Bahraini vessel forced into Iranian waters

The Ministry of Interior has clarified that three Bahraini sailors were forced at gunpoint from Bahrain's territorial waters into Iranian waters during an armed robbery on February 18, 2026.

The incident involved a Bahraini vessel, from which one engine and other belongings were seized.

According to the sailors' statements, they were transferred onto a boat operated by the perpetrators, who headed towards Iranian waters before releasing them approximately three hours later, allowing them to return to Bahrain. The assailants were Iranian nationals.

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Money safety

MPs call for urgent action to protect citizens from investment scams

- **Tougher regulation to shield investors**
- **Deceptive schemes targeting small and medium savings**

MPs have backed an urgent call for action to shield citizens from fraud dressed up as investment. Parliament agreed yesterday to press for tougher steps against schemes that draw in small and medium savings under the guise of trading or money placement, yet offer no real guarantees to those handing over their funds.

The proposal was tabled by MPs Bader Al Tamimi, Ali Saqer Al Doseri, Hassan Ebrahim, Abdulhakeem Al Sheno and Dr Ali Al Nuaimi.

Al Tamimi told the chamber that recent months had seen a rise in the marketing of speculative ventures in many forms. "These activities aim to attract small and medium capital for placement under the cover of investment, without genuine guarantees for the owners of that money," he said. "This calls for preventive action to protect citizens' savings and to preserve the resources of the economy."

He said action was needed to prevent the drain of community assets and to reinforce the role of licensed bodies overseeing investment and financial services.

Protection

"The protection contained in financial laws must be brought into effect to avert the risks linked to these activities, which amount to harmful practices," he said.

Awareness campaigns alone would not suffice, he added. "There must be stronger oversight by the competent bodies

to curb unlicensed activity or operations conducted without adequate guarantees, and those responsible must be pursued

through the relevant authorities in line with the law.

The explanatory note attached to the motion grounded the request in constitutional principles.

Justice

It cited Article 4 of the Constitution, which states that "Justice is the basis of governance" and names security, equality and social solidarity among the pillars of society guaranteed by the State.

It also referred to Article 5(a), which describes property, capital and labour, in line with Islamic justice, as core components of social order and national wealth, regulated by law.

The motion seeks to entrench financial transparency, curb unlawful or informal economic activity, protect citizens' savings from exploitation and shield the economy from fraudulent practice. (BD3m investment fraud on Page 3)

Instalment alert

Tighter regulation to safeguard buyers

- **Unclear terms, pricing gaps**

An urgent call for stronger oversight of instalment sales in electronics shops was approved by Parliament yesterday.

MPs pointed to complaints about unclear contracts and a

wide gap between cash prices and pay-by-instalment totals.

The proposal by request, submitted on an urgent basis by MPs Hamad Al Doy, Mohammed Mousa, Ali Saqer Al Doseri, Abdulwahid Qarata and Mohammed Al Refai, was passed during the sitting.

Al Doy said instalment buying had expanded across local markets, "especially in shops selling electronic devices", with demand coming from "young people and middle- and low-in-

come families".

He said the growth had been followed by a rise in complaints about practices that "may lack clarity and transparency", including contract wording, disclosure of "the true cash price compared with the instalment price", and how profit rates, administrative fees and late-payment penalties are shown to customers.

Warning

"Electronic devices are now

among the essential consumer goods," he told MPs, warning that weak rules in this area could leave consumers facing "financial burdens beyond the consumer's actual ability".

He said this could lead to the build-up of obligations that harms the financial stability of individuals and families.

Al Doy added that incomplete disclosure, or the use of unclear contract forms, could "lead to legal disputes and weaken trust in the local market".

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Push for national stadium in Muharraq

Parliament has endorsed a proposal calling for the construction of a national stadium in Muharraq, highlighting the governorate's lack of major sports infrastructure.

The proposal, submitted by MPs including Khalid Saleh Buanaq and Hisham Abdulaziz Al Awadhi, argues that Muharraq, home to more than 120,000 residents, remains without a fully equipped national-level sports facility.

MP Abdulhakim Al Sheno stressed that strengthening sports infrastructure forms part of broader institutional development in the sector.

He expressed hope that the government would consider incorporating the project into future development plans.

The Services Committee recommended approval of the proposal, signalling parliamentary recognition of Muharraq's sporting heritage and its need for modern facilities.

MPs support BD30,000 bank guarantee to protect market

After hours of pointed exchanges inside Parliament, MPs approved a proposal to amend Article 264 of the Commercial Companies Law, introducing a BD30,000 bank guarantee for companies involving non-Bahraini partners.

The vote followed an emotionally charged but orderly debate, reflecting growing concern among MPs over the direction of the local market.

MP Jaleela Al Alawi spoke of shuttered shops and empty units across commercial areas, describing them as visible signs that the market is under strain.

Warning

She warned that weak purchasing power and short-lived businesses are not isolated incidents, but indicators of deeper imbalance.

MP Mamdouh Al Saleh insisted the proposed BD30,000 guarantee is not a fee collected by the government, but a refundable measure to ensure seriousness.

He argued that genuine investors would not be discouraged by a safeguard designed to filter out shell companies.

