Joint maritime exercise



The Ministry of Interior confirmed that, as part of strategic plans aimed at enhancing national capabilities in the field of maritime security and ensuring a safe and sustainable maritime environment, the Coast Guard Command carried out the joint maritime exercise (Comprehensive 1) with the participation of the National Guard and Bapco Energy, and with support from a number of security departments at the Ministry of Interior. The exercise also included marine search and rescue operations in the area designated for Bapco Energy's marine survey project, enhancing full readiness to handle emergencies and protect lives and property. The Coast Guard Command indicated that these joint exercises represent a fundamental pillar for enhancing the efficiency of naval and security units and developing field capabilities to confront security challenges, thus consolidating the Kingdom of Bahrain's leading role in the field of maritime security and safety.
