Russia claims another village in Ukraine region

The Russian army yesterday claimed to have captured another village in Ukraine’s Dnipropetrovsk region, moving deeper into Ukrainian territory as peace efforts stall.

Russian forces are slowly but steadily gaining ground in costly battles for largely devastated areas in eastern and central Ukraine, normally with few inhabitants or intact buildings left.

Russia’s defence ministry said its forces had seized the settlement of Zaporizke in the region, which Russian troops recently advanced into for the first time in the three-and-a-half-year offensive.

Kyiv denies that Russian troops have gained a foothold in the Dnipropetrovsk region, an important industrial hub.

Climber killed in Mont Blanc

An Italian mountaineer has been killed by a falling block of ice near Mont Blanc in the French Alps, while his climbing partner was rescued, officials said yesterday.

The 38-year-old man climbing Mont Blanc du Tacul, one of the routes to the summit of Mont Blanc, on Sunday when a serac - a large block of ice - broke loose and “swept away” the two climbers, a member of the Chamonix mountain police told AFP.

Bahrain’s weekly Cabinet meeting yesterday captured both regional diplomacy and domestic empowerment, as His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Deputy King, chaired a session that stretched from Oman relations to the role of women, youth and schools in shaping the Kingdom’s future.

The Cabinet began by emphasising the importance of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa’s visit to the Sultanate of Oman and his meeting with His Majesty Sultan Haitham bin Tariq Al-Said. Ministers com-



mended the depth of ties linking the two countries.

Women recognised

Marking the 24th anniversary of the Supreme Council for Women (SCW), the Cabinet praised the Council’s contributions to national achievements and comprehensive development. It highlighted the pivotal role of Bahraini women, sup-

ported by Her Royal Highness Princess Sabeeka bint Ibrahim Al Khalifa, Consort of His Majesty the King and President of the SCW, in advancing the Kingdom across various sectors.

Youth spotlight

The success of the 14th edition of Youth City 2030 was also commended, with ministers noting strong participation by

young Bahrainis. The Cabinet stressed the significance of initiatives led by His Highness Shaikh Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Representative of His Majesty the King for Humanitarian Work and Youth Affairs, in fostering innovation and excellence among youth.

Education focus

HRH the Deputy King directed the introduction of a Parent Induction Day across public schools to brief families on the new academic year. He tasked the Ministry of Education with putting in place the necessary measures to provide a supportive educational environment that nurtures excellence.

The Cabinet further affirmed the importance of the newly inaugurated Abdullah bin Khalid College of Islamic Studies building in preparing future leaders capable of strengthening Arab and Islamic identity, while promoting coexistence in line with the principles of Islamic law.

Broader governance

The meeting also extended

condolences to Pakistan over the victims of recent floods and landslides, wishing a speedy recovery to the injured.

Ministers reviewed and approved a wide set of memorandums - government website procedures; the classification of certain organisations and individuals as terrorist entities; amendments to the Arab Authority for Agricultural Investment and Development agreement; supervision of halal products in partnership with the GCC Accreditation Center; a Ministry of Education memorandum with the British Council; the expropriation of two properties for urban development; and responses to legislative proposals from the Council of Representatives.

They also reviewed preparations for the upcoming GCC Ministerial Council session, a report showing improved performance in the “Sijilat”, “Tawasul” and “Benayat” systems between January and July 2025 compared with 2024, and the outcomes of the World Health Organisation Regional Director’s visit to Bahrain.

# Nationwide Labour Crackdown Launched

Crackdown spans every governorate this week

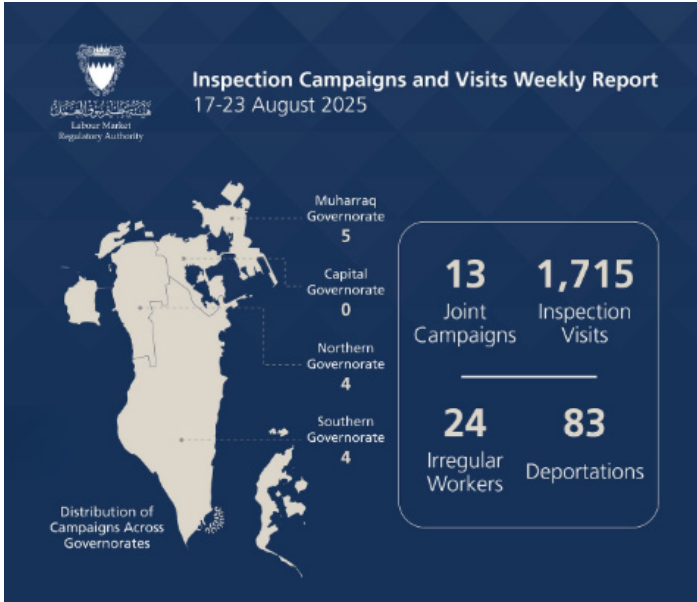
- 1,728 inspections in one week
- 24 irregular workers detained
- 83 violators deported

The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) has launched its most extensive inspection drive of the year, conducting 1,728 campaigns and visits across Bahrain from August 17 to 23. The effort covered all governorates and resulted in the detention of 24 irregular workers and the deportation of 83 violators.

### Nationwide coverage

According to the LMRA, the crackdown included 1,715 shop inspections alongside 13 joint campaigns. These were distrib-



uted across the Kingdom with five in Muharraq, four in the Northern Governorate, and four in the Southern Governorate, ensuring that no part of the country was left unchecked.

### Joint coordination

The campaigns drew on the

cooperation of several government bodies, including the Ministry of Interior's Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs (NPRA), the respective Police Directorates in each governorate, the General Directorate of Civil Defence, the Social Insurance Organisation,

the Ministry of Health, and the Ministry of Industry and Commerce. This broad collaboration underscored the government's commitment to upholding the stability of the labour market.

