HM King invites Oman Sultan to attend GCC Summit

His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa sent a written message to His Majesty Sultan Haitham bin Tariq Al-Said, the Sultan of the Sultanate of Oman, inviting him to take part in the 46th GCC Summit, to be hosted by the Kingdom of Bahrain in December.

The Kingdom of Bahrain welcomed the efforts undertaken by the US, led by President Donald Trump, to bring an end to the ongoing Russian-Ukrainian conflict.



In a statement, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs said that these efforts are grounded in diplomatic, security, and humanitarian principles and are aimed at promoting peace and stability, fostering mutual understanding and coexistence, supporting economic cooperation, and preventing the proliferation of nuclear weapons.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs described this initiative as a significant diplomatic step toward achieving a lasting ceasefire and reinforcing stability on the European continent.

Bahrain reiterates its support for regional and international efforts to resolve conflicts through dialogue and negotiation, mitigate humanitarian consequences, and advance security and a just and sustainable peace, in full conformity with international law and the Charter of the United Nations.

Zero deaths goal

New traffic rules bring points system, more road cameras to deter dangerous driving

Zero fatal crashes is the aim behind Decree-Law 30/2025, which the Shura Council passed yesterday, raising traffic penalties and introducing a points system that strips licences from repeat offenders.

The decree-law amends the 2014 Traffic Law.

It increases prison terms and fines as Bahrain tries to curb dangerous driving and repeat breaches.

Ali Al Aradi, rapporteur of the Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee, said the changes update the law to match the growth of the road network and the rise in vehicles and drivers.

He said the tougher rules are meant to cut reckless conduct seen in recent years, including extreme speeding, overtaking in banned spots, driving against the flow of traffic, drink- or drug-driving, using a phone at the wheel, and failing to wear a seat belt.

Second Deputy Chairwoman Dr Jihad Al Fadhel said the amendments respond to deadly road behaviour that has harmed innocent families as well as offenders.

"Our goal is to reach zero fatal accidents," she told the chamber, asking the General Directorate of Traffic to show the gains from

the new law in clear figures once it is in force.

She also asked how dash-cam footage is handled under current rules, and how the law keeps pace with the spread of electric and self-driving cars.

Offenders

The lawmaker suggested that some offenders given alternative penalties should be assigned to units treating crash victims, to deepen moral deterrence.

First Deputy Chairman Jamal Fakhro thanked the Ministry of Interior for moving quickly to change the law after a rise in reckless driving.

"What happened in Bahrain recently is outside the nature of our society," he said, adding that the ministry set penalties firmly but without inflating fines to

unrealistic levels.

Review

He urged other ministries to review their laws regularly so they keep pace with social change.

Rashid Bu Najma, Undersecretary of the Ministry of Interior for Legislative Authority Affairs, said the decree-law was drafted on the back of accident figures and field data, which called for urgent action to curb traffic crimes.

He said early signs point to

fewer breaches, but warned against drawing quick conclusions.

"Its effect cannot be studied in three months," he said, adding that a clearer assessment will come after six months of use, and the Council will be given the results once they are available.

Optional

On dash cams, Bu Najma said fitting them remains optional because they are not a formal safety condition for cars.

"We cannot oblige people to install them because they are not a safety requirement," he said, noting that recordings can serve as an indicator rather than conclusive proof after review, and that users must respect privacy rules.

He said electric cars fall under

the amended law in the same way as petrol vehicles, and that a separate law for self-driving cars is being prepared.

Bu Najma also outlined a wider move towards automated enforcement.

Monitoring

He said 500 extra cameras are planned for traffic monitoring, with a small trial run due in December and about 300 expected to go live in the first months of 2026.

The points system will start alongside that rollout, with each offence carrying a set tally and licences withdrawn once repeat drivers hit the limit.

The Shura Council approved the decree-law and sent it to the Speaker of Parliament to notify the government.

Cash cap and new anti-money-laundering checks for gold trade and auditors

Gold and jewellery dealers and external auditors in Bahrain are now covered by a new Ministry of Industry and Commerce decision that lays down updated steps to stop money laundering, terror financing, proliferation financing and the illegal cross-border movement of funds.

The decision was published in the latest Official Gazette and takes effect the day after publication.

Decision No. 105 of 2025 applies to anyone licensed to sell or trade gold and jewellery, and to auditors when they carry out

the specified activities defined under the anti-money-laundering law.

Risk

Its reach also extends to relevant branches and subsidiaries inside and outside Bahrain, according to the level of risk tied to each business.

For gold and jewellery businesses, the rules bar cash payments for any single deal worth BD3,000 or above, or the equivalent in other currencies.

A copy of the customer's ID must be taken for any cash purchase over BD2,000.

Firms must keep a record of transactions for at least five years, and issue a receipt showing the client's details, the sale value, a description of the items and the date of sale.

Auditors performing the specified activities must apply due-diligence checks on clients and beneficial owners, monitor business relationships and one-off transactions, and put internal controls in place.

Measures to protect lives and improve road safety

Shura Council clears decree-laws on traffic violations linked to deaths with heftier penalties and criminal orders

Two decree-laws raising penalties for road-death and injury cases and revising criminal case rules cleared the Shura Council yesterday, with members sending both to Parliament's Speaker to notify the government.

The chamber approved Decree-Law No. 31 of 2025 amending parts of the Penal Code issued under Decree-Law No. 15 of 1976.