Meanwhile, MPs such as Hassan Ibrahim Hassan and Hisham Abdulaziz Al Awadhi questioned whether tighter entry rules might unintentionally burden the wider investment climate.

'Immediate financing'

BD800m support for housing loans as 11,000 applications completed

The Housing Minister, Her Excellency Amna Al Rumaihi, told Parliament yesterday that BD800 million has been allocated over two years to support government-backed housing loans, with citizens paying 25 per cent of their salary towards repayments.

Answering a question from MP Iman Shuwaiter, H.E. Al Rumaihi said the ministry was relying on "immediate financing" to deal with rising demand, as new households form each year.

"The immediate financing solutions did not come out of nowhere; they were preceded by a number of studies," she said.

H.E. Al Rumaihi said the Ministry of Housing is working through three tracks.

The first is building and development in housing cities, car-

ried out under the Government Programme and within fixed capacity and budget limits.

Track

"This track has a fixed capacity, with clear budgets allocated to it," she said. "The programmes, budgets and final accounts are sent to MPs, and you know the scale of spending and the volume of work under



way."

But she said applications continue to climb, driven by a young population and rising marriage rates.

"Housing applications continue to rise," she said. "Bahraini society is young, and new families are formed every year."

The minister said one response has been to provide subsidised loans funded through

the general budget, with state support aimed at easing costs for applicants.

Policy

"A total of 800 million dinars has been allocated to the housing file over two years," she said. "The citizen pays 25 per cent of their salary, and we are continuing with this policy."

She said applicants can choose between the subsidised loan and larger options available in the market, including additional borrowing, depending on what they want to buy.

"This is where the citizen's role comes in, in choosing what suits them," she said.

H.E. Al Rumaihi said the ministry has completed 11,000 applications "during this short period" through the immediate financing track.

"We have now reached 11,000 applications completed, which

shows the programme's success," she said.

She added that the ministry offers financial advice before applicants choose a route, working with private sector partners to match people with suitable units.

Death sought over Budaiya murder

Prosecutors have asked the court to sentence two Asian men to death over the alleged killing of a man in his fifties in Budaiya. They said the pair had monitored his movements for nearly two months before attacking him outside his home with a knife and a cleaver. The High Criminal Court is due to rule on 14 April. The Public Prosecution says the defendants, aged 25 and 28, killed the victim on 28 December 2025 within the Northern Governorate security jurisdiction.

It says the pair acted with premeditation and lay in wait, having bought the knife and cleaver for the attack and tracked the man until they knew when he left home and when he returned. Prosecutors allege the defendants waited near the victim's house on the day of the killing, then fell on him as he walked back to his residence, stabbing and striking him in different parts of his body.

Businessman jail term upheld in BD3m investment fraud

● 10 years behind bars

A businessman who promised lucrative returns in real estate, luxury assets and commercial ventures has been sentenced to 10 years in prison after authorities determined he collected millions of dinars without a license and failed to return investors' money.

The High Criminal Court of Appeal upheld the prison term, imposed a BD100,000 fine, or-

dered confiscation of illicit proceeds and mandated repayment to victims in a case involving losses exceeding BD3 million.

Prosecutors said that between 2020 and 2023, the defendant cultivated trust among investors by presenting himself as an expert in real estate development, company formation, luxury cars, high-end watches and distinctive vehicle number plates.

Investors were told their funds would be formally registered in their names and that profits would be deposited into dedicated bank accounts.

According to court findings,

those accounts were never opened.

The largest investor transferred nearly BD1.67 million in bank payments, cash and assets — including vehicles and jet skis — after being assured the investments would be legally documented.

Years later, he discovered that nothing had been registered in his name and that no profits had been deposited.

Another investor transferred 1 million Saudi riyals to finance a proposed seaside venture in the Seef area, featuring jet skis and padel courts.

There was no written con-

tract, only verbal promises. Most of the capital was later returned, except for 50,000 riyals, and no profits were paid.

A third victim invested BD45,000 after being promised employment, substantial returns and a luxury car.

He also transferred ownership of two distinctive number plates at the defendant's request.

The cheque issued to him was later reclaimed, and the promises were not fulfilled.

A Gulf businessman testified that he had delivered approximately BD2 million between 2020 and 2024 for investments in property, vehicles and busi-

ness ventures, only to discover that none of the assets had been registered in his name and no account had been opened as promised.

The Public Prosecution charged the defendant with collecting funds for investment without the required regulatory license and with misappropriating entrusted assets.

The ruling reinforces that investment activity conducted outside the regulatory framework carries criminal consequences — and highlights the risks of informal agreements built on personal trust rather than legal safeguards.

Push for new health centre in Busaiteen

MPs backed a proposal calling for the establishment of a new health centre in Busaiteen, citing rising population density and growing pressure on existing facilities in Muharraq.

During the session, MP Abdulwahid Abdulaziz Qarata stated that the area's population has exceeded 25,000 residents, with new housing developments expected to increase that number further in

the coming years.

He noted that the current northern Busaiteen health centre operates on a limited schedule and does not fully meet the needs of residents.

