Explaining more about the deployment of ITS Carabiniere in the Middle East, Pagnotta said that Italy aims to strengthen its on-going cooperation with trans-regional allies and develop relationships with potential partners.

"Main themes of the naval campaign are maritime safety and surveillance, strengthening cooperation and naval diplomacy."

In this regard, he stressed that the South East Asia and Australia naval campaign, which started from Italy on 20 December 2016, reflects an international vision that converges and outlines this century as the "blue one".

"The "blue growth" is

considered a key factor for sustainable development of the countries where the sea is a key resource for growth, employment and scientific and technological advancement," he explained.

The deployment has been organised with the support of Fincantieri, Leonardo, MBDA Italia, Elettronica, Telespazio and Drass.

Workshop assembling used surgical tools shut

he National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA) and Industry, Commerce and Tourism Ministry have shut down a workshop assembling used surgical tools imported from a neighbouring country to distribute in the Kingdom.

The workshop was operating in the backyard of a villa to illegally manufacture surgical tools for the local market, according to NHRA.

"The tools were made in the workshop using construction materials so it could be distributed in the local markets," NHRA explained.

"NHRA coordinated with Industry, Commerce and Tourism Ministry to visit the workshop, which has been operating without a permit from the ministry. All the tools and equipment detected at the workshop were confiscated," the statement added.

Engineering Safety Consultant at the Authority Nada Al Sayigh confirmed that the workshop is not qualified to manufacture and maintain medical tools in accordance to international standards.

But we don't understand how local variety shrimps are being sold in regional markets when Bahraini fishermen are prohibited from catching them. Official statistics show that our fish stock is declining. We demand the export of local fish to be banned by the authorities concerned," he added.

yesterday announced the launch of its new employment reward system 'Taqdeer' to honour organisations that exceeded their Bahrainisation target.

"Any company that has one employee above the LMRA quota is eligible to apply and would receive a financial grant from Tamkeen, said Dr Ebrahim Mohammed Janahi, the Chief Executive of Tamkeen.

This was announced at a press conference held at the Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BCCI) tower.

Dr Janahi said the move is part of Tamkeen's ongoing effort to create more job opportunities for Bahrainis.

Explaining further, Dr Janahi said the reward can be used by the companies to pay

their expenses.

'This can be used for paying municipality fees (not including fines and violations), electricity and water bills, GOSI, CR and SIO fees, health insurance of Bahraini employees as well as their training and development expenses," he said.

The grant can be utilised over two periods (six months each) for expenses incurred over the past twelve months from applying.

Dr Janahi, however, said the size of the financial grant will depend on the points gained.

Points will be calculated based on the number of employees in the company and their average salary.

When asked about the application process, Qusay Al Arayed, Executive Director of Operations told DT News that all required is logging on to Tamkeen web portal and

your company by registering through our website and activate it by visiting any of our branches.

The Bahrainisation rate will be monitored by Tamkeen for over a period of six months, before the first part of the grant will be approved. The payments will be processed over two six-month periods

All relevant invoices and receipts can be submitted through the online portal.

All companies with active commercial registration in Bahrain and exceeds its Bahrainisation rate requirement are eligible for the programme.

He, however, warned that Tamkeen has created an internal monitoring system to prevent misuse. The programme is also fully integrated with LMRA, Al Arayed said.

Meanwhile, Dr Janahi said that Tamkeen is constantly improving its programmes to enhance the prospects of Bahrainis in the job market.

Tensions ease as Sisi meets King Salman



Saudi Arabia's King Salman bin Abdulaziz al-Saud (R) receiving Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi, upon the latter's arrival in the

gyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi received a royal welcome from King Salman as he landed yesterday in Saudi Arabia for a visit to boost ties after months of tension.

Salman, surrounded by key Saudi officials, greeted Sisi as he stepped off the plane in the capital Riyadh and hosted him for lunch, the official Saudi Press Agency said.


The Egyptian presidency announced the visit in a statement on Friday, saying Sisi's trip was in response to an invitation by Salman and aimed at "bolstering strategic relations between the two countries".

It said Salman and Sisi would discuss regional and international issues of common interest".

"The struggle against terrorism which threatens security and stability" in the region and beyond would top their agenda, it said.

Sisi met Salman on the sidelines of an Arab League summit in Jordan last month to break the ice after months of apparent tensions between the two allies.