### Public reporting call

The LMRA stressed that inspections would continue in coordination with partner agencies to curb practices that undermine the Kingdom's economic and social security. The Authority urged members of the public to support these efforts by reporting illegal labour activity through its website, call centre (17506055), or the government's Suggestions and Complaints System (Tawasul).

### Protecting stability

Officials said that targeting violations linked to the LMRA and Residency Laws was essential to preserving fair competition and safeguarding social stability. The Authority reiterated its pledge to intensify inspection campaigns across all governorates

## 'Unrealistic plan'

"Unrealistic for Bahraini families," said MP Hamad Al Doy of the Philippines' plan to set a \$400-500 minimum for Filipino domestic workers within 60 days and to require pre-contract video interviews and digital welfare checks.

He said the move would add to household costs and unsettle the domestic labour market, warning that some families might forgo hiring or turn to irregular recruitment.

### Review

Al Doy added that MPs are preparing to review parts of the Domestic Work Law to balance worker protections with Bahraini family interests.

The Philippines' Department of Migrant Workers has notified recruitment offices in Bahrain and other Gulf states of the new package.

The department has asked that the higher wage be written into all contracts it processes, saying the new floor recognises domestic work as work of equal value that merits fair pay.

### Contract

Annual medical examinations and treatment for work-related accidents or illnesses are also required, alongside continued enforcement of the Standard Employment Contract, which guarantees housing, suitable living conditions and at least one full day of rest each week.

The measures will apply to newly hired workers, those on leave and returnees on renewed contracts after the 60-day window.

A compulsory 'Know Your Employer' step will introduce a video call between the prospective worker and the employer before any contract is signed so the worker understands duties, workplace conditions, family make-up, rest periods and accommodation, and gives full, informed consent before deployment.

### Responses

A digital care-monitoring system will see designated social-welfare case officers check in by call or message, assess responses for welfare concerns and refer cases for legal, medical, psychosocial or financial help, or for reintegration where needed.

The department also plans stricter standards for accommodation facilities run by agencies, including safe lodging, food, mattresses and internet access, and says it will coordinate with host governments to observe local laws.

Mona Al Mulla of the Bahrain Association for Recruitment Agencies said a rise of about 26 per cent in recruitment costs for Filipino domestic workers, roughly \$100, would be a 'shock' for citizens and would chiefly hit families.

### Costs

She said other nationalities might follow suit, pushing costs higher.

Al Mulla noted that Bahrain records relatively few disputes involving domestic workers thanks to strict labour laws, hotlines run by the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) and awareness sessions provided by the Philippine embassy on arrival.

Al Mulla questioned the basis for such a steep rise and pointed out that the new conditions add duties such as an end-of-service gratuity while Bahraini employers already pay for housing, living costs, clothing and care.

### Sourcing

She urged the authorities to widen sourcing to countries comparable to the Philippines.

A missing agreement with Ethiopia has halted direct recruitment from Addis Ababa and forced agencies to route workers through third countries, adding time and expense.

She called on the LMRA and the Foreign Ministry to conclude an agreement with Ethiopia quickly to ease recruitment and reduce burdens, and pressed for talks with the Philippine side so any rise is moderate, well considered and does not harm Bahraini families.

Enkutatash, the Ethiopian New Year falls in September, marking the end of the rainy season and the beginning of sunshine and prosperity. This year, Ethiopia will celebrate the arrival of 2018 on September 11, while the Gregorian calendar marks 2025.

The seven-year gap is rooted in differing calculations of the birth of Jesus Christ. While the Roman Church fixed the year in AD 1, the Ethiopian Orthodox Church placed it in 8 AD, resulting in Ethiopia's calendar running about seven years behind.

Enkutatash, which means "gift of jewels," is also tied to seasonal blooms of the yellow "Meskel Flower," symbolizing hope and renewal. For Ethiopians, it is a time of reflection, forgiveness, and fresh beginnings.

## MP welcomes move to end 16-year wait for labour and Waqf staff

He said the decision ended years of insecurity for workers and would bring relief to their families after long uncertainty.

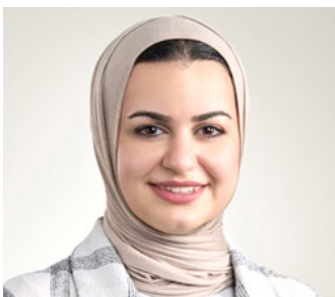
Kadhem called on all ministries and government bodies to close the file of temporary contracts and switch them to permanent terms.

MP Mohsen Ali Al-Asboul conducted a field visit to Tubli Bay and the villages of Al-Akar and Al-Ma'ameer in coordination with the Supreme Council for the Environment, accompanied by a number of local residents.

The visit aimed to assess the environmental situation in the area, monitor ongoing efforts to improve water quality, and review sustainability measures.

Al-Asboul said the inspection was prompted by complaints from residents of the Ninth District of the Capital Governorate regarding foul odors in recent days, as well as the spread of algae blooms and the accumulation of waste along the coasts.

Review

Bahrain has vowed to place the Palestinian cause at the heart of its upcoming United Nations Security Council term, using its 2026-2027 seat to amplify the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation's call for urgent action on Gaza.

Foreign Minister H.E. Dr. Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani

made the pledge during the OIC Council of Foreign Ministers' meeting in Jeddah, chaired by Türkiye's Hakan Fidan. H.E. said the Kingdom will use its UNSC role to highlight the justice of the Palestinian cause and renew support for the people of Gaza.

H.E. Dr. Al Zayani urged unified diplomatic action with the United Nations and Security Council to end the conflict, uphold international humanitarian law, release hostages and speed relief efforts. His Excellency stressed this coordination is key to achieving a just and lasting

peace.