As a result, many patients turn to King Hamad University Hospital for urgent cases, often facing waiting times of six to eight hours.

The MP pointed out that land has already been allocated to the Ministry of Health near Al Hasan Mosque, urging that funding be included in the upcoming state budget cycle.

Proposal for food security council

MPs have supported a proposal to establish an independent authority or Supreme Council for Food Security, reflecting increasing attention to supply resilience and long-term planning.

The initiative, submitted by MPs including Hamad Farooq Al Doy and Bader Saleh Al Tamimi, aims to centralise oversight of food security policies and enhance coordination

between relevant ministries.

Supporters argued that food security is no longer a purely commercial matter but a strategic national priority requiring unified direction. They stressed that global disruptions in recent years have underscored the importance of structured preparedness.

The Public Utilities and Environment Committee recommended approval of the proposal to strengthen regulatory and strategic frameworks tied to national resilience.

Marijuana smuggling attempt foiled

● 3kg substance intercepted at airport

The Ministry of Interior confirmed that the Air Customs Directorate at Customs Affairs has foiled an attempt to smuggle a substance suspected to be marijuana weighing approximately 3 kilograms at Bahrain International Airport.

The Ministry of Interior stated that while a customs officer was performing his duties, he became suspicious of a passenger's luggage after screening it with the X-ray machine.

The passenger was referred to the red lane, and upon inspection of his bag, a substance suspected to be marijuana was found concealed within his belongings.

The suspect and the seized items were handed over to the Anti-Narcotics Directorate to complete the necessary legal procedures.

The tenure of Tata Sons' current chairman, 62-year-old N Chandrasekaran, is set to end in February 2027.

On Tuesday, the Tata Sons

board deferred taking a call on whether Chandrasekaran should be granted another five-year term, which would be his third.

US told EU it 'stands' by tariff deal: trade chief

AFP | Brussels, Belgium

The EU's trade chief said yesterday his US counterparts had told him Washington stands by a key trade deal with the bloc, following an adverse Supreme Court decision on President Donald Trump's tariffs.

After the Supreme Court ruled last week that Trump lacks authority to impose levies under a 1977 law, the US leader responded with fresh tariffs of 10 percent on import-duty goods -- which Trump has vowed to hike further to 15%.

That raised complex ques-

tions about what the new duties mean for the EU deal clinched last year with Trump, which set tariffs at 15 percent for most EU goods.

"I have been in constant touch with my counterparts, and they both reassured me they stand by the deal with the European Union," Trade Commissioner Maros Sefcovic told EU lawmakers.

The top trade negotiator also touched on another sensitive topic in transatlantic ties: Trump's 50 percent duties on steel and aluminium imports, which the EU has been pushing to bring down.

Al Baraka Group delivers record performance

Reports 2025 total net income of USD 357 Million and Assets exceeding USD 31 Billion

● The performance was driven by a robust momentum across all banking subsidiaries, a significant increase in operating income, and a qualitative expansion in commercial activities

Al Baraka Group continued to deliver record-breaking results, announcing its strongest financial performance in its history for the year ended 2025. The performance was driven by a robust momentum across all banking subsidiaries, a significant increase in operating income, and a qualitative expansion in commercial activities throughout the Group's banking network.

Against an increasingly challenging and volatile global economic backdrop, the Group once again demonstrated its exceptional ability to convert uncertainty into opportunity. Net income attributable to the shareholders of the parent company for the fourth quarter of



2025 increased by 41% to USD 47 million, compared with USD 33 million for the same period in 2024, reflecting the strength of the Group's business model and superior operational efficiency. Basic earnings per share rose to US cents 2.44 in Q4 2025, compared with US cents 1.31 in Q4 2024.

The Group also recorded a 93% increase in total comprehensive income attributable to the shareholders of the parent company during the last three months of 2025, reaching USD 44 million compared with USD 23 million in the corresponding period of 2024, supported by im-

proved subsidiary performance and effective foreign exchange risk management.

Total net income for the fourth quarter of 2025 grew by 36% to USD 90 million, compared with USD 66 million for the same period in 2024, underscoring the strong business momentum achieved towards the year-end.

Furthermore, the Group reported a 57% increase in total comprehensive income during Q4 2025, reaching USD 85 million compared with USD 54 million for the same period in 2024, driven by enhanced subsidiary performance and prudent management of currency fluctuation

risks.

For the full year 2025, net income attributable to shareholders of the parent company increased by 21% to USD 191 million, compared with USD 157 million in 2024. Basic earnings per share for 2025 rose to US cents 12.85, compared with US cents 10.09 in the previous year, demonstrating the Group's success in enhancing shareholder returns.

Total net income increased by 16% to reach USD 357 million in 2025, compared with USD 309 million in 2024, representing the highest annual profitability level in the Group's history.

ABG also achieved a 264% upsurge in total comprehensive income attributable to shareholders of the parent company during 2025, reaching USD 170 million compared with USD 47 million in 2024, supported by stronger subsidiary results and effective foreign currency risk management.

This strong performance reflects the Group's continued success in executing balanced growth strategies focused on expanding high-quality financing portfolios, strengthening investment products, diversifying income streams through cross-border services—particularly trade finance—, enhancing retail banking and digital service delivery, and further improving risk, liquidity, and capital management efficiency.

