HM King orders RBAF aircraft named 'Mohammed bin Zayed Squadron'

His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, the Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces, has ordered that a Royal Bahraini Air Force (RBAF) squadron be named "Mohammed bin Zayed Squadron" in recognition of His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the UAE and Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces, for his role in supporting the longstanding relations and cooperation between the two nations.

This announcement came as HM the King and HH Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed attended the joint Bahrain-UAE military exercise "Rabdan Shuwaiman"

yesterday.

The exercise featured the participation of the Hamad bin Isa Airborne Brigade from the UAE Presidential Guard and their counterparts from the Royal Guard of the Bahrain Defence Force (BDF).

It was held in Bahrain as part of the countries' longstanding military cooperation.

Gratitude

HH Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed expressed gratitude to HM King Hamad for the gesture, emphasising that it reflects the strong historical ties between Bahrain and the UAE.

He also commended the high level of skill and performance displayed during the joint exercise, wishing both nations con-

tinued prosperity and success.

During the exercise, HM the King and HH the UAE President were briefed on its objectives and proceedings.

Salute

The event concluded with a commemorative photo session as aircraft from the "Mohammed bin Zayed Squadron" of the RBAF flew past in salute.

His Majesty hosted a luncheon at Sakhir Palace in honour of HH Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed and the accompanying delegation before their departure.

The luncheon was attended by the sons of His Majesty the King and senior officials from both countries.

Public safety

Shura to vote on tougher traffic penalties, penal code changes and criminal procedure

Three major decree-laws on traffic offences, the Penal Code and criminal procedure will go before the Shura Council today, with a committee recommending approval of all three.

Members will discuss reports from the Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee on Decree-Law No. 30 of 2025 amending the Traf-

fic Law, Decree-Law No. 31 of 2025 amending the Penal Code, and Decree-Law No. 32 of 2025 amending the Code of Criminal Procedure.

The committee says the set is meant to improve road safety, tighten discipline on the roads, cut repeat violations and deter reckless driving.

Rules

The Traffic Law decree-law updates rules in line with urban, economic and population

growth, as road networks expand and the number of vehicles and drivers rises.

The committee says the changes increase jail terms and fines to strengthen deterrence.

It points to a rise in dangerous acts in recent years, including excessive speeding, overtaking where banned, driving against traffic, driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, using a phone at the wheel, and not wearing a seat belt.

The Penal Code decree-law

is framed as reinforcing protection of life and bodily safety, and applying the same penalties to similar acts.

The committee says this will aid clearer legal treatment of wrongful, non-intentional killing and injury cases and support consistency in court rulings.

Provisions

The criminal procedure decree-law updates case-handling rules so they match the revised provisions in the Traffic Law and Penal Code.

The committee says this keeps criminal orders working as a route to settle straightforward cases early, easing the load on courts while keeping fair-trial guarantees in place.

The Council will also be notified of a question sent to the Minister of Health by member Nancy Eili Khadouri about the right of a non-Bahraini widow of a Bahraini citizen to keep access to health insurance services after her husband's death, along with the minister's reply.

Bahrain's record-breaking athletes receive hero's welcome



Bahrain's athletics delegation received a hero's welcome on their return to the Kingdom yesterday, following a historic showing at the sixth Islamic Solidarity Games in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. The team recorded the Kingdom's best-ever performance at the multi-sport event after winning a record 34 medals. The achievement surpasses Bahrain's previous best total of 23 medals from the 2021 Games in Kenya, marking a new era of success for the kingdom on the international stage. Among the standout stars were Edidiog Odiong and Nelly Jepkosgei, who each struck double gold. Odiong capped a brilliant campaign with victory in the women's 200 metres, her second gold and third medal overall, while Jepkosgei completed her own golden double by adding the 1,500m crown to her earlier win in the 800m.

Flight boom

Bahrain airport records 11.2% rise in passengers, reaching over 851,000 travellers in October

Passenger traffic through Bahrain International Airport rose in October 2025, with 851,981 travellers passing through the terminal, up from 766,394 in September, a month-to-month rise of 11.2 per cent.

This was according to Civil Aviation Affairs statistics from the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications.

Arrivals totalled 432,490 passengers and departures 418,894, while 597 travellers were recorded in transit.