The committee rapporteur, Ali Al Aradi, said the measure protects the right to life and bodily safety as core constitutional rights and applies the same punishment to similar acts.

He said the change would help courts deal more precisely with cases of killing or injury by mistake and keep judgments consistent.

Decree-Law No. 32 of 2025, which amends provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedure issued under Decree-Law No. 46 of 2002, also passed.

Criminal justice

Al Aradi said the update completes work to modernise criminal justice rules so procedures match the revised Penal Code and the amended Traffic Law.

He added that maintaining the criminal-order system as an early way to close minor cases would ease pressure on courts and speed decisions in straightforward matters, while leaving fair-trial rights intact.

In the debate, Dr Jameela Al Salman backed the Penal Code amendments, saying they rest on a clear legislative view aimed at protecting lives and improving road safety.

Deterrence

Al Salman described deterrence as both general, aimed at public behaviour, and specific, aimed at repeat offenders, arguing that this would cut accident rates.

She added that tougher punishments work best when three conditions are met: certainty that the rule will be applied, penalties that fit the offence, and quick enforcement by the authorities.

The lawmaker called for continued follow-up and wider public awareness alongside the legal changes.

Dalal Al Zayed said the higher penalties fit a wider move to deal more firmly with acts that cause serious harm or death.

Approach

She supported the approach of combining fines with custodial terms, or allowing either, leaving the choice to the courts. On refusal to assist, she said:

"The crime is the withholding of assistance despite being able to provide it," giving the example of a doctor or an ordinary passer-by.

She said the legal dividing line between misdemeanour and felony rests on the elements of the offence and the penalties set by law.

Lina Qasim welcomed bringing Article 342 of the Penal Code into step with the Traffic Law amendments, saying this should help enforcement bodies apply the rules across the different cases set out in the article.

Evidence

She asked how judges would show that a driver had refused to help despite being able to do so, and what evidence would be used.

The lawmaker also queried how the law would treat deaths that occur later in hospital after a crash, and how the new penalties would affect cases still under trial or on appeal.

Legal Affairs Minister Yousif Khalaf said the difference between "sijn" (imprisonment) and "habs" in Bahraini criminal law tracks the kind of offence rather than sentence length.

"Imprisonment is for felonies, while detention is a penalty for misdemeanours," he said, explaining that although penalties for killing by mistake under the amended Traffic Law have risen, the legislator kept the act classed as a misdemeanour.

He pointed to other Penal Code articles that allow detention terms of up to 10 years while remaining misdemeanours, and said the category is chosen after studying the act itself.

Exception

Khalaf said assigning some of these cases to the High Criminal Court is a written exception in the new text because heavier sentences may reach ten years or more if another aggravating factor applies, allowing a three-judge panel to hear them instead

of a single-judge lower criminal court.

On deaths occurring after a delay, he said liability depends on direct causation from the crash, regardless of timing, and that courts rely on technical expertise to assess that link.

He confirmed that offences committed before the amendments will be tried under the law in force at the time, as criminal law does not apply retroactively.

Controls

The Minister also clarified two controls for penalties that combine detention and a fine.

Where the wording allows detention or a fine, the judge is free to choose, keeping criminal orders available for minor cases.

Criminal orders follow a financial scale, he said: sums below BD2,000 may be decided by a public prosecutor at assistant level, while higher amounts are issued by a judge of the Lower Criminal Court.

Seeds of tomorrow

Students showcase Bahrain's new era of agricultural innovation



● Where young minds cultivate ideas that outgrow classrooms

The Student Agricultural Innovations Expo 2025 opened yesterday at Bahrain Polytechnic, attended by His Excellency Dr Mohammed bin Mubarak Juma, Minister of Education, and Eng. Wael bin Nasser Al Mubarak, Minister of Municipalities and Agriculture, together with the Secretary-General of the National Initiative for Agricultural Development and senior ministry officials

The ministers moved among the stands, tested prototypes and spoke directly with pupils from public and private schools who displayed practical, locally relevant projects.

AI-driven robot

In an exclusive interview with The Daily Tribune, students from New Vision School presented AgroGuard, an AI-driven robot designed to monitor plant health.

The system uses a camera to analyse foliage for signs such as healthy leaves, yellowing from nutrient deficiency, fungal infections or dryness.

When a problem is detected,

AgroGuard transmits signals through its software to trigger relevant treatments.

The team told the Daily Tribune the project targets Bahrain's high temperatures and limited water resources and aims to reduce crop losses by enabling earlier diagnosis and intervention.

Sustainability lab

In another exclusive interview with The Daily Tribune, Bayan Bahrain School showcased Eco-Lab 360, a school-level sustainability lab that recycles grey water from the kitchen through multi-stage filtration for use in irrigating campus plants.

The students reported the system recycles roughly 3,000 litres a month.

They also demonstrated a soil-analysis app: users measure soil properties, enter the data and receive recommenda-

tions for the best crop, irrigation schedule and fertiliser regime.

The team plans to integrate robotic automation to simplify home and small-scale gardening.

Vertical hydroponic system

Al Hikma School's Harvest Heights — also explained in an exclusive interview — is a vertical hydroponic system designed to maximise production in tight spaces.

The static tower supports 36 plants; solar panels charge lithium-gel batteries that run DC pumps to deliver water and organic nutrient solution evenly through pipe work and gravity feed.

The students emphasised the system's suitability for Bahrain's limited arable land and arid conditions, offering a compact model for urban and school gardens.