Additionally, ABG recorded a 99% increase in total comprehensive income during 2025, reaching USD 293 million compared with USD 147 million in 2024, primarily driven by foreign currency translation reserves.

Total assets grew by 18% to reach USD 31 billion, representing the highest level since the Group's inception. This growth was driven by strong expan-

sion in customer deposit bases across its banking subsidiaries, particularly in Turkey, Jordan, and Egypt, which were effectively deployed into financing, investment, and commercial activities.

On this occasion, Shaikh Abdullah Saleh Kamel, Chairman of Al Baraka Group, stated:

"2025 was not merely a year of growth; it was a year in which the Group reaffirmed its ability to consistently generate sustainable value and strong returns even in the most challenging economic environments. ◆ **Pavel Durov, the** Russian-born founder of Telegram, said yesterday that Russian authorities were probing him for "aiding terrorism", the latest escalation in Moscow's repeated attempts to block the popular messenger. Moscow has restricted access to both Telegram and WhatsApp, Russia's two most popular messaging apps, as it tries to shift users onto Max -- a state-backed alternative which critics say lacks privacy -- but so far without much success.

Russia says new US nuclear tests could spur dangerous 'domino effect'

◆ **Moscow** voiced alarm yesterday at Washington's assertion it will resume nuclear testing to match alleged secret explosions by China and Russia, warning such a move would spark a dangerous "domino effect". Speaking before the Conference on Disarmament in Geneva, Russian ambassador Gennady Gatilov decried US

President Donald Trump's announcement last year that his country was prepared to stage its first nuclear test since 1992. "We warn that the US withdrawal from its national moratorium would trigger a domino effect," he said, speaking through a translator, stressing that "the responsibility for the consequences would rest entirely with Washington". Christopher Yeaw, the US assistant secretary of state for arms control and nonproliferation, indicated last week that Trump was serious when he said in October that the United States would resume nuclear testing.

◆ **Australian Prime Minister** Anthony Albanese

was forced to evacuate his official residence yesterday over a security threat, police said. Albanese was evacuated from The Lodge, his official residence in the capital Canberra. National broadcaster ABC reported the threat saw Albanese taken to a separate location for several hours. In a statement, the Australian Federal Police said they had responded to "an alleged security incident" around 6 pm (0700 GMT).

Aid groups petition Israel's top court to halt ban on Gaza, West Bank ops

◆ **More than a dozen** international humanitarian organisations have petitioned Israel's Supreme Court to block an imminent order that would force 37 NGOs to cease operations in Gaza, the West Bank and east Jerusalem, warning of catastrophic consequences for Palestinians. Organisations including Doctors Without Borders (MSF), Oxfam, the Norwegian Refugee Council and CARE were notified on December 30, 2025 that their Israeli registrations had expired and that they had 60 days to renew them by providing lists of their Palestinian staff. If they fail to do so, they will have to cease operations in Gaza and the occupied West Bank, including east Jerusalem, from March 1.

Europe faces large 'shortfalls' in its defence: report

◆ **Europe has wide** "shortfalls" in its military capabilities which leave it "ill-prepared" as the war in Ukraine grinds on, a new report said yesterday.

The 2026 edition of the Military Balance report by the London-based institute notes that the United States is seeking to refocus its efforts on protecting its own territory. As a result, the US leader continues to push allies for "greater burden-sharing" in military spending, both in Europe and in the Asia-Pacific region in response to China's growing influence.

Iran says students must respect 'red lines' after protests

Iran offered a muted warning yesterday for students who staged anti-government rallies, with the country's leaders under pressure after a recent mass protest movement and threats of US military action over its nuclear programme.

University students kicked off a new semester over the weekend with gatherings in which they revived slogans from nationwide protests against the country's clerical leadership that peaked in January and were met by a deadly crackdown.

On Tuesday, the fourth consecutive day of the campus protests, videos verified by AFP showed two groups facing off in a large hall at a Tehran university -- one wav-

ing Iranian flags and the other chanting anti-government slogans -- before scuffles broke out.

The day before students had burned the flag that was adopted after the 1979 revolution that toppled the monarchy, according to verified videos.

Iranian government spokeswoman Fatemeh Mohajerani, giving the first official reaction to the rallies, said on Tuesday that while students had a right to protest, they must "understand the red lines".

The flag, she added, was one "of these red lines that we must protect and not cross or deviate from, even at the height of anger". She said Iran's students "have wounds in their hearts and have seen scenes that may upset and anger them; this anger is understandable".

Duterte drew up 'death lists', boasted about murders: ICC prosecutor

Duterte publicly named persons he alleged were involved in drugs

Former Philippines president Rodrigo Duterte personally drew up "death lists" and boasted about murders committed during his "war on drugs", an International Criminal Court prosecutor alleged yesterday at a crimes against humanity hearing.

On day two of proceedings against Duterte, ICC prosecutor Edward Jeremy laid out searing testimony including allegations that children had their heads wrapped in packing tape and were strangled to death.

