**Fraudsters jailed over card theft and fake payments**

● Fined BD1,000 each

The High Criminal Court of Appeal upheld the first-instance ruling, sentencing an Arab defendant, who had previous convictions, and an Asian defendant to three years in prison each.

The court also imposed a fine of BD1,000 on each defendant and ordered their permanent deportation upon completion of their sentences.

The conviction came after the defendants used stolen bank cards to pay electricity and water bills online in 12 fraudulent transactions totaling BD1,854.

The Public Prosecution stated that the defendants used electronic signatures of other people's bank cards fraudulently, entering card data and verification codes to complete payments through the government e-portal, unlawfully taking money belonging to others.

According to a fraud operations monitor at the financial company, the 12 payments were processed for the benefit of four different accounts.

# Deadly birdstrike

Col. Bahar: Feeding or raising pigeons near airports puts lives and flights at risk

Speaking on the Ministry of Interior's "Al Aman" program, Col. Dr Osama Bahar, head of Hidd Police Station, cautioned that raising pigeons or feeding birds near airports and public areas can pose serious dangers to aircraft during takeoff and landing — the most critical phases of flight.

"If you're raising pigeons and flying them near the airport, you need to give up this hobby," he said. "People's lives matter. This isn't a game."

According to Bahar, roughly 1,000 pigeons are present in areas surrounding Bahrain International Airport. While pigeons are common in urban neighbourhoods, their presence near flight paths creates a significant risk.

**Altitudes**

Birds often fly in flocks at low altitudes — sometimes below 150 feet — overlapping with aircraft climb and descent routes. When birds are ingested into jet engines or strike windshields, the consequences can be severe.

Globally, aviation authorities estimate bird strikes cost be-

emergency landing, saving all 155 passengers — a reminder of how quickly routine flights can turn into crises.

**Prevention**

"These examples show this is not a small issue," Bahar said. "Prevention starts on the ground."

Public health officials have long warned about pigeons as disease carriers. But Bahar stressed that his focus is on aviation safety.

Feeding birds in open areas —

including cemeteries, rooftops and vacant plots near airport zones — encourages flocking and population growth. Hobbyists who raise and release pigeons may unintentionally draw birds into protected airspace.

Acts of kindness toward animals, he said, must not endanger human life.

**Deeds**

"If you seek good deeds, protect those on the planes — those arriving and those departing."

Airports worldwide invest heavily in wildlife management systems, including radar monitoring, deterrents and habitat control. Yet officials say community awareness remains essential.

Authorities urge residents near airports to avoid feeding birds and to reconsider pigeon-raising activities involving free flight.

Protecting passengers, pilots, and airport workers requires cooperation between regulators and the public.

As Bahrain strengthens its position as a regional aviation hub, officials say safe skies depend not only on regulation and technology — but also on responsible choices made on the ground.

**Drug offense trial**

A man in his twenties is on trial for importing 1.2 kilograms of cannabis for trafficking and possessing marijuana and hashish for personal use.

He admitted to using the drugs but denied trafficking.

Customs intercepted the package from Asia, which was professionally concealed, and he later collected it, admitting ownership before it was handed to the Narcotics Control Department.

A search of his residence uncovered more drugs, marijuana plants, a container with traces of narcotics, rolling papers, and small bags.

**Narcotic arrest**

The Ministry of Interior announced that the Air Customs Directorate at Customs Affairs has foiled an attempt to smuggle 98 capsules containing a substance suspected to be narcotic at Bahrain International Airport.

It explained that while screening the luggage of a traveller through the X-ray scanner, a customs officer became suspicious.

# Noise controls

## 'Make Gergaoon bag' workshop

Call to set fixed hours for noisy building work in residential areas

A formal decision to rein in noisy construction and maintenance work in residential areas has been sought by a Northern Municipal Council member.

The move follows complaints that building, demolition and digging activities are taking place late at night and on public holidays, disturbing residents.

Council member Abdulla Ashour asked for rules to fix the hours when works that cause loud noise can be carried out within the Northern Municipality's jurisdiction.

### Recommendation

The council agreed to refer a recommendation to the Minister of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, urging a ministerial decision on the issue.

Ashour said the lack of a clear legal rule has left some contractors and workers starting building, demolition and excavation at 'unsuitable times', including during public holidays and leave periods, and in late-night hours.