Aircraft movements also increased over the month.

The airport handled 8,532 flights, split between 4,273 arrivals and 4,259 departures.

Airspace

During the same period,

46,675 aircraft crossed Bahrain's airspace without landing.

Air cargo and mail volumes moved higher too.

The total handled reached 34,970 tonnes, including 13,726 tonnes inbound, 8,682 tonnes outbound and 12,562 tonnes of

transit freight.

The figures add to the rise seen across air travel and freight activity during 2025.

Destinations

India and the United Arab Emirates led the destinations

showing the fastest rise in passenger numbers compared with October 2024.

Travel to India via Bengaluru and Mumbai rose by 87 per cent to 51,363 passengers.

Traffic to the UAE through Abu Dhabi and Sharjah rose by 44 per cent to 82,228 passengers.

Postal transactions

In a separate update, the ministry said Bahrain Post processed 40,536 postal transactions in October 2025 across incoming and outgoing services.

Express mail accounted for 2,307 incoming items and 603 outgoing, while parcel post handled 1,567 incoming parcels and 477 outgoing.

Registered mail saw 7,972 incoming items and 1,501 outgoing, and ordinary mail totalled 22,121 incoming letters and 3,988 outgoing.

A wave of global innovation in smart medical capsules is beginning to touch Bahrain, where the devices are used in some advanced hospitals yet remain unfamiliar to most patients and practitioners.

This contrast shaped the core of a widely-praised presentation by Dr. Fatema Al Dhaen, Assistant Professor at Ahlia University, in Cairo, where she argued that the next phase of medical transformation is moving inside the human body through ingestible devices capable of diagnosis and treatment.

Global Momentum

Dr. Al Dhaen presented her paper at the International Conference on Sustainable Business and Technology (ICBST Cairo 2025) hosted at the American University in Cairo.

Her research examined how ingestible devices equipped with Internet of Things capabilities are reshaping medical practice by offering precise imaging, monitoring and intra-body drug delivery.

She noted that these capsules already hold approval from the United States Food and Drug Administration and are used widely in several countries.

In the United States they are a primary option for diagnosing gastrointestinal diseases.

Japan has integrated them into its national health insurance system for more than a decade.

Hospitals across the United

Kingdom's National Health Service have adopted their use to help shorten waiting times for traditional endoscopies.

Similar deployments were highlighted across European and Asian telemedicine programmes.

Local Gap

Dr. Al Dhaen pointed out that Bahrain has begun to experiment with this technology.

Some advanced hospitals already use ingestible capsules as a modern and safe diagnostic tool, especially for gastrointestinal examinations.

She added that adoption remains limited because many patients and doctors still depend on traditional investigative procedures and awareness of the benefits of ingestible devices is low.

She anticipates that usage will grow as public understanding improves and as medical institutions continue moving toward digital transformation.

Research Roadmap

During her presentation Dr. Al Dhaen announced a forthcoming study using the Technology Acceptance Model and the Technology, Organization and Environment model.

The research aims to identify the factors influencing adoption in Bahrain and develop a national roadmap that encourages wider use of ingestible medical devices.

Tampered goods

Three charged after expired food found with changed dates to mislead customers

The Public Prosecution has referred the owner of a commercial food business and two employees to criminal court after inspectors found expired goods on the premises with altered expiry dates.

A hearing is set for 25 November 2025 at the Sixth Minor Criminal Court.

Prosecutors said yesterday they had ordered the three to stand trial for possessing and trading expired food products after changing the dates shown on packaging to make them appear valid.

The Ministry of Industry and Commerce had already shut the establishment after the inspection.

Report

The case started when the ministry filed a report saying its inspection officers seized expired items during routine visits to the shop.

Checks showed the original expiry dates had been replaced

with new ones indicating a longer shelf life, contrary to the true status of the goods, the prosecution said.

A prosecution team moved to

the site after receiving the report, carried out an inspection, and heard the statement of the ministry's judicial officer.

Suspects

Arrest warrants were issued for the suspects, two were taken in and questioned, then held pending the inquiry.

The premises and all food items inside were also seized.

Specialists from the ministry were tasked with taking stock of the goods and testing them to identify expired items, as well as tracking any expired products being sold in the wider market.