That encounter on March 29 came days after Egypt announced that Saudi energy giant Aramco had resumed delivering shipments of petroleum products after abruptly suspending them in October.

wo Qatari hunters who endured a 16-month hostage ordeal in Iraq spoke Sunday of their joy at being released, in the first public comments since the group were freed

Mohammed Marzouki was among 24 Qataris and two Saudis who were on a hunting trip in a mainly Shia area of southern Iraq when they were kidnapped in late 2015.

They flew back to Doha on Friday following their release under a complex regional deal linked to the Syrian civil war.

"When I saw the lights

of Doha, I felt like life was beginning again -- my happiness is indescribable, Marzouki told the local Arabic daily newspaper, Al-Sharq.

"My joy at returning to the homeland is a feeling that cannot be described in words.'

A fellow hostage, Khalid bin Dhafer Al-Dosari, told the same newspaper that "all our aches and pains disappeared once we reached our homeland".

The hunting party, believed to include prominent members of the Qatari royal family, were captured in midDecember 2015 and held captive until they were freed on Friday.

There was never any claim of responsibility for the kidnapping of the hunters, who were widely believed to have been taken by militias with close ties to Tehran.

While the terms of the group's release have not been made public, it has been reported that Qatar paid millions in ransom to secure their freedom.

After flying home on Friday, the hunters were met at Doha's Hamad International Airport by the country's emir,

Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani. The release deal was linked to the evacuation of thousands of people from the Syrian government-held towns of Fuaa and Kafraya, long besieged by rebels.

The evacuations marked the end of the first stage of a deal brokered by rebel backer Qatar and regime ally Iran.

Petrol price hikes: Kuwait Court backs government

Kuwait City

Kuwait's appeals court ruled yesterday that a government decision to raise petrol prices was in line with the constitution, overturning a decision by a lower court.

It said the decision to raise prices was within the cabinet's

Ali al-Ali, one of several lawyers who filed the suit against the government, said on Twitter the group intends to challenge the latest ruling in Kuwait's supreme court, whose decisions are final.

Kuwait has been hit hard by a sharp drop in crude prices since June 2014.

The OPEC member recorded a budget shortfall of \$15 billion in the fiscal year to March 2016.

It was the first deficit since the fiscal year to March 1999. In response, the government adopted austerity measures

including hikes in the prices of electricity, water and fuel. In September, it raised the cost of fuel by up to 80 per cent depending on its grade, the first such increase since 1998.

The action was met with stiff opposition by lawmakers. who this month filed motions to question the prime minister in parliament over the price hike and other issues.

Israeli attack on Syria military camp kills 3

Damascus

n Israeli attack on a Syrian training camp near the Golan Heights killed three members of a pro-government militia yesterday, an official from the forces said.

The Al-Fawwar camp in Syria's southwestern Quneitra province is used by the National Defence Forces (NDF), which command some 90,000 fighters across Syria.

The NDF official said that two fighters were also wounded in the Israeli attack, but said it was unclear whether the damage was inflicted by an air strike or shelling.

Another Syrian source inside the training camp said that around 6:00 am local time (0300 GMT), "security guards at the camp saw what looked like three fireballs coming towards the camp.'

"Then there were several consecutive blasts because of the explosion of ammunition warehouses" that firefighters worked hard to extinguish, the source said.

The source also said that they were "Israeli rockets" but could not specify what kind of missiles may have been used.

Invest in Infrastructure, Human Capital: Minister

The Minister of Finance, Shaikh Ahmed bin Mohammed Al Khalifa yesterday urged Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs) to help finance investment in infrastructure and human capital to generate inclusive and sustainable economic growth and create jobs.

"Increased support for developing countries will be critical in helping them achieve their development needs, said the Minister. He also expressed his support to World Bank's strategy of collaborating with the private sector, which improves productivity and job creation.

On the occasion, the Minister also commended the International Finance Corporation (IFC), saying that it had demonstrated its

ability to play a leadership role in mobilising private capital.

However, Shaikh Ahmed said that in order to address the financial costs of fulfilling the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), the IFC should play a leading role in synchronising partnership across the entire WBG, reinforcing the "One World Bank Group" model.

The Minister also highlighted the ability to generate better jobs, particularly for youth and women, as an essential requirement for promoting sustainable economic growth, stability and social

Saudi unveils reforms, reshuffles Cabinet

The series of orders issued also shuffled cabinet, and replaced the head of the army which for two years has been fighting rebels in neighbouring Yemen. Analysts have estimated that restoring the financial perks would put around 50 billion to 80 billion rivals (\$13.3 billion to \$21.3 billion) annually in consumers' pockets

4) Fired minister

Fired Minister of Civil Service Khaled al-Araj, who will be investigated by a committee of the Royal Court. The Arab News reported late last year that Araj was under investigation by the kingdom's anti-corruption commission for the alleged "irregular hiring" of his son.

