UN chief denounces 'cruellest phase' of Gaza conflict

United Nations chief Antonio Guterres yesterday said "Palestinians in Gaza are enduring what may be the cruellest phase of this cruel conflict" as Israel ramps up its mil-

itary offensive. "For nearly 80 days, Israel blocked the entry of life-saving international aid," he said in a statement. "The entire population of Gaza is facing the risk of famine."

"The Israeli military offensive is intensifying with atrocious levels of death and destruction. "Today, 80% of Gaza has been

either designated an Israeli-militarized zone or an area where people have been ordered to leave."

Israel resumed major operations in Gaza on March 18, ending a two-month ceasefire.

Aid also began trickling into the Gaza Strip on Monday for the first time in more than two

months, amid condemnation of the Israeli blockade that sparked severe shortages of food and medicine.

"Israel has clear obligations under international humanitarian law," Guterres said. "As the occupying power, it must agree to allow and facilitate the aid that is needed."

Trump signs orders to boost US nuclear energy

Washington, United States

President Donald Trump signed a series of executive orders yesterday to boost nuclear energy in the United States, including by rolling back regulatory processes on a still divisive technology. "We're signing tremendous executive orders today that really will make us the real power in this industry," Trump told reporters as he penned the four orders in the Oval Office. Trump's orders aim to speed up the building of new reactors and to boost domestic mining and enriching of uranium, with the United States relying on imports for most of the crucial fuel.

Top Indian lawmakers land in Bahrain for strategic talks

A high-level delegation from India will arrive in Bahrain for a two-day visit today.

Mr. Baijayant Panda, Member of Parliament, leads the delegates which has Members of Parliament, senior political personalities and former Diplomats.

They will hold a series of meetings with senior officials and key stakeholders in Bahrain. The visit comes in the immediate aftermath of the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam and subsequent developments, adding significance to the diplomatic engagement.

India and Bahrain enjoy a longstanding and robust bilateral relationship, marked by strong political ties and growing economic cooperation. In 2023-24, bilateral trade reached USD 1.7 billion, positioning India among Bahrain's top five trading partners.

Investment links have also deepened, with a 40% increase in two-way investments since 2019. From the first quarter of 2023 to the first quarter of 2024 alone, Indian investments in Bahrain rose by USD 200 million, bringing total mutual investments to USD 1.56 billion.

Fintech booms to billions

A 12-fold leap by 2032 positions Bahrain as Gulf's rising fintech force

● **Central Bank reforms and Gulf's first fintech sandbox boost growth**

● **Real-time payments to hit 77% of transactions by 2028**

Bahrain is all set to become a fintech powerhouse in the Gulf, with the sector poised for a twelvefold leap to BD10.4 billion by 2032.

This meteoric rise from BD831 million in 2023, according to research firm DataCube, highlights Bahrain's growing dominance as a leading digital finance hub in the region.

Powering up this transformation is bold regulatory reforms and a wave of innovation by the Central Bank of Bahrain.

CBB's proactive stance has set the tone for the region. From launching

the Arabian Gulf's first regulatory sandbox to establishing a specialised fintech unit, the CBB has laid the groundwork for a thriving digital ecosystem. New regulations now guide everything from digital banking and crypto-assets to open banking, crowdfunding, and online payment platforms.

Instant payment services are surging ahead, with Mastercard forecasting the real-time payment market to hit BD564 million by 2028 — accounting for 77% of all financial transactions in Bahrain. Digital wallets and mobile payment apps are also expanding fast, expected to reach a market value of BD8.36 billion within the same timeframe.

Highlighting Bahrain's fintech leader-

ship, Forbes named four Bahraini companies among the Middle East's top 50 fintech firms in 2025: Tarabut Gateway (open banking), EazyPay (payments), and crypto platforms CoinMENA and Rain. Excluding Tarabut, these firms processed transactions worth over BD5.47 billion last year.

Bahrain's Electronic Fund Transfer System (EFTS), alongside the widely used BenefitPay app and its services — including Fawri, Fawri+, and Fawateer — saw transaction volumes soar to BD33 billion in 2024 alone.

According to DataCube, financial services, banking, and insurance are expected to generate around 21% of Bahrain's total fintech revenue by 2032, up from 17.2% of GDP today. The sector's growth is broad, spanning digi-

UAE hits hottest May on record at 50.4C

The United Arab Emirates recorded yesterday its highest temperature for May since

it began documenting them in 2003 at a sweltering 50.4 degrees Celsius, according to the National Center of Meteorology.

"The highest temperature recorded over the country today is

50.4°C in Al Shawamekh (Abu Dhabi) at 14:30 UAE Local time," it said in a post on X.

"This is the highest temperature we've ever recorded (for May) since we started keeping

records in 2003," the NCM told AFP.

That topped the highest temperature of 50.2 Celsius recorded in May 2009, said the centre.

Latest round of US-Iran nuclear talks ends in Rome

Iran's foreign minister described nuclear talks with the United States as "complicated", following the conclusion of a fifth round of discussions in Rome yesterday.