He said constant exposure to noise can harm residents' comfort and has led to neighbour disputes in some areas.

### Fines

He said there is no legal text that names the body responsible for setting work hours, tracking breaches and issuing fines against those behind nuisance linked to construction activity.

The Building Regulation Law, issued under Decree-Law No. 13 of 1977, does not contain an ex-

PLICIT provision that deals with such limits, he added.

Ashour also pointed to an earlier step in the Shura Council, where the Services and Public Utilities Committee put forward a draft law to add a new Article 21 (repeated) to the Building Regulation Law.

### Decision

Under that proposal, the minister, in coordination with municipal councils, would issue a decision that lists the days and times when building, demolition and excavation would be banned in residential areas, along with any exceptions.

He said the public interest calls for a decision that sets out the barred hours for certain works in housing areas, to shield residents from noise and to support their comfort, as building activity expands across the kingdom.

Ashour said the reasons behind the proposal include creating a quieter setting for people living in nearby homes, supporting safety away from sources of disturbance, and cutting neighbour disputes linked to noisy works during weekends and official holidays.

## Council pushes for solar power to cut utility costs

The Capital Municipal Council has voted unanimously to install solar panel systems on its buildings and facilities, signalling a practical shift towards cleaner energy and long-term savings.

Members said the proposal

was about responsibility, not symbolism.

With Bahrain enjoying high levels of sunlight throughout the year, councillors stressed that it makes sense for public institutions to benefit from this readily available natural resource.

Behind the technical language lies a simple idea: reduce reliance

on the national grid and lower annual operating costs.

Every dinar saved on electricity, members noted, can be redirected towards projects that residents see and feel in their neighbourhoods.

The council recommended conducting a detailed technical and economic feasibility study to identify suitable buildings

and ensure the project delivers measurable financial and environmental returns before implementation begins.

Councillors described the move as part of a broader responsibility to lead by example.

If public institutions adopt renewable energy solutions, they said, it sends a clear message to businesses and households alike.

## Salmabad garage robbers jailed

The High Criminal Court of Appeal upheld the first-instance ruling sentencing two appellants – along with three others – to five years in prison in a robbery case that took place inside a garage in Salmabad.

The crime was reportedly motivated by the intention to seize money and narcotics.

According to the case details, the plan was formed at the home of the second defendant, where the fourth defendant suggested robbing an Asian man believed to be staying at a garage and allegedly in possession of drugs.

The idea was accepted by those present.

The first defendant was contacted, arrived at the house, and agreed to participate.

Late at night, the group headed to the location in a car driven by the first defendant.

He and the fifth defendant remained inside the vehicle.

# Germany's Merz meets Xi, announces Airbus order

## China will buy up to 120 aircraft from Airbus



China will buy up to 120 aircraft from European aviation giant Airbus, German Chancellor Friedrich Merz said following talks with President Xi Jinping in Beijing on Wednesday.

Merz's visit comes as Berlin and Beijing seek to build on their decades-old economic ties to weather global uncertainty sparked by US President Donald Trump's tariff blitz and other erratic foreign policy moves.

China, the world's number two economy, overtook the United States last year to become

Germany's biggest trade partner. At the same time, Berlin regards the Communist Party-run state as a systemic rival to the West.

Following talks with top Chinese leaders, Merz told re-

porters that China had agreed to purchase "up to 120" Airbus aircraft, adding that it "demonstrates how worthwhile such trips can be".

Other contracts were in the

pipeline, Merz added.

Earlier in the day, Merz and Xi stressed their commitment to developing closer strategic relations, with the German leader saying he saw the trip as a "great opportunity" to boost economic ties. Xi, in turn, told Merz he was willing to take their ties to "new levels".

Merz said that in his meetings he also touched on the sensitive topic Taiwan, the self-ruled island China claims as part of its territory and which it has not ruled out the use of force to annex.

Any "reunification" must be done peacefully, Merz said.

He also discussed the Ukraine war with Xi, who according to state news agency Xinhua said diplomacy was "key to the issue".

"Xi noted the necessity of ensuring the equal participation of all parties to lay a solid foundation for peace, (and) addressing the legitimate concerns of all sides to strengthen the will for peace," Xinhua added.

Germany's trade deficit with China hit a record 89 billion euros (\$105 billion) last year.

