 $\mathbf{B}$ ahrain has made a remarkable climb in the FIBA men's 3x3 basketball world rankings, jumping 84 places to reach 73rd globally and 17th in Asia.

### **Rapid Rise, Strategic Roots**

It's easy to look at the numbers and label Bahrain's ascent a breakthrough, and it is, but the real story lies in how it happened. Back in March, Bahrain sat outside the top 150. Today, they're firmly in the global conversation, and that's largely down to two things: elite-level performances abroad and smart planning at