The inventory recorded over 600 expired food products.

Forgery expert

The prosecution appointed a forgery expert from the Directorate of Material Evidence to examine samples.

The expert's report found that expiry dates on the tested products had been changed by substituting new dates for the originals.

The Attorney General said the Public Prosecution would enforce the law firmly against anyone who tampers with goods, especially foodstuffs, to protect public health and the safety of citizens and residents.

Court clears man accused of working without permit

A defendant accused of working without a permit has been found not guilty after the Lower Criminal Court concluded he had no link to the case.

The ruling cancels a earlier criminal order that had convicted him, with the judges saying the file does not show proof that he took part in the alleged offence.

His lawyer Sara Atiq had asked the court at a previous hearing to dismiss the criminal order and clear her client.

In a written defence, she denied the charge, disputed the elements needed to prove the offence, and argued that her client was not involved.

In its reasons, the court said it was not satisfied that the second defendant was connected to the incident, noting that fair-trial rules shape the result of a criminal case from start to finish.

It described the presumption of innocence as a basic starting rule that applies to every person, suspected or charged, and said the burden rests on proving the accusation.

The worker actually on site that day was another person, the only worker present at the time.

Court rejects partition of shared property to protect heirs' rights

The Civil Minor Court has dismissed a lawsuit filed by one of the heirs demanding the partition and sale of a jointly owned property. The court found that the property is subject to government restrictions prohibiting any disposal without written approval.

It also ruled that partition or sale would harm the heirs residing in the property—particularly since one of the defendants stated that the house is her only residence and that she refuses to end the state of joint ownership.

This led the court to conclude that the request for partition and sale contradicts the restricted ownership conditions and fails to protect the rights of the

other heirs.

Attorney Manar Janahi, representing one of the heirs, explained that the plaintiff filed the lawsuit claiming joint ownership with the defendants and sought to end the state of common ownership by requesting the property's division, or its sale at public auction if division proved impossible.

Janahi added that her client

objected to ending the state of joint ownership and submitted a detailed memorandum confirming his position.

Case documents revealed that the property lies within a government housing project, and that its ownership was granted under conditions requiring that the house be used for the residence of the original beneficiary and passed on to his heirs.

The Northern Governorate, in cooperation with the French Embassy, organised today's "Archaeology Walkathon", a five-kilometre cultural event designed to highlight Bahrain's archaeological significance and promote public engagement with key heritage sites.

Participants assembled at

Qal'at Al Bahrain, where Dr Salman Ahmed Ibrahim Al Mahari, Director General of Antiquities, delivered opening remarks emphasising the importance of safeguarding Bahrain's historic landscape and expanding public awareness of its cultural depth.

French Ambassador to Bahrain Éric Giraud addressed attendees immediately afterwards, reaffirming his strong personal interest in the Kingdom's archaeological sites.

Genuine treasures

In an interview with the Daily Tribune, he described these locations as "genuine treasures", noting that since arriving in Bahrain two years ago, he has developed a deep appreciation for exploring them.

He added that today's walk coincides with the 20th anniversary of Qal'at Al Bahrain's inscription on the UNESCO World Heritage List, and highlight-

ed 50 years of uninterrupted French-Bahraini archaeological collaboration, a partnership that has produced significant discoveries and reinforced global understanding of Bahrain's ancient civilisations.

Ambassador Giraud also shared a light personal detail,



mentioning his weekly enjoyment of Bahraini tikka.

Guided tours

Two groups – Arabic-speaking and English-speaking – departed on parallel guided tours.

The route began with an over-



view of Qal'at Al Bahrain's layered historical narrative, before continuing through the agricultural areas surrounding Al Qalah village.

Participants then visited a natural spring in Hillat Abdul Saleh, once a source of freshwater but now affected by salinity.

A brief stop in Al Maqsha offered refreshments, including karak, before the groups proceeded to Al Hajar and Abu Saiba, where guides outlined the significance of the ancient burial mounds and the tradition of burying valuable personal items with the deceased in belief of an afterlife.

Traditional food

The walk concluded at the Abu Saiba archaeological zone, where participants were served traditional food such as chick-peas, milk tea, baqsam, and dates.

