threats to target civilian infrastructure. The total number of US deaths since the start of the war is 18.

The US leader also repeated threats on Tuesday to strike what he said was a secret Iranian nuclear complex called Pickaxe Mountain. Iran denies the existence of any facility at the site, which it calls Kolang mountain.



The United States has 95 operating commercial nuclear power reactors, overseen by the US Nuclear Regulatory Commission. The fleet consists of 64 pressurised-water reactors (PWRs) and 31 boiling-water reactors (BWRs).

ing to "honor our heroes and they're indeed great heroes."

"All of them said, very strongly, that we can't let Iran have a nuclear weapon, so we're going to honor them... For me it's one of the hardest things to do as president but it has to be done."

Trump rejected polls that show the Iran war is unpopular with US voters ahead of midterm elections in November, with rising oil prices fueling a spike in the cost of living.

The war has already cost Washington \$37.5 billion.

"Americans don't want high gasoline prices but they're not against the war, that just came out loud and clear," he said.

The United States has stepped up strikes against Iran since a preliminary ceasefire deal collapsed amid fighting over the strait, carrying out 11 straight days of attacks on the Islamic republic.

Germany approves controversial French-Russian nuclear project

German authorities said yesterday they were giving the green light to a controversial French-Russian nuclear project which critics fear will enable spying and sabotage by Moscow.

The planned joint venture by a subsidiary of French company Framatome and Russia's state-owned nuclear power agency Rosatom is aimed at producing fuel rods used in Russian-designed reactors.

It will be based at Framatome's fuel rod assembly facility in the town of Lingen in the state of Lower Saxony, near the Dutch border.

Framatome's subsidiary ANF (Advanced Nuclear Fuels) applied for permission for the project in March 2022, just weeks after Russia began its full-scale invasion of Ukraine.

Happy birthday, George! UK prince becomes a teenager



London, United Kingdom

The UK's Prince George, second in line to the throne, turned 13 on Wednesday as he readied to follow in his father Prince William's footsteps and start at the prestigious Eton College.

Kensington Palace shared a picture of the prince, as his grandfather King Charles III and his wife Queen Camilla wished him "happy birthday".

As the eldest child of the heir to the British throne, Prince William, and Princess Catherine, George is set to succeed his father as king one day.

But first, he will face another daunting challenge: the terrible teens and starting at Eton boarding school in September.

According to royal commentator Richard Fitzwilliams, the young prince was being "inducted into things very gradually" and as he grows older, he would increase his public appearances.

The prince was born on July 22, 2013, at St Mary's Hospital in London to a global media frenzy and public celebrations. His full name is George Alexander Louis.

He was quickly whisked away on his first royal tour in April 2014, when his parents visited New Zealand and Australia, where the eight-month-old was seen excitedly interacting with the wildlife.

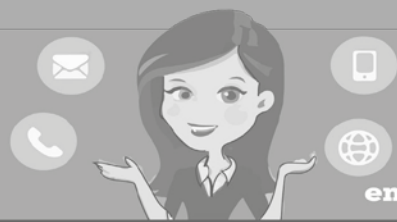

GCC Urges Firm Global Action

Secretary-General condemns Iranian attacks and Houthi threats to shipping



Gulf Co-operation Council (GCC) Secretary-General Jasem Mohamed Albudaiwi has called for immediate international accountability over what he described as Iranian attacks on GCC states and Houthi threats to close the Bab al-Mandab Strait, warning that such actions endanger global energy security, international shipping and regional stability.

Speaking at the United Nations Security Council’s high-level open debate on “Natural Resource Governance: A Driver of Peace, Security and Prosperity” in New York on Wednesday, Albudaiwi said the international community must adopt a firm stance to uphold international law, protect freedom of navigation and safeguard critical energy infrastructure.

Energy security at risk

Albudaiwi stressed that natural resources, when managed with good governance, transparency and international co-operation, promote sustainable development and prosperity. However, he warned that targeting energy infrastructure or disrupting supply routes transforms those resources into sources of conflict, threatening global economic stability and international peace.

He highlighted the GCC’s role as a reliable global energy partner, noting that the bloc holds around 30 per cent of the world’s oil reserves, nearly 20pc of global natural gas reserves, and contributes approximately one-quarter of global oil production.

The Secretary-General said GCC countries have invested resource revenues in economic diversification, renewable energy, low-emission hydrogen projects, infrastructure, innovation and human development while maintaining a balance between energy security and climate goals.

Calls for international accountability

Albudaiwi accused Iran of carrying out ballistic missile and drone attacks against GCC states and other countries since February 28, describing them as violations of international law, the UN Charter and the principles of good neighbourliness.