"The negotiations are too complicated to be resolved in two or three meetings," Iranian Foreign Minister and lead negotiator Abbas Araghchi said, as the Oman-mediated talks concluded. Omani Foreign Minister Badr Albusaidi had said on X, that the fifth round concluded "with some but not conclusive progress", adding that he hoped "the remaining issues" would be clarified in the coming days.

79 miners rescued from S.African shaft, over 100 still underground

Rescuers have hoisted 79 miners who were stuck in a gold mine outside Johannesburg but more than 100 were still trapped underground, the mine's operator said yesterday.

At least 260 miners were trapped underground on Thursday at the Kloof gold mine, 60 kilometres (37 miles) west of Johannesburg, after a hoist used to access the shaft was damaged in an accident, the mining company Sibanye-Stillwater said.

Amid growing global concern, several recent viral videos have stirred controversy over the use of deepfake technology to manipulate public perception. But how confident are you in spotting one?

Deepfakes, the AI-generated videos that alter a person's face or voice to mimic someone else, are no longer limited to science fiction. Fraudsters are now using these digital disguises to impersonate family members, bank staff, and even senior company executives in elaborate scams.

How to spot a Deepfake

- Look for blurry edges
- Watch the mouth closely
- Check if lighting feels "off"
- Notice unnatural blinking
- Listen for robotic voice
- Look at ear, nose lines
- See if shadows shift strangely
- Ask: does this feel real?
- Confirm via another source
- When unsure, always pause

Harder to detect

With today's tools, even lighting inconsistencies and lip-sync errors are expertly masked. Blurred edges around ears or sudden stutters might still give them away, but Woods cautions that companies can no longer rely on human judgment alone. He adds that companies must invest in AI-based identity verification to stay ahead of this evolving threat.

Younger generation at risk

Contrary to assumptions, it's younger adults, aged 16 to 34, who fall prey to deepfake-enabled scams most frequently, according to Rob Woods, citing recent research from the UK that shows this demographic is particularly active on social media platforms where such scams often originate. As deepfakes get sharper, the line between real and fake continues to blur, making digital literacy and caution essential for all.

Professor Marike Patrani Paulsson, Secretary General of Bahrain's Council for International Dispute Resolution participated at the main plenary event of the 13th St. Petersburg International Legal Forum.

The Forum, attended by 6,000 participants and live-streamed worldwide, was held from May 19 to 21, 2025, and assembled an international audience, includ-



ing policymakers and legal experts, under the title "The Law: Lessons of the Past for the World of the Future."

The plenary session commenced with a keynote address by Dmitry Medvedev, the former President of the Russian

Federation and current Deputy Chairman of the Russian Security Council.

The other plenary speakers invited to address the Forum included Professor Paulsson, as well as Ahmed Naser Al-Raisi (President of INTERPOL); Felix Ulloa (Vice-President of the Republic of El Salvador); Karin Kneissl (former Austrian Foreign Minister and chair of G.O.R.K.I at Saint Petersburg State University); and Mateus Saize (Minister of Justice, and of Constitutional and Religious Matters of Mozambique).

Professor Paulsson's speech explored vital themes: historical lessons and the ongoing role of the UN Charter; the critical role of multilateral adjudicative bodies in ensuring due process and access to neutral justice during

conflict; and the complex relationship between sovereignty and the implementation of UN due process mechanisms. She also presented Bahrain's perspective on neutral justice with the creation of its new international hub.

On the sidelines of the Forum, Professor Marike Patrani Paulsson attended a meeting between the plenary speakers and Mr Medvedev to compare perspectives and prospects.

In addition, she had productive talks with Mr Konstantin Chuychenko, the Minister of Justice of the Russian Federation, to discuss future collaboration on promoting arbitration, further strengthening Bahrain's commitment to advancing international dispute resolution.



Residents saved from rooftop as flames consume building

Four people were pulled to safety from the rooftop of a burning residential building in Nuwaidrat early yesterday morning, after a fierce blaze broke out.

Residents nearby and onlookers said they saw thick clouds of smoke spiralling into the sky shortly before dawn.

The incident prompted a rapid response from Civil Defence teams, who arrived to find the trapped residents signalling for help from the roof.

They launched an urgent rescue operation, navigating heavy smoke and intense heat to reach the stranded individuals. All four were safely brought down and treated at the scene by paramedics.

“It was chaos,” said a nearby resident. “The smoke was everywhere and we could hear sirens and shouting. We were worried people were still inside.”

Police cordoned off the area to keep onlookers safe as fire crews worked to control the blaze, which also engulfed several cars parked near the building.



The mixed-use property includes a number of ground-floor shops, and early images show

significant damage to an automotive repair shop.

While the flames were eventu-

ally brought under control, the cause of the fire remains unclear.

Investigators were seen at the

site throughout the day, combing through the debris to determine how the blaze began.

Authorities said they are closely monitoring the situation, but the full extent of the damage has yet to be assessed.

The investigation is ongoing.

Mining rig deal goes bust: court orders BD10,000 refund

A protracted court battle over an undelivered cryptocurrency mining rig ended with the High Civil Court ordering the seller to refund around BD10,000.

Incident leading to the case started three years ago with the victim ordering a cryptocurrency mining machine from a woman for BD9,970.

However, the deal signed in December 2021 was never fulfilled, where the machine was originally promised to deliver in February the following year.