G20 threatened by geopolitical fractures, leaders warn

The G20's role in fixing economic crises is threatened by geopolitical fractures, leaders warned yesterday at a summit in South Africa boycotted by the United States.



The G20 comprises 19 countries plus the European Union and the African Union, and accounts for 85 percent of the world's GDP and two-thirds of its population.

S.Africa says president will not hand G20 to US embassy official

Johannesburg, South Africa

President Cyril Ramaphosa will not hand the next presidency of the G20 to a US embassy representative after President Donald Trump refused to attend this weekend's summit, the South African government said yesterday.

The Trump administration has boycotted the Johannesburg meeting that wraps up on Sunday and said it would send the charge d'affaires of its US embassy in South Africa for the handover, with Washington assuming the 2026 presidency of the group of leading economies.

European leaders attending the G20 summit -- the first held in Africa -- huddled on its sidelines to push back at a unilateral plan by US President Donald Trump aimed at ending the war in Ukraine on terms favouring Russia.

In a joint statement issued with Canada and Japan, they said Trump's plan needs "additional work" and some of its

Speaking at the opening of the summit, one of the statement's signatories, French President Emmanuel Macron said: "We are struggling to resolve major crises together around this table."

He warned that, given fissures in international cooperation, "the G20 may be coming to the

end of a cycle". "There's no doubt, the road ahead is tough," agreed British Prime Minister Keir Starmer -- who also signed the statement -- adding: "We need to find ways to play a constructive role again today in the face of the world challenges."

Chinese Premier Li Qiang said "unilateralism and protectionism are rampant" and "many people are pondering what exactly is happening to global solidarity".

But the summit's host, South African President Cyril Ramaphosa, downplayed Trump's absence and argued the G20 remained key for international cooperation.

"The G20 underscores the value of the relevance of multilateralism. It recognises that the challenges that we face can only be resolved through cooperation, collaboration and partnership," Ramaphosa said. The Johannesburg summit was undermined by the American boycott, and China's Li stood in for an absent President Xi Jinping, while Russia sent a Kremlin official, Maxim Oreshkin, instead of President Vladimir Putin, who is wanted under an International Criminal Court warrant.

Moody's upgrades Italy credit rating on 'policy stability'

Washington, United States

US ratings agency Moody's lifted Italy's credit rating on Friday, citing "a consistent track record of political and policy stability," while shifting the country's outlook from positive to stable.

The move raises Italy's ratings from "Baa3" to "Baa2," and comes after the eurozone's third-largest economy also won upgrades from Fitch Rat-

ings and S&P earlier this year.

Moody's said Friday that stability in Italy "enhances the effectiveness of economic and fiscal reforms and investment implemented under the National Recovery and Resilience Plan."

The agency added that this points to the prospects of more policy actions supporting growth and fiscal consolidation beyond the plan's deadline in August next year.

Amazon summit seals climate deal without fossil fuel plan

Belem, Brazil

Nations clinched a deal at the UN's COP30 climate summit in the Amazon Saturday without a roadmap for phasing out fossil fuels as demanded by the European Union and other countries.

Nearly 200 countries approved the deal by consensus after two weeks of fraught negotiations in the Brazilian city of Belem, with the notable absence of the United States as President Donald Trump shunned the event.

Applause rang out in the plenary session after COP30 president and Brazilian diplomat Andre Correa do Lago slammed a gavel signalling its approval.

The EU and other nations had pushed for a deal that would call for a "roadmap" to phase out fossil fuels, but the words do not appear in the text.

Instead, the agreement calls on countries to "voluntarily" accelerate their climate action and recalls the consensus reached at COP28 in Dubai. That 2023 deal called for the world to transition away from fossil fuels.

The EU, which had warned that the summit could end without a deal if fossil fuels were not addressed, accepted the watered-down language.

"We're not going to hide the fact that we would have preferred to have more, to have more ambition on everything,"

EU climate commissioner Wopke Hoekstra told reporters.

"We should support it because it is at least going in the right direction," said Hoekstra.

More than 30 countries including European nations, emerging economies and small island states had signed a letter warning Brazil they would reject any deal without a plan to move away from oil, gas and coal.

But a member of an EU delegation told AFP that the 27-nation bloc was "isolated" and cast as the "villains" at the talks.