H.E. praised Saudi Arabia's leadership of the international coalition for a two-state solution, while backing Qatari-Egyptian-American mediation to secure a permanent ceasefire and release of hostages. His Excellency also welcomed Egyptian initiatives for recovery and reconstruction in Gaza.

Highlighting Gaza's deprivation of food, water, medicine and essential services, H.E. the minister said the crisis underscored a shared duty to defend the rights of its people to life, freedom and dignity.

H.E. added that the OIC's united stance reflected the Islamic world's deep concern, reinforcing Bahrain's conviction that diplomatic momentum must continue at the UN.

BSA takes part in space sustainability panel discussion

His Excellency Dr. Mohammed Ibrahim Al Aseeri, CEO of the Bahrain Space Agency (BSA), participated in an open panel discussion on the overview effect, the change in perspective experienced by astronauts when seeing Earth from space.

The session featured astronaut Eiman Jahangir and international experts in space philosophy and explored how the human perspective of Earth from space shapes future approaches to space sustainability and supports efforts to ensure a safe environment on Earth.

Dr. Al Aseeri noted that the dialogue, organised in collaboration with the Frank White Institute and the Space Debris Foundation, addressed three key themes.

Existential transformation

The first centred on existential transformation, considering how viewing Earth from space reshapes human awareness of global responsibility, beyond political boundaries, and highlights the fragility of the ecosystem.

The second focused on space sustainability, stressing the need to shift from a "space colonisation" mindset to one of "responsible stewardship", particularly as the number of satellites is expected to exceed 60,000 by 2030.

The third theme highlighted the unity of human destiny and the close interconnection between humanity and Earth in the face of global challenges.

## Legal ban breach

Publishing a full paternity judgment and case details to a newspaper has led to a lawyer standing trial, with prosecutors setting out the charges as the hearing opened.

The Lower Criminal Court was told the lawyer sent an unredacted ruling in a Sharia paternity dispute to a local journalist, exposing her client's personal information along with details of related inquiries.

Prosecutors argued this broke the legal ban on reporting certain family cases, including marriage, divorce, custody, alimony, adultery and paternity.

The law restricts reporting in these disputes to protect family life, preserve values and maintain public order.

The prosecution presented oral and visual submissions, laid out the evidence, and examined articles published under the lawyer's name. Their presentation also included examples of readers' comments on social media responding to the reports.

The prosecutor said the law does not forbid publishing judicial rulings altogether but makes it conditional on strict rules, particularly to shield parties in sensitive cases.

"The lawyer is the custodian of her client's secrets, and her most basic duty is not to disclose them," she told the court.

## Musk's xAI sues Apple, OpenAI alleging antitrust violations

**E**lon Musk's companies xAI and X filed a sweeping US antitrust lawsuit Monday against Apple and OpenAI, alleging the tech giants formed an illegal partnership to stifle competition in artificial intelligence and smartphone markets.

The 61-page complaint, filed

in federal court in Texas, accuses Apple and OpenAI of entering an exclusive deal that makes OpenAI's ChatGPT the only generative AI chatbot integrated into Apple's iPhone operating system, while blocking rivals like xAI's Grok.

Apple and OpenAI announced their partnership in June 2024.

# Trump advisor says US may take stakes in other firms after Intel

The US government could take stakes in other companies after doing so with chipmaker Intel, President Donald Trump's top economic advisor Kevin Hassett said yesterday. Hassett, director of the National Economic Council, cited

Trump's plans for a sovereign wealth fund in a CNBC interview, saying "I'm sure that at some point there'll be more transactions" in the semiconductor industry or others.

He was responding to a question on whether a recently announced deal for the US government to take a 10-percent equity

stake in Intel was the start of broader efforts towards similar moves in other industries that authorities have been funding.

Under the agreement with Intel, the US government will receive 433.3 million shares of common stock, representing a 9.9% stake in the company, Intel said in an earlier statement.

This amounts to an \$8.9 billion investment, funded partially by \$5.7 billion in grants awarded but not yet paid under the CHIPS and Science Act -- a major law passed under former president Joe Biden, which Trump has criticized. The other portion comes from a different award. Hassett said on Monday that

"in the past, the federal government has been giving money away" to companies.

But he maintained that under potential deals like that with Intel, "these are going to be shares that don't have



voting rights." He said the US government plans to stay out of how companies are run.

## Stocks edge downwards after rallying on US rate hopes

Stocks edged downwards on Monday after earlier rallies in Europe and Asia, a surge fuelled by comments from the US central bank chief last week indicating a shift toward lower rates.

Investors were also keenly awaiting an earnings report from dominant AI chip company Nvidia due on Wednesday -- the firm's stock fell sharply last week as investors worried that enthusiasm for AI may be overcooked, which helped drag down the buoyant tech industry.

"AI has been the primary driver of the market this year," said Christopher Low of FHN Financial, adding that Nvidia stock is particularly important as investors have used it to wager on the AI industry more broadly.

Fed chief Jerome Powell told central bankers at their annual conference in Wyoming last Friday that "the balance of risks appears to be shifting" toward signs of weakness in the world's largest economy.

Investors interpreted that as a sure signal of a rate cut at the Fed's meeting next month, as in-

flation has not shown signs of soaring in the wake of President Donald Trump's tariffs blitz.

"Powell basically delivered the 25 basis points before the September meeting," said Ipek Ozkardeskaya, an analyst at Swissquote Bank. While global markets soared initially and Asian markets kept their gains.