He urged the UN Security Council and the wider international community to fulfil their legal responsibilities by taking action to deter further attacks and preserve international peace, state sovereignty and territorial integrity.

He also said the Iranian government’s actions not only threaten neighbouring countries but also harm the Iranian people by diverting national resources away from development and public welfare.

Houthi threats condemned

The GCC chief strongly condemned recent statements by the Houthi militia threatening to close the Bab al-Mandab Strait and making what he described as false accusations against Saudi Arabia.

He said such threats represent a serious escalation, violate international law and pose a direct threat to one of the world’s most strategically important maritime routes, global trade and energy supplies.

Albudaiwi reaffirmed the GCC’s full support for Saudi Arabia’s measures to protect its sovereignty, national security and vital interests.

Young Bahrain Reds march into quarter-finals

Bahrain's junior national handball team secured their place in the quarter-finals of the 19th Asian Men's Junior Handball Championship after defeating hosts China 35-27 yesterday to finish second in Group A.

The young Bahrain side produced a strong performance from the opening whistle, taking control of the match through a disciplined defensive display and effective attacking play. Bahrain built a six-goal advantage by half-time, leading 18-12, before continuing their strong performance after the break. The team maintained their intensity in the second half, outscoring China 17-15 to complete a convincing eight-goal victory.

Abuthar Yateem led Bahrain's scoring charts with five goals, while Sayed Ahmed Alfalahi

and Mahmood Yousuf each contributed four. Sayed Majeed Al Muhafda, Abbas Ali and Ahmed Eid also played important roles with three goals apiece.

Goalkeepers Ali Almahroos and Haidar Salman combined for 13 saves, helping Bahrain maintain control during key stages of the contest. Yateem was later named the match's Most Valuable Player for his

influential performance in attack and his contribution in creating opportunities for his teammates.

The victory was Bahrain's fourth in the preliminary round, following wins over Chinese Taipei, Oman and Hong Kong. Their only defeat came against group winners Saudi Arabia, who finished top of the standings with a perfect record, while

Bahrain collected eight points to secure second place in Group A.

Head coach Husam Madan's side will now face Iran in the quarter-finals tomorrow as they continue their pursuit of a place among Asia's leading junior handball nations.

The semi-finals will take place on Saturday, setting up the gold and bronze medal matches on Monday, the tournament's concluding day. Classification matches will also be held during the final two days of the knockout stages.

The Asian championship also serves as the continental qualifier for the 26th IHF Men's U21 Handball World Championship, scheduled to be held in North Macedonia from June 23 to July 4 next year. The four semi-finalists will earn qualification for the global tournament, meaning Bahrain are one victory away from securing their place on the world stage.

Bahrain basketball set for new era with revamped league and cup formats

Bahrain basketball is set for a new era after the Bahrain Basketball Association introduced major changes to the formats of the Zain Basketball League and Khalifa bin Salman Cup for the 2026-2027 season.

The new regulations bring changes to playoff structures, professional player usage and the route to the championship, with the aim of creating more competitive contests and raising the overall standard of domestic basketball.

The Zain Basketball League will continue under a single-division format featuring all participating clubs, with the preliminary stage consisting of two rounds. During this phase, teams will be allowed to use three professional players under a system of one professional player on the court and two on the bench.

The top eight teams in the standings will advance to the quarter-finals, where the league leaders will face eighth place, second will meet seventh, third will take on sixth, and fourth will play fifth.

These ties will be contested in a best-of-three format, with the first team to secure two victories progressing to the next stage. From the quarter-finals onwards, clubs will be permitted to use three professionals under a two-on-court, one-on-bench system.

The semi-finals will be played in a best-of-five format, with the winner of the first-versus-eighth-place tie facing the winner of the fourth-versus-fifth matchup. Meanwhile, the winner of the second-versus-seventh tie will meet the winner of the third-versus-sixth clash.

The league champion will then be crowned through a best-of-five final series, with the title going to the first team

to record three victories.

The new season arrives with Muharraq aiming to maintain their recent dominance after securing back-to-back Zain Bahrain Basketball League titles last April. Their triumph completed a historic domestic treble during the 2025-2026 season, highlighting their strength across Bahrain's major competitions.

However, Manama remain the most decorated club in the Kingdom's basketball history. The capital side lead the all-time honours list with a record 25 Premier League championships, followed by Al Ahli with 20 titles and Muharraq with five.

The association has also confirmed the format for the Khalifa bin Salman Cup, with teams finishing from first to seventh place in the league standings earning direct qualification to the quarter-finals.