The push to phase out oil, coal and gas -- the main drivers of global warming -- grew out of frustration over a lack of follow-through on the COP28 agreement to transition away from fossil fuels.

French ecological transition minister Monique Barbut had accused oil-rich Saudi Arabia and Russia, along with coal producer India and "many" other emerging countries, of refusing language on a fossil-fuel phaseout.

She said Saturday the text was bland but that there was "nothing extraordinarily bad in it."

The deal caps a chaotic two weeks in Belem, with Indigenous protesters breaching the venue and blocking its entrance last week and a fire erupting inside the compound on Thursday, forcing a mass evacuation.

◆ **The owner of the UK** tabloid Daily Mail struck a £500 million (\$654 million) deal with US-Emirati consortium RedBird IMI for the purchase of The Telegraph newspaper, The Daily Mail and General Trust said yesterday. "DMGT has signed an agreement with Redbird IMI over the acquisition of the Telegraph Media Group at a valuation of £500 million", DMGT said in a press release sent to AFP. The DMGT's potential purchase of its rival 170-year-old newspaper could make it one of the biggest right-leaning media groups in the UK and conclude the protracted sale marked by government intervention. It comes a week after US investment group RedBird Capital Partners abruptly abandoned its takeover, reigniting uncertainty over the paper's future. DMGT, which also owns national newspapers Metro and The i Paper, said it would enter a period of exclusivity to finalise the terms of the transaction, which the parties "expect to happen quickly".

Gunmen seize 315 in latest Nigerian mass school kidnapping

◆ **Gunmen have** kidnapped more than 300 students and teachers in one of the largest mass kidnappings in Nigeria, a Christian group said yesterday, as security fears mounted in Africa's most populous nation. The early Friday raid on St Mary's co-education school in Niger state in central Nigeria came after gunmen on Monday stormed a secondary school in neighbouring Kebbi state, abducting 25 girls. The Christian Association of Nigeria (CAN) had earlier reported 227 people seized, but the new number came "after a verification exercise" following the early Friday mass kidnapping, and added that "The total number of victims abducted ... is now 303 students and 12 teachers". The number of boys and girls kidnapped from St Mary's is almost half of the school's student population of 629. The Nigerian government has not commented on the number of students and teachers abducted.

First saplings from felled UK tree to be planted

The first five saplings grown from one of the UK's most iconic trees after it was deliberately felled will be planted yesterday, organisers said. Until September 2023, the tree had stood for nearly 200 years in a dramatic dip next to Hadrian's Wall, a Roman-era UNESCO World Heritage site in northern England. Known as the Sycamore Gap tree, it was so striking it featured in the 1991 Hollywood film "Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves". Two men were jailed for more than four years in July for felling it. Now some 49 saplings grown from the tree will be planted, including half next

week during UK National Tree Week, the National Trust conservation charity which protects historic places said. Director General Hilary McGrady praised "quick thinking" Trust conservationists who took cuttings in the wake of the vandalism that had "allowed the Sycamore Gap tree to live on". "The team has cared for these 49 hopeful saplings beautifully and they're now ready to be given to communities," she said. McGrady said each tree would "become a source of inspiration, a place to reflect, a home for nature or simply a reminder that there are always good things worth fighting for, even after something so senseless".

Aftershocks rock Bangladesh as quake death toll rises to 10

Two minor tremors hit Bangladesh yesterday, a day after a powerful earthquake struck outside the capital Dhaka and killed at least 10 people.

A 3.3-magnitude jolt was recorded in Narshingdi district, east of Dhaka, in the morning, followed by a 4.3-magnitude quake that struck the capital around 6:00 pm (1200 GMT), according to the Bangladesh Meteorological Department.

Dhaka resident Tasnuba Sharmin Sharna, 32, said her children started screaming as the furniture in their apartment began shaking.

"We are praying to God for mercy," Sharna told AFP.

Friday's deadly earthquake was felt in Dhaka and neighbouring districts, causing widespread destruction.

Updating earlier tolls from the 5.5-magnitude quake, disaster

management official Ishtiaque Ahmed told AFP that "the number of casualties has reached 10, while a few hundreds were injured".