News in brief

◆ **The Iranian and Russian** presidents discussed Tehran's nuclear programme yesterday as European powers threaten to reimpose sanctions on Tehran over the moribund 2015 deal. Britain, France and Germany have threatened to trigger a "snapback mechanism" to reintroduce UN sanctions that were lifted under the agreement unless Iran agrees to curb its uranium enrichment and restore cooperation with the International Atomic Energy Agency's (IAEA) inspectors. Iran will hold talks with the European trio in Geneva on Tuesday, Iranian state media reported. Russia's Vladimir Putin held a phone call with Iran's Masoud Pezeshkian, the Kremlin said Monday, in which the pair "touched on the situation around Iran's nuclear programme".

◆ **France summons US ambassador over antisemitism claims**

◆ **The US ambassador** to France, Charles Kushner, was yesterday ordered to report to the French foreign ministry after he criticised Paris for what he said was its insufficient action against antisemitism. The diplomatic row comes with concerns about an increase in antisemitic acts and hate crimes in France as international tensions mount over the conflict in Gaza. In a letter to French President Emmanuel Macron, Kushner, who is the father of US President Donald Trump's son-in-law, expressed his "deep concern over the dramatic rise of antisemitism in France" and the French government's "lack of sufficient action" to confront it. France on Sunday evening said "the allegations from the ambassador are unacceptable" and added that Kushner's letter, which was released to the media, violated international law.

◆ **Syria's interim president**, Ahmed al-Sharaa, will speak at the United Nations General Assembly next month, a foreign ministry official told AFP yesterday, the first Syrian leader to do so in decades. Sharaa "will take part in the United Nations General Assembly in New York where he will deliver a speech", the official said, requesting anonymity as they were not authorised to brief the media. Sharaa took power in December after his Islamist group led a coalition of forces that toppled longtime ruler Bashar al-Assad after nearly 14 years of gruelling civil war. "He will be the first Syrian president to speak at the United Nations since former president Nureddin al-Atassi (in 1967), and the first Syrian president ever to take part in the General Assembly's high-level week," scheduled for September 22-30, the official added.

US studio unearths fossilized dinosaur game 'Turok'

Everything old is new again, especially for gamers at the Gamescom trade fair, who got a preview of upcoming video game "Turok: Origins" -- a third-person shooter pitting the player against dinosaurs and aliens.

After that, its eponymous native American adventurer was largely forgotten -- until US studio Saber Interactive dug him up for "Turok: Origins" and developed him into a game that looks like a blend of the "Jurassic Park" and "Predator" movie franchises.

When Universal Studios -- producer of the "Jurassic Park" movies -- tapped Saber in 2020 to develop its Turok intellectual property (IP), the gaming company was "shocked", its studio head, Jesus Iglesias, told AFP.

"It's been sleeping for a long time," he noted.

But Saber -- founded in Russia but now based in Florida in the United States -- had a track record of reviving some memorable but neglected titles.

"Saber Interactive is known for taking, from time to time, some dead IPs and rebooting them, like we did with (Warhammer 40,000's) 'Space Ma-

The result is "Turok: Origins", part of which was presented at Gamescom in Germany, one of the biggest gaming trade shows in the world, which ended on Sunday after welcoming more than 357,000 visitors.

The game, which Iglesias said had 250 people working on it at the peak of its development, offers single-player and multi-player modes to tackle AI-controlled enemies.

Whereas the original run of Turok was reminiscent of early-stage Lara Croft in a prehistoric setting, the "Origins" reboot promises a fluid, fast-moving and more cinematic experience, as demanded from today's players.

"We are being respectful with the originals, especially with Turok 1 and Turok 2, and also adding some elements that help to make the universe a little bit more consistent," Iglesias said.

Israel offers 'phased' withdrawal if Lebanon **disarms Hezbollah**

Lebanese army has been deploying in the country's south

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu yesterday said Israel was ready to back Lebanon's efforts to disarm Hezbollah and offered "a phased" pullout of its troops if Beirut followed through with plans to seize the group's weapons.

Following the war between Israel and Iran-backed Hezbollah last year, the Lebanese army has been deploying in the country's south and dismantling the mili-

tant group's infrastructure there.

Lebanon has been grappling with the thorny issue of disarming Hezbollah, with the cabinet this month tasking the army with developing a plan to do so by the end of the year.

Despite the November ceasefire that ended the war, Israel has continued to strike Lebanon, saying it will do so until Hezbollah is disarmed.

Israeli forces also continue to occupy five areas of the south that they deem strategic.

"Israel stands ready to support Lebanon in its efforts to disarm Hezbollah and to work together towards a more secure and stable future for both nations," said Netanyahu, according to a statement released by his office.

Israel also acknowledged "the significant step taken by the Leb-

anese government", according to the statement.

If the Lebanese government follows through with the plan, Netanyahu said Israel was prepared to "engage in reciprocal measures, including a phased reduction of IDF (military) presence in coordination with the US-led security mechanism".

'First step'