### Cars, AI and competition

China's top diplomat, Wang Yi, told Merz at the Munich Security Conference this month that Beijing wanted Germany to be a "stabilising anchor for strategic relations" in the European Union.

Merz is joined by business leaders including executives of auto giants Volkswagen, BMW and Mercedes.

On Thursday, he is set to visit Beijing's Forbidden City, then a Mercedes plant where autonomous driving vehicles will be presented.

The chancellor will then travel to AI hub Hangzhou to visit the robotics group Unitree and German turbine maker Siemens Energy.

German businesses have given Merz a to-do list on his trip.

"We expect the chancellor to clearly address problems such as overcapacity, distortions of competition, and export controls on critical raw materials," said Wolfgang Niedermeyer of the Federation of German Industries.

Merz should advocate for "structural reforms to strength-



en domestic demand and fairer competitive conditions" in China, he said, warning that without change there will be "new trade conflicts with the EU".

◆ **The lives of more than 1.9 million displaced people in South Sudan are being put at risk due to aid funding shortages, the UN's migration agency said yesterday.** The International Organization for Migration (IOM) said humanitarian needs were dramatically outstripping resources in one of the world's most displacement-affected countries. "Critical funding shortfalls are putting the lives of over 1.9 million displaced people in South Sudan at risk," the agency said in a statement. South Sudan, the world's newest sovereign country, has been beset by civil war, poverty and massive corruption since it was formed in 2011. South Sudan is grappling with new arrivals fleeing the conflict in neighbouring Sudan, while dealing with its own displacement caused by years of conflict, flooding and instability, the IOM said.

◆ **US to ease Venezuelan oil exports to Cuba for humanitarian reasons**

◆ **The United States** said yesterday it will ease restrictions on Venezuelan oil exports to Cuba's private sector for humanitarian reasons, as the island reels from an energy crisis. The Treasury Department said in a notice it would allow "transactions that support the Cuban people, including the Cuban private sector," such as oil exports "for commercial and humanitarian use."

◆ **The astronaut** who faced a health issue prompting the first-ever medical evacuation in International Space Station history is "doing very well," he said in a statement issued by NASA yesterday. Mike Fincke, 58, said he's "doing very well and continuing standard post-flight reconditioning" at NASA's center in Houston. NASA had previously declined to identify which astronaut experienced the "medical event," the details of which they still did not disclose in Wednesday's statement. The health issue prompted NASA to cut short the mission of a quartet including Americans Fincke and Zena Cardman along with Russian cosmonaut Oleg Platonov and Japanese astronaut Kimiya Yui. Fincke said that his January 7 health mishap required "immediate attention from my incredible crewmates."

AI robot monk unveiled in Japan

Japanese researchers have unveiled a robot monk powered by AI that they say can dispense spiritual advice and maybe one day ease shortages of its human counterparts.

Trained on even the most esoteric Buddhist scriptures, the University of Kyoto says the machine can answer sensitive questions that people may feel hesitant to share with other humans.

In addition, "Buddharoid", as the diminutive two-legged humanoid is known, can offer a sense of presence at religious sanctuaries in addition to voice communications.

"In the future, it is conceivable that they may assist with or replace some of the religious rituals traditionally performed by human monks," the university said in a statement on Wednesday.

The robot is the latest offering from Seiji Kumagai, a professor at the university's Institute for the Future of Human Society.

Using AI models from Ope-

nAI and others, he has worked with engineering firms to develop religious AI chatbots like Buddha Bot and a catechism bot.

For his new creation, Kumagai installed his updated "BuddhaBotPlus" on a Chinese-made "Unitree G1" humanoid robot to create the AI robo-monk.

In a media presentation at a temple on Tuesday, Kumagai presented the robot -- as yet without a face -- wearing a simple grey garment.

It held its gloved hands together in a prayer form and walked around in front of reporters and performed other tasks.

As it sat on a chair, the humanoid gave advice to a young local journalist who confessed to thinking and worrying too much.

"Buddhism teaches that it is important not to blindly follow one's thoughts or rush headlong into things," it said in a soothing baritone to the journalist from national broadcaster NHK.

"One approach is to calm your mind and let go of the thought itself," it said.

**Modi lands in Israel to 'strengthen cooperation'**

Modi tells MPs in Jerusalem that India stands with Israel 'firmly with full conviction'

● **Talks opened in New Delhi for India-Israel Free Trade Agreement (FTA)**

India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived in Israel yesterday for a two-day visit aimed at deepening ties with a key trade and defence partner.