There were no immediate reports of casualties on Saturday, but the aftershocks -- which are common after major earthquakes -- have added to fears of an even

greater disaster. "I don't feel safe yet, as there was another jolt this morning... Maybe we are next," said Shahnaj Parvin, 44, who lives near the epicentre of Friday's earthquake and told AFP she had never experienced such a tremor. Cracks have developed in dozens of houses in her area, she

said. "I was hanging my children's clothes on the washing line when the tremor struck," added Parvin. "I held onto a mahogany tree, and when I returned home, I found my glassware broken."

The government has activated Bangladesh's emergency operation centre to assess the scale of the damage and to coordinate relief and rescue operations.

Rubayet Kabir of the Meteorological Department's Earthquake Observation and Research Center said Bangladesh's geography makes the country of 170 million people prone to quakes.

"That's why we experience earthquakes quite frequently, though they are not as strong as the one" on Friday, he told AFP.

"Some small tremors are expected after any major earthquake," Kabir said.

"There has been no massive earthquake in the last 100 years or more, but Bangladesh has been vulnerable for quite some time."

Climate activists dye Venice's Grand Canal green

Climate activists dyed Venice's Grand Canal green Saturday, as countries at a UN climate conference in Brazil struggled to agree on the crucial issue of phasing out of fossil fuels.

Extinction Rebellion said its activists released an environmentally harmless dye into canals, rivers, lakes and fountains in a total of 10 Italian cities to highlight "the massive effects of climate collapse".

Greta Thunberg was present at the "Stop Ecocide" protest in Venice, where demonstrators dressed entirely in red with veils over their faces walked slowly through curious crowds of tourists, images showed.

The green dye was also poured into the Po river in Turin, the Reno river in Bologna, the Tara

river in Taranto, as well as fountains in Padova and Genoa, the activist group said. Negotiations at key UN climate

talks in Brazil ran into overtime on Saturday with no agreement struck and delegates still locked in a bitter fight over whether to mention fossil fuels in the final text. At stake at the Belem talks is securing a deal that paves the way for faster cuts to planet-warming emissions that are driving ever more extreme weather.

"The most important global summit to define international political agreements aimed at countering climate and social collapse is drawing to a close, and once again this year, Italy has been among the countries blocking the most ambitious proposals," said activist Paola as quoted by Extinction Rebellion, whose surname was not provided.

Brazil's Bolsonaro jailed over alleged bid to break ankle bracelet and flee

Brazil's former president Jair Bolsonaro was taken from house arrest into police custody yesterday after the Supreme Court accused him of trying to break his ankle bracelet and plot an escape.

The far-right firebrand was sentenced to 27 years in prison over a scheme to stop leftist Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva from taking office after the 2022 elections -- a ruling he is still appealing.

Supreme Court judge Alexandre de Moraes said Bolsonaro's arrest was a preventive measure as he is a "high flight risk," and not the execution of his sentence.

Bolsonaro, who governed Brazil from 2019 to 2022, was placed under house arrest in August and has been confined to an upscale condominium in the capital Brasilia.

In his ruling, Moraes said that a planned vigil outside the condominium called by the former leader's son Flavio Bolsonaro on Saturday could cause turmoil that would "create an environ-

ment conducive to his escape." Flavio urged supporters to "fight for your country" in a video calling for the vigil.

The judge said there had been an "attempt to break" Bolsona-

ro's ankle bracelet early Saturday as part of a plan to "ensure the success of his escape, facilitated by the confusion caused by the demonstration called by his son."

Moraes also highlighted the proximity of Bolsonaro's home to the US embassy, adding the far-right leader had previously planned to flee to the Argentine embassy to request political asylum.

Bolsonaro is an ally of US President Donald Trump, who said his trial was a "witch hunt" and imposed punitive tariffs and sanctions against Brazil in retaliation. In a statement, Bolsonaro's defense team said his detention caused "deep perplexity" as it was based on a "prayer vigil."

They said they would appeal the detention which "could put his life at risk" due to his alleged frail health.

Ukraine, Europe scramble to respond to US plan to end war

Zelensky has pushed back against the 28-point US plan

Ukraine and its European allies scrambled yesterday to come up with counter-proposals after US President Donald Trump gave Kyiv a tight deadline to approve a deal to end the war that accepts some of Russia's hardline demands.

