### World Court orders Myanmar to protect Rohingya

he International Court of Justice yesterday ordered Myanmar to take genocide, a ruling cheered by refugees as their first major legal victory since being forced from their homes.

A lawsuit launched by Gam-Nations' highest body for disputes between states accuses convention.

The court's final decision could take years, and yesterday's ruling dealt only with Gambia's request for preliminary measures. But in a unanimous ruling by the 17 judge urgent measures to protect panel, the court said the Roits Rohingya population from hingya face an ongoing threat and Myanmar must act to protect them.
