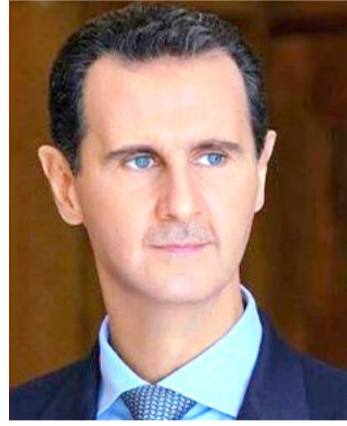

'Safety over food'

Hamis urges end to Gaza airdrops after deaths, and allow more aid trucks' entry

Hamis yesterday urged foreign nations to stop parachuting aid into war-torn Gaza after officials and humanitarians said 18 people died trying to reach food packages in the starving north.

Instead, the Palestinian group that rules the Gaza Strip demanded that Israel allow more aid trucks to enter the besieged territory, which the United Nations has warned is on the brink of a "man-made famine".

Fighting raged on unabated a day after the UN Security Council passed its first resolution calling for an "immediate ceasefire" in the bloodiest ever Gaza war, sparked by Hamas's October 7 attack on Israel.

The resolution also demands that Hamas fighters free the roughly 130 hostages Israel says remain in Gaza, including 33 captives who are presumed dead.

Jordanian, US and other planes have airdropped food into Gaza, even as UN officials and aid agencies have warned this falls far short of the dire needs of its 2.4 million people and is far less effective than en-

suring overland access.

Rushing crowd

Yesterday, as Jordanian, Egyptian, Emirati and German planes again airdropped relief goods, with the sight of food packages

floating down on parachutes sending Palestinian crowds rushing toward them.

Six people were killed in stampedes and 12 others drowned off the territory's Mediterranean coast, the Hamas government

and the Swiss-based Euro-Med Human Rights Monitor said.

Hamas in a statement called for "an immediate end to airdrop operations" and "the immediate and rapid opening of land crossings to allow humanitarian aid to reach our Palestinian people".

'Imminent famine'

The UN children's fund, UNICEF, said vastly more aid must be rushed into Gaza by road, rather than air or sea, to avert "this imminent famine".

Food aid is usually only airdropped in crises where "people are cut off for hundreds of kilometres", said UNICEF spokesman James Elder, speaking via video link from Gaza.

But "the lifesaving aid they need is a matter of kilometres away", he said, as trucks loaded with aid have been waiting across Gaza's southern border with Egypt.

"We need to use the road networks."

Overnight attack

Syria strikes kill 14 pro-Iran fighters, WHO worker

Strikes in Syria yesterday killed 14 pro-Iran fighters including an Iranian Revolutionary Guard, a war monitor said, while the World Health Organization also reported one of its workers was killed.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights did not say who carried out the air strikes in the

eastern province of Deir Ezzor, which has been targeted by both US and Israeli raids in the past.

A US defence official told AFP the United States "did not conduct any airstrikes" overnight.

The Observatory said "an Iranian Revolutionary Guards adviser, his two Iranian security escorts, two Syrian fighters" and five other combatants belonging to pro-Iran groups were

killed in a villa in Deir Ezzor city.

It said the villa "served as a communications centre" in the area, reporting that the building was destroyed and that a Syrian civilian was also killed.

WHO chief Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus later announced on social media "the tragic loss of another one of our own in an airstrike in Syria this morning".

It identified him as Emad Shehab, an engineer who it said "served as the WHO water and sanitation focal point" in Deir Ezzor.

Iran's state news agency IRNA reported the attack was "carried out by the Zionist regime", its term for Israel.

It identified the dead guard as Behrouz Vahedi, saying he belonged to the Quds Force, the

foreign operations arm of Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps.

Four other fighters were killed in a separate strike in the town of Albu Kamal on the Iraqi border, said the Britain-based Observatory, which has a network of sources inside Syria.

It said in total nine of the dead in the strikes were Iraqi nationals.

Inmate receives proper healthcare after football collapse

Inmate Hussain Khalil Ibrahim Kathem, who was reported to have died after being transported by an ambulance from the Correction and Rehabilitation Center in Jau following a collapse while playing football, received comprehensive healthcare, which is provided to all inmates under the supervision of government hospitals.

This affirmation came from the Government Hospitals, which stated, "It was clarified that upon his arrival at the medical clinic in the center, the medical team performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on him. It was found that his

heart had completely stopped, and despite continuous resuscitation efforts, there was no response. Consequently, he was transferred by ambulance to the hospital, where his death was announced, and the cause of death was determined as cardiac and respiratory arrest."

The medical record of the deceased inmate documents regular monitoring of his health condition.

He had received 201 medical consultations between April 30, 2018, and March 25, 2024, at the clinic of the Center in Jau and Salmaniya Medical Complex.

Tale of torment in Tubli

Expatriate woman tenant endures seven weeks of harassment ordeal, cry for help falls on deaf ears

● **Building bullying sparks sleepless nights and growing safety concerns among residence**

In a distressing turn of events, an expatriate tenant residing in a building in Tubli has been subjected to ongoing harassment for the past seven weeks.

The tenant, who wishes to remain anonymous, has endured sleepless nights and early morning disturbances caused by the incessant noise from the flat above her residence.

Despite her efforts to seek assistance from the building management, her pleas have fallen on deaf ears.