Sheikh Khalifa bin Salman In-



stitute — Solar water generation Purifying and harvesting water In an exclusive conversation with The Daily Tribune, student Ahmed Gharib from the Sheikh Khalifa bin Salman Institute of Technology displayed a hybrid water-production prototype that purifies non-potable water using solar concentration to create steam, then condenses and collects the purified liquid.

The design also includes a method to extract moisture from air by creating a cold surface for condensation. The system relies on solar panels (including recycled units), a low-voltage heater, a cooling unit with a compressor and a stored-water tank. A support module using batteries and a generator provides backup power; the team said they incorporate AI for automated control and voice-assistant compatibility for user commands.

Practicality over novelty

Across the hall, a consistent theme emerged: the students built solutions tightly calibrated to Bahrain's realities — heat, scarce water and limited farming space — and focused on practicality over novelty.

Ministers engaged with the teams, asking technical questions and encouraging further development and potential scaling.

The projects combined engineering, software and sustainability in ways that suggest a real pathway from classroom prototypes to community or commercial application.





◆ **Fifty of the more than 300 children** snatched by gunmen from a Catholic school in Nigeria have escaped their captors, a Christian group said yesterday. Gunmen on Friday raided St Mary's co-education school in Niger state, taking 303 children and 12 teachers in one of the largest mass kidnappings in Nigeria. The abduction came days after gunmen stormed a secondary school in neighbouring Kebbi state, abducting 25 girls. "We have received some good news as fifty pupils escaped and have reunited with their parents," said the Christian Association of Nigeria in a statement, adding they escaped between Friday and Saturday. The number of boys and girls - aged between eight and 18 years - kidnapped from St Mary's is almost half of the school's student population of 629. The Nigerian government has yet to comment on the number of students and teachers abducted.

Over 800,000 new voters register for Nepal post-uprising polls

◆ **Hundreds of thousands** of new voters have registered to cast their ballot in Nepal's first polls since a mass uprising in September ousted the government, election officials said yesterday. Election Commission spokesman Narayan Prasad Bhattarai told AFP there was "a total of 837,094 registered names" of first-time voters. Bhattarai said that by Friday, 123 established parties had registered to take part in the March 5 parliamentary polls, while another 40 new slates await further verification to be allowed to run. Interest in participating in the elections has surged, especially among young people who see it as a critical test of whether the demands of protesters who took to the streets against economic hardships and government corruption can translate into meaningful change.

Daughter of S.Africa president accused of recruiting for Russian forces

South African police are investigating claims that a daughter of ex-president Jacob Zuma was involved in recruiting men to join Russian mercenaries in the Ukraine war, they said yesterday.

The allegations against Duduzile Zuma-Sambudla, an MP in her father's MK political party, were made by one of her sisters in an affidavit asking for a formal investigation, police said.

It claims Zuma-Sambudla and two other people were involved in recruiting 17 South Africans whom the presidency said this month it had been asked to rescue from Ukraine's war-ravaged Donbas region.

It was alleged the men were

lured to Russia under false pretences and handed to a Russian mercenary group to fight in the Ukrainian war without their knowledge or consent," the statement said.

The case had been handed to a special police unit that investigates crimes against the state to determine the charges.

The presidency said in early November it had been asked to bring home the 17 men who were allegedly "trapped" in Donbas after being lured there "under the pretext of lucrative employment contracts".

The war that started with Russia's invasion of Ukraine in 2022 has drawn in mercenaries on both sides, including from several African countries.

Reports in South African media said the men were allegedly sent to Russia for security training by the opposition MK party, which is headed by Zuma, the president between 2009 and 2018.

It is illegal for South Africans to join foreign armies unless authorised by the government.

Israel says targeted Hezbollah chief of staff in Beirut strike

The strike took place in Beirut's southern suburbs

Israel said it had carried out an air strike yesterday targeting Hezbollah's chief of staff in Beirut, leaving a smoking hole in the side of an apartment building and debris scattered in the street, according to AFP journalists.

Lebanon's health ministry reported at least one person killed in the strike, and 21 people wounded, calling it a "preliminary toll".

The strike took place in Beirut's southern suburbs, a densely populated area where Hezbollah holds sway, and caused "injuries and significant damage", according to Lebanon's official National News Agency (NNA).

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said he had given the orders for the attack -- the latest against a target in Lebanon despite a year-long ceasefire between Israel and Iran-backed Hezbollah.

"A short while ago, in the heart of Beirut, the IDF (Israeli mil-

itary) attacked the Hezbollah chief of staff, who had been leading the terrorist organisation's buildup and rearmament," the premier's office said in a statement.

"Israel is determined to act to achieve its objectives everywhere and at all times."

An AFP correspondent at the scene said the strike hit the third and fourth floors of a nine-storey building, with ambulances gathered around it and rescuers inspecting the apartments.

NNA reported three missiles were fired at the building in the Haret Hreik area, damaging vehi-

cles and other nearby structures. Israel has carried out near-daily strikes in Lebanon since the November 2024 ceasefire that sought to end more than a year of hostilities with Hezbollah, usually saying it is striking members of the group in the country's south and east.

Sunday's strike, however, was the first on Beirut's southern suburbs since June 5, when Israel said it hit a Hezbollah drone factory.

It follows an earlier strike on the southern town of Aita al-Shaab, which the Lebanese health ministry said killed one

person.

