131 Government Services Go Digital

Bahrain has upgraded 131 government services across 22 government entities between January 15 and August 13, 2026, as part of efforts to improve service quality and simplify procedures.

The upgrades included digitising applications for purchasing chemicals, simplifying trademark registration, and enabling social programme beneficiaries to update their information electronically.

Other improvements included faster VAT registration and data updates, and an electronic service allowing jobseekers to postpone scheduled job interviews.

The programme achieved 100 per cent digitalisation, reduced service-level agreement periods by at least 25 per cent, and limited applications to a maximum of four steps.

Saudi Crown Prince to Meet Macron

Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman is scheduled to meet French President Emmanuel Macron at the Élysée Palace; the talks are expected to focus on strengthening the strategic partnership between the two countries.

The visit follows Macron's trip to Saudi Arabia in December 2024 and will include the first meeting of the Franco-Saudi Strategic Partnership Council chaired by the two leaders.

The leaders are expected to discuss major economic and strategic issues, as well as regional developments and efforts to promote stability and peace in the Middle East.

They are also scheduled to attend the closing ceremony of the Esports World Cup on Sunday, being held in Paris for the first time outside Saudi Arabia since its creation.

Several Injured in Syria Bus Blast

An explosive device detonated on a bus carrying security forces near the Syrian capital on Saturday, injuring passengers, state media reported.

"An explosive device targeted a bus carrying Internal Security Forces personnel on the Maarounah-al-Tal road in Damascus countryside, injuring several personnel," state news agency SANA reported, adding that the attack was under investigation.

17,000 Bahraini families benefit from housing finance programmes

Around 17,000 Bahraini families have benefited from housing finance programmes since August 2022, according to Eman Al Abbasi, Director of the Housing Finance Department at the Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning.

Speaking to Bahrain TV, Al Abbasi said partnerships with participating banks have given citizens greater flexibility and a wider range of housing options.

Beneficiaries can choose solutions based on their needs and financial circumstances, including purchasing a ready-made home or a plot of land, depending on the programme.

She said the programmes aim to help citizens access housing solutions more quickly while giving them greater freedom to select options that match their priorities.

Al Abbasi highlighted the role of co-operation between the ministry, Bahrain Housing Bank and participating banks in expanding available choices and offering different financing solutions. The programmes are also being

The interview also covered the 10th edition of the "Mobile Housing Finance Branch", organised by the ministry in cooperation with Bahrain Housing Bank to bring housing and financing services closer to citizens.

Visitors can learn about various programmes, including the different "Tasheel" financing options, "Tasheel+" and the "Tamouh" programme.

Al Abbasi also highlighted the "BeitY" electronic platform, which brings together properties available across Bahrain, including villas, apartments and plots of land, as part of the housing finance system.

GCC Condemns Israeli Settlement Expansion



GCC Secretary-General Jasssem Mohamed Albudaiwi strongly condemned Israel's continued settlement expansion in the occupied West Bank, including the E1 settlement project.

Albudaiwi said the plans represent a challenge to international legitimacy and undermine the legitimate rights of the Palestinian people, while threatening efforts to establish an independent Palestinian state.

He called on the international community to take serious action to halt settlement policies and prevent measures aimed at changing the geographic and demographic character of the occupied Palestinian territories.

He reaffirmed the GCC's support for an independent Palestinian state on the June 4, 1967 borders, with East Jerusalem as its capital, in line with the Arab Peace Initiative and relevant international resolutions.

Qatar Condemns Israeli Attack in Syria



Qatar strongly condemned an Israeli drone attack on a civilian vehicle in Beit Jin village in rural Damascus, Syria, which injured civilians.

The Qatari Foreign Ministry described the attack as unacceptable aggression and a violation of Syria's sovereignty, warning that continued violations by Israel pose a threat to regional security and stability.

Qatar called on the international community to fulfil its responsibilities and prevent further violations, stressing that a lack of accountability encourages their continuation.

The ministry reaffirmed Qatar's solidarity with Syria and support for its sovereignty and territorial unity, while wishing those injured a speedy recovery.

Don't Let Safety Slip

Civil Defence urges households to strengthen fire safety

The General Directorate of Civil Defence has urged citizens and residents to follow basic fire and safety requirements at home to help prevent household fires and reduce their consequences. The directorate stressed the importance of installing smoke and gas detectors, which can provide an early warning of fires or gas leaks, particularly at night when families are asleep. Battery-operated detectors can continue working during power cuts and alert residents when their batteries need replacing. Civil Defence also advised households to keep emergency exits clear and avoid installing window bars that cannot be opened from inside. Residents were urged to keep suitable fire extinguishers, particularly in kitchens, ensure they are regularly maintained and

learn how to use them. Other precautions include regularly checking electrical wiring and appliances, using automatic circuit breakers, closing gas cylinders after use, and ensuring cigarettes and shisha are fully extinguished. The directorate also advised keeping flammable liquids away

from heat, flames, and electrical sources; maintaining good ventilation in kitchens and storage areas; and avoiding matches, flames, or smoking where there is a smell of gas or flammable vapour. In the event of a fire, residents should avoid opening windows, as this could help the fire spread.