"As president, Duterte publicly named persons he alleged were involved in drugs, and many of those would end up as victims in his so-called war on drugs," Jeremy said.

The "Duterte list" was "basically a death list", Jeremy cited a witness as saying, showing a video of Duterte himself saying: "I am the sole person responsible for it all."

Duterte faces three ICC counts of crimes against humanity, with prosecutors alleging his involvement in at least 76 murders between 2013 and 2018.

Prosecutors say this is a "mere

fraction" of the thousands believed killed in his "war on drugs" as mayor of Davao City and then president.

"As witnesses stated, the poor were often targeted, because they were the ones least likely to file complaints against the police," said Jeremy.

'The bodies pile up'

Jeremy played a clip of Duterte joking about "extrajudicial killings" during a speech.

"And in this opulent, gilded, presentation room, the officials laugh along with their president while he boasts about his skills in extrajudicial killing," said Jeremy.

"And outside on the streets of the Philippines, the bodies pile up."

Jeremy alleged that almost 1,500 people had already been killed at the time of this video.

The prosecutor said that on

two occasions, children aged around 14 or 15 were taken into custody.

"On each occasion, the police wrapped the child's head in packing tape. So no one could hear them scream. And then strangled the child to death with wire," said Jeremy.

"It's difficult to imagine a more terrifying end to two lives that had barely even begun. And these murdered children were then sold to funeral homes."

The week-long ICC proceedings are not a trial but a "confirmation of charges" hearing, enabling judges to weigh whether to move ahead with a trial.

Another prosecutor, Robynne Croft, described the alleged crimes as a "widespread and systematic attack" on the people of the Philippines.

The killings were "highly organised, planned and coordinated" and without Duterte's "es-

sential contribution", would not have occurred, Croft alleged.

Duterte, 80, is not in court after exercising his right not to appear.

His defence team says he is weak and in cognitive decline. The prosecution and victims counter that he is healthy but does not want to face the loved-ones of victims.

The court passed him fit to attend but granted his right to stay away.

Once the hearings wrap up Friday, the court will take up to 60 days to decide whether to proceed to a full trial, usually in a written judgement.

Duterte's defence lawyer, Nicholas Kaufman, on Monday said his client "maintained his innocence absolutely".

Kaufman argued that while Duterte used "bluster and hyperbole" in his speeches, he also frequently ordered authorities only to shoot in self-defence.

UK steps up support for Ukraine four years after invasion

Britain unveils 'biggest' Russia sanctions on Ukraine war anniversary

The UK government yesterday announced its "biggest sanctions package" against Russia since one imposed straight after Moscow's invasion of Ukraine four years ago, targeting oil exports and military equipment suppliers.

Marking the anniversary of the invasion, London announced nearly 300 new sanctions as foreign minister Yvette Cooper visited Kyiv.

This took the total of companies and individuals targeted by Britain over the Ukraine war to

more than 3,000.

New measures included an asset freeze on Russia's state controlled pipeline operator Transneft, citing the oil sector's "strategic significance to the government of Russia".

Britain also moved against Russia's "dark web of illicit oil traders", cracking down on one of the largest shadow fleet operators shipping oil in contravention of international sanctions.

Britain said the new raft of sanctions sent the message that "Russian oil is off the market".

not win this war."

The new package includes £20 million in emergency funding to repair and protect Ukraine's energy grid following sustained Russian strikes over the winter. The funding will help restore power generation capacity and strengthen resilience ahead of next winter. This brings total UK energy support since the invasion began to more than £490 million.

An additional £5.7 million will provide humanitarian assistance to frontline communities, those forced to evacuate and civilians affected by airstrikes. The UK has also pledged £30 million to bolster Ukraine's societal resilience and support accountability efforts for victims of alleged Russian war crimes.

In Kyiv, Foreign Secretary Yvette Cooper condemned what

she described as Russia's "disgraceful attempts to erase the Ukrainian identity" in occupied territories, citing forced passportisation, suppression of Ukrainian language and arbitrary detentions. "Russia can and must end this war," she said. "The UK will stand with Ukraine for as long as it takes to achieve a just and lasting peace."

On the military front, British medical teams are mentoring Ukrainian clinicians in complex battlefield trauma care, sharing expertise developed through years of operational experience. Meanwhile, Ukrainian pilots are training at a UK air base to become helicopter flying instructors -- the first time Britain has offered rotary-wing instructor training -- enabling them to train the next generation of military aviators.

Defence Secretary John Healey said Putin had underestimated Ukraine's determination. "With our support, they continue to fight with huge courage and defiance," he said, adding that Britain would continue stepping up pressure on Moscow as efforts intensify to bring the conflict to an end.

Bahrain Can Be A Hub for Carbon Capture

Carbon capture, utilisation and storage (CCUS) is a cutting edge technology tool used worldwide to capture CO₂ emissions from industrial sources such as power plants and factories and prevent these emissions from entering the atmosphere. Such captured carbon is repurposed for making products like fuels, plastics and concrete besides achieving net zero targets. In terms of storage, under CCUS the CO₂ is compressed and injected into secure underground rock formations.

In today's world of oppressive climate change conditions, CCUS is crucial as it mitigates emissions from hard to abate sectors like cement, steel and chemical production.