A receipt, dated and signed and bearing the stamp of her sole proprietorship, confirmed the sum had changed hands.

According to the claimant's lawyer, Mohammed Al Mahdi, his client waited well past the deadline before sending a notice asking for the machine. There was no reply. He then took the matter to the Consumer Protection Directorate, which referred the case to the Public Prosecution.

The woman was fined BD1,000 under a criminal order. She objected. Her objection was dismissed by the Lower Criminal Court, which upheld the fine. The buyer submitted the ruling along with records of the

deal as part of the civil claim.

In its judgment, the court said the criminal order, having gone unchallenged within the legal time frame, carried weight in civil proceedings. The facts, it said, were settled. The machine

was neither delivered nor refunded, and the evidence was clear.

The woman had not disputed the receipt or the amount. The court ruled she must pay back BD9,970 and cover the cost of the case including legal fees.

Bus Shelters, Housing Units and Advert Sites

The Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications has invited bids for installing 36 bus shelters across Bahrain, as part of its 2025 works plan.

Union Plastic submitted the highest offer at BD 510,705.112, while Awal Plastic submitted the lowest at BD 364,056.000. The shelters form part of a broader effort to improve public transport services.

Separately, the Ministry of Housing is moving ahead with plans to construct 512 social apartment units in Madinat Salman. The project will be carried out on Island 12 and will span plots 15, 18 and 19. Madinat Salman lies on reclaimed land off Bahrain's northern coast, across from Budaiya, and is being developed as a mixed-use community designed to help meet demand for social housing.

Fifteen contractors have submitted bids for the housing project. These include Santy Excavation and Contracting, Granada Contracting, Aseeri Engineering and Contracting, Mohammed Abdulmohsin Al

Kharafi & Sons, Al Ghanim General Trading and Contracting, Sayed Kadhem Al Durazi & Sons, Al Ghanim International, the Al Khunaizi Group, Ahmed Mansoor Al Aali, Dar Al Khaleej, Almoayed Contracting, Smart Skyline Contracting and Cebarco Bahrain. The ministry has already issued four tenders in Madinat Salman this year. Three fall under the Government Land Development Programme and account for a combined total of 649 homes.

Also, the Capital Municipality is seeking contractors for the lease and maintenance of 171 Mobiz advertising sites located in Seef, Zinj, Sehla, Tubli, Adliya, Juffair, the Diplomatic Area and Al Hoora.

Four advertising firms submitted offers. The highest came from Adline Media at BD 1,603,541.146, while the lowest was put forward by Group Plus Advertising at BD 338,623.092. The work is expected to improve the appearance of advertising across the city and ensure regular upkeep of the sites in line with accepted standards.

Blaze at Arad farm brought under control; no injuries reported

Civil Defence forces swiftly contained a fire that broke out at a farm in the Arad area yesterday.

While no injuries were reported, the blaze reportedly spread to engulf several vehicles in the vicinity. Firefighters worked quickly to prevent further damage and ensure public safety.

The exact cause of the fire remains unknown, and an investigation is currently underway to determine how the blaze started.



Seizure no excuse: Court orders compensation in crash case

● Court awards BD13,374 to woman injured in car crash

The Fourth Civil Court has ordered an insurance company and one of its policyholders to jointly pay BD13,374 in compensation to a woman injured in a traffic accident caused by the insured driver.

The plaintiff, a woman in her fifties, sustained serious injuries in the collision, including multiple rib fractures, spinal dam-

age, a fractured pelvis, and soft tissue injuries to her right leg, according to medical reports submitted in court. Her injuries were assessed to result in a 20% permanent disability.

Lawyer Sahar Nabil, rep-

resenting the woman, argued that the accident was a result of the driver's failure to observe road safety measures. A criminal court had earlier found the driver guilty and sentenced him to one month in prison.

The defence claimed that the driver had suffered a seizure and lost consciousness at the time of the crash, invoking force majeure as a reason to dismiss liability. However, the court rejected this argument, stating that the driver was aware of his medical condition and had a duty to avoid situations where it could pose a risk to others.

The court ruled that the driver's condition did not constitute an unforeseeable event and found both the driver and the insurance company liable for the injuries and damages caused.

In its final ruling, the court awarded the plaintiff BD13,374, including legal interest of 3% from the date the claim was filed until full payment, and ordered the defendants to cover all court fees and legal expenses.

Lawyers' case thrown out over missing file number

A court has dismissed a case brought by two lawyers after they failed to include the correct case number in their petition, a misstep that ultimately led to their claim being rejected.

The lawyers had filed a complaint against a fellow attorney, accusing her of failing to disclose assets in an enforcement case. However, the Lower Criminal Court ruled the petition inadmissible, stating that the relevant enforcement file had not been clearly identified in the documents submitted.

Defence lawyer Khatoun Ali, representing the accused attorney, said her client had received no formal notification about the case cited. In her defence brief, she denied all charges and requested either a full acquittal or the most lenient sentence available.

Ali also submitted a certificate from the Director of the Notary Directorate, confirm-

ing her client had already filed the necessary disclosure form for the enforcement case that was allegedly overlooked.