Worker Arrested After Horse Stabbed at Stable

An African worker has been arrested after CCTV footage showed him heartlessly stabbing a horse with a knife and hurling stones at others at a stable in the Northern Governorate, according to the Bahrain Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. Society chairman Mahmoud Faraj said the stable keeper filed a report with Hamad Town Police Station at Roundabout 18 after the footage was found. Police attended the stable and arrested the African worker, who is due to be referred to the Public Prosecution for legal action, Mr Faraj said. The case came to light after

une that the footage showed the worker stabbing the animal with a knife and throwing stones at other horses. Days earlier, the stable keeper had found a filly dead after leaving it with its mother the night before in apparently normal condition. No clear cause of death was known. No security cameras covered the part of the stable where the young horse had been kept, meaning there was no footage to show what happened to it, Mr Faraj said. No link between its death and the worker has been established. He said the recordings were key to uncovering the attack on the other horse and urged stable owners to install cameras in areas where animals are kept to help deter abuse and record any harm.

Summer electricity bills back on Parliament's agenda

MP Hassan Ibrahim Hassan calls for summer bill relief, solar power and energy-efficient solutions

Air conditioning is a basic necessity for Bahraini households during the summer, and an MP is calling for measures to ease the impact of higher electricity bills during the hottest months. MP Hassan Ibrahim Hassan has proposed a mechanism to reduce the burden of summer electricity costs on citizens while encouraging solar power and more efficient energy use. He said Bahrain's high summer temperatures make air conditioning essential rather than optional, directly affecting household electricity consumption. The proposal calls for practical measures to reduce living costs during summer while maintaining the sustainability of the electricity sector. It also promotes energy-efficient appliances, solar energy, and greater private-sector involvement as longer-term solutions. Mr Hassan has also called for a comprehensive study of the impact of summer electricity bills on Bahraini households, including identifying

the groups most affected and developing sustainable ways to reduce the financial burden. The government said in December that the development of new electricity and water support mechanisms had been postponed pending further study. It also confirmed that electricity rates for the first and second consumption tiers in citizens' primary residences would remain unchanged, while rates for non-subsidised categories increased from 29 fils to 32 fils per kilowatt hour from January 2026. The proposal must first be approved by Parliament before being referred to the government for a response.

Why weight loss gets harder after repeated dieting

Dietitian explains why two people following the same plan can see very different results

Two people can follow the same weight-loss plan and see very different results, with one steadily losing weight while the other experiences repeated losses and gains. According to dietitian and sports nutritionist Fatima Al Alawi, previous dieting attempts can be an important factor, particularly when earlier methods involved severe calorie restriction or poor nutrition. She said every attempt to lose weight involves eating fewer calories, but the effect on metabolic rate depends on how the diet is carried out. Healthy, planned weight loss based on evidence has a limited effect, she said. However, deprivation, skipping meals, and inadequate protein intake can negatively affect the body's response. Repeated cycles of losing and regaining weight can leave people struggling to achieve the same results as someone

attempting weight loss for the first time, Al Alawi said. She advised people experiencing repeated fluctuations to seek guidance from a dietitian and identify the habits contributing to the cycle. Patience, understanding individual needs, and having appropriate professional support are key to maintaining a healthier approach to weight loss, she said.

Legal Action Against Unlicensed Transport

The Robot in the Operating Room

Bahrain's Robotic Surgery Opens New Era of Precision Care

A surgeon sits at a console several metres from the operating table, guiding robotic arms with precise movements that are translated into delicate actions inside the patient's body. What once seemed like science fiction is now becoming part of modern healthcare in Bahrain.

The Royal Medical Services (RMS) introduced the Hugo Robotic-Assisted Surgery system by Medtronic in July 2024, becoming the first hospital in the Middle East to perform surgery using the platform.

Since then, the multidisciplinary team has completed around 180 robotic procedures across urology, general surgery and gynaecology, according to Dr Ayman Aqeel Raees, Consultant Urologist, Chief of Medical Staff and Head of the Robotic Surgery Programme at RMS Bahrain.



The programme forms part of the broader vision of Major General Dr Shaikh Fahad bin Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa, Commander of the Royal Medical Services, to advance healthcare through the adoption of cutting-edge medical technologies, specialised equipment and continuous professional development.

Under his leadership, RMS has focused on integrating advanced

technologies across its medical network, with the aim of providing citizens and residents with high-quality specialised care locally while strengthening Bahrain's healthcare capabilities.

Dr Raees said robotic surgery represents the next stage in the evolution from conventional open surgery to minimally invasive procedures, giving surgeons greater precision, control and

flexibility.

The robotic system does not replace the surgeon. Instead, surgeons control the robotic arms from a specialised console, while the technology helps eliminate natural hand tremors and enables more precise movements during complex procedures.

For patients, the benefits can include smaller incisions, less pain, reduced blood loss and fast-

er recovery.

Dr Raees said patients undergoing procedures such as radical nephrectomy can often leave hospital within one or two days, compared with five to seven days following traditional surgery.