Hezbollah was weakened by its fight with Israel, which it started in support of its ally Hamas in Gaza in October 2023 with cross-border exchanges of fire that later escalated into two months of full-blown war.

Since then, Lebanon has come under increasing Israeli and American pressure to disarm Hezbollah, a move that group has rejected.

Netanyahu had insisted earlier on Sunday that Israel would do "everything necessary" to stop Hezbollah from regrouping in Lebanon.

Boos, blowups and last-minute pause as a chaotic COP30 closes out

Jabs about greedy children, boos for the Vatican, and proceedings suspended for more than an hour: the COP30 finale unfolded with the same chaotic energy that defined the summit, exposing the rifts that came close to derailing a deal.

Andre Correa do Lago, the dapper Brazilian diplomat who presided over the two-week affair in Belem, opened the final plenary on Saturday afternoon, nearly a full day behind schedule, after nations worked through the night to find a text they could all live with.

Bleary-eyed delegates took their seats, eager to see the marathon talks finally come to an end.

The summit in this rough-around-the-edges Amazonian city had already been interrupted twice by Indigenous protesters last week -- once when they breached the compound and clashed with security, another time when they blocked delegates from entering -- before a fierce blaze on

Thursday triggered a panicked evacuation.

A round of cheers broke out when Correa do Lago brought down his gavel and announced the adoption of the "Mutirao" text -- a Portuguese word of Indigenous origin meaning "collective efforts" that was also the summit's slogan.

Early in the session, a representative from the Holy See earned loud boos from NGOs after taking the mic to read out the Vatican's definition of gender along strict biological lines -- a side story at this COP after several governments, from Iran to Argentina, sought to clarify their positions in the gender and climate action plan.

But the drama did not end there.

After a COP defined by a bitter struggle between dozens of nations including the European Union pushing for a "roadmap" to transition away from fossil fuels, and oil producers and emerging economies firmly resisting it, the session saw an unusual procedural clash.

Daniela Duran of Colombia declared that her country had raised a point of order in a side text that was gavelled through anyway, and was now formally objecting.

Rather than brush her aside, Correa do Lago suspended the plenary, in an uncommon move that signaled Brazil's determi-

nation to show it was handling concerns seriously.

Observers suggested the pause likely reflected Colombia's deep frustration: the country had been at the forefront of efforts to include a "roadmap," and was displeased with how the talks concluded.

Diplomats huddled as the suspension dragged on for more than an hour before the plenary finally resumed.

"I have not slept, and probably this has not helped, as well as my advanced age," said Correa do Lago, in his mid-sixties, apologizing as he blamed an honest mistake for missing Colombia's point of order.

Still, Russia -- often aligned with Brazil in international forums -- chose to voice its displeasure, objecting to the objections.

Trump blasts Ukraine for 'zero gratitude'

Top US, Ukrainian representatives met in Geneva for talks

AFP | Washington, United States

US President Donald Trump yesterday accused Ukraine again of lacking "gratitude" for Washington's support against Russia's invasion, as top US and Ukrainian representatives met in Geneva for talks on a proposal to halt the war.

"UKRAINE 'LEADERSHIP' HAS EXPRESSED ZERO GRATITUDE FOR OUR EFFORTS," Trump wrote on his Truth Social platform, while also re-airing frustration at the war's "HUMAN CATASTROPHE" and attacking his predecessor Joe Biden, but offering no direct condemnation of Moscow.

Trump's blast at Ukraine and the US allies reflected the Republican's annoyance over the war, which began when Russia launched its full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022, seizing and destroying swaths of territory.

Trump claimed in his presidential campaign last year that he would

Ukraine says new draft of US plan reflects Kyiv's 'key priorities'

The latest version of the US draft plan for ending war in Ukraine now includes most of Kyiv's "key priorities", its negotiator said yesterday, after holding a few rounds of talks in Geneva.

"The current version of the document, although still in the final stages of approval, already reflects most of Ukraine's key priorities," negotiator Rustem Umerov said, adding: "We look forward to further progress throughout the day."

broker a peace within 24 hours.

However, his sporadic diplomatic efforts have made little ground and he faces fierce criticism from within his own party for a new 28-point plan being discussed in Geneva that would deliver several of Russia's key war aims.

While Trump has previously said he is disappointed in Putin, he rarely criticizes

the Kremlin leader directly or condemns the invasion, instead pressuring Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky.

In yesterday's social media post, he criticized European countries that he said continued to buy oil from Russia and called Biden "crooked Joe" for giving Ukraine weapons "free, free, free."

The only mention of Putin in the lengthy post was to claim that the Russian president thought "Now is my chance!" to invade Ukraine only because "Sleepy Joe" Biden was in office.

Zelensky has repeatedly expressed thanks for the huge US military support to Ukraine, which continues to battle the occupying Russian forces across a front hundreds of miles long.



Turkey's Erdogan says will speak with Putin

Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said yesterday he would speak with Russia's Vladimir Putin Monday, just days after the US unveiled a controversial plan to end the Ukraine war.

"Tomorrow I will have a phone call with Mr. Putin," he told a news conference at the G20 in South Africa, following pushback from Kyiv and its allies over the draft plan which accepts some of Russia's

hardline demands. US President Donald Trump has given Ukraine until November 27 to approve the plan to end the nearly four-year conflict.

Erdogan said Turkey would leave no stone unturned to try and broker an end to the conflict.

"So many people have died; I will discuss with (Putin) what steps we can take to stop these deaths. After these discussions, I believe I will have the opportunity to discuss the outcome with our European partners,

Mr. Trump, and other friends," he said.