The tenant initially lodged complaints with the watchmen, seeking respite from the disruptive activities of her neighbors. Unfortunately, her grievances were met with indifference, and no action was taken to address the issue.

Frustrated by the lack of response, she took matters into her own hands and approached the building owner directly, highlighting the disturbance

caused by the neighboring flat.

However, instead of receiving support, she faced anger and was advised to handle the situation on her own.

Since making her complaint, the tenant has become the target of harassment by her neighbor. Recounting the incidents of damage she has suffered, she shared her harrowing experiences to The Daily Tribune.

"On February 8, 2024, at ap-

proximately 8 a.m., I discovered that my car's left rear tire had been deliberately slashed with a blade measuring around 6" wide.

"Another incident occurred on February 23, 2024, at 6 a.m., when I found my car covered in black spray paint, causing significant damage."

Police report

She further explained, "In re-

sponse to these safety concerns, I decided to file a report with the Isa Town police station.

"On March 15, 2024, upon returning home after spending the entire day outside, I was shocked to find my car, the building floor area, and the trunk covered in white paint."

Subsequently, she promptly contacted the authorities, who advised her to document the incidents and visit the police station on Sunday, as it was a Friday.

The constant harassment, has taken a toll on the tenant's mental well-being. Sleepless nights and constant vigilance have become the norm for her and her roommate, both working women.

Additionally, another tenant residing in Flat 12 faced a safety issue when their gas cylinder was stolen in January 2024. The lack of safety measures in the building has put not only the victim but also other residents at risk.

Responsibility

Despite the tenant's pleas for assistance, the building owner has failed to take any responsibility for the ongoing harassment.

When she expressed her desire to relocate, she was informed that it was not possible due to the yearly contract.

The police, while intervening in the matter, could only summon the owner to the police station and urge them to install security cameras. However, without concrete evidence, such as CCTV footage, the authorities claimed their hands were tied.

In an effort to protect herself and her property, the tenant has resorted to parking her car in a different building equipped with security cameras.

Appropriate action

The question remains as to why tenants are subjected to such treatment, and why the building owner has not taken appropriate action.

Female driver faces manslaughter charge

The Chief Prosecutor of the Traffic Prosecution Department has revealed that authorities received a report of a deadly traffic collision on busy Salman Road in the capital last week.

According to preliminary details, the incident occurred during evening rush hour near a popular shopping district. Witnesses said the female driver appeared distracted as her vehicle drifted onto the roadside emergency lane at high speed.

Tragically, this is where a jogger in his late 30s was running along the strip at the time to keep fit. The forceful impact from the car struck him down and caused critical injuries.

Emergency responders rushed the motionless victim to the Salmaniya Medical Complex but doctors could not rescue him from the severity of wounds sustained. He was sadly pronounced dead from internal bleeding.

Traffic investigators swiftly handed the case over to public prosecutors after gathering initial testimonies at the crash scene. The female suspect, in her 20s, was then summoned for official questioning about the chain of events.

BD200 million allocated to empower Bahraini workers

The Council of Representatives unanimously approved an edict to provide partial funding for The Train and Place Programme by a sum of BD200 million after exhaustive deliberations yesterday.

This initiative, operated by The Labour Fund (Tamkeen), aims to facilitate the integration of Bahraini nationals into the labour market.

In an effort to elevate the minimum wage across various sectors of society, the scheme was designated urgent, with the ultimate goal of enhancing the living standards of Bahrainis.

This endeavour is expected to expedite crucial programmes aimed at improving the skills of Bahraini jobseekers, aligning them with the requirements of the labour market and subsequently increasing their productivity, creating in turn more job opportunities for Bahraini jobseekers.

The scheme has been nodded by both the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) and the Bahrain Free Labour Unions Federation, signaling

their approval and support.

A sum of BD129 million is expected to be allocated for 13,000 Bahraini employees. As for private institutions set to promote its employees, the scheme will fully cover the intended increment for employees earning below BD1,500 per month over a period of 24 months.

Collaborative effort

"The edict before us is a result of collaborative effort between the legislative and executive branches, arising from their discussions on the state budget. The focus of these deliberations was to prioritise the private sector, particularly in light of the recent salary raise granted to the public sector," MP Ahmed Salloom said.

"It is crucial to bear in mind the significance of judiciously utilising the allocated funds for the Unemployment Insurance System. However, it is equally important to recognise that this initiative aligns with the core objectives for which the Unemployment Insurance System was originally established," MP Salloom added.

"We strive as legislators to enhance the appeal of the private sector to Bahraini youth and foster a smooth integra-

tion of their work with the public sector. This objective becomes even more pertinent in light of the increasing delegation of tasks to technology," MP Jalal Kadhem stressed.

According to official statistics provided by the Ministry of Labour, the number of jobseekers in Bahrain stands at 16,856 with a minimum wage for private sector employees at BD500 for college graduates, BD430 for Diploma holders, and BD350 for Secondary School graduates and below averaging at BD826.

"The recent package of subsidies handles the issue from the top, as demonstrated by the remarkable success of the On-The-Job Training Service (Furas), which has achieved a record high employment rate of 65%," said the Minister of Labour, His Excellency Jameel Humaidan.

"As we celebrated Bahraini Youth Day yesterday, it is essential to cement this celebration by providing our youngsters with genuine employment opportunities. By doing so, we enable them to discover their true potential, lead dignified lives, and ensure their valuable contributions to the development of our nation," said MP Eman Showaiter.