He also highlighted reduced blood loss during robotic radical prostatectomy procedures, noting that the programme had

not required a blood transfusion following a robotic radical prostatectomy as it approached its second year.

The programme has also enabled patients to receive specialised procedures in Bahrain that previously required travel abroad.

Building the service involved extensive training, including simulator sessions, international certification and support from experienced robotic surgery specialists during the initial procedures.

RMS's technology strategy extends beyond surgical robotics, with investments in advanced orthopaedic systems, high-precision imaging and specialised diagnostic technologies.

For Dr Raees, the technology is not about replacing surgeons but expanding what they can achieve — giving patients access to increasingly advanced treatment closer to home.

Housewives' Welfare Plan Back Before MPs

Bill seeks social assistance for housewives, but government raises financial and legal concerns

A plan to give Bahraini housewives a right to social welfare payments is heading back to Parliament, despite government warnings that it could make the state a permanent stand-in for husbands who are legally bound to provide for their wives.

The bill, proposed by MP Maryam Al Dhaen and expected to come before MPs in the next legislative session, would amend the Social Security Law to add housewives to those entitled to assistance.

Ms Al Dhaen argues that the change would take account of the circumstances faced by women who stay at home, raise their standard of living and give greater weight to the role they play in family life and society.

The measure was due to move through Parliament in the previous session, but the government asked for it to be sent back to the Services Committee.

Its explanatory memorandum mounted a wide-ranging

case against the change, saying welfare under the current law is based on need, not social status or a person's place within the family.

The present system is meant to help those who cannot secure a minimum decent standard of living. The proposed bill, the government said, would break with that rule by granting a housewife assistance once she reaches a given age and devotes herself to caring for her family, without first proving financial need.

Nor would the means of her husband or another person legally required to support her have to be taken into account.

The government said that would turn state aid from a last resort, used when a husband or family cannot provide support, into a standing replacement for the breadwinner.

It also argued that the label "housewife" was too blunt a test for welfare. Some women live in wealthy households or have money of their own, while others are in real financial need.

Giving all housewives the same right to aid, it said, could

weaken the welfare system and lead other groups to seek similar treatment without clear legal or economic grounds.

The government also said the bill would breach equality and social justice rules by giving housewives terms not offered to other groups covered by the law.

Under the existing rules, orphans, older people, people with disabilities and others can lose their right to aid where they have someone financially able to provide for them.

vide for them.

Housewives, under the proposed change, could receive payments even where a husband or other relative required by law to support them had the means to do so.

The memorandum said this would cut across the husband's duty to maintain his wife for as long as the marriage remains in force, regardless of her own income or ability to work. That duty, it said, is rooted in Sharia and recognised in law.

The government also warned that some women could qualify twice where they already fall under another welfare category.

It further criticised the lack of a financial study showing what the bill would cost the state budget.

The proposal also ran against government policy aimed at helping women enter and remain in work, the memorandum said.

The government concluded that no change in the law was needed, arguing that the current welfare system already provides aid to those who need it.

Six EU countries urge windfall tax on energy firms

Six EU countries are stepping up calls for a bloc-wide windfall tax on oil companies as profits soar due to the Middle East war.

The finance ministers of Germany, Italy, Austria, Poland and Portugal, along with Spain's economy minister, sent the joint letter to Ireland's finance minister.

Ireland currently holds the EU's rotating presidency, and the ministers urged the issue of a levy be put on the agenda at a meeting of the bloc's finance chiefs in Dublin next month.

"Oil companies are enjoying overall profitability and margins on refined products that exceed the rise in crude oil prices," it read.

"We are experiencing one of the biggest supply shocks in decades, and all over the world there

is growing discontent about the rise in the cost of living."

They called for discussions on an "EU-wide framework to tax windfall profits," which would take into account lessons from when a similar measure was introduced in 2022 following Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

German Finance Minister Lars Klingbeil has repeatedly stressed that energy companies must not "rip off" consumers during the current crisis, a ministry source told AFP.

"Excessive crisis profits must be returned to consumers," said the source.

Several of the countries had already called for a levy to be imposed on oil firm profits earlier this year.

Energy firms have seen their earnings soar since the United States and Israel launched a war against Iran in February, resulting in constricted traffic through

the key transit route the Strait of Hormuz.

The EU has so far not indicated it intends to impose a levy on oil companies, however.

There are also divisions within the German government over

the issue.

While Klingbeil of the centre-left SPD, the junior partners in the ruling coalition, backs a levy, the centre-right CDU party of Chancellor Friedrich Merz is against it.

Loz Prices Hit BD10 as Supplies Run Short

Loz prices have hit BD10 a kilo for some varieties as short supplies, searing heat and strong demand push up the cost of one of Bahrain's best-known summer fruits.

Shoppers have been surprised by the rise, with some Bahraini types, including the 'jumbo' variety, selling for as much as BD10 a kilo. Prices vary by type and quality, sellers said.

The increase comes as the habban season ends and Alexandrian loz begins to reach the market, leaving a gap of about 10 to 12 days when far less fruit is available.

Red and yellow Alexandrian loz is now coming into sale and its season is expected to run until mid-October.