In the realm of CCUS, Bahrain is making impressive strides. According to studies Bahrain's geological carbon storage capacity exceeds its domestic needs, thereby creating opportunities for cross border carbon sequestration and in the process be on the path to become a regional hub for carbon capture and storage. Already as of late 2023 Bapco Energies and Mitsui O.S.K Lines signed an MOU for transporting liquified CO₂ from Asia-Pacific region to permanent storage sites in Bahrain. This is also in line with Bahrain's aim to achieve net zero target by 2060. But a lot more is possible in the field of CCUS to make it more efficient and help in making net zero emissions a faster reality.

In addition to the outstanding measures already undertaken by Bahrain in the field of CCUS, the nation can look at using advanced technology to lower the costs so that long term sustainability of the initiative is assured. Similarly, measures such as the creation of market demand for synthetic fuels such as sustainable aviation fuels (SAF) or green methanol can help replace fossil-based alternatives. Additionally, the mineralisation of CO₂ for usage building materials can further help reduce carbon footprint and related emissions. Bahrain can also put captured CO₂ to large scale use for producing green urea thereby increase agricultural yield in eco friendly manner.

Bahrain can also scale up CCUS mainstreaming strategies such as Direct Air Capture (DAC) and enhancing chemical and biological conversion. Furthermore, the development of carbon nanomaterial from captured CO₂ is an emerging field with significant potential. Carbon nano-materials such as carbon nanotubes and graphene have exceptional properties that make them highly useful in electronics, energy storage and construction. These materials can be synthesised using CO₂ as a carbon source, turning harmful greenhouse gas into a resource for advanced technologies. These measures can help cement Bahrain's regional leadership in CCUS and help fight climate change.

Bahrain has solid Carbon capture, storage & utilisation credentials, which can be further improved with advanced technology based strategies.

G7 reiterate 'unwavering support for Ukraine'

had hoped to take Kyiv in days when it launched its invasion on February 24, 2022.

Instead, four years later, hundreds of thousands have been killed, millions forced to flee and much of eastern Ukraine has been destroyed.

In the midst of another winter of combat, the G7 said it has provided financial support along with "critical equipment" in recent weeks such as generators and turbines to aid the country's energy supplies.

Since January, "more than half a billion euros of new pledges were made to the Ukraine Energy Support Fund to purchase equipment to repair and protect the Ukrainian energy system," the statement said. The United States has been pushing to end the conflict, mediating talks between the two sides this year in Geneva and Abu Dhabi, but they remain at odds over the issue of territory.



The Russian army seized more territory during the fourth year of the Ukraine war than in the preceding two years combined, according to an AFP analysis of data from the Institute for the Study of War (ISW). Since February 24, 2025 -- the third anniversary of Russia's invasion -- Moscow's troops have taken 4,524 square kilometres (1,750 square miles), an area slightly larger than the US state of Rhode Island, according to data from the ISW.

US TV anchor offers \$1 million in mother's abduction

US TV anchor Savannah Guthrie said yesterday her family is now offering up to \$1 million for a tip leading to the recovery of her mother, who was kidnapped 24 days ago.

Guthrie acknowledged that her mother might now be dead, in what would be a tragic end to a case that has gripped America and baffled police since Nancy Guthrie, 84, went missing from her home in Tucson, Arizona on February 1.

Despite a frantic search for the older woman, police have not identified a suspect in the case.

Fighting back tears in a post on Instagram, Guthrie said she and her sister and brother now accept their mother may be dead.

"We know that she may be lost," Guthrie said. "She may already be gone."

But the family needs closure, she added.

"We need her to come home. For that reason, we are

offering a family reward of up to one million dollars for any information that leads us to her recovery," Guthrie said.

"Someone out there knows something that can bring her home," Guthrie said. "Somebody knows."

Federal investigators are offering \$100,000 for information leading to the older woman's location or the arrest of her

captors. The FBI has released photos and video of a masked person approaching Guthrie's home on the night of the kidnapping but has failed to identify a suspect.

Pima County Sheriff Chris Nanos said last week that investigators had ruled out Nancy Guthrie's family members as having any involvement in her disappearance.

BBK announces its financial results for the year ended 31st December 2025, recording a net profit attributable to the owners of the Bank of BD 80.0 million and BD 23.5 million for the fourth quarter then ended.

For the fourth quarter of 2025:

The Bank achieved a net profit attributable to the owners of the Bank of BD 23.5 million, registering a growth of 23.7% compared to the net profit of BD 19.0 million achieved during the corresponding period of last year. The basic and diluted earnings per share for the fourth quarter amounted to 13 fils compared to 11 fils during the previous year.

Total comprehensive income attributable to the owners of the Bank amounted to BD 25.5 million during the fourth quarter of 2025, compared to BD 11.8 million during the same period of last year, representing a significant increase of 116.1%. The growth is mainly due to higher movement during the quarter in unrealized gain in fair value reserves relating to debt instruments and equity investments compared to the same period last year, as well as higher reported net profit.