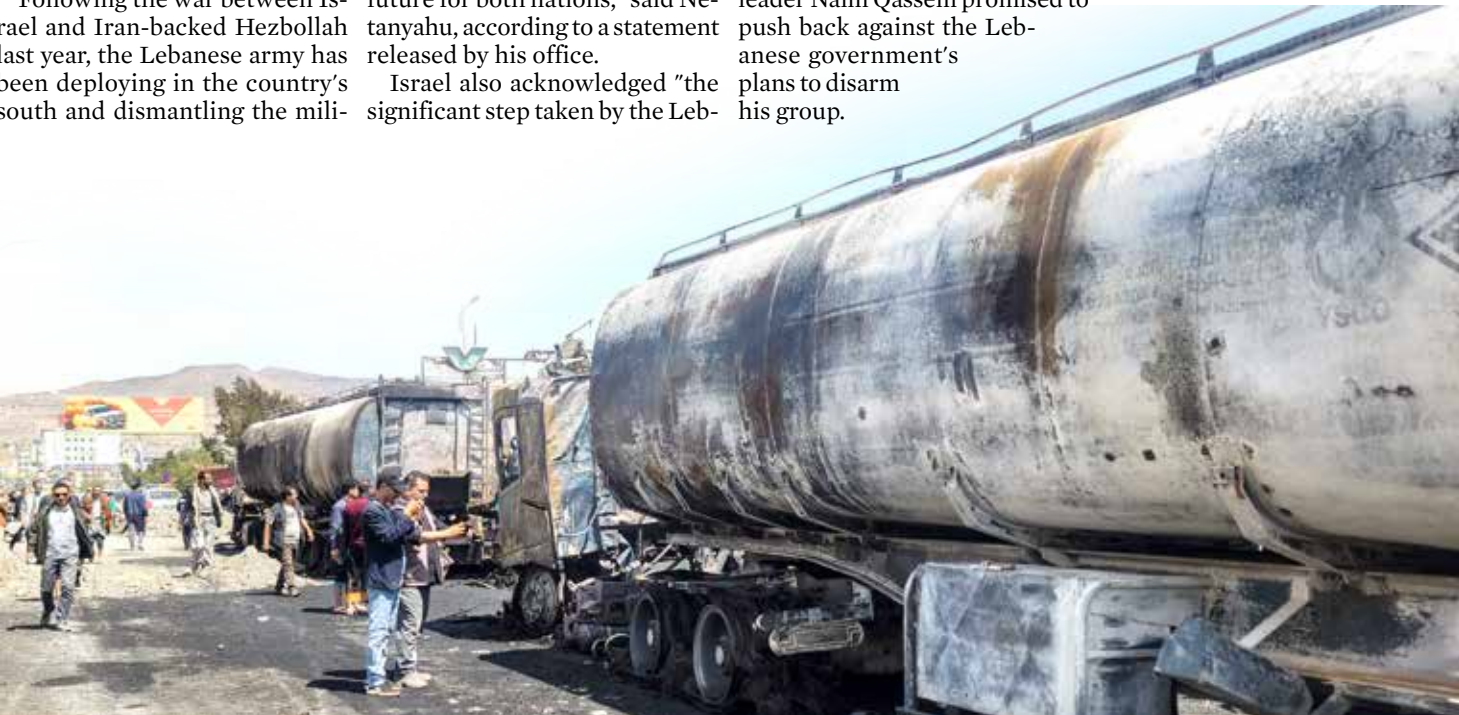
Later on Monday the Israeli military said in a statement it had "eliminated" a Hezbollah member in southern Lebanon and would "continue to operate to remove threats posed to the citizens of Israel".

Earlier this month, Hezbollah leader Naim Qassem promised to push back against the Lebanese government's plans to disarm his group.

Last week, US envoy Tom Barrack called on Israel to honour commitments under a ceasefire that ended its war with Hezbollah.

Five journalists among **20 killed** in Israeli strikes on Gaza hospital

Gaza's civil defence agency said five journalists were among at least 20 people killed Monday when Israeli strikes hit a hospital in the south, with Reuters, the Associated Press and Al Jazeera mourning their slain contributors.

The ongoing war in Gaza has been one of the deadliest for journalists, with around 200 media workers killed over the course of the nearly two-year Israeli assault, according to media watchdogs.

Civil defence spokesman Mahmud Bassal said "the toll so far is 20 martyrs, including five journalists and one member of the civil defence", after strikes hit Khan Yunis's Nasser Hospital -- a large medical complex that has been targeted several times by Israel since the start of the war.

In a statement, the Israeli military said its troops on Monday

# Trump tightens grip on security in US capital

Troops in Washington began carrying their service-issued weapons

● **Trump directed the hiring of additional National Park Police**

● **Trump also took aim at cashless bail in a separate order**

President Donald Trump yesterday announced new measures that tightened his grip on security in Washington, a day after National Guard troops began carrying weapons in the US capital.

Trump ordered the deployment of the National Guard -- who now number more than 2,200 -- earlier this month as part of what he has billed as a

crackdown on allegedly out-of-control crime in the city.

On Monday, Trump ordered Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth to set up a specialized unit

within Washington's National Guard "dedicated to ensuring public safety and order in the nation's capital."

In the same executive order,

Trump directed the hiring of additional National Park Police in the city, as well as more prosecutors to focus on prosecuting violent and property crimes.

Trump also took aim at cashless bail in a separate order, and told law enforcement that anyone arrested should be held in federal custody "to the fullest extent permissible" and federal charges should be pursued against them.

Those steps are aimed at ensuring that "criminal defendants who pose a threat to public safety are not released from custody prior to trial," the president wrote. The previous day, National Guard troops in Washington began carrying their service-issued weapons, the US military said, noting that they are only authorized to use force as a last resort.

## Trump slams 'purge' in S. Korea ahead of visit by President Lee

US President Donald Trump yesterday suggested that a "purge or revolution" was underway in South Korea, hours before new President Lee Jae Myung was due at the White House.

"WHAT IS GOING ON IN SOUTH KOREA? Seems like a Purge or Revolution. We can't have that and do business there," Trump posted.

He did not specify to what he was referring but said he would bring it up with Lee.

South Korean prosecutors on Sunday filed an arrest warrant for former prime minister Han Duck-soo, accusing him of aiding ex-president Yoon Suk Yeol in his short-lived imposition of martial law in December.

Yoon, a conservative with close ties with the United States, was impeached after his strong-armed tactic to seize power,

which he took after facing deadlock in parliament.

The martial law bid was a throwback to South Korea's earlier era of military rule and was swiftly reversed after an

impromptu popular revolt.

Trump has tested the limits of his own presidential authority, sending troops into the capital Washington in what he called an effort to fight crime and earlier

sending forces into Los Angeles after demonstrations against his crackdown on immigration.