The court found no grounds for conviction. It reviewed records of electronic notifications and found the defendant had been informed of multiple enforcement cases—but not the one named in this particular dispute.

Without the correct case number, the court said it could not be satisfied that due notice had been served or that a failure to disclose had occurred. The petition was dismissed accordingly.

Trump threatens 25% tariff if iPhones not made in US

Trump fires new 50% tariff threat at EU, drawing stiff response

Stock markets fell back yesterday after US President Donald Trump ended a lull in his trade war with threats of massive tariffs on Apple products and imports from the European Union.

Wall Street's main indexes were all down around 1% two hours into trading, with the tech-heavy Nasdaq at one stage losing 1.5% before rallying while Apple shares sank 2.5%.

with losses of around 1.5%, paring slightly earlier losses, with shares in luxury and car companies taking a hit after Trump suggested he would hit the EU with 50-percent tariffs.

London's FTSE 100, which initially rose, also ended in the red.

Germany's DAX had also been higher earlier in the day as German economic growth data was revised up.

"What is somewhat of a surprise is the fact that the EU will now face a considerably higher tariff rate than China, an almost unthinkable scenario just a matter of weeks ago," said Lindsay

James, investment strategist at Quilter.

"It is highlighting that much of this policy is designed to be punitive, rather than having any economic credibility to it."

Oil prices rebounded, meanwhile, having earlier dropped by around 1%, while the dollar remained under pressure.

Trump's new threats revived investor concerns about his trade policies after a recent deal with Britain and a tariffs truce with China.

"All the optimism over trade deals wiped out in minutes -- seconds, even," said Fawad

Razaqzada, market analyst at StoneX.

Trump said on his Truth Social platform that he was "recommending a straight 50% Tariff on the European Union" from June 1 as "discussions with them are going nowhere!"

"The EU is one of Trump's least favourite regions, and he does not seem to have good relations with its leaders, which increases the chance of a prolonged trade war between the two," said Kathleen Brooks, research director at trading platform XTB.

The US president had announced 20-percent tariffs on EU goods last month but suspended the measure to give space for negotiations.

Trump, however, maintained a 10-percent levy on imports from the 27-nation bloc and nearly every other nation around the world, along with 25-percent duties on the car, steel and aluminium industries.

He also threatened on Friday to hit Apple with a 25-percent tariff if its iPhones are not manufactured in the United States.

"Trump's attack on Apple

looks like one of his negotiating tactics to us," Brooks said, noting that the threat comes as his tax-cut plan faces Senate debate after passing the lower house of Congress.

Trump's social media outburst rocked stock markets which had steadied following losses over concerns about the ballooning US debt and rising US borrowing costs.

Investors were already on edge after Moody's stripped the United States of its top-tier credit rating and the House of Representatives approved Trump's tax cut plan, which critics say would add to the country's debt pile.

The yield -- or borrowing cost -- on 10-year and 30-year US government bonds surged this week as investors worried about the fiscal health of the world's biggest economy.

The yields eased late Thursday.

Trump's tax package, which now goes to the Senate, had faced scepticism from fiscal hawks who fear the country is headed for bankruptcy.

Independent analysts warn it would increase the deficit by as much as \$4 trillion over a decade, although the White House insists it will spur growth of up to 5.2%, projections well outside the mainstream consensus.

Pakistan, India extend airspace ban on each other

Pakistan had closed its airspace to Indian aircraft on April 24, while India took a similar measure days later, with the ban to last until May 23.

Journeys from India to Central Asia, Europe and North America take up to two hours longer.

Pakistan and India's aviation authorities said yesterday they would extend an airspace ban on each other's airlines, after the worst violence between the nuclear-armed rivals in decades.

It comes a month after the deadly April 22 attack on Indian tourists in Kashmir, which sparked a four-day military conflict between India and Pakistan.

More than 70 people were killed in missile, drone and artillery fire until a ceasefire was announced on May 10.

Pakistan had closed its airspace to Indian aircraft on April 24, while India took a similar measure days later, with the ban to last until May 23.

"No flight operated by Indian airlines or operators will be allowed to use Pakistani airspace," Pakistan's Civil Aviation Authority said in a statement, adding that the ban had been extended until early morning on June 24.

"This ban will also apply to Indian military aircraft."

India's Ministry of Civil Aviation returned in kind, saying it "extends (Notice to Airmen) for Pakistan flights for one month", until June 23.

Pakistan's decision to close its airspace to carriers from its neighbour has seen journeys from India to Central Asia, Europe and North America take up to two hours longer.

And the extra flying time may eventually make flights more expensive.

Indian government data shows that when Islamabad closed its airspace in 2019 -- after New Delhi hit it with airstrikes in response to an attack in Kashmir -- domestic airlines saw a financial cost of nearly 5.5 billion rupees (\$64.3 million) during the nearly five-month-long shutdown.

Melania Trump uses AI vocal replica to narrate audiobook

US First Lady Melania Trump warned recently of the danger of AI deepfakes. Now she is releasing an audiobook narrated by an artificial intelligence-generated version of her own voice.

The 55-year-old wife of President Donald Trump announced the release of the seven-hour recording -- which retails for \$25 -- in a social media post on Thursday.