One farmer said the shortage was the main reason for the higher prices, though demand from juice shops and ice-cream makers was also taking large amounts off the market. Buyers from outside Bahrain add to the pull.

The weather has hit growers too.

High temperatures and harsh sunlight can burn fruit on the trees, leaving part of the crop unfit for sale. Abu Ali, a loz seller, said the heat also makes the work harder for farmers, many of whom begin picking from the early hours of the morning.

Bahraini loz still draws the strongest demand, sellers said, because of its taste and quality. Some traders have even dubbed it the 'trend of the season' as interest in the fruit grows during its short run.

Visitors are among the buyers, with some taking home large quantities while it is available.

Licensed growers and traders, however, say they face added pressure from street sellers working without commercial registrations.

Some bring in loz from abroad and sell it from stalls near authorised outlets, farmers said, while registered businesses must bear rent, registration and other running costs.

For growers, the rise in price is therefore about far more than demand alone. Less fruit, heat damage, heavy buying and higher costs are all feeding into what shoppers now pay at the stall.

Trump's New Tariffs Add to Canada's Trade Pressure

50% US tariffs on selected Canadian goods are pushing Ottawa to seek new markets and strengthen domestic trade

The new US tariffs on certain Canadian goods have added fresh pressure to bilateral trade, prompting Ottawa to accelerate efforts to diversify its economy and reduce dependence on the United States.

The 50% tariffs took effect Saturday after negotiations between the two countries failed to reach an agreement. They affect about \$20 billion worth of Canadian goods, representing around 5.5% of Canada's exports to the United States, including products such as hockey sticks and cement.

About 70% of Canadian exports are sent to the United States, leaving the Canadian economy highly exposed to

changes in US trade policy.

Prime Minister Mark Carney has responded by pursuing new international markets, encouraging domestic trade and advancing major infrastructure projects. Canada has also faced economic difficulties this year, including two consecutive quarters of contraction.

Carney said Canada would match the US tariffs "dollar for dollar" to protect Canadian workers and businesses.

The latest measures also affect some products previously covered by protections under the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA), raising concerns about the future of the North American trade framework.

Richard Ouellet, a professor of international economic law

at Quebec's Laval University, described the move as a breach of the protection previously provided by the agreement.

However, Royal Bank of Canada said the tariffs were unlikely to significantly alter

overall Canadian growth because they affect a relatively small share of total trade. The bank estimated that around 80% of Canadian goods would continue to enter the United States tariff-free.

Five Firms Bid for East Hidd Boys' School

A BD9.1 million bid has put Mohammed Jalal Contracting at the head of a five-firm race to build East Hidd Housing City's first government school, a 40-classroom boys' primary school with a large indoor and outdoor sports site.

The Ministry of Works opened the financial bids with offers stretching from BD9.1 million to BD10.906 million, a gap of about BD1.806 million.

Mohammed Abdulmohsin Al-Kharafi & Sons placed second on price at BD9.4 million. Poullaides Construction Company followed at BD9.846 million.

Almoayyed Contracting bid BD10.478 million, while Ahmed Omer Trading and Contracting submitted the highest price, at BD10.906 million.

All five bids were accepted for assessment.

The cheapest offer does not, however, mean an automatic



win. Tender terms say each bid must pass technical and financial checks, with price becoming the main yardstick once the other requirements have been met.

The Ministry of Works put the East Hidd school contract to tender in May. The building period is 24 months.

Plans show a sizeable school campus built around 40 classrooms, with a separate classroom for students with special educational needs, a sports hall and an administration block.

Teaching spaces will include a science laboratory, family education facilities, computer

and IT laboratories, a technology workshop, a talent workshop and an art room. A library, cafeteria, staff rooms and other support facilities are also planned.

Sport takes up a large share of the scheme. Outdoor handball, basketball and volleyball courts will be built alongside an elevated football pitch. The sports hall will have courts for handball, basketball and volleyball.

The contract was offered through a public request-for-proposals tender open to local and GCC contractors.

Qatar cuts state spending as war hits LNG revenues

Government departments face budget reductions of up to 30%, while overseas aid funding has also been sharply reduced

Qatar has cut government spending as the economic impact of the ongoing US-Iran conflict and disruption to the Strait of Hormuz weighs heavily on its liquefied natural gas revenues.

Government departments have reportedly faced budget reductions of up to 30%, while funding for overseas aid has been cut by about 85%, according to people briefed on the matter.

Qatar has been particularly affected because it has halted LNG production following damage linked to the conflict and difficulties shipping gas through the Strait of Hormuz, a key route for its energy exports.

The reductions come as Qatar faces a sharp economic contraction. The International Monetary Fund has forecast that the country's economy



will shrink by 8.6% this year, the largest contraction among the six Gulf states.

Qatar has substantial financial reserves, including the Qatar Investment Authority, which manages around \$500 billion in assets. However, officials and economists have warned that prolonged disruption could put further pressure on government finances and lead to additional spending cuts.

The conflict has affected Gulf economies more broad-

ly, disrupting energy exports, trade, tourism, and other economic activity. Qatar and Kuwait are particularly exposed to the Strait of Hormuz because of their reliance on the waterway for energy shipments.