Lee comes from South Korea's left but has voiced eagerness to start a productive relationship with Trump.

The two presidents could see eye-to-eye on North Korea.

Trump in his first term met three times with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, and Lee is an advocate of outreach with the North.

It is not the first time Trump has surprised an unsuspecting foreign leader with a disputable claim about their domestic policies.

In May, Trump ambushed South African President Cyril Ramaphosa in a White House meeting by alleging a "genocide" against white farmers by the post-apartheid government, which denies any such campaign.

## Human ancestor Lucy gets first European showing in Prague

The 3.18-million-year-old bone fragments of human ancestor Lucy, which rarely leave Ethiopia, went on display in Prague yesterday, with the Czech prime minister hailing the fossils' "first ever" showing in Europe.

The ancient remains of the Australopithecus afarensis were discovered in Ethiopia in 1974. The find was, at the time, the most complete ever made and revolutionised the understanding of humanity's ancestors.

At the Czech National Museum, Lucy's remains are presented alongside Selam, the fossil of a baby Australopithecus who lived about 100,000 years earlier than Lucy and was found in the



same place 25 years later.

The fossils lent by Ethiopia's National Museum in Addis Ababa landed in Prague on August 15, under stringent security measures.

"Both skeletons rank among the most precious exhibits of the global heritage... they are exhibited in a European country for the first time ever," Czech Prime Minister Petr Fiala said at the ceremonial opening with a military brass band.

## SpaceX delays Starship megarocket launch in latest setback

South Padre Island, United States

SpaceX delayed a planned test flight for its Starship megarocket by 24 hours until Monday, saying it needed time to troubleshoot problems, in the latest setback for Elon Musk's behemoth after a series of explosive failures.

The recent problems have led some observers to doubt whether the world's biggest and most powerful launch vehicle will be capable of taking humans back to the Moon -- or achieving Musk's dreams of colonizing Mars.

The rocket had been scheduled to blast off on its tenth flight from the company's Starbase in southern Texas at 6:30 pm local time (2330 GMT) on Sunday.

However, around 15 minutes before lift-off, SpaceX scrubbed the flight, which is a relatively common event for space launches.

"Standing down from today's tenth flight of Starship to allow time to troubleshoot an issue with ground systems," it said on X.

Musk later posted on the same platform that a "ground side liquid oxygen leak needs to be fixed."

## Israel army says to 'conduct initial inquiry' on Gaza hospital strike

Jerusalem, Undefined

The Israeli military said yesterday it will investigate a strike in the area of Nasser Hospital in Khan Yunis, which Gaza's civil defence agency said killed 15 people including four journalists.

"Earlier today (Monday), IDF troops carried out a strike in the area of Nasser Hospital in Khan Yunis. The Chief of the General Staff instructed to conduct an initial inquiry as soon as possible," the military said in a statement, adding it "regrets any harm to uninvolved individuals and does not target journalists as such."

## UN delays vote on Lebanon peacekeepers

United Nations, United States

An expected United Nations Security Council vote on the future of the blue helmet peacekeeping mission in south Lebanon, which has faced US and Israeli opposition, was pushed back yesterday as negotiations continued.

The Council is debating a French-drafted compromise that would keep the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL).

# World's first commercial CO2 'graveyard' opens in Norway

## Oslo, Norway

The world's first commercial service offering carbon storage off Norway's coast has carried out its inaugural CO2 injection into the North Sea seabed, the Northern Lights consortium operating the site said yesterday.

Northern Lights, led by oil giants Equinor, Shell and TotalEnergies, involves transporting and burying CO2 captured at

smokestacks across Europe. The aim is to prevent the emissions from being released into the atmosphere, and thereby help halt climate change.

"We now injected and stored the very first CO2 safely in the reservoir," Northern Lights' managing director Tim Heijn said in a statement.

"Our ships, facilities and wells are now in operation."

In concrete terms, after the CO2 is captured, it is liquified

and transported by ship to the Oygarden terminal near Bergen on Norway's western coast.

It is then transferred into large tanks before being injected through a 110-kilometre (68-mile) pipeline into the seabed, at a depth of around 2.6 kilometres, for permanent storage.

Carbon capture and storage (CCS) technology has been listed as a climate tool by the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) and the

International Energy Agency (IEA), especially for reducing the CO2 footprint of industries like cement and steel that are difficult to decarbonise.

The first CO2 injection into the Northern Lights geological reservoir was from Germany's Heidelberg Materials cement plant in Brevik in southeastern Norway. But CCS technology is complex and costly.

Without financial assistance, it is currently more profitable



for industries to purchase "pollution permits" on the European carbon market than to pay for capturing, transporting and storing their CO2. Northern Lights has so far signed just three com-

mercial contracts in Europe.

One is with a Yara ammonia plant in the Netherlands, another with two of Orsted's bio-fuel plants in Denmark, and the third with a Stockholm Exergi thermal power plant in Sweden.

Largely financed by the Norwegian state, Northern Lights has an annual CO2 storage capacity of 1.5 million tonnes, which is expected to increase to five million tonnes by the end of the decade.

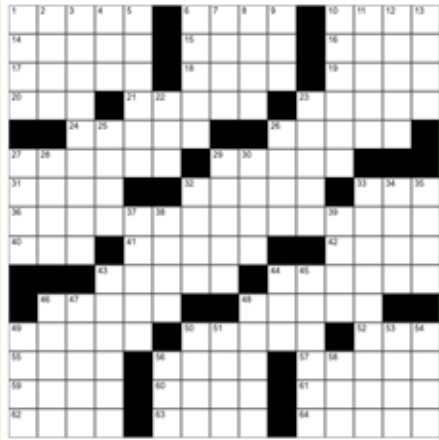

Manchester United manager Ruben Amorim believes his side need to show more maturity after blowing the lead to draw 1-1 at Fulham on Sunday and remain without a win this season.