"My story, my perspective, the truth," narrates a voice in the Slovenian-born former model's distinctive accent, over a short black and white video featuring computer-gen-

erated graphics of her face.

Whether it's Melania herself who is speaking in the video, or her AI doppelganger, is not made clear.

She then writes in the same post: "I am honored to bring you Melania -- The AI Audiobook -- narrated entirely using artificial intelligence in my own voice."

"Let the future of publishing begin."

The website for the audiobook says the "AI-generated replica" of Melania Trump's voice was "created under Mrs. Trump's direction and supervision."

"Multiple" foreign language versions would be available later this year, it added.

UK newspaper The Telegraph set for US ownership

London, United Kingdom

British right-wing newspaper The Telegraph has agreed a takeover by US investment group RedBird Capital Partners, ending a two-year saga marked by UK government intervention over press freedoms.

RedBird has struck an "in-principle agreement" to purchase The Telegraph Media Group (TMG), which comprises the 170-year-old paper's print and online operations, for £500 million (\$670 million), the pair announced in a statement on Friday.

It concludes a protracted sale that involved an intervention by the previous Conservative government.

US-Emirati consortium RedBird IMI, comprising Redbird Capital, had already struck a deal for TMG in late 2023.



News in brief

US tightens security after murder of Israeli embassy staff ♦ Police have beefed up security at schools and religious buildings across Washington, as the US Capitol reeled from the fatal shooting of two Israeli embassy staffers outside a Jewish museum. The 31-year-old Chicago man accused of Wednesday's attack shouted "Free Palestine" as he was taken away by police – exacerbating fears over rising antisemitism since Israel's invasion of Gaza following the unprecedented Hamas attack.

Defendants accused of stealing \$10 million in jewellery from reality TV star Kim Kardashian in Paris in 2016 asked for forgiveness yesterday as the court prepared to deliver its verdict. Nine men and one woman have been standing trial since April, with prosecutors seeking the toughest jail terms -- 10 years -- for the four men accused of carrying out the robbery. Kardashian, then 35, was robbed while staying at an exclusive hotel in the French capital on the night of October 2-3, 2016.

Several people were killed when a small plane crashed onto a California neighbourhood before dawn Thursday, destroying a home and setting more than a dozen cars on fire. At least 10 houses were hit by debris and vehicles on both sides of one street went up in flames when the Cessna 550 slammed into the ground, spewing burning jet fuel in a part of San Diego that is home to military families. San Diego Fire Department Assistant Chief Dan Eddy told reporters one house had been badly damaged, but that no one on the ground had been seriously hurt.

Dubai eatery gets 3 Michelin stars in first for Indian cuisine

An Indian restaurant in Dubai was awarded the maximum three Michelin stars Thursday – the first time the prestigious honor has been given to Indian cuisine anywhere in the world.

The crowd erupted in cheers as Tresind Studio was named a three-star winner at the Michelin Guide's fourth Dubai ceremony, along with another Dubai restaurant – FZN by Bjorn Frantzen.

It also marks the first time restaurants in the United Arab Emirates received the top Michelin rating.

"Today I realized what is the word called 'only' and how heavy it is when we are awarded (the three stars) as the only Indian restaurant," said Bhupender Nath, founder of Tresind Studio.

Chef Himanshu Saini, 38, said he felt "proud" that the fine-dining restaurant had made history.

"I hope this motivates all the younger upcoming chefs," he said, adding "it's a dream which is possible."

"I think it's a great time for

Indian food".

Michelin guide international director Gwendal Poullennec called the chef a "pioneer" who had paved "the way for many more talents to join the industry in India."

'Culinary history'

On its website, the restaurant said it aimed to challenge common perceptions of Indian cuisine "by showcasing flavors both new and familiar through a creative lens."

The eatery with just 20 seats and an open kitchen located on the Palm, Dubai's famous man-made island, said it favors ingredients locally sourced from organic and sustainable farmers in the UAE.

"Tresind Studio in Dubai has just made culinary history, becoming the first-ever Indian restaurant to earn Three MICHELIN Stars," the Michelin Guide said on its website.

"While The MICHELIN Guide is not in India, the global spotlight is brighter than ever. Indian chefs in cities from London to Dubai have been rewriting the playbook, fusing time-honoured flavors with boundary-pushing techniques," it added.

Ukraine, Russia begin massive prisoner swap

Largest exchange since 2022 invasion sees 390 freed on first day

- Deal includes 1,000 prisoners from each side over three days
- Russia received 270 troops, 120 civilians, including Kursk residents

Ukraine and Russia began a major prisoner exchange yesterday, which if completed would be the biggest swap since Moscow invaded more than three years ago.

Both sides received 390 people in the first stage yesterday, and are expected to exchange 1,000 each in total under an agreement reached at direct talks in Istanbul last week.

The process is set to last three days, Kyiv said.

The enemies have held regular exchanges since Russia launched its 2022 attack -- but none have been of this scale.

"The first stage of the '1,000-for-1,000' exchange agreement has been carried out," Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said in a post on X.

"Today -- 390 people. On Saturday and Sunday, we expect the exchange to continue."

Russia said it had received 270 Russian troops and 120 civilians, including some from parts of the

Kursk region that were captured and held by Kyiv for months.