Gulf Air losses exposed

Parliamentary investigation committee unveils damning findings on national carrier

The parliamentary investigation committee has submitted its report regarding the individuals accountable for the losses incurred by Gulf Air.

Spearheaded by MP Mohamed Almaarafi, the committee commenced its inquiry with a total of 10 meetings held, conducted interviews with representatives of the company, and collected evidence pertaining to the matter.

Gulf Air, founded in the 1950s by four families, operated under the authority of four governments: Bahrain, Qatar, Abu Dhabi, and Oman with a capital of BD130 million.

Some of the committee's investigation noteworthy revelations included:

1. Gulf Air's responses failed to disclose the magnitude of its losses, which are estimated to be around BD77 million.

2. The loss rose to 8.4% in 2022 due to the Russia-Ukraine war.

3. The committee revealed that the national carrier has not made any plans to fly to highly sought-after destinations, a missed opportunity that its competitors capitalised on.

4. Contrary to circulating numbers suggesting a figure of 35 affected by the company's restructuring, it issued a statement indicating that 22 employees were initially affected, 13 of which the company later reemployed.

"The report relied heavily on previous reports and the transparent correspondence with the company's trade union, unlike its board of directors," said MP Al Maarafi.

"Appealing to article 200 of Bahrain's Penal Code, holding the responsible for the losses is of utmost importance," he added.

The MP unveiled compelling documents to the house that

purportedly showcased instances of vindictive termination against employees who had successfully prevailed in legal battles against the company. These documents shed light on a troubling pattern of retaliatory actions taken by the company, casting doubt on their commitment to fair labour practices and raising serious concerns about employee rights.

According to official sources, the national carrier received approximately BD48 million in subsidies in 2023. This financial support aims to facilitate the implementation of the company's plan to revitalise its capital and pursue a strategic approach towards effective spending.

MP Khalid Saleh Buanaq later showcased images of dilapidated machines worth thousands of

dinars purchased by Gulf Air, which have been left unused for years. A blatant example of irresponsible spending by the company.

In a written statement, MP Basma Mubarak has proposed five key recommendations for Gulf Air aiming to enhance the overall efficiency and transparency of Gulf Air. These recommendations include:

1. Solidifying financial performance and reducing reliance on state subsidies.

2. Expanding the airline's reach by introducing flights to new destinations.

3. Establishing a robust system of accountability to ensure responsible and transparent operations.

4. Boosting Bahrainisation in the company.

5. Enhancing transparency in disclosing the company's financial transactions

In response to the concerns expressed by the MPs, H.E. Minister of Transportation Mohamed bin Thamir AlKaabi highlighted reports from reputable aviation organisations like IATA (International Air Transport Association) and ICAO (International Civil Aviation Organization) that underscored the significant financial repercussions endured by the entire airline industry as a direct consequence of the pandemic.



From chaos to safety

After strong winds swept through various areas of Bahrain on Monday, the government swiftly acted to ensure public safety and minimize property damage. The Daily Tribune observed crews removing damaged light poles and replacing them with new, securely cemented bases in locations such as Mahooz and Um Al-Hassam. The Cabinet discussed measures to address the weather-related damage and directed authorities to document and manage it. These efforts, in line with the Cabinet's decision, aim to prevent further incidents and ensure the safety of both people and property. (By Ashen Tharaka)

Kidnappers imprisoned

The High Criminal Court has handed down a verdict, sentencing one defendant to one month in prison and another defendant to three years in prison for their involvement in the kidnapping of a man who was riding his scooter in a residential area.

The defendants took the victim to their apartment in the country and physically assaulted him before stealing his belongings. According to the details, the victim was riding his scooter to a restaurant when he was approached by a GCC man, aged 36, who grabbed him by the neck and demanded that he accompany him to a car.

The man then took him to the apartment where they resided in a hotel. Upon entering the apartment, the man pushed the victim onto a billiard table, locked the door, and called out to the second man, aged 29, who was present.

The second man joined in the assault, punching the victim in various parts of his body, hitting him on the head and hand with a wooden staircase, and restraining him with a curtain rope.

The second man also managed to steal the victim's mobile phone and the key to his scooter.

The victim remained confined in the apartment for some time while bound. During this period, he noticed a mobile phone charging in the room and took advantage of the kidnappers' absence.

He closed the room's door and called the police for help without the kidnappers noticing.

BYD overtook Elon Musk’s Tesla in the fourth quarter of 2023 to become the world’s top seller of EVs. The firm recorded a net profit of 30 billion yuan (\$4.16 billion) last year, according to a filing to the Shenzhen Stock Exchange, up 80.7 percent year-on-year from 16.6 billion yuan in 2022, reaching an all-time high.

Big tech told to identify AI deepfakes ahead of EU vote

Brussels, Belgium

The EU called on Facebook, TikTok and other tech titans yesterday to crack down on deepfakes and other AI-generated content by using clear labels ahead of Europe-wide polls in June.

The recommendation is part of a raft of guidelines published

under a landmark content law by the European Commission for digital giants to tackle risks to elections including disinformation.

The EU executive has unleashed a string of measures to clamp down on big tech, especially regarding content moderation.

Its biggest tool is the Digital Services Act (DSA) under which the bloc has designated 22 digital platforms as "very large" including Instagram, Snapchat, YouTube and X.

There has been feverish excitement over artificial intelligence since OpenAI's ChatGPT arrived on the scene in late 2022, but the EU's concerns over the technology's harms have grown in parallel.