The Red Devils were made to pay for not making more of a dominant first 45 minutes, during which Bruno Fernandes blazed a penalty over the bar.

Amorim, though, was more concerned by what he saw after United took the lead thanks to Rodrigo Muniz's own goal on the hour mark.

Fulham hit back to level through Emile Smith Rowe 17 minutes from time and ended the game on top.

"I think we scored the goal and then we forgot about how we play," said Amorim, who has won just seven of his 29 Premier League games in charge.

"We want to win so badly, and that is a good feeling, that we scored a goal and everyone on the pitch was thinking, 'Let's hold onto the advantage and try to win the game'. For me that is the moment that we have to enjoy more and push the opponent.

# Sabalenka, Djokovic open with wins

Sabalenka overcomes slow start while Djokovic fights through challenge to reach US Open second round

- Sabalenka beats Masarova 7-5, 6-1
- Djokovic wins in straight sets over Tien
- Raducanu ends four-year US Open drought
- Alexandra Eala makes Filipino tennis history
- Fritz, Shelton progress with comfortable victories

Aryna Sabalenka launched the defence of her US Open crown with a victory on Sunday while Novak Djokovic made a successful start to his latest bid for a record 25th Grand Slam singles title.

World number one Sabalenka, who is bidding to become the first woman to claim back-to-back US Open titles since Serena Williams completed a hat-trick of wins in 2014, was made to work hard en route to a 7-5, 6-1 victory over Switzerland's Rebe-ka Masarova.

Masarova, ranked 108th in the world, pushed Sabalenka out of her comfort zone with a gutsy performance on the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center's main Arthur Ashe Stadium showcourt.

my best in the first games, but then I found my rhythm," said Sabalenka, who will face unseeded Russian Polina Kudermetova in the second round.

While Sabalenka advanced safely, Danish 14th seed Clara Tauson tumbled out to Alexandra Eala.

Eala, 20, became the first player from the Philippines to win a Grand Slam singles match with a thrilling 6-3, 2-6, 7-6 (13/11) win, battling back from a 5-1 deficit in the final

set to advance.

"I'm super over the moon with what I was able to do today, especially coming back in the third," Eala said.

"It's a very special win for me."

Another player

from Southeast Asia -- Indonesia's Janice Tjen -- also bagged an upset, ousting Russian 24th seed Veronika Kudermetova 6-4, 4-6, 6-4 to move on.

"I feel proud to be able to do this for my country," said Tjen, the first Indonesian since Angeli-que Widjaja in 2004 to reach the main draw of a Grand Slam singles event.

Tjen, ranked 149th in the world, will face Britain's Emma Raducanu in the second round.

### Djokovic off the mark

Raducanu, who made history at Flushing Meadows in 2021 by becoming the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title, clinched her first US Open match win since that memorable triumph with a 6-1, 6-2 drubbing of Japan's Ena Shibahara.

"I wanted to win a match here really bad," said Raducanu.

"It's been four years, and it's a very special tournament for

With men's de-fending champi-Jannik Sinner rival Carlos Alcaraz not opening their first-round campaigns until yesterday and Tuesday, all eyes were on the veteran Serbian star Djokovic in Sunday's night session on Ashe.

The 38-year-old showed flashes of brilliance in a 6-1, 7-6 (7/3), 6-2 win against his unseeded 19-year-old American opponent

Djokovic raced through the first set but was then forced to save a set point in the second after Tien grew in confidence.

A lengthy medical time out to treat what looked like a blister on his right foot helped re-vive Djokovic and he pulled away to wrap up victory in 2hr 25min.

"Great to be back in New York," Djokovic said. "I wish I had Learner Tien's age -- when you come to the late 30s it's about learning how to preserve the energy for what matters.

"I still have the flair, I still have the drive, and you guys give me

the energy," he told the crowd. "Hopefully I can keep it going."

Fourth seed Taylor Fritz and sixth seed Ben Shelton eased into the second round.

Fritz, last year's beaten finalist and a semi-finalist at Wimbledon last month, won 7-5, 6-2, 6-3 against unseeded compatriot Emilio Nava.

Shelton had a similarly comfortable 6-3, 6-2, 6-4 defeat of Peruvian qualifier Ignacio Buse.

Shelton and Fritz are spear-heading US hopes of a first Grand Slam men's singles title since Andy Roddick's victory at the 2003 US Open.

Shelton insisted he was not looking beyond the second round, where he will face Spain's Pablo Carreno Busta.

"As soon as you start looking ahead, you stumble over your own feet. So just one game at a time," he said.

Czech 16th seed Jakub Mensik edged Chile's Nicolas Jarry 7-6 (7/5), 6-3, 6-4 and Spanish 18th seed Alejandro Davidovich Fokina breezed past Alexander Shevchenko of Kazakhstan 6-1, 6-1, 6-2.

Italy's 32nd seed Luciano Darderi eliminated Australia's Rinky Hijikata 6-2, 6-1, 6-2.

## US Open chaos as Bonzi ousts raging Medvedev

France's Benjamin Bonzi sent Russian 13th seed Daniil Medvedev crashing out of the US Open early yesterday in a stormy late-night thriller that boiled over into chaos following an extraordinary third-set flashpoint.

Bonzi advanced to the second round after holding his nerve to win 6-3, 7-5, 6-7 (5/7), 0-6, 6-4 in 3hr 45min.

The match exploded into drama in the third set as Bonzi served at advantage on match

point, leading 5-4 after winning the opening two sets.

After faulting on his first serve, Bonzi prepared to serve again when chair umpire Greg Allensworth suddenly halted play after a photographer mistakenly walked onto the court.