For the full financial year ended 31st December 2025:

BBK achieved a new high record net profit attributable to the owners of the Bank of BD 80.0 million compared to BD 72.0 million achieved during the previous year, an increase of 11.1%. The basic and diluted earnings per share amounted to 44 fils compared to 40 fils for the prior

year.

The total comprehensive income attributable to the owners of the Bank for the year 2025 amounted to BD 102.2 million, compared to BD 69.5 million reported during last year, an increase of 47.1%. The increase is mainly related to positive market valuations, and higher net profit.

The increase in net profit was mainly attributable to an increase in the net fees and commission income from BD 19.5 million to BD 22.1 million, recording a growth of 13.3%, while investment and other income experienced a growth of 6.1%, increasing from BD 19.8 million to BD 21.0 million, reflecting the Bank's dynamic business model and its efforts to diversify income from non-interest income streams. In addition, the Bank's share from associates and joint ventures recorded a profit of BD 1.5 million compared to a loss of BD 2.7 million reported during 2024. Net provisions and impairments declined by 60.7% from BD 17.3 million to BD 6.8 million reported in 2025, reflecting the

Bank's active management of credit risk and distressed exposures. On the other hand, net interest income declined by 5.9% at BD 117.2 million compared to BD 124.6 million. Total operating expenses increased by 3.9% from BD 71.3 million to BD 74.1 million, mainly due to the implementation of strategic initiatives and investments in human capital to support the implementation of various strategic and business initiatives aimed at providing our customers with the best banking experience.

Total shareholders' equity attributable to the owners of the Bank increased to BD 657.5 million as of end of December 2025, compared to BD 620.8 million as of end of the financial year 2024, an increase of 5.9%. The increase is mainly related to the positive movement in investment securities' market valuations and higher reported net profit.

Total assets increased by 18.6% to reach BD 4,974.3 million as of end of December 2025 compared to BD 4,192.6 million reported at end of financial year

2024. Deposits and amounts due from banks and other financial institutions increased by 73.1% to stand at BD 290.6 million (31st December 2024: BD 167.9 million); net loans and advances increased by 31.5% to BD 2,358.5 million (31st December 2024: BD 1,794.1 million); while investment securities portfolio recorded a growth of 26.8% to BD 1,190.9 million (31st December 2024: BD 939.4 million). On the other hand, Cash and balances with central banks was lower by 14.7%, to stand at BD 586.6 million (31st December 2024: BD 687.7 million). Treasury bills declined by 23.7% to reach BD 304.4 million (31st December 2024: BD 399.2 million). However, Customer deposits recorded a growth of 18.3% to stand at BD 2,853.5 million (31st December 2024: BD 2,411.3 million). Term borrowings increased by 32.2% to stand at BD 405.3 million (31st December 2024: BD 306.5 million), due to the successful closure of US\$500 million, 3-year Club Loan Facility, to support the Bank's strategic business plans.

Dividend

Following the positive financial results for the year ended 31st December 2025, the Board of Directors recommended paying cash dividends of 40 fils per share (including 12.5 fils interim dividend paid earlier) for the year 2025 for the shareholders registered with the Bank on the record date, subject to the approval of the regulatory authorities and the shareholders at the Annual General Meeting (AGM).

The Board expressed its satisfaction with the financial re-

sults, stating: "BBK has delivered a solid record performance over the past year despite a challenging market environment. The result marked a historic milestone for BBK, delivering the highest net profit on record in the Bank's history. This exceptional achievement underscores the resilience of our business model, the effectiveness of our strategic initiatives, and the unwavering commitment of our management team and employees. Through prudent risk management, disciplined execution, and a strong focus on customer centric innovation, BBK has continued to strengthen its financial position and enhance shareholder value. We extend our sincere appreciation to our customers for their trust and loyalty, to our employees for their dedication and professionalism, to our management for their leadership, and to our shareholders for their continued confidence in our vision. Looking ahead, the Board remains confident in the Bank's ability to navigate future challenges, build on its strong foundations, and deliver sustainable long term value for all stakeholders".

BBK's Group Chief Executive, Mr. Yaser Alsharifi, added, "BBK remains sound in its commitment to a robust business model that aims to deliver value and excellence to its shareholders and customers. 
Bahrain Nandi Association Hosts Vibrant Iftar Meet



Ramadan Recipe

Turmeric Lamb Kebabs

Servings: 6 | Time: 1hr

Ingredients

- 1 large white onion, peeled, plus more sliced onion, for serving
- 2 pounds ground lamb
- 4 large garlic cloves, finely chopped (about 1 1/2 tablespoons)
- 2 tablespoons kosher salt, plus more to taste
- 2 teaspoons black pepper
- 1 teaspoon ground turmeric
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 12 (10-inch) metal skewers
- 6 tablespoons fresh lemon juice (from 2 lemons), plus lemon wedges, for serving
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter, melted
- Neutral oil, for grill
- Dried mint, to taste
- Lavash, sumac, fresh herbs (such as cilantro, parsley, basil, dill, and mint), and plain whole-milk yogurt, for serving

Directions

1. Grate onion on large holes of a box grater. Place grated onion in a double layer of paper towels, and squeeze to remove excess liquid. Place grated onion in a large bowl; stir in ground lamb, garlic, salt, pepper, turmeric, and baking soda until combined. Working in batches if need-



ed, transfer mixture to a food processor, and pulse until a smooth, thick paste forms, about 5 pulses. Divide mixture into 12 equal portions (about 3 1/2 ounces each).