Brussels especially fears the impact of Russian "manipulation" and "disinformation" on elections taking place in the bloc's 27 member states on June 6-9.

In the new guidelines, the commission said the largest

platforms "should assess and mitigate specific risks linked to AI, for example by clearly labelling content generated by AI (such as deepfakes)".

The commission recommends that big platforms promote official information on elections and "reduce the monetisation and virality of content that threatens the integrity of electoral processes" to diminish any risks.

"With today's guidelines we are making full use of all the tools offered by the DSA to ensure platforms comply with their obligations and are not misused to manipulate our elections, while safeguarding freedom of expression," said the EU's top tech enforcer, Thierry Breton.

While the guidelines are not legally binding, platforms must explain what other "equally effective" measures they are taking to limit the risks if they do not adhere to them.

The EU can ask for more information and if regulators do

not believe there is full compliance, they can hit the firms with probes that could lead to hefty fines.

'Trusted' information

Under the new guidelines, the commission also said political advertising "should be clearly labelled as such" before a tougher law on the issue comes into force in 2025.

It also urges platforms to put in place mechanisms "to reduce the impact of incidents that could have a significant effect on the election outcome or turnout".

The EU will conduct "stress-tests" with relevant platforms in late April, it said.

X has already been under investigation since December over content moderation.

And the commission on March 14 pressed Facebook, Instagram, TikTok and four other platforms to provide more information on how they are countering AI risks to polls.

Europe space telescope's sight restored after de-icing procedure

Paris, France

The vision of the Euclid space telescope has been restored following a delicate operation that successfully melted a thin layer of ice that had been clouding its sight, the European Space Agency announced yesterday.

There had been fears that the creeping ice could delay the mission of Europe's space telescope, which blasted off in July on the world's first mission to investigate the cosmic mysteries of dark matter and dark energy.

However a de-icing procedure to gently warm up an optical mirror on the telescope "performed significantly better than hoped", the ESA said.

"After the very first mirror was warmed by just 34 degrees, E u -

clid's sight was restored," it added.

In November, scientists on the ground noticed that they were losing a little light coming into the telescope's visible light imager.

They determined that the problem was a layer of ice -- thought to be just the width of a strand of DNA -- building up on the telescope's optical surfaces.

There are heaters onboard that can warm up the entire spacecraft, a process that was carried out shortly after Euclid launched.

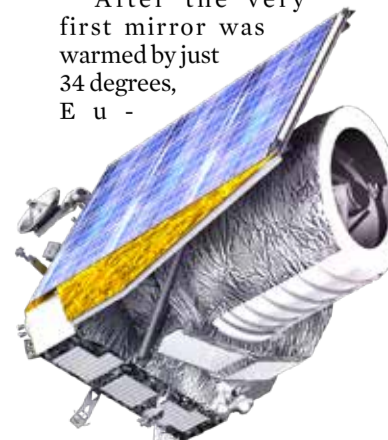
But heat expands many materials, and warming up the whole spacecraft now would require careful recalibration.

That had the potential to delay the telescope's mission by months, Euclid instrument operations scientist Ralf Kohley told AFP last week.

So the team opted instead to warm up single mirrors.

Kohley had said they would move through a number of different mirrors until they found the right one.

But the ESA emphasised they had solved the problem by heating up the very first mirror attempted.

Why Waste When You Can Recreate?

One of the biggest kitchen dilemmas is dealing with leftovers. What is appetizing one day seems undesirable a couple of days later. The roasted chicken breast that no one wanted the following day, a couple of stale bread slices that remained isolated, boiled potatoes conveniently chilling in the fridge, a bowl of rice that did not make it on to a plate, unconsumed slices of cake that met the boredom of everyone at home. Do these instances seem familiar? Food waste is increasing day by day. Imagine the accumulated food waste of each household per year. What would these numbers look like? It is a known fact that Bahrain alone witnesses a food waste of 146,000 tonnes each year! This number includes food wasted by F&B outlets and retailers. The good news is that cooked and uncooked food can

escape their disastrous fate. We can do our small part in com-



bating food waste by becoming mindful and creating new recipes out of unwanted edible food.

Create food competitions at home where family members create their unique recipes using leftovers. Dedicate days to use tiny quantities of vegetables or meat. Incorporate meat and vegetables with rice to create fried rice. Adding egg and spring onions along with some soy sauce and black pepper can elevate the dish. Use bread to make breadcrumbs or bread pudding. Everyone loves a good bread pudding. Leftover roast meat or

chicken can be cubed or shredded and made into sandwiches or wraps. Add a dollop of mayonnaise, ranch sauce or a generous smear of butter and you have the most delightful meal.

Apart from fried rice, small quantities of rice can turn into a luscious rice pudding when combined with a little milk, sugar and dried fruits along with a hint of nutmeg or cardamom. Do you have recipes using leftovers that have become family favourites?

A world famous recipe came into being with the motive to reduce the wastage of unconsumed tandoori chicken. A genius Delhi-based chef prepared a simple gravy to dunk tasty pieces of leftover tandoori chicken. This dish is none other than Butter Chicken. Try this recipe for whole tandoori chicken and use any leftover pieces to create the succulent and easy butter chicken recipe.