President Volodymyr Zelensky has pushed back against the 28-point US plan. Russian leader Vladimir Putin has welcomed the proposal, which would force Ukraine to give up land, cut its army and pledge never to join NATO.

French President Emmanuel Macron, German Chancellor Friedrich Merz and UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer met yesterday on the sidelines of a G20 summit in South Africa, the French presidency said.

The huddle was held ahead of a wider meeting on the same topic that would include other European leaders, the presidency said.

Starmer had earlier said the aim was to "look at how we can strengthen this plan for the next phase of negotiations".

European Commission chief Ursula von der Leyen said the

allies should make it clear "that there should be nothing about Ukraine without Ukraine."

US Vice President JD Vance reacted to the criticism of the plan, saying it "either misunderstands the framework or misstates some critical reality on the ground."

"There is a fantasy that if we just give more money, more weapons, or more sanctions, victory is at hand," he added.

Ukraine faces one of the most challenging moments in its history, Zelensky said in an address to the nation, adding that he would propose alternatives to Trump's proposal.

A top Ukrainian official yesterday said Kyiv would launch talks with the US in Switzerland to discuss ways to end the war. The delegation will be led by Zelensky's top aide Andriy Yermak.

The Hidden Price of Our Growing Addiction to Smart Technology

A cuddly cotton doll, equipped with artificial intelligence and marketed as an educational companion for children, recently shocked the world when a U.S. consumer-protection lab discovered it was delivering dangerous and highly inappropriate responses to young users. What was meant to be a harmless "smart toy" suddenly revealed itself as a threat – not only to children, but to the integrity of our increasingly technology-dependent lives.

Users quickly nicknamed it "Chucky-GPT," a playful reference to the horror-film character. Yet beneath the humor lies a chilling truth: this doll may be a small glimpse into a much larger problem. If a child's toy can behave like a rogue device, what does that say about the advanced technologies we are welcoming into our homes with excitement and blind trust?

A similar concern surfaced when an Indian engineer found that his smart vacuum cleaner was quietly collecting data from inside his home and transmitting it to the manufacturer without his consent. The moment he blocked the data flow, the device stopped working altogether – as if its real purpose was surveillance, not cleaning.

No doubt many families in Bahrain already own the same devices, relying on them daily without considering the potential risks. And soon, AI-powered dolls could replace human caregivers, leaving parents comfortable and confident while unknowingly surrendering their children's privacy to machines designed by corporations far beyond our borders.

This should concern us deeply. Our region, rich in strategic importance and natural resources, has always attracted external interest. Today, the battleground is no longer land or oil – it is information. And smart technology has become the easiest, most efficient means of obtaining it.

Just days ago, former Mossad chief Yossi Cohen openly admitted that Israel had planted modified, booby-trapped devices for espionage in several countries worldwide. His statement should serve as a global wake-up call about how vulnerable technology has made every society – not just ours.

We love technology. We chase every new device, upgrade our homes with interconnected systems, and hand our children digital tools that promise education and entertainment. But convenience comes at a price. And sooner or later, that price will be high and irreversible.

Our growing dependence on smart devices mirrors the arc of addiction: easy to begin, nearly impossible to reverse.

AUBH Students achieve 2nd place in first edition of AI Hackathon at MECC 2025

Manama

Students from the American University of Bahrain secured second place in the first edition of the AI Hackathon at the 19th Middle East Corrosion Conference and Exhibition (MECC 2025).

The event took place in Dhahran, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, and brought together more than 1,500 student participants from across the region, marking a highly competitive and prestigious platform dedicated to corrosion and materials innovation.

AUBH team consisted of Jana Abu Sarhan, Laurence Mascarenas, Abdulaziz Ajlan, and Malak Alsalam. The team selected the challenge titled Material Failure Analysis and developed an AI based model designed to identify the root causes of material failure, whether resulting from corrosion or ruptures or various forms of degradation. The project also provides preventive recommendations and proposed solutions, and contributes



to reducing the need for direct human intervention in inspection, decreasing the burden of manual inspection processes, and enhancing industrial safety and operational efficiency. This makes it a promising solution with considerable potential impact across engineering-related industries.