Despite the economic pressures, a Qatari official said the country remained capable of managing the crisis and maintaining its long-term economic plans, citing its experience in dealing with previous regional and global crises.

Anthropic eyes record-breaking \$100 billion IPO

A company Anthropic, maker of Claude, could seek to raise more than \$100 billion in a potential IPO, potentially surpassing SpaceX's record-setting \$85.7 billion listing.

The five-year-old company could be valued at around \$2 trillion, more than double its \$965 billion valuation from its latest funding round. If launched later this year, An-



thropic could become the first major AI rival to OpenAI to enter public markets.

More than 16,000 doses of the Ervebo vaccine arrived in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) late Friday, an AFP journalist saw, as the country faces the deadliest Ebola outbreak in its history.

The DRC's 17th Ebola outbreak, which has killed thousands of people, was declared on May 15 but is thought to have been spreading for several weeks prior.

It has hit regions in the north and east where the presence of the state is weak, health infrastructure is largely lacking and myriad armed groups have roamed for decades.

South Korea sent its first trial container ship through the Arctic yesterday, as the Middle East war rattles global shipping, while environmental groups warned the route could accelerate polar ice melt.

The Middle East conflict, sparked by US-Israeli strikes on Iran in February, has roiled global shipping, sending governments and shipping firms scrambling to seek alternative routes.

Sailing from Busan New Port, the "PanStar Acro" container ship is to sail to Europe via the Arctic, testing whether a route opened by melting sea ice can be commercially viable.

Ex-diplomats say Israel out to 'destroy' Palestinian state

Former French and UK diplomats demand joint action to uphold international law

● Israel accused of undermining statehood

● West Bank violence draws concern

● Letter alleges ethnic cleansing

Dozens of former senior French and UK diplomats yesterday urged their governments to work together to uphold international law in the Palestinian territories, accusing Israel of seeking to "destroy" any prospect of a viable Palestinian state.

The 102 signatories of the letter published in Le Monde included former British ambassadors to the UN Jeremy Greenstock and Emyr Jones Parry as well as the former directors for the Middle East at the French foreign ministry Yves Aubin de la Messuziere and Denis Bauchard.

They said the involvement of France and the UK was essential given the historic roles of the two powers in the Middle East and the fact that both permanent members of the UN Security Council, in 2025 recognised a Palestinian state.

"Our two nations believe that those responsible for war crimes

and crimes against humanity must be held to account. Only then can our governments rebut the accusation of double standards. That is why they must act together to uphold international law in Palestine," said the letter.

It accused Israel of seeking "to destroy any prospect of an independent Palestinian state, showing contempt for the law, the rulings of the International

former senior French and British diplomats signed an open letter calling on their governments to uphold international law in the Palestinian territories

Court of Justice and countless UN Security Council resolutions."

Israel launched a military campaign on the Palestinian territory of Gaza following the October 7, 2023 attack by militant group Hamas against Israel.

Violence in the West Bank, occupied by Israel since 1967, has surged since the Gaza war began, sparking international concern over the conduct of Israeli troops

and settlers.

France and Britain this week joined other countries in releasing a statement condemning the Israeli government's release of new tenders for construction in the occupied West Bank.

The letter said house demolitions and "rampant settler violence -- with the connivance of the Israeli army and police" in annexed east Jerusalem and the West Bank amounted to "ethnic cleansing"

"The world no longer sees Israel as a genuine democracy -- there is nothing democratic about depriving others of their rights and land," said the letter.

Israel conducts fresh strike in Syria after US criticism

Israel carried out a fresh strike in Syria yesterday and lambasted US envoy Tom Barrack for criticizing an earlier attack on an air base in the northwest, which Israel has accused Türkiye of seeking to use.

Barrack on Tuesday slammed Israel's attack on the disused military air base that

day as an "unnecessary escalation that does not advance regional stability".

On Friday, in an interview with influencer Mario Nawfal, Barrack said the strike may have been intended to provoke a conflict with Türkiye, prompting Israeli Defense Minister Israel Katz to hit back yesterday, calling the remarks "full of inaccuracies".

Heavy rain lashes northeast Spain, injuring 11

Heavy rain battered northeast Spain, flooding streets, trapping people in cars, forcing the evacuation of a campsite and injuring 11 people, officials said yesterday.

Three people were injured, one critically, when a wall collapsed near the seafront at the port of Roda de Bera, about 75 kilometers (45 miles) southwest of Barcelona, emergency

services said. Firefighters had to free two people trapped under the rubble.

Seven people were taken to hospital following other incidents, including two who were injured when another wall collapsed during the overnight storm at a campsite in Roda de Bera. Firefighters evacuated around 300 people staying at the campsite, with about 100 taking shelter at a municipal sports centre, officials said.

Trump to star as motor race takes to streets of US capital

Donald Trump will take a lap of honor at an IndyCar race through the streets of Washington this weekend, capping a summer of 250th anniversary festivities that the US president has centered on himself.

Racing cars will roar past historic landmarks including the US Capitol and Smithsonian Museums as 25 drivers make 147 laps of the course at speeds of up to 185 mph (298 kmh).