Whole Tandoori Chicken



1- 1.3 kilograms whole chicken

For the first marinade:

- 1 tablespoon ginger garlic paste
- 2-3 teaspoons Kashmiri chili powder
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- Salt to taste

For the second marinade:

- 1¼ cup thick plain yogurt
- 1 tablespoon ginger garlic paste
- 2-3 teaspoons Kashmiri red chili powder
- 1 teaspoon coriander powder
- 1 teaspoon garam masala powder
- ¾ teaspoon black salt (or regular salt)
- ½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon cumin powder
- ½ cup mustard oil (or vegetable oil of choice)
- Red food colour (optional)



Instructions:

- Clean, wash and make cuts on the chicken. This will help the marinade to penetrate well into the chicken.
- Combine all the ingredients of first marinade (ginger garlic paste, Kashmiri red chili powder, lemon juice and salt), in a large bowl.
- Add chicken and coat it very well with the marinade.
- Cover the bowl with a cling wrap and leave it for 45 minutes - 1 hour in the fridge.
- In another large bowl, add all the ingredients of second marinade and mix to combine well.
- After the first marination process is over, transfer the chicken in the prepared second marinade. Cover the bowl with a cling film cover and refrigerate for 7-8 hours or overnight.
- Take the chicken out of the fridge 30-45 minutes prior to cooking.
- Grill it either on a charcoal grill or in the oven.
- Grill at 220c for 1 hour, basting with butter or leftover marinade halfway through.

Quick Butter Chicken

Ingredients:

- 300-400 gms leftover tandoori chicken
- 1 tbsp (30 g) ghee or butter
- 1 onion pureed
- 1 tsp ginger garlic paste
- 1/2 cup canned tomatoes in sauce
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 tsp sugar
- ¼ tsp cardamom powder
- 1 green chilli sliced lengthwise
- 3/4 tsp salt
- Coriander for garnishing

Instructions:

- Heat the ghee or butter over high heat in a large fry pan.
- Add the ginger garlic paste and cook until raw smell disappears.
- Add the onion puree and cook until light golden.
- Add the canned tomato, cream, sugar, cardamom powder, chilli and salt.
- Turn down to low and simmer for 20 minutes. Taste and add more salt if needed.
- Place leftover tandoori chicken in the frying pan and heat through.
- Garnish with coriander/cilantro leaves if using. Serve with rice or naan.

Ramadan Recipe that is Perfect For Sharing

Kashk Bademjan is a beautiful, mouthwatering warm starter prepared with eggplant. The creamy texture of eggplant against the crunchy walnut topping makes this Persian starter delightful to the palate. Smoky grilled or roasted eggplant skillfully combined with garlic, mint and kashk (Dried and fermented yoghurt) provides a well-balanced flavour profile. Caramelised onions add a pleasing sweetness to the dish. Prepare this irresistible starter for your family and watch them ask for more!

KASHK BADEMJAN

Ingredients:

- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 large eggplant peeled and thinly sliced vertically
- 1 large yellow onion thinly sliced
- 4 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 tablespoons dried mint
- 1/4 teaspoon turmeric powder
- 1/4 cup water
- 1/2 tablespoon bloomed saffron water
- 1/4-1/2 cup of kashk depending on your preference (and more for serving)
- Garnish: chopped walnuts
- Salt and pepper to taste

Instructions:

- Peel off the skin of the eggplant, slice the eggplant vertically.
- In a pan, heat olive oil and sear the eggplant in batches. Sear on both sides until golden brown and a bit caramelised. Set aside on a plate.
- While eggplant is cooking, bloom the saffron by putting 1/4th tsp of saffron in a mortar and pestle. Grind into a powder and add in a cup with 1-2 ice cubes. Once dissolved, you get bloomed saffron.
- In another skillet, add a little olive oil and sauté the onions until soft and golden brown.
- Add the garlic and dried mint to the onions and mix until combined on low flame. Set aside about 2-3 tablespoons for topping! Empty out the mixture and set aside.
- In the same skillet, add the eggplant, the onion/garlic/mint mixture, salt, pepper, turmeric and mix well. Add 1/4th cup of water and cover. This will allow the eggplant to fully cook through and soften (Around 10 minutes).
- Once the liquid has dissolved and eggplant is soft, mash the eggplant using a masher or fork. Keep the eggplant a bit chunky. When the dip is fully combined and mashed to your desired consistency, add in to the bloomed saffron, salt and pepper to taste and kashk. Mix well to combine on low heat for another 5-6 minutes.
- Serve Kashk Bademjan on a plate and top it with caramelized onion, sauteed dried mint, extra kashk, and chopped walnuts.

News in brief

◆ **The head of Russia's FSB** security agency claimed yesterday that Western and Ukrainian special services had aided the attackers who stormed a Moscow concert hall last week, killing dozens. Russia continues to allege Ukraine was somehow involved in Friday's massacre, even after President Vladimir Putin acknowledged "radical Islamists" had carried it out. "We believe the action was prepared both by the radical Islamists themselves and, of course, facilitated by Western special services, and Ukraine's special services themselves have a direct connection to this," FSB head Alexander Bortnikov was cited as saying by Russian news agencies. He also repeated the Kremlin's claim that the attackers tried fleeing over the Ukrainian border, an assertion that Kyiv has called absurd.