5) New culture minister

Dismissed Minister of Information and Culture Adel al-Turaifi and replaced him with Awad al-Awad.

6) New information minister

Minister of Communication and Information Technology Mohammed al-Suwaiyel also lost his job, replaced by Abdullah al-Swaha.

Aluminium (Alba) Bahrain yesterday announced financial results for the first quarter of 2017 reporting a jump in its top-line and bottomline performance, driven primarily by higher LME prices.

The company also approved a dividend of BD 29.6 million (US\$78.7m) to be paid from April 2nd

Alba's total sales for the first quarter of 2017 jumped by 22 per cent YoY to reach BD190.4m (US\$506m) versus BD156.4m (US\$416m) for the same period in 2016. The company posted a net income of BD25.6m (US\$68m) compared to BD4.2m (US\$11m) in Q1 2016, an increase of 506pc YoY.

LME cash-average for the first quarter of 2017 was US\$1,850/t up by 22 per cent YoY. LME inventories were

at 1.8m mt in March.

Sales volume during the priod was up by 4.9pc YoY (242,932 mt) and production up by 5.6pc YoY (248,776 mt).

Global physical demand remains healthy with world consumption up by 6pc YoY. Asian demand rose by 7pc YoY led by Chinese consumption (+8pc YoY). MENA demand grew by 5pc YoY driven by major infrastructure spending in Saudi Arabia (+13pc YoY). In addition, demand in North America surged by 3pc YoY supported by firm growth in the auto production while Europe consumption rose modestly by 2pc YoY attributed to good demand in construction and automotive sectors.

World production rose by 9pc YoY supported by Chinese output (+17pc YoY), leading the world market to be in surplus with China

(+664Kt) and in deficit w/o China (-414Kt).

Saudi stocks rose in heavy volumes yesterday as investors cheered news that King Salman had issued a royal decree restoring financial allowances for civil servants and military personnel, while Egypt fell steeply on profit taking.

The allowances were reduced last September as part of austerity measures due to low oil prices. Officials said on Saturday the cuts had been cancelled because of better-than-expected budgetary performance in the first quarter of 2017.

The move is likely to boost consumption, benefiting the retail and food sectors, according to economists at Riyadh-based Alrajhi Capital.

On Sunday consumer cyclical shares, which have been underperforming the market in the past year, were among the top gainers, helping push the index up 1.0pc.

Electronics retailer Jarir surged 8.3 per cent in its heaviest daily trading volume this year and home improvement retailer Saudi Company for Hardware (SACO) jumped 8.9pc in unusually heavy trade.

Shares of the Gulf's largest dairy producer, Almarai, rose 1.7pc after reporting a first quarter net profit of 328.3 million riyals (\$87.55 million), up 13.7pc from a year earlier. Four analysts polled by Reuters forecast a net profit of 337.4 million riyals.

Almarai attributed its improved results to better cost management, lower commodity costs and lower general expenses and said it will continue "to focus on costs control, efficiency gains and cash-flow preservation".

Other sectors such as banks, especially those exposed to the retail segment, are also likely to benefit from the restored allowance to the Saudi, the Alraihi analysts said.

improved confidence in the economy, which is positive for the equities market in general," said Alrajhi Capital.

Sunday also marks the first day of the Saudi stock exchange settling trades within two business days of execution, a practice called T+2, rather than the previous same day settlement.

In contrast to the Saudi market, other bourses in neighbouring Gulf states experienced a quiet day. Kuwait's index edged up 0.1pc in below 10-day average volumes, while in Qatar the index lost 0.4pc, with petrochemicals producer Industries Qatar dropping 1.8pc as crude oil prices fell to a three-week low on Friday.

Stock markets in the United Arab Emirates were closed for a public holiday.

Cairo's index dropped 2.8pc to 12,544 points, it largest single day decline since Jan. 23, as local traders exited positions with all but two of the 30 most traded shares declining, bourse data showed. (*Reuters*)

Less than two weeks after United Airlines prompted a public relations crisis for dragging a passenger from his seat on an overbooked flight, rival American Airlines is being buffeted by its own controversy.