2. Press 1 meat portion onto a skewer using lightly

dampened hands; flatten into an 8-inch-long tube, leaving 2 inches of space at base of skewer. Using your thumb and pointer finger on either side of skewer, make 1/2-inch-deep divots along length of meat. Place skewer on a baking sheet. Repeat with remaining meat portions.

3. Preheat grill to medium-high (400°F to 450°F). Meanwhile, stir together lemon juice, butter, and salt to taste. Set aside.
4. Place skewers on oiled grates. Grill, uncovered, until bottom side is well browned, about 3 minutes. Flip skewers, and baste generously with lemon juice mixture. Continue grilling until skewers are cooked through, about 3 minutes. Remove from grill, and baste with remaining lemon juice mixture. Sprinkle to taste with dried mint. Serve skewers with sliced onion, lemon wedges, lavash, sumac, herbs, and yogurt.

Former US Open champion Raducanu in no hurry to find new coach

Emma Raducanu insists she is in no rush to find a new coach as the former US Open champion looks to revert to a "more aggressive style of play".

The British tennis player has got through several coaches in a relatively short career, with Francisco Roig the latest to leave the role after the Spaniard spent six months working with Raducanu.

The 23-year-old was outspoken after a second-round loss to Anastasia Potapova at the Australian Open, saying she wanted to be playing "in a way more similar to when I was younger".

In Raducanu's next tournament in Romania she reached her first final since the stunning US Open triumph in 2021 and she insisted she remains happy working with hitting partner Alexis Canter, a 27-year-old former British player who reached a career-high ranking of 779 last year.

Brook ton fires England past Pakistan into semi-finals

Harry Brook smashed a breathtaking century as England defeated Pakistan by two wickets in a tense Super Eights clash in Kandy yesterday to seal their place in the T20 World Cup semi-finals. Chasing 165, England recovered from 0 for 1 and 17 for 2 to reach 166 for 8 with five balls to spare, Brook anchoring the innings with a blistering 100 off 51 balls, hitting 10 fours and four sixes.

Brook held England together as wickets fell around him, adding crucial middle-overs runs with Will Jacks, who made 28 off 23, before falling with just 10 runs needed. Shaheen Shah Afridi rattled the top order with a four-wicket burst to finish with 4 for 30, while Mohammad Nawaz and Usman Tariq struck in the middle overs to keep Pakistan

in the contest until the closing stages.

Earlier, Pakistan posted 164 for nine after electing to bat, built around an impressive 63 from 45 balls by opener Sahibzada Farhan, who struck seven fours and two sixes. Fakhar Zaman added a brisk 25 off 16 and Shadab Khan thrashed 23 off 11, but regular strikes from Liam Dawson, who took 3 for 24, and Jofra Archer and Jamie Overton, with two wickets apiece, checked Pakistan's late surge.

England's nervy chase went down to the final over before Jofra Archer punched the winning boundary to complete a memorable night at Pallekele International Cricket Stadium. The result left Pakistan's hopes of progressing hanging by a thread, while an unbeaten Brook walked off to a standing ovation for one of the tournament's standout innings.

Santer's New Zealand ready for Sri Lanka's spin challenge

New Zealand skipper Mitchell Santner said yesterday adapting to slow-turning pitches in Colombo would be key for their crucial T20 World Cup clash against co-hosts Sri Lanka. The Black Caps need a win in their second Super Eights match in Group 2 on Wednesday at the R. Premadasa Stadium after their first match against Pakistan was washed out at the same venue.

Santner's team have been in the Sri Lankan capital for a week after finishing their group

Bahrain National Team Looks To Regroup In Turkey

The Bahrain national football team will hold a training camp in Turkey from March 22 to 31, including two friendlies against Kyrgyzstan on March 23 and Uganda on March 26. The camp comes as the squad looks to recover from a difficult international period.

Bahrain's Arab Cup campaign in 2025 saw mixed results. The team began with a 1-0 win over Djibouti in the first qualifying round on November 26, but fell 2-1 to Iraq in Group Stage Matchday 1 on December 3. A heavy 1-5 defeat to Algeria on Matchday 2 put the team in a

difficult position, and although Talajic's side bounced back with a 3-1 win over Sudan, they were already out of contention for the knockout stage.

Earlier last year, Bahrain's

2026 World Cup qualifying hopes ended after a 0-2 home loss to Saudi Arabia on June 5, followed by a 1-0 defeat to China on June 10. The team finished in the lower half of Group C, which

included Japan, Australia, Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, and China, failing to advance further.

Coach Dragan Talajic emphasized the importance of the Turkey camp for the squad to reset. "After the results we've had, it's important for the team to regroup and put things right," he said. "We want to get our act together and make sure the players are ready for the challenges ahead."

The camp concludes on March 31, when the squad returns to the Kingdom. With two friendlies and focused preparation, the team will aim to address recent setbacks and build momentum for a stronger 2026 campaign.