On November 19, Erdogan hosted Ukrainian leader Volodymyr Zelensky in Ankara for talks in which he urged both sides to return to the negotiating table in Istanbul where they had held three rounds of negotiations earlier this year.

Zelensky had said he was heading to Ankara to try and revive US involvement in diplomatic efforts to end the Russian invasion, saying he wanted to revive the frozen peace talks.

G20 grapples with splintering world order

Johannesburg, South Africa

G20 leaders wrapping up a summit in South Africa on Sunday hailed multilateralism -- even as they struggled to adapt to a changing world order beset by go-it-alone US policies, wars and deepening geopolitical rivalries.

"Too many countries are re-treating into geopolitical blocs or the battlegrounds of protectionism," Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney told reporters.

He added: "We are not experiencing a transition, but a rupture."

He and the other leaders at the summit -- which was boycotted by the United States -- held a searching discussion on how the G20 can survive in a fragmenting world.

South African President Cyril Ramaphosa said, just before bringing the gavel down on the summit, that the meeting took place "at a crucial time, as calls around the world grow louder for progress on the imperatives of our time".

Despite challenges to international cooperation, Ramaphosa said a joint declaration by G20 leaders issued early in the meeting "reaffirms our renewed commitment to multilateral cooperation and our recognition that our shared goals outweigh our differences".

Dozens of leaders from key

economies around the world -- including Europe, China, India, Japan, Turkey, Brazil and Australia -- attended the summit, the first to be held in Africa.

In their G20 statement, they said their meeting was held "against the backdrop of rising geopolitical and geo-economic competition and instability, heightened conflicts and wars, deepening inequality, increasing global economic uncertainty and fragmentation".

French President Emmanuel Macron on Saturday warned that "the G20 may be coming to the end of a cycle".

Noting difficulties in finding a common stance on conflicts around the world, he argued it should refocus just on strategic economic issues going forward.



The G20 -- comprising 19 nations plus the European Union and the African Union -- was founded in the wake of the 1997-1998 Asian financial crisis, and its original mission was to boost global economic and financial stability.

Six airlines cancel Venezuela flights after US warning

Six airlines cancelled flights to Venezuela on Saturday, an industry group said, after the US aviation regulator warned of dangers from "heightened military activity" amid a major buildup of American forces in the region.

Spain's Iberia, Portugal's TAP, Chile's LATAM, Colombia's Avianca, Brazil's GOL and Trinidad and Tobago's Caribbean have suspended their flights to the country, said Marisela de Loaiza, president of the Venezuelan Airlines Association (ALAV).

She did not specify how long the flight suspensions would last. Panama's Copa Airlines, Spain's Air Europa and PlusUltra, Turkish Airlines, and Venezuela's LASER are continuing to operate flights for now.

The US Federal Aviation Administration on Friday urged

civilian aircraft in Venezuelan airspace to "exercise caution" due to the "worsening security situation and heightened military activity in or around Venezuela."

"Threats could pose a potential risk to aircraft at all altitudes, including during overflight, the arrival and departure phases of flight, and/or airports and aircraft on the ground," it said.

Washington has sent an aircraft carrier strike group, other Navy warships as well as stealth aircraft to the region -- deployments it says are aimed at curbing drug trafficking but which have sparked fears in Caracas that regime change is the goal. A US terrorism designation takes effect Monday for a drug cartel allegedly headed by leftist Venezuelan leader Nicolas Maduro -- a move that some believe could presage military action against his government.

Hamas says discussed **second phase** of Gaza truce in Cairo

A delegation of senior Hamas leaders discussed the second phase of the Gaza ceasefire agreement yesterday with the head of Egyptian intelligence, the Palestinian group said.

Led by Hamas chief negotiator Khalil al-Hayya, the delegation arrived in the Egyptian capital on Saturday for talks yesterday with Egyptian intelligence chief Hassan Rashad, two officials from the movement told AFP.

Hamas said in a statement that it "reaffirmed its commitment to implementing the first phase of the (ceasefire) agreement, stressing the importance of putting an end to Israeli violations".

"The nature of the second

phase of the agreement" was also discussed in Cairo, Hamas added, without giving further details.

The second stage of the Gaza ceasefire plan concerns disarming Hamas, establishing a transitional authority and deploying an international stabilisation force.

Hamas, excluded from any role in the future governance of the territory under the Trump plan adopted by the UN Security Council, is refusing to disarm.

Over the past few days, Israel and Hamas have accused each other of violating the US-brokered truce that came into effect on October 10 after two years of war.

Gaza's civil defence agency said 21 people were killed and dozens more wounded in mul-

iple Israeli air strikes on Saturday.

The Israeli military said an "armed terrorist" had crossed the so-called Yellow Line within the Gaza Strip, behind which Israeli forces have withdrawn, and fired at Israeli soldiers.

In response to the incident in southern Gaza, the Israeli military said it "began striking terror targets in the Gaza Strip".

Hamas said yesterday it had also raised the fate of fighters in Gaza's southern area of Rafah with whom it had lost contact.

According to various media reports, up to 200 Hamas fighters are believed to be trapped in tunnels in Gaza beneath part of the territory where the Israeli army has redeployed under phase one of the agreement.

Myanmar junta says nearly 1,600 foreigners arrested in scam hub raids

Myanmar's military said yesterday it arrested nearly 1,600 foreign nationals in five days in a highly publicised crackdown on a notorious internet scam hub on the Thai border.