The two sides have not yet revealed the identities of those exchanged.

US President Donald Trump earlier congratulated the two countries for the swap.

"This could lead to something big???" he wrote in a post on Truth Social.

Trump's efforts to broker a ceasefire in Europe's deadliest conflict since World War II have thus far been unsuccessful, despite his pledge to rapidly end the fighting.

Each exchange often surprises Kyiv – with individuals believed dead or missing reappearing alive among the freed, including some on missing persons lists for years

After 39 months of fighting, thousands of POWs are held in both countries.

Russia is believed to have the larger share, with the number of Ukrainian captives held by Moscow estimated to be between 8,000 and 10,000.

Kyiv and Moscow have both accused each other of violating the Geneva Convention on the treatment of POWs, with the UN saying prisoners on both sides have been "subjected to torture and ill-treatment."

Shortly before the exchange, Kyiv released a statement accusing the Russian army of executing around 270 Ukrainian POWs since its invasion.

Flood victims confront damage after record deluge in eastern Australia

Flood victims confronted damage from a record deluge in eastern Australia yesterday, returning to find their homes caked in silt, cars half submerged and streets littered with debris.

Four bodies have been pulled from floodwater in northern New South Wales, a fertile region of rivers and valleys about 400 kilometres (250 miles) from Sydney.

The storms dumped more than six months' worth of rain over three days, according to the government weather bureau, smashing records in some areas.

In Taree, one of the worst-hit towns, the swollen Manning River broke a 96-year record.

People picked through piles of sodden trash dumped in the town centre, searching for anything salvageable.

Rescue worker Jason Harvey said the immediate flood emergency was over but the clean up had just begun.

"Emotions were high as we were rescuing a lot of people who are distraught when we get

to them," he told AFP.

"We are now at that clean up stage. I am glad it is over," he said.

The rising tides cut off tens of thousands of people, forcing some to clamber atop cars, houses and highway bridges before helicopters winched them away.

Rescue crews have plucked more than 600 people to safety since the waters started rising earlier this week.

State Emergency Service

head Dallas Burnes warned that even as the floods recede, the stagnant, muddy lakes still poses a threat, including from snakes that may have slithered into homes.

"Floodwaters have contaminants. There can be vermin, snakes. You need to assess those risks."

"Electricity can also pose a danger as well."

He said recovery efforts were focused on "resupplying the isolated communities".

Palestinian faction chiefs quit Damascus amid pressure: faction sources

The leaders of pro-Iran Palestinian factions close to former ruler Bashar al-Assad have left Syria under pressure from the new authorities, Palestinian sources said yesterday, a key US demand for lifting sanctions.

A pro-Iran Palestinian faction leader who left Syria after Assad's December overthrow said on condition of anonymity that "most of the Palestinian factional leadership that received support from Tehran has left Damascus" to countries including Lebanon, while another still based there confirmed the development.

"The factions have fully handed over weapons in their headquarters or with their cadres" to the authorities, who also received "lists of names of faction members possessing individual weapons" and demanded that those arms be handed over, the first added.

Harvard sues Trump administration

University challenges foreign student ban in federal court after visa revocation

● Homeland Security revokes Harvard's authority to host foreign students

Harvard sued the Trump administration yesterday over its move to block the prestigious university from enrolling and hosting foreign students in a broadening dispute, a court filing showed.

On Thursday, Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem revoked Harvard University's ability to enroll foreign nationals, throwing the future of thousands of students into doubt.

President Donald Trump is furious at Harvard -- which has produced 162 Nobel prize winners -- for rejecting his demand that it submit to oversight on admissions and hiring over his claims that it is a hotbed of anti-Semitism and "woke" liberal

ideology.

His administration has already threatened to put \$9 billion of government funding to Harvard under review, gone on to freeze a first tranche of \$2.2 billion of grants and \$60 million of official contracts, as well as targeting a Harvard Medical School researcher for deportation.

"It is the latest act by the government in clear retaliation

for Harvard exercising its First Amendment rights to reject the government's demands to control Harvard's governance, curriculum, and the 'ideology' of its faculty and students," said the lawsuit filed in Massachusetts federal court.

The loss of foreign nationals -- more than a quarter of its student body -- could prove costly to Harvard, which charges tens

of thousands of dollars a year in tuition.

Harvard President Alan Garber said in a statement yesterday that "we condemn this unlawful and unwarranted action.

"It imperils the futures of thousands of students and scholars across Harvard and serves as a warning to countless others at colleges and universities throughout the country who

have come to America to pursue their education and fulfill their dreams," he said.

"We have just filed a complaint, and a motion for a temporary restraining order will follow."

Noem had said Thursday that "this administration is holding Harvard accountable for fostering violence, antisemitism, and coordinating with the Chinese Communist Party on its campus."

Chinese students make up more than a fifth of Harvard's international enrollment, according to university figures, and Beijing said the decision will "only harm the image and international standing of the United States."

North Korea launches probe into warship launch accident

North Korea has begun an investigation into an accident that occurred during the launch of a new warship this week, state media said yesterday, assessing the damage as "not serious".

North Korea said Thursday that "a serious accident occurred" at the Wednesday launch ceremony for the newly built 5,000-ton naval destroyer, in which sections of the bottom of the vessel were crushed -- with leader Kim Jong Un calling the mishap a "criminal act".