The remaining quarter-final place will be decided through a preliminary playoff, with eighth place facing 11th and ninth meeting 10th before the winners compete for the final qualification spot.

The cup competition will follow the same professional-player regulations, with clubs allowed to register three professionals and use two on the court while one remains on the bench from the preliminary stage through to the final.

In the quarter-finals, the first-placed team will lead Group A and the second-placed team will lead Group B, while the remaining qualified teams will be determined through a draw. Matches at this stage will be played as single-elimination fixtures.

The semi-finals will then be contested in a best-of-three format, with the winners advancing to a one-match final to determine the 2026-2027 Khalifa bin Salman Cup champions.

Danylo Voievodkin gets new opponent as Janos Csukas steps up for BRAVE CF 107

Riffa stay top despite Um Al Hassam defeat

Hussain Abdulkarim recorded the best individual score of the round with 661. Sayed Moosa Al Alawi was Sanad's leading player with 570.

Al Hala are fourth with 34 points. Busaiteen and Sanad each have 32, with Busaiteen placed fifth on total pinfall. Al Ettifaq are seventh with 12 points, while Isa Town remain last on 10.

The eleventh round will be held at Funland Bowling Centre on Sunday from 6.30pm. Bahrain will play Riffa, Busaiteen will face Um Al Hassam, Sanad will meet Isa Town and Al Ettifaq will take on Al Hala.

Philipsen ends drought with stage win

Belgian sprinter moves within seven points of green jersey leader Mads Pedersen

Jasper Philipsen took a dominant victory in a reduced bunch sprint at the end of the Tour de France's Alpine 17th stage yesterday to end a "horrible" run of near misses.

Set up by a strong lead-out from his former world champion team-mate Mathieu van der Poel, Philipsen finished several bike lengths ahead of Mauro Schmid and Olav Kooij, who had each already won a stage at the Tour.

It was an 11th Tour stage victory overall for the 28-year-old Belgian, who won the sprinters' green points jersey in 2023.

It meant that he has won at least one stage in each of the last five editions of the Tour.

He had come close on several other sprint stages this year, finishing five times in the top five already.

And he admitted that it had been frustrating.

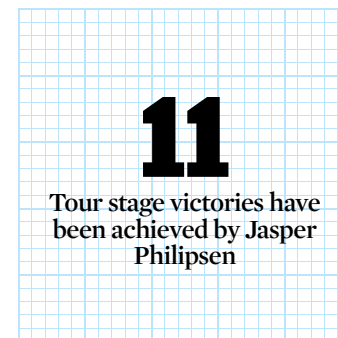
"I was prepared very, very well, I was in the shape of my life," said Philipsen.

"The first stage (of the race) was horrible, I couldn't find myself, I couldn't find the form I

was hoping for.

"After 17 stages... we won for the team."

In several of those near misses, Van der Poel had tried to lead him out but often a fraction too early, with Philipsen being caught and passed before the



finish -- usually by compatriot Tim Merlier.

But Merlier had dropped out of the Tour a few days earlier, unable to keep up on a tough mountain stage, and this time, Philipsen proved the quickest at the end of the 174.7km stage from Chambéry to Voiron.

"I think it was a very hard day all day and I just tried to be in the front, (to) be in each important group and then everything came together," said Van der Poel.

"And then Edward (Planckaert) was in the front group, so in the end you always had somebody in one of the groups and that was what made the victory a bit easier to achieve."

Frantic, hectic day

The 50 points Philipsen earned for winning the stage

also moved him to within just seven points of another former world champion, Dane Mads Pedersen in the green jersey competition.

Race leader and defending champion Tadej Pogacar came home safely in the main peloton just under nine minutes later.

But there was one concern for Pogacar, whose UAE Emirates-XRG team-mate Adam Yates -- a crucial mountain lieutenant -- struggled throughout the stage after suffering from a stomach problem the previous night.

He eventually came home more than 26 minutes after Philipsen.

It was a day of frantic, hectic bike racing.