Workers have had to weld down more than 200 manhole covers on the 250-mile (400-kilometer) circuit so that the sheer force created by the speeding cars doesn't tear them off.

Practice and qualifying sessions were yesterday and the "Freedom 250 Grand Prix" itself will take place on Sunday.

Trump, 80, is expected to take a ceremonial lap of honor in his armored limousine dubbed "The Beast" and then wave the green flag to start the

race.

The event is being managed by the organizers of the IndyCar championship, the US motorsport whose cars resemble Formula One vehicles but often compete on oval tracks, including at the flagship Indianapolis 500 race.

'Once in a lifetime'

It marks a final attempt by Trump to stamp his mark on

Washington's celebrations of the 250th anniversary, which began with an Ultimate Fighting Championship (UFC) bout in a huge cage on the White House lawn in June.

As with the UFC fight, the IndyCar organizers are footing the bill for a huge logistical challenge which has shut down some of Washington's busiest roads for days.

France yesterday promised to deliver new interceptor missiles to Ukraine amid a surge in Russian strikes that have pushed civilian deaths in the four-and-a-half-year war to their highest since the first months of Moscow's invasion.

At least 13 people were killed in strikes overnight and through yesterday -- seven in Ukraine, four in Russia and two in Russia-annexed Crimea.

The latest deadly attacks come as rescuers in the eastern Ukrainian city of Kryvyi Rih were sifting through the rubble of a part-de-

stroyed shopping centre, where 16 were killed a day earlier in a Russian drone attack.

Ukraine's allies in the Coalition of the Willing -- an initiative led by France and Britain -- will meet on Monday to look at how to ramp up pressure on Moscow to halt its invasion.

Diplomacy has stalled with the United States, which has brokered several rounds of direct talks between Kyiv and Moscow, but which is now distracted by its war on Iran and frustrated the conflict has not been as easy to solve as President Donald Trump once touted.

Announcing the new missile interceptors, French President Emmanuel Macron wrote on X: "It is crucial to provide Ukraine with all the necessary means to defend its skies and thwart this aggression."

Russia has pounded Ukraine -- the capital Kyiv especially -- with ballistic missile attacks in recent months.

The hard-to-intercept super-fast weapons reach their target within minutes, making it virtually impos-

sible for locals in Kyiv to reach an underground shelter in time.

Among the deadly attacks yesterday was a Ukrainian drone strike on a house in southern Russia, killing two children and wounding their parents, the head of the Krasnodar region said.

"This morning, civilian infrastructure and residential buildings in the Yeysk district came under a drone attack," Governor Veniamin Kondratyev said.

"As a result of yet another vile and cynical strike ... two children were killed, and two adults are in the hospital," he added.

Russia fired a ballistic missile towards Kyiv in the middle of the day -- while the German Foreign Minister Johann Wadephul was visiting for talks with his Ukrainian counterpart and President Volodymyr Zelensky.

Two were killed and several wounded in the Boryspil district, on the eastern outskirts of the city.

At least four were killed in a series of strikes on the frontline region of Zaporizhzhia, Ukrainian officials said.

US Supreme Court allows White House ballroom construction for now

The US Supreme Court allowed construction of a massive White House ballroom to continue for now, giving President Donald Trump a temporary victory for one of his pet renovation projects.

Chief Justice John Roberts temporarily lifted a lower court ruling that had demanded a halt to the building of the controversial ballroom by midnight on Friday.

Roberts's one-sentence order means that work on the ballroom, which has been challenged by historical preservation groups, may proceed while litigation plays out in the lower courts.

Trump, in a post on Truth Social, said he was "grateful" for the Supreme Court decision.

"The Military/Ballroom Complex being built on the hallowed grounds of the White House, which is so vital for National Security, will be the greatest of its kind!" he said. "Construction is under budget and ahead of sched-

ule."

The Trump administration asked the conservative-dominated Supreme Court last week to allow it to finish building the ballroom and an underground bunker at the White House, saying the project was essential for national

security.

Trump ordered the demolition of the entire historic East Wing of the White House last year -- without input from Congress -- to make way for his long-desired ballroom, but the project was quickly challenged in court.

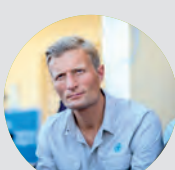

Australia halt Bahrain's 3x3 charge

Bahrain's under-23 men's and women's 3x3 teams both missed out on the final of Stop Three in the Fiba 3x3 Youth Nations League 2026 Asia West/Pacific conference yesterday in Singapore.

The women, runners-up in each of the opening two stops, began their latest campaign in emphatic fashion with a 21-6 victory over Qatar in Pool B.

Polina Sviatskaya produced a dominant individual display, scoring 14 of Bahrain's 21 points, while Bayan Salman and JaMya Robinson added three apiece and Noor Malek contributed one.

Bahrain then faced familiar opponents Australia with a place in the final at stake, but the Australians prevailed 21-6 to finish top of the pool.

The contest was still within reach at 7-4 before Australia began to pull clear, eventually reaching the 21-point target with more than three minutes remaining.