South Korea's military said US and Seoul intelligence authorities assessed that North Korea's "side-launch attempt" of the ship failed, and the vessel was left listing in the water.

The North's official Korean

Central News Agency (KCNA), however, said yesterday that an "underwater and internal inspection of the warship confirmed that, unlike the initial announcement, there were no holes made at the warship's bottom".

"The hull starboard was scratched and a certain amount of seawater flowed into the stern section through the rescue channel," according to KCNA.

The extent of damage to the vessel was "not serious", it said, adding it was "necessary to make clear the cause of the accident".

The North on Thursday had blamed "inexperienced command and operational carelessness" for the destroyer's botched launch, which was observed by Kim who called it a "criminal act caused by absolute carelessness".

Gaza civil defence says 16 killed in Israel strikes

Gaza's civil defence agency said Israeli strikes killed at least 16 people yesterday across the Palestinian territory, where Israel has ramped up its military offensive in recent days.

The toll from "Israeli strikes in various areas across the Gaza Strip since midnight" totalled 16 dead, agency official Mohammed al-Mughayyir said.

He said there were also dozens of people wounded in the attacks, which mainly hit the centre and south of the territory.

In Gaza's north, Al-Awda hospital reported yesterday that three of its staff were injured "after Israeli quadcopter

drones dropped bombs" on the facility.

The Israeli army said that over the past day, its forces had attacked "military compounds, weapons storage facilities and sniper posts" in Gaza.

"In addition, the (air force) struck over 75 terror targets throughout the Gaza Strip," it added.

Aid began trickling into the Gaza Strip on Monday for the first time in more than two months, amid mounting condemnation of an Israeli blockade that has sparked severe shortages of food and medicine.

COGAT, the Israeli defence ministry body that oversees civil affairs in the Palestinian

territories, said that on Thursday 107 humanitarian aid trucks entered Gaza. The UN's World Food Programme said the following day that 15 of its trucks "were looted late last night in southern Gaza, while en route to WFP-supported bakeries".

WFP executive director Cindy McCain had previously said some aid was finally reaching Gazans, "but it's moving far too slowly".

Israel resumed major operations in Gaza on March 18, ending a two-month ceasefire.

Yesterday, Gaza's health ministry said at least 3,673 people had been killed in the territory since then, taking the war's overall toll to 53,822, mostly civilians.

leased, that he was willing to do whatever it took to get the flick made.

The 62-year-old actor said: "I knew it was going to be a long shoot. He was like, 'No, no, no. We'll finish in three or four months.' And I said, 'Stanley, look, I'm here for you. Whatever it's going to take we're going to do this.'"

Cruise continued: "I thought the film was very interesting, and I wanted to have that experience. When I go to make a movie, I do a lot of detailed investigation and a lot of time with the people before I commit so that I understand what they need and want and they understand me and how we can work together and really create something very special."

Cruise also found it "exhilarating" to work with Val Kilmer, who died at the age of 65 last month, on the 'Top Gun' movies.

He recalled: "I felt so grateful that he decided to make the film. We did a lot to get him in the movie. Originally, he just didn't want to be a supporting, I want to star in films."



Man City back plea on squad cuts: Guardiola

Manchester City hierarchy supports coach's desire to slash underachieving squad

● Guardiola insists large squad creates unrest, harms team harmony

● Club agrees with Guardiola's call for fewer, more involved players

Pep Guardiola has revealed the Manchester City hierarchy support his desire to slash his underachieving squad next season regardless of their last-day bid to qualify for the Champions League.

The deposed champions head to Fulham on Sunday needing one point to be certain of avoiding a first season without Champions League action since 2010/11.

With the top five in the Premier League guaranteed to reach Europe's elite club competition, City are two points clear of sixth-placed Aston Villa with a vastly superior goal difference.

Defeat in London could spell disaster after their shock FA Cup final loss against Crystal Palace last week.

But whatever happens at Craven Cottage, City manager Guardiola is convinced he must work with a smaller group next season.

Speaking after Tuesday's win against Bournemouth, the City boss threatened to quit if he was unable to reduce the squad be-

cause it was "impossible for my soul" to make so many players unhappy by leaving them out.

But yesterday he played down his threat to resign and insisted he has the support of his employers to cut his squad.

"I was laughing when I said that," Guardiola said. "I'm not

going to quit. But the expression is the same, I don't want players at home with their families when the team is playing. "In the last three weeks, we

had four, five or six players at home -- that is not healthy for any of us, for them especially, for me and the club.

"The club knows it and agrees with me. We will find a solution. Everyone has to have the chance to compete."

City started the season gunning for a fifth straight Premier League title but have been reduced to fighting for a Champions League berth.

But at the end of his first trophyless campaign since 2016/17, Guardiola is relieved his team have their Champions League fate in their own hands.

"It's been a really tough season," he said. "I knew it would come down to the last day in the 95th minute and I was not wrong."

Leclerc dominates Monaco practice

Home hero tops both sessions, boosting Ferrari's hopes despite downbeat forecasts

Local hero Charles Leclerc made light of his own downbeat forecasts by recording a convincing 'double top' for Ferrari in yesterday's opening practice sessions at the Monaco Grand Prix.