Sprawling fraud factories have mushroomed in war-torn Myanmar's border regions, housing scammers who target internet users with romance and business cons worth tens of billions of dollars annually.

Myanmar's junta has long been accused of looking the other way as the illicit industry grows, but has trumpeted a crackdown since February after being lobbied by key military backer China, experts say.

Additional raids beginning last month were part of a smoke-screen, according to some monitors, choreographed to vent pressure from Beijing without too badly denting profits that

enrich the junta's militia allies.

In its latest publicised tally, the junta said "1,590 foreign nationals who entered Myanmar illegally were arrested" from November 18 to 22 in raids on gambling and fraud hub Shwe Kokko, according to state media The Global New Light of Myanmar.

"Moreover, authorities seized 2,893 computers, 21,750 mobile phones, 101 Starlink satellite receivers, 21 Routers and a large number of industrial materials used in the online fraud and gambling activities," the newspaper said.

After an AFP investigation last month revealed receivers from

the Starlink satellite internet service had been installed en masse at scam compounds, the Elon Musk-owned company said it had disabled more than 2,500 Starlink devices in the vicinity of suspected Myanmar scam centres.

The Global New Light of Myanmar said 223 people accused of perpetrating online fraud and gambling at Shwe Kokko were detained on Saturday alone, including 100 Chinese nationals.

Video published by local media showed a steamroller crushing hundreds of computer monitors lined up in rows next to piles of already smashed mobile phones at the Shwe Kokko compound on Saturday.

Scam hubs, staffed by thousands of willing workers as well as people trafficked from abroad, have proliferated in Myanmar's loosely governed borderlands since a 2021 coup sparked a civil war in the country.

Bangladesh presses India on ousted leader Sheikh Hasina's extradition

Bangladesh's government said yesterday it had asked India to extradite ousted prime minister Sheikh Hasina, who was sentenced earlier this week to be hanged over a deadly crackdown against a student-led uprising.

Hasina, 78, has been in hiding in India since her autocratic rule was overthrown in August 2024. As prime minister, she had had New Delhi's backing.

Touhid Hossain, who holds the foreign affairs portfolio in Bangladesh's interim administration, told reporters that on Friday "we sent a letter seeking the extradition of Sheikh Hasina."

He did not elaborate on the contents of the letter, which according to Bengali newspaper Prothom Alo was the third official extradition request since Hasina fled.

Following the court ruling on Monday, convicting Hasina of crimes against humanity and sentencing her to death, the foreign ministry in Dhaka said in a statement that Delhi had an "obligatory responsibility" under a bilateral treaty to facilitate the former leader's return.

India's foreign ministry said in response it had "noted" the verdict, without directly commenting on the extradition request.

It did not immediately respond to the latest letter from Dhaka.



Singapore deports Australian man over Ariana Grande incident

Singapore deported yesterday an Australian man at the end of a nine-day jail term for rushing film star Ariana Grande during the Asian premier of "Wicked: For Good", local media reported.

The man, Johnson Wen, was sent back to Australia "and has been barred from re-entering Singapore", the city-state's immigration authority said in a statement quoted by broadcaster CNA.

On the opening night of the much-hyped "Wicked" sequel on November 13, Wen jumped a barricade and put his arm around Grande.

He was arrested hours later and subsequently charged with

"being a public nuisance". Last week, a court sentenced Wen to nine days in jail.

Video clips, which have gone viral online, show Wen wrapping his arm around the shocked star before jumping up and down and smilingly waving to the crowd.

Grande's co-star Cynthia Erivo then rushes to her defence and the man is grabbed by security guards and dumped back over the barricade.

Singapore District Judge Christopher Goh, who issued the jail sentence, called the Australian "attention seeking".

Wen, who is alleged to have disrupted other global sports events and concerts, "showed a pattern of behaviour" which

suggested that he will do it again, the judge had said before last week's ruling.

The jail term was far below the maximum penalty afforded by law: three months in jail, a fine of \$1,500, or both.

Wen has told the court he was "wrong" to think his actions would bear no consequences and promised not to repeat the act.

The incident did not stop the premiere from going ahead, with the cast huddling around Grande before continuing down the yellow carpet.

Grande, 32, began her career as a teen on Broadway before embarking on a hugely successful pop career.



Verstappen wins in Vegas, McLarens disqualified

Norris and Piastri disqualified, severely tightening F1 title race

● McLaren cars disqualified post-race

● Skid blocks below legal limit

● Verstappen's title chances boosted

Formula One world champion Max Verstappen produced a masterful drive to win the Las Vegas Grand Prix on Saturday and his title hopes were boosted further with the McLarens of championship leader Lando Norris and Oscar Piastri both being disqualified.

Norris finished the race in second with Piastri fourth but the skid blocks on both cars were found after the race to be less than the minimum depth.

The disqualifications mean that with two race weekends remaining in Qatar and Abu Dhabi, four-time defending champion Verstappen is now level on points with Piastri in the title race, just 24 points behind Norris.

His chances of a fifth successive title, however, will depend on another spectacular slip-up from Norris or his McLaren team.

"It's frustrating to lose so many points," said Norris in a McLaren statement.

"As a team, we're always pushing to find as much performance as we can, and we clearly didn't get that balance right today.

"Nothing I can do will change that now, instead full focus switches to Qatar."