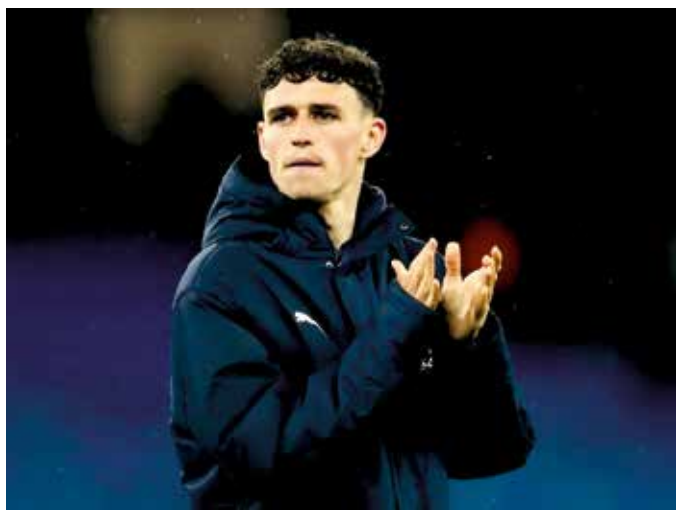
It took more than 100km for a breakaway to stick and eventually a six-man group opened up a lead at the head of the race.

Amongst them was Pedersen, who was eying maximum points at the intermediate sprint 27km from the finish.

He duly won that but almost immediately, Jasper Styven attacked and went clear of his breakaway companions.

Behind them, a larger group including Philipsen and Kooij was gaining steadily and they soon caught the other five riders.

Man City's Foden signs four-year contract extension

Manchester City forward Phil Foden gave a boost to new boss Enzo Maresca by signing a four-year contract extension yesterday.

Foden's deal provides the England international with much-needed stability after a turbulent period.

The 26-year-old had struggled for form during an injury-plagued period that included being left out of England's squad for the recent World Cup.

He would have been out of contract at the end of the coming season, but his new deal, which contains an option for a further one-year extension, resolves his long-term future.

"Committing my future to City means everything to me. Playing for this club is all I've ever wanted to do and it's always an honour to wear the shirt," Foden said.

"It's not lost on me that I've been lucky enough to be part of a historic period with so many titles won, but we're always looking to the future and trying to win more.

"I can only thank the club, staff, team-mates and fans who continue to put their faith in me and trust that I give everything I can for City and I hope I'll be able to repay you for years to come."

Foden has won six Premier League titles, the Champions League, two FA Cups and five League Cups with City since graduating from the club's youth academy.

He is the most decorated player in City's history alongside Bernardo Silva and John Stones, who both left in the close-season.

But a year ago, after struggling to replicate his form of previous campaigns, Foden opened up on his battles off the pitch with his mental health.

Italian FA chief says in touch with Guardiola over coaching vacancy

The head of Italy's football federation has confirmed he held discussions with legendary coach Pep Guardiola over the vacancy at the Italian national side but added he was "not sure that this will come about".

Giovanni Malago revealed the talks had taken place in an interview with the website Cronache di Spogliatoio (Dressing Room Chronicles) published yesterday.

Asked whether the budget for the coach's salary could be increased in the case of Guardiola, he said: "Yes, and that is the exception for obvious reasons".

"I won't go into detail here but it's not sure that this will come about.

"However, I still believe it was

the right thing to do. It was important to open a dialogue and keep it alive," he added.

Guardiola has first hand

knowledge of Italian football having played for Brescia and AS Roma (2001-03).

Already at a low ebb, Italian

football was sent into a tailspin in March after the men's national team failed for a third consecutive time to qualify for the World Cup.

Italy has won four World Cups.

Guardiola, 55, stepped down at Manchester City at the end of last season after winning six Premier League titles and the Champions League in his glittering decade at the Etihad Stadium.

According to Italian media reports, former Italy internationals Andrea Pirlo and Roberto Mancini -- who guided the Azzurri to the Euro 2020 title -- are also being considered as candidates to coach the national team, which faces Belgium on September 25 in the Nations League.

Chelsea sign Rogers from Villa for reported UK record fee

Chelsea signed England midfielder Morgan Rogers from Aston Villa on Tuesday in a deal British media valued at £117 million (\$157 million), a price that smashed the transfer record for a British player.

"The 23-year-old forward has signed a contract at Stamford Bridge until 2033," the London club posted on their web site.

Rogers passed a medical on Monday following his return

from the World Cup in North America.

"I'm so excited," said Rogers. "For me, Chelsea are the biggest club in London and a club I've always admired since I was a kid," Rogers was quoted as saying by the club.

"I'm really excited about the project with the new manager, the players we've got and where the club is heading. That's why I'm here and I can't wait to get started."

The transfer surpasses the previous record fee for a British player set by Manchester City when they signed England

midfielder Elliot Anderson from Nottingham Forest for £116 million earlier in July.

Rogers is the most expensive signing in Chelsea's history, eclipsing the £107 million paid to sign Enzo Fernandez from Benfica in 2023.

The swoop is a significant statement of intent from Chelsea, who convinced Rogers to leave Villa even though -- unlike his former club -- the west Londoners will not play in the Champions League in the coming season.

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
