# Manchester United sign Sancho on five-year deal from Dortmund

Manchester United have signed England winger Jadon Sancho from Borussia Dortmund on a five-year contract, the Premier League club announced yesterday.

No fee was disclosed but British media reports said Sancho had moved from Germany in a deal worth £73 million (100 million dollars) -- which would make him the second-most expensive English player of all time behind new United teammate Harry Maguire.

Sancho is set to stay at United until June 2026, with the option of a further year.

"I'll always be grateful to Dortmund for giving me the weeks after Sancho, opportunity to play first team together with new football, although I always United team-mate knew that I would return to Marcus Rashford England one day," Sancho told and Bukayo Saka, manutd.com.