Russia claims West aided Moscow attackers

Natural disasters cost insurers \$108 bn in 2023: Swiss Re

◆ **Natural disasters caused \$280 billion** in damage worldwide in 2023, including \$108 billion covered by insurance companies, Swiss reinsurance giant Swiss Re said Tuesday, warning the bill could double within 10 years. The total amount of damage, and the share covered by insurers, both fell compared to 2022, which saw Hurricane Ian -- one of the deadliest storms to hit the United States this century -- send costs soaring. In 2022, the damage caused by natural disasters amounted to \$286 billion, while the bill for insurers reached \$133 billion. Despite the drop from the previous year, the bill for insurers in 2023 nonetheless exceeded the \$100-billion mark for the fourth year in a row, Swiss Re said in its Sigma study. The annual overview by the Zurich-based group -- which acts as an insurer for insurers -- details the cost of disasters and natural catastrophes.

◆ **A Russian court** yesterday remanded an eighth suspect in custody over the attack on a Moscow concert hall that killed at least 139 people, officials said. Moscow earlier announced it had detained 11 people in connection with the attack, which saw camouflaged gunmen storm into Crocus City Hall, open fire on concert-goers and set the building ablaze. The court's press service said the latest suspect to be remanded was a man originally from the Central Asian country of Kyrgyzstan. Officials said he was ordered to be held in detention until at least May 22, without detailing the exact accusations against him.

Five Chinese dam workers, Pakistan driver killed in suicide attack

◆ **Five Chinese nationals** working on a major dam construction site were killed along with their driver on Tuesday when a suicide bomber targeted their vehicle in northwest Pakistan, police said. Islamabad is Beijing's closest regional ally, but the security of Chinese workers has long been of concern in Pakistan. "Five Chinese and their local driver were killed in the attack," Muhammad Ali Gandapur, a senior police official in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, told AFP.

Major US bridge collapses as cargo ship plows into pylon

Baltimore, United States

A major bridge in the US city of Baltimore collapsed early yesterday after being struck by a container ship, sending multiple vehicles and people plunging into the frigid harbor below.

Dramatic nighttime footage showed a 300-meter vessel hitting a pylon of the Francis Scott Key Bridge, bringing most of the steel-built structure crashing into the Patapsco River within seconds.

Vehicles could be seen on the road surface as the bridge

warped and crashed in sections, with the third tranche cantilevering upwards before it, too, tumbled into the water.

Rescuers said they were still looking for at least seven people, having pulled two people free.

As daylight broke the extent of the disaster became apparent.

Twisted stanchions of steel lay draped over the deck of the ship, on which stacks of containers teetered precariously -- adding further danger to rescue and recovery work.

Gaza teens hoping to be killed to end their 'nightmare': UN

The situation in war-ravaged Gaza is so desperate that teenagers are now saying they hope to be swiftly killed to escape the "nightmare", a spokesman for the UN children's agency said yesterday.

"The unspeakable is regularly said in Gaza," said James Elder, spokesman for the United Nations children's agency UNICEF. Speaking to journalists in Geneva via video message from Rafah in southern Gaza, he said the agency had on Monday held a meeting with adolescents.

Several said they were "so desperate for this nightmare to end that they hoped to be killed", he said.

The war began with Hamas's October 7 attacks, which resulted in about 1,160 deaths in Israel, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally of Israeli official figures.

Militants also seized about 250 hostages, of whom Israel believes around 130 are still held in Gaza, including 33 presumed dead.

Israel's retaliatory campaign against Hamas has killed at least 32,333 people in Gaza, most of them women and children, according to the health ministry. The UN has warned that Gaza is facing a looming famine, spurring increasingly urgent appeals for Israel to open up more border crossings and to stop hampering the movement of aid through the Palestinians territory.

The Israelis "have a right to control. They inspect every single gram, litre, kilo of whatever goes into Gaza," Jens Laerke, spokesman for the UN humanitarian agency, told reporters.

"But they cannot say that once it's inside, we leave it with you. They must create this enabling environment that allows us to move it around."

"We need to dispel this notion that their obligation with getting aid in somehow stops with getting a few trucks, a fraction of what is needed, across the border," he said.

"That is not correct."

Elder meanwhile pointed out that the Israelis had denied a quarter of the 40 mission requests to the north since the beginning of the month.

"Now there is an existing old crossing point that could be used in the north 10 minutes from where those people are putting their hands to their mouth pleading for food," he said, referring to the Erez Crossing.

"10 minutes. Open that and we could turn this humanitarian crisis around in a matter of days. But it remains closed."

"Let's be clear, life-saving aid is being obstructed, lives are being lost, dignity is being denied."

Planting trees in wrong places heats the planet: study

Planting trees in the wrong places can actually contribute to global warming, scientists said yesterday but a new map identifies the best locations to regrow forests and cool the planet.

Trees soak up carbon dioxide and restoring areas of degraded woodlands or planting saplings to boost forest cover is one tool in the fight against climate change.

But in some cases, more trees means less sunlight is reflected back from the earth's surface and more heat is absorbed by the planet, according to a study in the journal Nature Communications.

"There are some places

where putting trees back leads to net climate negative outcomes," Susan Cook-Patton, one of the study's co-authors, told AFP.