The 27-year-old Monegasque, who won last year's race to become the first home winner in the modern era of the Formula One world championship, kept alive hopes of a repeat and boosted Ferrari after a disappointing start to the year.

Leclerc, who on Thursday said he had "low" expectations for this weekend's race, clocked a fastest lap in one minute 11.355 seconds to top the times ahead of championship leader Oscar Piastri of McLaren by 0.038 sec-

onds.

Seven-time champion Lewis Hamilton was third in the second Ferrari, one-tenth down on his team-mate, ahead of Lando Norris in the second McLaren, a result that suggests Ferrari and McLaren may be the teams to beat this weekend.

Liam Lawson, who was dropped by Red Bull after only

two races this season, was fifth for RB ahead of team-mate Isack Hadjar, who had two heavy brushes with the barriers in a session interrupted twice by red flag stoppages.

Two-time champion Fernando Alonso was seventh for Aston Martin ahead of Williams' Alex Albon, Mercedes' new boy Kimi Antonelli and de-

fending four-time world champion Max Verstappen of Red Bull and his team-mate Yuki Tsunoda.

George Russell was 12th for Mercedes, a position, like those of several other drivers, that may not indicate his true potential for qualifying on Saturday when the grid, so important for this race at the tight, narrow and

bumpy street circuit is decided.

After a busy start, French rookie Hadjar triggered the first red flag of FP2 when he smacked the barriers at the Nouvelle Chicane, having clipped the inside barrier and damaging his left rear wheel.

His tyre continued to rotate on the rim as he kept his car moving.

In the interval between sessions, Lance Stroll was handed a one-place grid penalty for dawdling at the hairpin during FP1 and causing an accident with Leclerc who, remarkably, recovered and set the fastest time.

'So dangerous'

When the afternoon action resumed Piastri prompted the second red flag when he hit the wall at Saint Devote, losing his front wing before reversing out

and nursing his McLaren back to the pits.

The lock-up was a rare error by the Australian driver, who leads Norris by 13 points in the championship.

Five minutes later, Verstappen was grumbling furiously about rookie Gabriel Bortoleto's cautious progress in his Sauber at the Swimming Pool. "So dangerous," ranted the champion.

Further confirmation of Ferrari's pace came when Hamilton went top after 29 minutes before Alonso beat him - proof if needed that the two oldest men in the field still have the talent and speed.

Leclerc then climbed to the top of the times. If his Ferrari was not suited to the task, as he said on Thursday, this statement lap was a big surprise for him and his team.

Hamilton tried to match him, but settled for third, 0.486 behind the Monegasque man, a position he lost to a bold lap from Liam Lawson's RB with 17 minutes remaining.

As if to confirm Ferrari's yesterday miracle, Hamilton then rose to second, one-tenth off his team-mate, before being pipped by 0.038 by Piastri with seven minutes to go - time enough for another mistake by Hadjar who smacked the barriers again at Ste Devote.

"So stupid," he told his team.

Pedersen wins Giro stage 13 as Del Toro extends lead

Mads Pedersen won the 13th stage of the Giro d'Italia yesterday as Isaac Del Toro maintained his lead in the battle for the overall title.

Lidl-Trek rider Pedersen burst to victory in the final few hundred metres, holding off Wout van Aert in a thrilling end to a punchy 180 kilometres of riding from Rovigo to Vicenza.

"I went a bit earlier than I really wanted to but on such a hard uphill final like this

sometimes it's okay to go early because everyone has burning legs the last 100 meters," said Pedersen.

Pedersen claimed his fourth stage of this year's Giro while wearing the sprint jersey, closing in on the six wins Tadej Pogacar racked up on his way to triumph at last year's edition of the Italian Grand Tour.

"I'm just happy with this one and adding another 50 points to the 'ciclomino' (sprint) jersey so let's see how it goes," added Pedersen.

Djokovic closes on 100th ATP title by reaching Geneva final

Novak Djokovic moved to within one win of securing his 100th ATP title by defeating a battling Cameron Norrie to reach the final of a clay-court event in Geneva yesterday.

The 24-time Grand Slam champion, playing in Switzerland to warm up for the French Open, missed a match point in the second set before eventually winning 6-4, 6-7 (6/8), 6-1.

"It was the toughest match of the tournament for me so far, three sets," said Djokovic. "(In) the second set, he was a break up and I managed to come back to the tie-break, (I had) a match point, I got a little bit tight there. But I'm really glad how I regrouped in the third and played the best set of the tournament."

Djokovic will attempt to secure his first tournament victory since winning Olympic gold in Paris last summer when he faces Poland's Hubert Hurkacz on Saturday's final.

He is aiming to become only the third player to reach a century of ATP titles after Jimmy Connors and Roger Federer.

The 38-year-old is playing in his first event since splitting from coach and old rival Andy Murray.

He also lost both of his previous matches on clay this season before this week, but appears to be finding form ahead of the start of Roland Garros on Sunday.

Djokovic will start his bid for a fourth French Open triumph and record-breaking 25th Grand Slam singles title when he faces American Mackenzie McDonald in the first round.
