Hosts recover from slow start to beat Pakistan 3-1 in Manama final.

ahrain were crowned champions of the 2025 AVC Men's Volleyball Nations Cup after a 3-1 comeback win over Pakistan in Tuesday night's final at Isa Town Sport City Hall in Manama.

The home side dropped the opening set 23-25 but found their rhythm quickly, controlling the rest of the match with scores of 25-15, 25-17, and 25-18 to seal the title in front of a home crowd. Mohamed Anan was top scorer with 27 points - 26 coming from attack, and 1 from an ace serve.

Momentum Shift

Pakistan entered the final with confidence, having swept Qatar in straight sets in the semi-final. Their strong start saw them edge the first set, but Bahrain's response was immediate and emphatic. The hosts tightened their block, found efficiency in transition, and dictated the tem-