McLaren's team principal Andrea Stella said the problem had been caused by "unexpected, high levels of porpoising" which had led to "excessive contact" with the ground.

"We apologise to Lando and Oscar for the loss of points today, at a critical time in their championship campaigns after two strong performances from them all weekend," said Stella.

With a maximum of 58 points available in the final two grands prix, Norris just needs to score two more points than each of his rivals next weekend in Qa-

tar, which includes a sprint, to secure his first title.

'Comfortable'

Verstappen dominated in Vegas from the moment he pounced on a slip by pole-sitter Norris on the first turn of Sin City's street circuit to grab the lead.

Thereafter he controlled the race to claim the 69th Grand Prix win of his career, finishing more than 20 seconds clear.

The Dutchman said Red Bull's tyre strategy had laid the foundation for the win.

"Normally the race is always a tough one for us. We are not normally that great on tyres but today it seemed like we were more in control and I could push a little bit more," he said.

"We had a lot more pace and I could stay out a little bit longer and split the race in half and

that definitely helped a lot.

"The car was working pretty well, much more to my liking and at the end it was quite a decent lap. Every lap I was just feeling comfortable and not taking too much out of the tyre."

Mercedes' George Russell finished third on the track but was upgraded to second with his teammate Kimi Antonelli, who finished in fifth, moving up to third.

After the drama of Friday's qualifying, when heavy rain made for a treacherous surface that Verstappen likened to driving on ice, Saturday's 50-lap race under the glittering lights of Las Vegas got under way in cool, dry conditions.

Norris, who had arrived in Vegas fresh from back-to-back wins in Mexico and Sao Paulo, attempted an aggressive move to block Verstappen right from the start.

The move backfired and Norris ran off the track and allowed Verstappen to grab first place. Norris dropped back to third after he was passed by Russell into second.

Piastri, who began in fifth place on the grid, was also running a challenging start which saw him bump wheels with RB's Liam Lawson.

The Australian had been desperately looking to make up ground in Vegas after surrendering a 34-point advantage in the drivers championship since his victory at the Dutch Grand Prix in August.

The McLarens are not the first team to fall foul of the rules on skid blocks which are intended to prevent the cars from running too low and gaining extra speed.

Russell was disqualified after winning in Belgium last season for the same technical infringement while Lewis Hamilton has been penalised twice.

In 2023, when he was still at Mercedes, Hamilton was disqualified from the US Grand Prix along with Ferrari's Charles Leclerc.

And this season, with new team Ferrari, it happened again after the Chinese Grand Prix in March.

"You have to be a man and face the toughness and go again, again and again because if you want to give up then you are at the wrong place in my eyes because this club has gone through much adversity over those years and we've always come out of it."

Liverpool's form in the Champions League has been much better with three wins from four games. The return to European competition could offer some relief for Slot's men when PSV Eindhoven visit Anfield in Liverpool's next outing on Wednesday.

England slammed as 'brainless' after first Ashes Test capitulation

Astunned England woke Sunday to savage criticism after their meek capitulation in the first Ashes Test, branded "brainless" and "damaged" by former greats after their cavalier approach backfired.

Ben Stokes's men lost the opening battle in Perth by eight wickets inside two days on the back of batting collapses and Travis Head slamming a sensational 69-ball century.

Since last claiming an Ashes series in Australia 15 years ago, they have now lost 14 Tests, drawn two and won none Down Under.

England had a perfect opportunity to snap the dire streak and earn a psychological advantage heading into the day-night second Test in Brisbane on December 4.

But after reaching 160-5 the tourists lost five wickets for 12 runs to be bowled out for 172 on day one before regaining the advantage after dismissing Australia for 132.

They were on track for a big lead after reaching 65-1 in their second innings, but again threw away five wickets in quick succession to leave Australia chasing 205 which they achieved with ease.

Leading into Perth, Stokes

called the former players who had criticised England's low-key build up as "has-beens" -- and that came back to bite him.

"Well, from this has-been the message is simple: when you keep throwing away Test matches by doing the same stupid things, it is impossible to take you seriously," batting great Geoffrey Boycott said in a newspaper column.

players.

"When we get to Brisbane we need to be back up to that mindset of how we came into this game, still very confident of our abilities and achieving the goal," he said.

"It's crucial not be taking any baggage from this result into Brisbane."

They are facing an ominous task in Brisbane where England have won just twice since World War II, but another former England captain is not yet ready to throw in the towel.

"They need to remember they played a lot of good cricket in this game, and remember that when you get ahead be ruthless and smart," Nasser Hussain told Sky Sports.

"It is a mountain to climb for England but they have a lot of character and a captain with a lot of character. They are going to need that."

Head shapes up as solution for Australia's opening woes

Travis Head may have battled himself into a permanent role as Australian opener after his swashbuckling 123 against England, casting doubt on the future of an ageing Usman Khawaja.

The 38-year-old Khawaja failed to open in either innings in Perth because of back spasms, paving the way for Head to seize the opportunity with all guns blazing.

His 123 from just 83 balls drove Australia to a crushing eight-wicket victory, with the knock hailed as one of the best in Ashes history by skipper Steve Smith.

Australia have been searching for a new opener since David Warner retired early last year with Khawaja going through six different partners.

Debutant Jake Weatherald got the nod for Perth.

But instead of striding out

Ali Almansoori continued his sensational winning run in the 2025-26 Bahrain Touring Car Challenge (BTCC) by taking both races in the season's third round to headline an exciting National Race Day triple-header, held over the weekend at Bahrain International Circuit (BIC) in Sakhir.