It is Modi's second visit to Israel as prime minister.

He is scheduled to meet his counterpart Benjamin Netanyahu and President Isaac Herzog.

"Our nations share a robust and multifaceted strategic partnership," Modi said in a statement before leaving New Delhi, adding that he will address the Knesset, Israel's parliament, later on Thursday.

"Ties have significantly strengthened in the last few years."

New Delhi has steadily expanded cooperation with Israel across the defence, agriculture, technology and cybersecurity sectors, while balancing diplomatic interests in the Middle East.

Talks opened in New Delhi on Monday for an India-Israel Free Trade Agreement (FTA), India's government said in a statement,

noting that merchandise trade reached \$3.62 billion in 2024-2025.

Modi said he would hold talks with Netanyahu to "discuss ways to strengthen cooperation".

Full diplomatic relations between the two countries were established in 1992. Ties deepened

after Modi took office in 2014.

Modi first visited Israel as prime minister in 2017, before Netanyahu made a reciprocal visit to India the following year.

Both right-wing leaders have called each other a "friend".

In September 2023, grand plans were unveiled in New Delhi

for an India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor -- to link railways, ports, electricity, data networks and pipelines, including through Saudi Arabia and Israel. Those plans were stalled by Hamas's October 7 attack on Israel, which responded with a devastating war in the Gaza Strip.

**India's economic growth, Israel's innovation create 'natural foundation' for partnership**

Continuing his address, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi told lawmakers in Jerusalem yesterday that India's rapid economic expansion and Israel's strength in technological innovation provide a "natural foundation" for a deeper and more

forward-looking partnership. He was speaking in the Knesset during his two-day visit aimed at strengthening ties with one of India's key trade and defence partners.

"For the last few years, India has been the fastest growing major economy in the world... At the same time, Israel is a pow-

erhouse of innovation and technological leadership," Modi told MPs in the Knesset, the Israeli parliament.

"This creates a natural foundation for our forward-looking partnership. We are committed to expanding trade, strengthening investment flows and promoting joint infrastructure

development," he said.

"I see a lot of synergies in areas such as Quantum technologies, semiconductors and artificial intelligence. We are also working with Israel on creating cross-border financial linkages using our digital public infrastructure," Modi added.

**Hezbollah official says will not intervene in event of 'limited' US strikes on Iran**

A Hezbollah official told AFP on Wednesday that the Lebanese movement would not intervene militarily in the event of "limited" US strikes on its backer Iran, but would consider any attack against supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei a "red line".

The US has repeatedly threatened Iran over its contentious nuclear programme, and Lebanese authorities fear Hezbollah could become involved if a potential US attack triggered a regional war. But the official told AFP on condition of anonymity: "In the event of limited US strikes on Iran, Hezbollah's position will be to not intervene militarily."

If the group determines, however, that the United States is trying to "provoke the downfall

of the Iranian regime or to target the supreme leader, Hezbollah will then intervene", they added.

The official predicted that in a

hypothetical scenario where the US attempted to militarily unseat the Iranian government, US-ally Israel would "inevitably wage a

war against Lebanon".

US President Donald Trump has deployed warships and fighter jets near Iran to back up his threats of strikes should ongoing negotiations between the two sides fail to secure a deal.

Lebanon's foreign minister said Tuesday that the government feared Israeli attacks on civilian infrastructure if Hezbollah -- which still has an arsenal of ballistic missiles -- became part of a regional conflict between the US and Iran.

"What the Lebanese fear is a chain reaction: an American strike against Iran, a Hezbollah retaliatory strike against Israel, followed by a massive Israeli response," said a Lebanese official who requested anonymity.

# Iran negotiators head Geneva for US talks

President strikes hopeful tone

● Trump claimed that Tehran had already developed missiles

● But Iranian foreign ministry refuted those claims

● The West believes Iran is seeking an atomic bomb

An Iranian delegation headed by its top diplomat set off for Geneva yesterday for talks with the US, as the Islamic republic's president struck an upbeat tone about the prospect for a negotiated agreement to avert fresh conflict.

Donald Trump has repeatedly threatened strikes if Iran fails to cut a deal on its atomic programme, and in his State of the Union address on Tuesday, the US president accused Tehran of "sinister nuclear ambitions" after he ordered a massive military deployment around the Gulf.

But Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian said yesterday that he had a "favourable outlook for the negotiations", after Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi and his team left for Switzerland.

## US unveils new Iran sanctions

Washington, United States

The United States yesterday announced fresh sanctions targeting Iran, pressing on with what Washington calls its "maximum pressure" campaign ahead of talks between both sides in Geneva.

The US Treasury Department's latest sanctions take aim at more than 30 individuals, entities and vessels said to be enabling "illicit Iranian petroleum sales," as well as its weapons production.

In particular, vessels operating "as part of Iran's shadow fleet, which transport Iranian petroleum and petroleum products to foreign markets" were targeted as a means to strike at authorities' revenue sources, the Treasury said.

"Iran exploits financial systems to sell illicit oil, launder the proceeds, procure components for its nuclear and conventional weapons programs, and support its terrorist proxies," charged US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent in a statement.

He vowed that the Trump administration will continue to push for "maximum pressure on Iran to target the regime's weapons capabilities and support for terrorism."

nor peace' situation," Pezeshkian said in a speech.

Trump in his address claimed that Tehran had "already developed missiles that can threaten Europe and our bases overseas, and they're working to build missiles that will soon reach the United States of America".

He also said that Iran was "at this moment again pursuing their sinister nuclear ambitions".

But Iranian foreign ministry spokesman Esmail Baqaei on Wednesday refuted those claims as "simply the repetition of 'big lies'".



The maximum range of Iran's missiles is 2,000 kilometres (1,200 miles) according to what Tehran has publicly disclosed, though the US Congressional Research Service estimates they top out at about 3,000 kilometres -- less than a third of the distance to the continental United States.

## Bill Gates admits affairs but denies involvement in Epstein crimes

Bill Gates has admitted making a "huge mistake" in associating with Jeffrey Epstein, telling staff at his charity foundation that he had affairs with two Russian women but denying involvement in the disgraced financier's crimes.

The Microsoft co-founder is among the prominent names appearing in documents released by the US Justice Department that revealed close friendships, illicit financial dealings and private photos with convicted sex offender Epstein.

In a town hall Tuesday with staff at the Gates Foundation, a recording of which was reviewed by The Wall Street Journal, Gates expressed regret that his relationship with Epstein had affected the work of his philanthropic organization.

"It was a huge mistake to spend time with Epstein" and to also bring Gates Foundation executives into meetings with Epstein, he said.

"I apologize to other peo-

ple who are drawn into this because of the mistake that I made."

In a draft email among the documents released by the Justice Department, Epstein alleged Gates engaged in extramarital affairs, writing that his relationship with Gates ranged from "helping Bill to get drugs, in order to deal with consequences of sex with Russian girls, to facilitating his illicit trysts, with married women."

Gates, 70, admitted at the town hall to two affairs.

"I did have affairs, one with a Russian bridge player who met me at bridge events, and one with a Russian nuclear physicist who I met through business activities," he said.

But he denied any involvement with victims of Epstein, who died in a New York jail cell in 2019 while awaiting

trial for sex trafficking underage girls.

"I did nothing illicit. I saw nothing illicit," Gates told the town hall.

The tech titan said his relationship with Epstein began in 2011, three years after the financier pleaded guilty to soliciting a minor for prostitution.

Gates said he knew of an "18-month thing" restricting Epstein's travel but didn't check his background.

He said his then-wife Melinda expressed concerns about Epstein in 2013, but that he continued the relationship for at least another year.

"Knowing what I know now makes it, you know, a hundred times worse in terms of not only his crimes in the past, but now it's clear there was ongoing bad behavior," Gates told staff.

## The Bill That Makes You Sick!

Have you ever wondered why a doctor prescribes five tablets — but the pharmacy sells you a full box of ten, twenty or even thirty?

It is a small moment at the counter. Yet for many Bahraini residents, it raises serious questions about costs, regulations, and waste.

Medical ethics are clear: patients must take medicines exactly as a doctor advises. But in practice, patients are often required to purchase an entire sealed pack, even when only a few tablets are prescribed. The remainder usually ends up in kitchen drawers or medicine cabinets — unused, forgotten, or eventually thrown away.