The airline said on Saturday it is investigating video of a flight attendant angrily confronting a passenger who had come to the defence of a sobbing woman with a baby in her arms.

The viral video, filmed by another passenger, shows a distraught mother carrying her baby boarding the plane moments after the flight attendant had apparently forcibly taken a stroller from

her, with other passengers registering shock.

"We have seen the video and have already started an investigation to obtain the facts," American Airlines said. "The actions of our team member captured here do not appear to reflect patience or empathy, two values necessary for customer care."

The incident on the plane -- scheduled to fly from San Francisco to Dallas -- was filmed by Surain Adyanthaya, who posted the video to Facebook account on Friday.

"OMĆ! Flight attendant violently took a stroller from a lady with her baby on my flight, hitting her and just missing the baby,"

she wrote. "Then he tried to fight a passenger who stood up for her."

The video does not show the first part of the incident, and begins with the woman crying uncontrollably as a pilot and other airline employees stand by impassively.

Another passenger waiting to board the plane later described the preceding confrontation to the Los Angeles television station KTLA-TV.

"The flight attendant wrestled the stroller away from the woman, who was sobbing, holding one baby with the second baby in a car seat on the ground next to her," Olivia Morgan told the station. (AFP)

Thousands March for Science across the USA

Washington

Thousands of people joined a global March for Science on Saturday with Washington the epicenter of a movement to fight against what many see as an "assault on facts" by populist politicians.

US President Donald Trump himself passed dozens of protesters on his way to visit wounded soldiers at a military hospital.

"Stop denying the earth is dying," one sign visible from Trump's motorcade read.

Despite rain, protesters gathered around Monument Washington for a festive day of music,



speeches and teach-ins by scientists disturbed by the rise of so-called "alternative facts" around crucial issues like climate change following Trump's election.

"We have no Planet B,"

read one of the signs. Many demonstrators sported "Keep Our Science Great" caps as they arrived from around the country on Earth Day to highlight the importance of science to daily lives.

Iran to air presidential debates live after U-turn

Iran will air live debates on state television ahead of May's presidential election, the interior ministry said yesterday, reversing a decision to show recorded versions that had triggered an outcry.

"After demands by the Iranian nation and the candidates for a review (of the decision), the presidential elections commission campaign decided... that debates may be broadcast live,"

the ministry said in a statement on official news agency IRNA.

The U-turn came days after the commission, which sets campaigning rules ahead of the May 19 poll, said the debates would not be broadcast live as in previous elections, sparking outrage on social media.

President Moderate Hassan Rouhani and his conservative rivals Ebrahim Raisi and Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf all rejected the ban.

Gunmen killed during hunt for militants



Four gunmen have been killed on a Philippine tourist island as President Rodrigo Duterte ordered the military yesterday to kill remnants of an Islamic militant group behind a foiled mass kidnapping attempt there.

Authorities said the dead suspects and three others on the run were stragglers from a boatload of Philippinessouthern based Abu Sayyaf gunmen who sailed to the central island of Bohol this month as part of a plot to kidnap

The raid had signalled an

escalation of the kidnapping threat from the Abu Sayyaf, who are based on remote islands and also blamed for beheadings and deadly bombings, prompting Duterte to vow deadly retribution.

"I told the military: Do not sleep. Find them. Kill them. I want them dead. Do not give them to me alive," Duterte said about the fresh fighting in Bohol.

"They are animals but if you want me to be an animal, I am used to that. We are the same. I can dish out more than what you can," he told people attending a public sports event.


NKorea detains American: SKorea's news agency

AUS citizen has been arrested as he tried to fly out of North Korea, becoming the third American to be detained there, South Korea's Yonhap news agency reported yesterday.

There was no immediate official confirmation of the reported arrest, which would come at a tense time in relations between Pyongyang and Washington.

Yonhap quoted sources as saying the man, identified only by his surname Kim, was arrested last Friday at Pyongyang International Airport on his way out of the

But having failed to find the net in a messy first half, Napoli hit the woodwork twice on their way to an eighth draw of the campaign that leaves them third, nine points behind leaders Juventus and one off

Juventus, bidding for a record sixth consecutive scudetto, host Genoa later on Sunday while Roma are at Pescara on

Belgium midfielder Dries Mertens, who has played as a striker during Milik's injury absence, broke the deadlock seven minutes after the restart with a rare header that gave him his 22nd league goal of the

Sassuolo pulled level seven minutes later largely thanks to Napoli captain Marek Hamsik. His mistimed header back to goalkeeper Pepe Reina was intercepted by Domenico Berardi, who scored in the 59th minute

Napoli should have pulled in front again on 65 minutes but a Mertens free kick rattled off Andrea Consigli's crossbar.

