ahrain took vet another step yesterday to ensure the legal rights of workers here by establishing a system to help expatriate labourers file labour lawsuits online.

The system, which includes the support of qualified translators, works through an electronic platform developed by the Ministry of Justice, Islamic Affairs and En-

Affairs and Endowments and the Labour Market Regulatory Authority signed a Memorandum of Understanding for this.

The deal calls for providing full administrative assistance to expatriate workers in filing labour lawsuits in the Kingdom.