Noor Malek led Bahrain with three points, while Sviatskaya added two and Robinson scored one.

Australia went on to capture the women's Stop Three title with a 19-7 victory over hosts Singapore in the final.

The Bahrain men, meanwhile, endured a difficult day in Pool A, suffering defeats against both Singapore and Australia.

They opened with a 21-8 loss to the hosts after falling 11-2 behind midway through the contest.

Hamad Al Amari led Bahrain with five points, while Mohammed Alanzi scored two and Ismail Alansari added one.

Bahrain produced a more competitive display against Australia in their second outing and briefly led 3-2 early on.

They remained within striking distance at 11-10 with just under four minutes left, but Australia pulled away in the closing stages to secure a 21-13 victory.

Al Amari again paced Bahrain with six points, Nasser Alanzoor contributed four

and Alanzi added three.

Australia later completed a perfect day in the men's competition by defeating Turkmenistan 21-7 in the Stop Three final.

Following a rest day today, action resumes with Stop Four tomorrow, when both Bahrain teams will compete in Pool A. Bahrain's men take on hosts Singapore

at 9.45am before facing Saudi Arabia at 1:25pm, while the women meet Singapore at 11:10am and Saudi Arabia at 1pm. All times are Bahrain.

"I want to thank Bahrain for always supporting me and the Bahrain Basketball Association for always being there for me throughout my journey," he said.

"I also want to thank HH Shaikh Isa bin Ali Al Khalifa, Vice-President of the Bahrain Olympic Committee, for always supporting me."

His participation continues Bahrain's representation at Basketball Without Borders camps, following Mustafa Hussain Ali's appearance at BWA Asia in Tokyo, Japan, in 2019.



Uzbekistan next in Bahrain's perfect run

Bahrain will look to maintain their perfect start to the 11th Asian Men's Youth Handball Championship when they take on Uzbekistan today at 12pm in Amman, Jordan.

The kingdom's under-19 side head into their third Group A encounter sitting top of the standings after opening their campaign with two emphatic victories.

Bahrain began with a 51-20 rout of India before producing another commanding display to defeat hosts Jordan 41-19, giving them four points from two matches and a goal difference of plus-53.

South Korea are level with Bahrain on four points but sit second on goal difference, setting up an intriguing battle for top spot as the preliminary round progresses.

Uzbekistan, meanwhile, will be looking to bounce back after suffering a 47-29 defeat to South Korea in their opening match.

Bahrain will enter today's contest with plenty of confidence after scoring 92 goals across their opening two games while conceding just 39.

Their latest victory saw them

take control against Jordan from the outset, building a 22-9 half-time advantage before continuing to pull away after the break.

Right-winger Mahmood Ahmed was the standout performer, scoring 10 goals to earn the Man of the Match award, while Mohammed Marzooq contributed seven and Ahmed Abdulla added five.

Head coach Mohamed Abdelrahman Soliman's side will now be aiming to extend their win-

ning run before facing fellow early pacesetters South Korea in their final preliminary-round fixture on Wednesday at 4pm.

With the top four teams from the five-nation group advancing to the quarter-finals, another victory today would further strengthen Bahrain's position heading into the closing stages of the preliminary round.

Elsewhere in Group A today, hosts Jordan face India at 6pm, with both sides searching for

their first victory of the tournament.

Bahrain are chasing a third Asian youth crown, having previously lifted the title in consecutive editions in 2016 and 2018. They also claimed bronze in 2010.

The continental championship doubles as a qualifier for next year's IHF Men's Youth Handball World Championship, with the four semi-finalists securing their places at the global tournament.

Australia lead by 101 in 2nd Bangladesh Test as 18 wickets fall on day one

Australia scratched out a 101-run lead over Bangladesh yesterday in the second Test, with 18 wickets falling on day one after Mitchell Starc and Shoriful Islam both took six in a fast-bowling master-class.

Home skipper Pat Cummins won the toss in Mackay and his pacemen feasted, determined to bounce back from a shock nine-wicket loss in the first Test at Darwin.

They skittled Bangladesh for 64 with an irrepressible Starc the destroyer in an incredible spell of swing and seam, taking five wickets in 22 balls during the morning ses-

sion to end with 6-12 from 10 overs.

Only a last-wicket partnership of 25 between Taijul Islam (11 not out) and Shoriful (14) took Bangladesh past their lowest Test score of 43, which came against the West Indies in 2018.

In reply, Australia stumbled to 165-8 at stumps with Darwin century-maker Cameron Green standing tall on 51 alongside Nathan Lyon (10). Shoriful, who missed the first Test injured, was the hero with a career-best 6-35.

"It was just getting our lengths a bit fuller, using the bouncer a bit more and holding onto our catches," said Starc.

Serena Williams and Alcaraz unite in US Open mixed doubles

Serena Williams, a 23-time Grand Slam singles champion, and second-ranked Spaniard Carlos Alcaraz, a seven-time Slam singles winner, will compete together in US Open mixed doubles, organizers announced yesterday.

The US Tennis Association announced mixed doubles pairings topped by 44-year-old American Williams making her return to the US Open for the first time since 2022.