Bahrain's pharmaceutical regulations are in place for sound reasons. Medicines must be sold in manufacturer-sealed packaging to prevent contamination, ensure quality control, reduce tampering and maintain proper monitoring of regulated drugs. These safeguards are essential in protecting public health.

But good regulation should also consider practical impact.

For families with modest incomes, every dinar matters. If a patient needs only five tablets of a common pain reliever or fever medication, being required to buy a pack of twenty can feel like an unnecessary expense. Multiply that across antibiotics, painkillers and other short-term treatments, and households quietly accumulate strips of unused medicine.

The issue becomes more concerning with antibiotics. When the prescribed course does not match the number of tablets in a commercial pack, extra pills remain at home. Those leftovers can encourage self-medication later without medical supervision — a dangerous practice that contributes to antibiotic resistance and other health risks.

In several countries, including India, pharmacies dispense medicines in exact quantities. Tablets are placed in labelled packets, dosage instructions are clearly written, and since each blister strip carries its expiry date, patients can verify the product's safety. While that system comes with its own regulatory challenges, it addresses both affordability and waste.

The debate, therefore, is not about weakening Bahrain's safety standards. It is about modernising packaging.

Pharmaceutical manufacturers could be encouraged to produce smaller pack sizes that align with common prescription durations — five, seven or ten tablets instead of only twenty or thirty. Such an approach would preserve quality control while easing the financial burden on patients.

Healthcare professionals often remind us that stress is one of the greatest contributors to illness. Financial strain only adds to that burden. When patients already worry about their health, they should not also worry about paying for medicine they do not need.

When a prescription says five tablets, the bill should not feel like twenty. Am I overdosing on my thoughts — or prescribing the right question?



# Bahrain Eyes Breakthrough at 3x3 Asia Cup

As the countdown begins for the FIBA 3x3 Asia Cup 2026, Bahrain's men's and women's national teams now know the path to the finals in Singapore, hosting the tournament for the fifth straight year and also set to welcome the 2027 FIBA 3x3 World Cup.

Singapore Sports Hub, the event will feature 24 men's teams and 22 women's teams competing for continental supremacy and a spot at next year's World Cup. Bahrain enters the tournament seeking redemption after their debut at the 2025 Asia Cup, which concluded last March. The men's team secured narrow wins over Indonesia (14-11) and Guam (21-20) but also suffered a heavy 7-21 defeat to Hong

Kong, missing out on the main draw. Meanwhile, the women's squad fell 5-21 to South Korea and 17-12 to Malaysia, exiting early. While the results were disappointing, the experience offered valuable lessons heading into 2026. In this year's qualifiers, Bahrain's men are drawn in Group D alongside Kazakhstan, Hong Kong, and India. Only the group winner advances to the finals,

where they would join New Zealand and Qatar. Australia, the most decorated nation in Asia Cup history with five titles, including last year's crown, lead a competitive field that also includes former champions Mongolia and Qatar. Bahrain's women are in Group C with Chinese Taipei, Saudi Arabia, and Hong Kong. Seeded 22nd, they face a challenging path, with the group

winner advancing to a finals pool that includes Japan and hosts Singapore. Australia arrive as defending champions, aiming for a fourth straight title. Both squads are led by Serbian coach Bogdan Dragovic, assisted by national coach Murtadha Mohammed. In November, on the eve of Bahrain hosting the FIBA 3x3 Manama Final, both teams claimed Under-21 titles.

The coaching duo also guided the men to the GCC Championship title in Muscat, while the women finished in second place. With national pride, World Cup qualification, and last year's early exits in mind, Bahrain's 3x3 teams are now focusing on Singapore. They'll be determined to surpass their seedings and leave their mark on the continental stage.

## Auger-Aliassime, Medvedev march on in Dubai

Felix Auger-Aliassime stamped his ticket to the quarter-finals of the Dubai Open yesterday with a 6-4, 6-4 win over Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard, while Daniil Medvedev put an end to Stanislas Wawrinka's tournament. Canadian top seed Auger-Aliassime overcame the big-serving Frenchman thanks to an impressive break-point conversion rate as he managed to make the most of three of the five break-points he forced on Mpetshi Perricard's serve. Consecutive breaks in the seventh and ninth games of the opening set allowed the world number eight to seize the initiative.

Auger-Aliassime pounced again early in the second set to get his nose in front and then managed to serve out to book a meeting with Jiri Lehecka in the last eight.