Allensworth called for time after shouting "Not now, get off the court please" before awarding a new first serve to Bonzi on the grounds of a "delay caused by outside interference."

## Djokovic voices physical concerns after win

Novak Djokovic fears his lack of physical conditioning may come back to haunt him as he chases a record 25th Grand Slam singles title at the US Open.

Djokovic, who needed a lengthy medical timeout to treat a blister on his right foot between the second and third sets, admitted afterwards he was worried by a sudden loss of stamina during the second set.

"I started great -- just over 20 minutes, first set, I felt really good. Then some long games to start the second set... I really was surprised how bad I was feeling in the second physically," Djokovic said.

"We had long exchanges, but also, I kind of dropped my level and made a lot of unforced errors and kind of got him back into the match. There are positives, but also things that hopefully won't happen in terms of how I felt on the court physically in the second set. It's slightly a concern. I don't know. I don't have any injuries or anything. I just struggled a lot to stay in long exchanges and recover after points," he added.

Djokovic has not played since his defeat in the semi-finals at Wimbledon last

month, skipping ATP Masters events in Toronto and Cincinnati to focus all his energy on the US Open.

While there were a few signs of rustiness at times on Sunday, Djokovic also laced his performance with flashes of the brilliance that has been his calling card throughout a glittering career.

Djokovic looked to be a man in a hurry in a scorching start, rattling off winners to take the first set 6-1.

Tien was given

hope in a laboured second set from Djokovic, but the 19-year-old American could not convert a break point that would have made it one set all.

Instead, Djokovic held serve to make it 5-5 in the second set and reasserted himself to claim the second-set tie break, attacking

the net cleverly and using some sublime variation to pull Tien all over the court.

Djokovic paused for a medical timeout for treatment to his right foot before the third set got under way. The rest appeared to give Djokovic a jolt of energy and he sprinted into a 5-1 lead to leave Tien reeling.

Tien did well to save a match point on Djokovic's serve before breaking for 5-2. But the respite was short-lived as Djokovic again responded emphatically, breaking back immediately to wrap up victory.

Djokovic will face US qualifier Zachary Svajda in the second round.

## Rooney forecasts ‘massive future’ for Arsenal teen sensation Dowman

Wayne Rooney believes Arsenal teenage rising star Max Dowman is set for a “massive future” following an impressive Premier League debut. Dowman came on as a substitute aged just 15 years and 234 days during the Gunners’ 5-0 win over Leeds at the Emirates on Saturday. massive future.

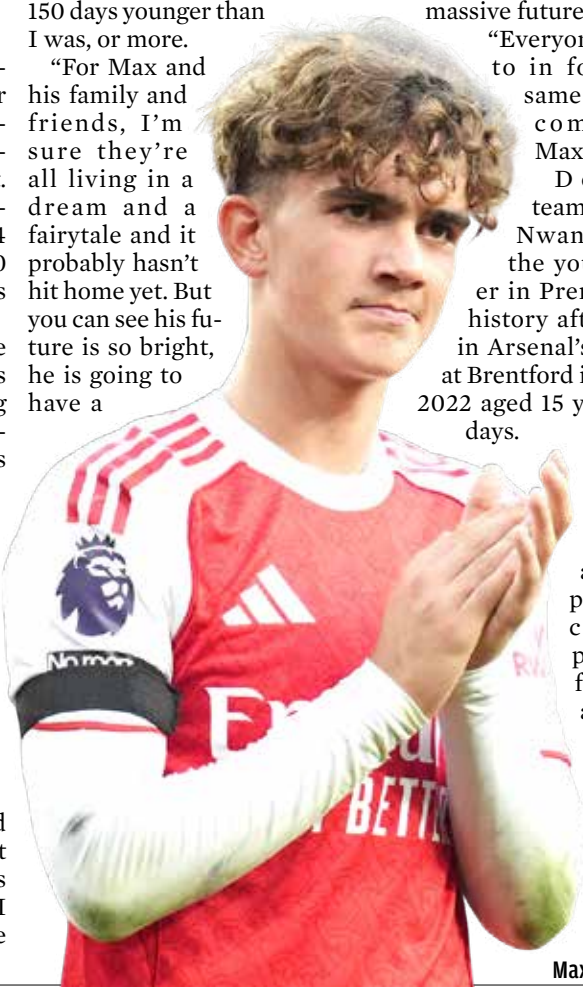

## Gaudu pulls away from Vingegaard to take Vuelta stage

David Gaudu surged to victory in the third stage of the Vuelta Espana in Ceres, in Italy, on Monday edging Mads Pedersen and Jonas Vingegaard who, despite being deprived of a second straight victory, hung onto the leader’s red jersey. The day before, Vingegaard powered away from his rivals in an uphill sprint to take the overall lead. Gaudu finished that stage third. On Monday, at the end of a hilly 134.6 kilometre run from San Maurizio Canavesse, Vingegaard was again well positioned as the pack came out of a final hairpin for a rising run to the line. But Gaudu handled the corner better and when the Frenchman, who rides for Groupama, and Pedersen, a Dane with Lidl Trek accel-

erated in the home stretch, Vingegaard eased up, unable to match them. Vingegaard collected a four-second bonus for finishing third but Gaudu gained 10 seconds and moved level on time with the Dane. “That was hard,” said Gaudu at the finish. “I’m very happy.” The finish completed a tough day for Vingegaard’s Visma Lease a Bike team. They announced in the morning that 18 of their bikes had been stolen overnight from a parked truck and also that one of Vingegaard’s lieutenants Axel Zingle had been forced to drop out. The Gazzetta Dello Sport report that Visma lost bikes worth a total of 250,000 euros (\$292,378), while Movistar and Lidl-Trek, who were staying in the same hotel near Turin, did not lose any equipment.
