**Brazil's jailed ex-president Bolsonaro undergoes surgery**  president Jair Bolsonaro, who is serving a 27-year



prison sentence for an attempted coup, went into surgery yesterday for an inguinal hernia, his wife said. The 70-year-old former president left prison on Wednesday for the first time since late November to undergo the procedure at the DF Star hospital in Brasilia. "My love has just gone to the operating room," Bolsonaro's wife, Michelle Bolsonaro, said in an Instagram post. Bolsonaro has grappled with

health issues since being stabbed in the stomach during the 2018 presidential campaign, undergoing multiple surgeries related to his wounds. He was also recently diagnosed with skin cancer.

Pacific archipelago Palau agrees to take migrants from US

up to 75 non-American migrants from the United States under a deal worth \$7.5 million, the two countries have said. President Donald Trump, who campaigned on a promise to expel undocumented migrants, has accelerated deportations and cracked down on border crossings since returning to power this year.



Under a new memorandum of understanding, Palau will let up to 75 third-country nationals from the United States live and work on the sparsely populated archipelago, officials said Wednesday. In return, the United States will grant \$7.5 million to Palau for public service and infrastructure needs.

Trump-backed Nasry Asfura declared winner of Honduras presidency





67-year-old son of Palestinian immigrants defeated fellow conservative TV personality Salvador Nasralla by less than one percentage point. Asfura's victory marks the return of the right wing to power in one of Latin America's poorest countries after four years of leftist Xiomara Castro's presidency. It also aligns Honduras with

a rise of conservative governments in the region following shifts in Chile, Bolivia, Peru and Argentina. "Honduras: I'm ready to govern. I won't let you down," Asfura posted to X after the win was declared, thanking election officials for validating his victory.

# Prime minister hopeful Rahman returns from exile ahead of polls

Opposition leader, poised to be prime minister, returns after 17 years abroad

Rahman, the son of former prime minister Khaleda Zia and heir apparent of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), shook hands with party leaders after touching down at the Dhaka air-

Accompanied by his wife and daughter, a visibly emotional Rahman took off his shoes, stood on the grass outside the airport and scooped up the soil as a mark of reverence.

## Heavy rain, flash floods hit southern California

Torrential rains uncertainty flash floods and warnings orrential rains unleashed of debris flow across southern California, particularly in fire-scarred areas, with further downpours forecast for later vesterday as authorities declared a state of emergency in several counties.

Driven by an atmospheric river known as "the Pineapple Express," which moves heavy moisture from the tropical climes of Hawaii to the US West Coast, the storm was expected to deliver months' worth of rain over a few days.

Early yesterday, the National Weather Service (NWS) warned about the risk of excessive rainfornia, including in Los Angeles, the second-most populous city in the United States.

The Los Angeles Times reported that at least three people had died in storm-related incidents, including a San Diego man who was killed by a falling tree.

On Wednesday, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works warned Angelenos to stay well away from waterways such as flood control channels, rivers, and streams -- even after the rain stopped.

"Water from upstream communities can move quickly through channels with little warning. What may look shallow or calm can suddenly become fast-moving and dangerous," the agency warned in a post on X.

In San Bernardino County, adjacent to Los Angeles, authorities said they were working to divert the flow of floodwater yesterday.