Scientists had already understood that restoring tree cover led to changes in albedo -- the amount of solar radiation bounced back off the planet's surface -- but didn't have the tools to account for

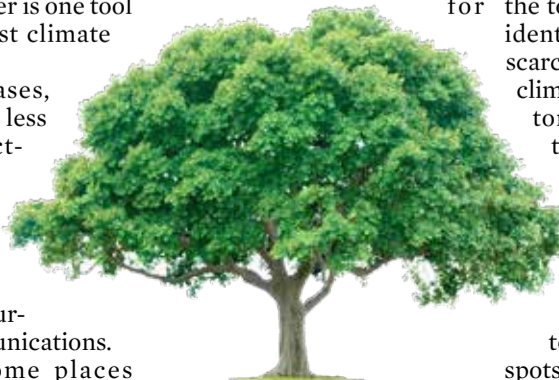
it, she said.

Using new maps, researchers were able to consider, for the first time, the cooling effect from trees and the warming caused by decreased albedo.

They found that projects that didn't factor albedo into the equation overestimated the climate benefit of additional trees by between 20 to 80 percent.

But the maps also provide the tools to help policymakers identify where best to funnel scarce resources for maximum climate impact, said Cook-Patton, senior forest restoration scientist at The Nature Conservancy.

"There's also lots of places still where restoring tree cover is a great idea for climate change. We're just trying to help people find those spots," she said.

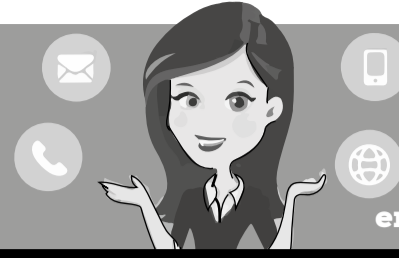

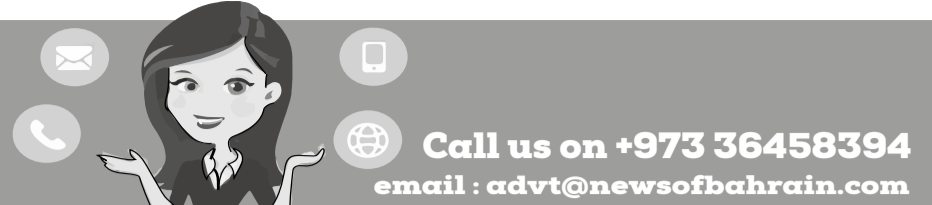

Zverev delivered a crucial break when Eubanks was serving for the set at 5-3 before breaking early in the second to go 3-0 up and see himself through to victory.

"He came out swinging and didn't give me chances to be aggressive. I tried to mix it up from the baseline," said Zverev.

"I was surprised how well he was playing from the baseline, not giving me many unforced errors. He makes a lot but usually misses a lot but today he wasn't missing, especially through some stages of the first set," he added.

Australian Alex De Minaur moved on with a 7-6 (7/3), 6-4 victory against 24th seed Jan-Lennard Struff of Germany.

De Minaur will face Fabian Marozsan in the next round after the Hungarian continued his impressive tournament with a 7-5, 6-3 win over Alexei Popyrin.

Hawks stage 30-point comeback to stun Celtics

The Atlanta Hawks produced a comeback for the ages to overturn a 30-point deficit and defeat the Eastern Conference-leading Boston Celtics 120-118 on Monday.

Boston, who were confirmed as having clinched the Eastern Conference's top seed earlier on Monday, appeared to be cruising towards a resounding win after outscoring Atlanta 44-22 in the first quarter.

The Celtics raced into a 30-point advantage midway through the second quarter before Atlanta woke up and began chipping into the Boston lead.

The Hawks kept the rally going into the second half, narrowing the gap further with a 34-22 third quarter before harnessing that momentum into the fourth quarter to complete a dramatic win.

DeAndre Hunter led the Hawks scoring with 24 points, including a decisive three-pointer with 10 seconds remaining that gave Atlanta a four-point cushion and effectively made the game safe.

Hunter was backed with 22

points from Bogdan Bogdanovic while Dejounte Murray finished with 19 points, 15 assists and five rebounds.

Hawks coach Quin Snyder praised the unrelenting support of the Atlanta home crowd in helping drive his team to a remarkable victory.

"Tonight the way we started the game, and the way Boston started, their energy really gave us a lift," Snyder said of the Atlanta fans.

"Anytime you're down that much you have to have something out of the ordinary a little bit to get back in the game.

"And when you have a group of people you know who are behind you thick or thin, rain or shine -- and there was a lot of rain early -- they were a big part of helping the sun come out tonight."

Atlanta improved to 32-39 and remain in 10th place in the East, on course for a spot in the play-in tournament.

Celtics coach Joe Mazzulla said his team paid the price for not killing the game off, adding that Atlanta's physicality had caused his team problems in the second half.

Top seed Swiatek exits Miami with Gauff after upsets

World number one Iga Swiatek was knocked out of the Miami Open after inspired Russian Ekaterina Alexandrova triumphed 6-4, 6-2 in their fourth round match on Monday.

The 16th seed Alexandrova played brilliant attacking tennis from the outset to beat the Pole and leave the WTA tournament without any of the top three seeds in the quarter-finals with Aryna Sabalenka and Coco Gauff also out.

France's Caroline Garcia upset world number three Gauff beating the American 6-3, 1-6, 6-2 on Monday to advance to the quarter-finals of the Miami Open, while world number two Aryna Sabalenka had been eliminated by Ukraine's Anhelina Kalinina on Saturday.

Australia and Iraq were in rampant goalscoring form yesterday as they both cruised into the next stage of Asian qualifying for the 2026 World Cup, while Son Heung-min's South Korea are on the brink of joining them after beating Thailand.

