# **Five sentenced in** fraud case TDT | Manama

A man was asked to pay BD3,400 for a Nokia mobile phone worth only BD60 in one of the most unusual fraud cases that have been reported in the Kingdom recently.

This has been revealed before the Minor Criminal Court, which yesterday ordered to imprison a wellknown Bahraini unionist for two years for the charges of forging debt bonds of customers at two of his electronic shops.

The court also sentenced four of the employees in the shops to six months for assisting in the fraud.

According to court files, the defendants have forged bills and other documents issued to their customers (victims), after selling them goods on the basis of monthly instalments.

Years later, the first defendant filed cases at the court, demanding the victims to pay the amounts mentioned in the forged documents.

A victim informed prosecutors that he had purchased a Nokia mobile for BD60 and was shocked after few years to find out that a lawsuit has been filed against him to pay BD3,400 for the same phone, while another victim said she had paid 12 monthly instalments of BD64 for a laptop she had bought from the defendant, who demanded her to pay BD1,482 for it seven years later.