Minutes later, Consigli was quick to collect the ball after Lorenzo Insigne's curler bounced off the inside of the far post.

After those reprieves, poured forward Sassuolo sensing an upset and were almost rewarded 10 minutes from the end when Reina could only parry Paolo Cannavaro's flick-on from a free-kick on the right.

Rangers kicked off at Hampden but it was to be the closest they were to the ball for the majority of the half.

But just as they started to threaten they conceded a penalty from a quick Celtic breakaway.

hesitated in coming to collect Kieran Tierney's through ball allowing Griffiths to run in on goal and the striker was brought down by a horribly mistimed sliding challenge from James Tavernier.

Foderingham nearly made amends as he palmed Sinclair's spot-kick on to the inside of the post but the ball bounced over the line to double Celtic's advantage.

Celtic then had two chances in quick succession with Foderingham tipping over a fierce strike from Griffiths Dedryck before Boyata headed over from close range.

Despite Celtic's dominance Rangers captain Kenny Miller was presented with a golden chance to pull one back when he got on the end of Tavernier's cross, but sent his weak header straight at Craig Gordon. (AFP)



The climb was followed by a long descent to the coast of Kvarner Bay, then another climb to Kastav and from there race led to the city centre of Rijeka. In Opatija, right on the coast began the final and decisive climb back to Učka, and that's where the group became compact.

Bahrain Merida riders showed excellent performance in giving support to Nibali, with the goal of keeping the first position in general classification after the stage, that might be decisive for the whole race.

After the stage, Sport Director Paolo Slongo commented on the sad news of Scarponi's death and the latest stage: "Scarponi had been Vincenzo's teammate for the last

three years and he was very important for him. We spent together training camps, many times with his family and wonderful twins too. We shared with him a lot of moments."

"The news shocked all of us and we're very sad, but our job - that was Michele's too - is racing and so we started today's stage of Tour of Croatia anyway. Maybe with a knot in our stomach, but this is part of our job.

"I can't say that this news influenced the performance of riders today, but for sure the mood of Vincenzo above all was not one of the best, but I don't know if this influenced the victory or not.

"Today's winner was really strong and he deserved to take the stage. At the finish they were three riders fighting for the first place and Vincenzo is not so fast. Anyway he tried to sprint, but he was second.

"What it's important according to me ahead of next aims is that the team worked very well and that rode full speed on the climb".

Alexis Sanchez earned Arsenal an FA Cup final showdown with Chelsea and gave Arsene Wenger renewed hope of salvaging a troubled campaign as the gritty Gunners fought back to beat Manchester City 2-1 vesterday.

When Sergio Aguero put City ahead in the second half of a bruising semi-final, Wenger's side were on the verge of another dispiriting defeat in arguably the worst season of the Frenchman's 21-year reign.

But, despite being outplayed for long periods, Arsenal summoned a spirit and desire too often missing from their performances this Nacho Monreal's equaliser

forced extra-time and Sanchez's predatory finish in the additional period secured a final with date Premier League leaders Chelsea back at Wembley on May

Arsenal's third FA Cup final in the last four years -- they won it in 2014 and 2015 -- gives them a record 20 appearances in the showpiece match of the famous old competition.

Crucially, it presents Wenger with a chance to mute the mounting criticism from his club's supporters who want him to resign.

City came close to striking first when the diminutive David Silva rose to meet Aguero's cross with a header that Petr Cech pushed over.

Silva departed due to injury soon after, but City monopolised possession and Arsenal were often reduced to kicking their opponents out of their rhythm.

Aguero Raheem Sterling combined to bundle the ball into the net just before

half-time, but the goal was controversially ruled out because Lerov Sane's cross was adjudged to have gone out as it looped over the bar before curling back into play.

To City's frustration, television replays suggested a tiny part of the ball was still in play before it reached Aguero.

Yet Arsenal's play still lacked conviction and by the 62nd minute the scoreline finally reflected City's dominance.

When Yaya Toure seized the ball after Aaron Ramsey's mistake deep in City's half, the Ivorian spotted Aguero and sent a long pass towards the striker

Aguero surged away from Monreal and, although his first touch almost ruined the chance, he recovered to lift a deft finish over Cech for his 30th goal this season.

Nadal wins 10th Monte **Carlo title**
