The Kingdom recorded a continued rise in new positive cases. Yesterday, the ministry detected 489 new cases, of which 120 are expatriate workers, 362 are contacts of active cases, and seven are travel-related cas-

Bottom trawls: Coast guard seizes fishing boat, 240 kg shrimp

ahraini coast guard patrols confiscated a fishing vessel vesterday for employing banned bottom trawl nets in the waters of Bahrain.

Coast guard officials also captured 240 kilograms of shrimp caught using the method, which destroys far more ocean habitat than any other fishing practice.

Bahrain has banned the usage of bottom trawls as per Ministerial Resolution No. (205) of 2018.

Coast Guard Commander said officials seized the vessel from the coast of Nabih Saleh.