Almansoori secured an incredible double for the third straight meeting to remain undefeated in this BTCC campaign. Also taking victories on National Race Day were Saeed Al Sulaiti and Mohamad Alzaidan in their respective classes of the Bahrain Motorcycle Championship (BMC), along with Ahmed Bajnaid, Ahmed Algaidy, Yazeed Al Saheel, Fahad Almulhem, Andulaziz Alramih, Fares Almutairi, and Hamad Albaloooshi in their var-



ious categories in Time Attack. National Race Day was organised and run by BIC in cooperation with the Bahrain Motor Federation, the Circuit Racing Commission, the Bahrain Motorcycle Commission, and the Bahrain Auto X and Drift Commission. Racing in each of the three national championships took place along BIC's 2.55-kilometre Inner Track. In BTCC, Almansoori won the

15-lap first race in a total time of 22mins 55.414secs. He dominated the sprint, finishing a commanding 27.297secs ahead of runner-up Isa Ebrahim, while Algaidy, who was also competing in the BTCC, came third 36.745s back. Each of the top three were driving Honda Civics. Almansoori then took the chequered flag in race two with an even bigger gap of 35.519s from Ebrahim, who was again sec-

ond. Almansoori triumphed in 20:12.431, while he and Ebrahim were joined on the podium by James Taylor, driving an Acura RSX DC5. Taylor finished 48.610s from first place. In the BMC, Al Sulaiti claimed his victory in the series' 1,000cc category while Alzaidan took the win amongst the 600cc riders. Al Sulaiti powered his Yamaha R1 to first place overall and in class in 16:09.821 after 14 laps. Fahad Al Gharabally on a Suzuki GSXR came second, both overall and in the 1,000cc category, 8.628s behind, while third was Fahad Algosaibi on a BMW 1000RR 10.406s back. Alzaidan completed the race fourth overall while taking

his 600cc win riding his Kawasaki ZX6. Joining him on the podium in class were Abdulrahman Ahmed on a Honda CBR600RR and Saif Al Buainain on a Yamaha R6. In Time Attack, Bajnaid was the winner in the ULA class. He registered a fastest time of 1:08.934 on the combined timesheet to take first place following the round's two heats. Algaidy triumphed in the SU category with a best mark of 1:09.430, while Al Saheel won the SA class at 1:11.596. Almulhem took first place in the MA category with a fastest time of 1:13.113, while Alramih triumphed in the ULB class with a best mark of 1:19.216.

Rounding off the Time Attack winners in the meeting were Almutairi in the MB category with a mark of 1:19.156, and Albaloooshi in the SB class with a fastest time of 1:24.335. Following all the action, the winners in the BTCC, BMC, and Time Attack were presented their respective trophies during their respective podium ceremonies. BIC's 2025/2026 racing calendar features seven rounds of National Race Day. The campaign resumes next year with round four on 10 January. Round five will be held on 6 February, and then the sixth and penultimate meeting will take place on 13 March. That will set the stage for the grand finale on 24 April.

Bahrain hosts regional Special Olympics swimming training course

Muthusamy, Jansen put South Africa on top in second India Test

Senuran Muthusamy struck his first Test century and Marco Jansen hammered 93 to guide South Africa to a commanding 489 all out on day two of the second match against India on Sunday.

The left-handed Muthusamy made 109 and put on 97 runs for the eighth wicket with Jansen, who was the last wicket to fall in the final session in Guwahati. Jansen struck six fours and seven sixes in his 91-ball blitz before he dragged a delivery from Kuldeep Yadav on to his stumps and the innings ended after 151.1 overs.

The hosts reached nine for no loss in 6.1 overs at stumps, trailing South Africa by 480 runs on a pitch still looking good to bat at India's newest Test venue.

Yashasvi Jaiswal, on seven, and KL Rahul, on two were at the crease when bad light stopped play for the day in the north-eastern city where sunsets are early.

The 6ft 8in (2.03m) Jansen frustrated the Indian attack

as he hung on with number nine and 10 after he reached his fourth Test half-century and surpassed his previous best of 84 not out in the longer format.

Jansen's seven hits over the fence are the joint-most in a Test innings against India. Pakistan's Shahid Afridi hit as many during his 103 in Lahore in 2006.

Muthusamy reached his hundred in 192 balls off pace bowler Mohammed Siraj, as he punched the air and raised his bat to a standing ova-

tion from the crowd and the dressing room.

He fell soon after the second break but Jansen, a right-hand batter and left-arm quick, kept up the charge with Simon Harmer (5) and Keshav Maharaj, unbeaten on 12.

Left-arm spinner Ravindra Jadeja ended a 88-run seventh-wicket stand after a wicketless first session when Kyle Verreynne was

stumped for 45 by captain Rishabh Pant.


Kuldeep finished with four wickets with his left-arm wrist spin.

Pace bowlers Jasprit Bumrah, Siraj and left-arm spinner Jadeja took two each.

The tourists, who won the toss and elected to bat on Saturday, are in hunt for their first series victory in India in 25 years after they won the opener of the two-match series.

Earlier Muthusamy and Verreynne used their feet to tackle spinners in a sedate first hour of play when only 28 runs were scored, including two fours.

Muthusamy survived a scare on 48 when Jadeja had him given out lbw, but the batsman's review showed a murmur when the ball passed his glove and the decision was overturned.
