Towering Obelisk welcomes travellers from Saudi Arabia

Bahrain inaugurated an LED-lit obelisk - a rectangular pillar with a tapered top forming a pyramidion - to commemorate the Saudi Naon the 23rd of September.

The structure, commissioned by Bahrain Tourism and Exhibitions Authority with Bahrain Bay Development yesterday, is in the Bahrain Bay Area.

The monument has internally LED-lit calligraphy and a beacon of light pointing towards the Holy Kaaba in the Grand Mosque in Makkah.

The grand structure is in the middle of the maze in the Gardens area in Bahrain Bay.

The inauguration featured events, including a musical performance and a Dhow show lasting for three hours.