Williams, a six-time US Open singles champion, captured the 1998 US Open mixed dou-

bles title with Max Mirnyi.

She and Alcaraz received one of the last three wildcard entries into the main draw for mixed doubles, with other spots going to Czechs Karolina Muchova and Jakub Mensik and Americans Emma Navarro and Tommy Paul.

Williams played women's doubles with her sister Venus for the first time since 2022 at Cincinnati but lost in the first round.

Mixed doubles will begin on Tuesday and conclude on Wednesday at the National Tennis Center, where the regular US Open begins on August 30.

Table tennis squad returns home with 26 West Asia medals

Bahrain finished top of the West Asia Table Tennis Championships medal table in Amman with 26 medals, including 10 golds, in its best result at the regional tournament.

The tally also included six silver and 10 bronze medals, with Bahraini players winning

across senior and age-group events during the championship in the Jordanian capital from August 12 to 19.

The final standings issued by the West Asia Table Tennis Federation placed Bahrain first among the 10 countries to win medals. Its 10 golds were also the highest tally of any team.

The result was Bahrain's best at the championship, with

medals won across boys', girls', men's and women's events.

The senior men added another gold after recovering from 2-0 down to beat hosts Jordan 3-2 in the team final. The win saw Bahrain retain the West Asian team title it won in Amman two years ago.

The age-group players also added heavily to the medal count. Both the boys' and girls' Under-13 singles finals were

all-Bahraini contests, ensuring Bahrain took gold and silver in each event.

Bahrain sent 26 players to Amman to compete in team, singles and doubles events across several age groups and the senior divisions.

The championship included teams from Bahrain, Jordan, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, the UAE, Oman, Kuwait, Lebanon and Palestine.

Norris clinches Dutch GP pole

Max Verstappen qualifies seventh despite strong home support at Zandvoort

- Russell qualifies second for Mercedes
- Antonelli starts third on grid
- Piastri secures fourth for McLaren

McLaren driver Lando Norris won pole position for Sunday's Dutch Grand Prix, the current world champion pipping Mercedes rivals George Russell and Kimi Antonelli into second and third place.

The British driver set a time of one minute and 11.163 seconds, 0.102 seconds faster than compatriot Russell, to take a critical advantage into the Grand Prix race on Sunday.

"Best lap of my life," said a pumped-up Norris, who had earlier complained his McLaren was lacking pace after being beaten into third in the sprint race earlier yesterday.

"I just had to commit through everything because I knew how close it was going to be," added the 26-year-old, who is enjoying a run of good form having won the Hungarian Grand Prix before the summer break.

Russell had been the quickest driver all weekend but was forced into second place on the grid on the last qualifying lap that was affected by light rain.

"I was on a very strong lap, to be honest. And then I just had

a small oversteer in turn eight" that cost him the vital tenth of a second, said Russell.

World championship leader Antonelli will start from third on the grid, ruing a difficult qualifying session with an error in turn one costing him a few crucial tenths of a second.

The teenage sensation set the pace in the first half of the season, winning six races, including a stunning run of five consecutive Grand Prix.

But the chasing pack has closed in fast, with McLaren in particular bringing upgrades to their car that have brought them into contention.

"It was a very good wake-up

call this weekend that you can never lower your guard," said Antonelli, who turns 20 next

week.

Oscar Piastri, who took the chequered flag last year at Zandvoort, qualified fourth, ahead of the two Ferraris driven by Charles Leclerc and seven-time world champion Lewis Hamilton.

Despite raucous home support, local favourite Max Verstappen was unable to make an impact and will start seventh on the grid.

Sunday's race promises to be a nail-biter, with just a few tenths of a second separating the top four or five drivers.

Starting on pole however will be a major advantage for Norris.

Man Utd humiliated by Hull in dismal start to Premier League season

Manchester United crashed to a humiliating 2-0 defeat at promoted Hull yesterday in a dismal start to their Premier League campaign.

Michael Carrick's side were rocked by first half goals from Semi Ajayi and Nobel Mendy at the MKM Stadium.

Hull, who are back in the Premier League for the first time since 2017, were without 10 players due to injury but still put woeful United to the sword with a vibrant display.

It was a chastening opening to the new season for United, who are expected to mount a title challenge after finishing third last term.

There was scant evidence that United are capable of going toe to toe with champions Arsenal on a dispiriting afternoon on Humberside.

Youri Tielemans and Andrey Santos were anonymous in their United debuts in mid-

field after joining from Aston Villa and Chelsea respectively.

Carrick laughed off claims that United have been handed an easy start to the season, with their trip to Hull followed by a home game against Ipswich, another of the promoted teams.

The United manager's caution proved prescient.

Former England captain Alan Shearer summed up United's malaise with a damning verdict.

"Man United have been shocking, no hunger, they've been terrible," the BBC pundit said.

Carrick's steady demeanour during his interim spell after Ruben Amorim's turbulent reign played a major role in United's revival last season.

But, now installed as permanent boss, Carrick is expected to mount a challenge for United's first English title since 2013, adding a layer of pressure he did not have to endure last season.
