uharraq Municipal Council has approved a set of service proposals, led by a plan to help finish the remaining works needed to open Mohammed bin Hameed Mosque in Arad and a move to address safety and access issues in Al Hidd.

Ahmed Al Mogahwi, a council member, said construction of the mosque in Block 241 was about 90 per cent complete, but work had stalled after the donor funding the build faced financial difficulties.

He said the council had written to the Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs asking it to look at completing what is left so the mosque can open.