The team was awarded USD 7,500, in addition to USD 10,000 worth of incubation program access, nanodegree grants, and opportunities to collaborate with research and industrial partners. These benefits strengthen the project's sustainability and support its transformation into a scalable and applicable solution.

Dr. Wafa Almansoori, Interim President and Provost at the American University of Bahrain, commented, "We take great pride in the accomplishments of our students, and their second-place result at MECC 2025 showcases their ability to excel on an international stage. This achievement reflects the

strength of the outcomes of our academic offerings and the effectiveness of our learning and research environment. It also demonstrates our students' capacity to develop impactful, technology-driven solutions which align with the university's mission to advance innovation, academic distinction, and the preparation of national talent for future leadership."

The winning students expressed their appreciation to the American University of Bahrain for its continuous support, as well as to the faculty members who played a key role in preparing them for advanced challenges of this level. They noted that the hackathon provided an enriching experience that allowed them to apply their knowledge and skills within a practical and meaningful project. 



Hero's welcome for Bahrain's record-breaking athletes

Bahrain's athletics delegation received a hero's welcome on their return to the kingdom yesterday, following a historic showing at the sixth Islamic Solidarity Games in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. The team played a leading role in Bahrain's best-ever performance at the multi-sport event, contributing heavily to the delegation's record 34 medals. The achievement surpasses Bahrain's previous best total of 23 medals from the 2021 Games in Konya, marking a new era of success for the kingdom on the international stage.

Among the standout stars were Edidiong Odiong and Nelly Jepkosgei, who each struck double gold in the Saudi capital.



Odiong capped a brilliant campaign with victory in the women's 200 metres, her second gold and third medal overall, while Jepkosgei completed her own golden double by adding the 1,500m crown to her earlier win in the 800m.

Bahrain's medal surge on the penultimate day also featured strong silver-medal perfor-

mances from Salwa Eid Naser in the women's 200m, Birhanu Balew in the men's 5,000m, and the mixed 4x400m relay team of Naser, Kemi Adekoya, Musa Isah, and Alaa Sami. Noora Jassim added a bronze in the women's shot put to round out an impressive track and field showing.

Also returning home yes-

terday was Bahrain's fencing delegation, including women's foil silver-medallists Sumaya Albuainain, Ritej Araoud, and Mariam Khan, who were warmly welcomed for their superb campaign that featured a strong semi-final win over Indonesia before finishing runners-up to Oman in the final.

Liverpool stunned by Forest, Chelsea boost title charge

Liverpool's miserable season plunged further on Saturday with a shocking 3-0 home defeat to Nottingham Forest, while Chelsea strengthened their Premier League title push with a 2-0 win at Burnley.

Forest went ahead in the 33rd minute when Murillo smashed home after Liverpool failed to clear Elliot Anderson's corner. Arne Slot was furious that the goal stood, arguing Dan Ndoye obstructed goalkeeper Alisson — similar to the incident that saw Virgil van Dijk's goal ruled out against Manchester City before the international break.

Forest doubled their lead just after half-time through Nicolo Savona, who finished from Neco Williams' cut-back. With Liverpool disorganised at the back, Morgan Gibbs-White added a third in the 78th minute after Alisson parried Omari Hutchinson's effort.

Liverpool have now lost eight of their last 11 games in all competitions and six of their last seven league matches. It is also the first time since 1965 that they have suffered back-to-back three-goal league defeats. Slot said the squad is still emotionally affected by the death of Diogo Jota in a car crash in July, and once again the Reds looked flat and uninspired, slipping to 11th place and eight points behind leaders Arsenal. Alexander Isak was substituted again and remains without a Premier League goal for the club.


At Turf Moor, Pedro Neto's diving header put Chelsea ahead just before the break, and Enzo Fernández sealed the win late on. The victory moves Enzo Maresca's side up to second, three points behind Arsenal. Chelsea have now won eight of their last ten matches in all competitions.

Elsewhere, West Ham let a two-goal lead slip in a 2-2 draw at Bournemouth, new Wolves manager Rob Edwards lost his debut 2-0 to Crystal Palace, Brighton came from behind to beat Brentford 2-1, and Raul Jiménez secured Fulham's 1-0 home win over Sunderland.


