### Myanmar's Suu Kyi moved to solitary confinement in prison



Kyi has been moved from house arrest to solitary confinement in a prison compound in the military-built capital Naypyidaw, a junta spokesman said yesterday. "In accordance with criminal laws... (Aung San Suu Kyi) has been kept in solitary confinement in prison" since Wednesday, Zaw Min Tun said in a statement. Suu Kyi had on Wednesday been "transferred to prison", a source with knowledge of the case said.

### Strikes cripple Britain's railways, unions warn of more to come

bosses, train operating firms and the government faced off over demands that workers' pay increases keep pace with surging inflation. A spike in the cost of food and fuel is pushing many household budgets to the brink and is driving trade unions to demand higher pay increases for their members. The government has urged wage



restraint to avoid an inflationary spiral. Unions formed picket lines around rail stations for the second day this week and warned of more industrial action unless a deal can be reached to improve pay and avoid redundancies.

### India to support crisis-hit Sri Lanka's economic recovery

India's top diplomat held talks with Sri Lanka's president and prime minister

yesterday as India signalled its willingness to go beyond the \$4 billion in loans, swaps and aid that it has already provided its cash-strapped neighbour. Indian Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra, accompanied by other Indian officials, held talks with President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe on providing further financial assistance to the country, the president's office said in a statement.

### • Eight medical personnel are to stand trial accused of criminal negligence in the death of legendary Argentinian footballer Diego Maradona. A

judge has ordered a culpable homicide trial after a medical panel found Maradona's treatment was rife with "deficiencies and irregularities". Maradona died in November 2020 of a heart attack in Buenos Aires, aged 60. He had been recovering at home from surgery on a brain blood clot earlier that month.

### **UK's Johnson defends** migrant deal on Rwanda visit

♦ British Prime Minister **Boris Johnson defended his** controversial migrant deal

with Rwanda on a visit to the country yesterday, telling critics to "keep an open mind". On the first day of a trip to Kigali -- which is hosting a Commonwealth summit this week -- he also heaped praise on Rwandan President Paul Kagame and the achievements of the east African country, despite widespread concerns about its human rights record. Johnson told reporters: "The critics need to keep an open mind about the policy."

Ukraine takes step toward EU membership as Russian forces tighten vise on Donbas cit