Australia handed out a 5-0 drubbing to Lebanon in Canberra in Group I while Iraq progressed from Group F after brushing aside the Philippines by the same score in Manila.

Iran also made sure of their place in the next round with a 1-0 win in Turkmenistan.

In Group C, Son scored as South Korea look favourites to go through after a 3-0 win against Thailand in Bangkok, while China got their qualifying hopes back on track with a 4-1 win against Singapore.

Park Jin-seob and Lee Jaesung joined the Tottenham Hotspur star on the scoresheet and South Korea now need only a draw in Singapore in June to go through.

Australia's Craig Goodwin led his side to a fourth straight qualifying victory with two

goals in a man-of-the-match performance, together with strikes from Kusini Yengi, John Iredale and an own goal.

"When I knew Craig Goodwin younger, he didn't believe in himself like he does these days," Australia coach Graham Arnold said of the 32-year-old, who also created the opener for Yengi and whose free-kick led to the own goal.

"He's a top-quality player, but he's a fantastic person and a great leader.

"His delivery, set pieces, is fantastic and his finishing, it's just got better and better as he gets older."

Palestine, their supporters in Gaza reeling from the Israel-Hamas war, gave themselves a great chance of going through with Australia by beating Bangladesh 1-0 in Dhaka.

Palestine just need a draw with third-placed Lebanon in their next match in June to guarantee their progress from Group I.

Aymen Hussein's 14th-minute penalty set Iraq on their way against the Philippines, ranked 139th in the world.

Murray out for 'extended period' with ankle injury

Britain's Andy Murray faces an "extended period" out of tennis after suffering serious ankle injuries in his third round exit from the Miami Open on Sunday.

Kingdom's national team take one step closer to advancing in FIFA World Cup 2026 qualifiers and securing berth in AFC Asian Cup 2027

Bahrain last night boosted their chances of advancing in FIFA World Cup 2026 qualification and securing their berth in the AFC Asian Cup 2027 following a 3-0 victory over Nepal at the National Stadium in Riffa.

Three players were on target for the Bahrainis in the contest, including Sayed Mahdi Baqer, Abdulla Yusuf, and Komail Al Aswad—all in the opening half.

It was the national team's second successive victory over their Nepali counterparts in under a week's time, adding to their 5-0 drubbing of the visitors last Thursday night at the same venue.

With the result, Bahrain improved to nine points on the Group H standings of the

joint-qualifiers and took one step closer to marching through to the third round of FIFA World Cup qualifying and ensuring their place in the AFC Asian Cup 2027.

They still have two matches to play, both in June—first against Yemen at home on June 6 and then against the UAE away on June 11.

The Emiratis are currently in first place in their pool with 12 points, and have already punched their tickets to the next stage of the World Cup qualifiers while securing their Asian Cup spot. They beat the Yemenis in last night's other Group H contest, played in Khobar, Saudi Arabia.

Bahrain's win yesterday maintained the fine start for national team head coach Dragan Talajic, who was at the helm of the Kingdom's squad for only his second official match.

Just like in their previous contest against Nepal, the nationals needed only a few minutes from kick-off to get onto the score-sheet.

Baqer opened their account in

the seventh minute off a corner that was not cleared. His shot from close range took a deflection off Nepal defender Ananta Tamang and went into the right of the net.

In the 16th minute, the hosts

were awarded a penalty after Mohammed Jassim Marhoon was brought down in the box by Nepal's goalkeeper Kiran Kumar Limbu. The stopper had just saved a shot from Al Aswad on a quick counter, but the ball

rebounded towards Marhoon, whom he brought down with his challenge. Yusuf stepped up to take the spot kick and he coolly converted into the bottom-right corner.

Mahdi Humaidan had a good

opportunity to add to the score line in the 29th minute off a back-heeled pass from Yusuf, but he shot directly at Limbu. Al Aswad then made no mistake with his effort in the 36th, scoring on a one-on-one with Limbu after being released with a brilliant one-touch pass from Marhoon to make it 3-0.

In the second half, a header from substitute Hussain Abdulkarim in the 64th minute was punched away, and then he could not take advantage of a one-on-one with Limbu minutes later.

Ebrahim Al Khattal also had a header late on collected by the goalkeeper, and then Abdulkarim shot just over the crossbar with a minute to go in regular time. Ahmed Al Sherooqi also came close in injury time as Bahrain cruised to the final whistle.

There are five rounds in the FIFA World Cup qualification format for the Asian Football Confederation (AFC), which will have eight teams book their tickets to the global showcase, plus potentially another following an inter-confederation play-off.

Bangladesh lawmaker Shakib recalled for second Sri Lanka Test

Batsman Towhid Hridoy, 23, who has yet to make his five-day debut, made way for Shakib in the squad after being left out of the first Test playing side.

Uncapped Mushfik Hasan has been ruled out of the second and final Test because of an ankle injury and was replaced by fellow pacer Hasan Mahmud.

Australia-India Test series to start in Perth late November

Perth will host the first match of a blockbuster five-Test series against India from November 22, Cricket Australia (CA) said yesterday as it released its international schedule for the 2024-25 season.

The series will then move to Adelaide for a day-night Test and then Brisbane's Gabba, which traditionally was the opening venue of Australia's Test summer.

The Melbourne Cricket Ground will stage the Boxing Day Test and the Border-Gavaskar Trophy series will wrap up at Sydney Cricket Ground starting on January 3.

CA chief executive Nick Hockley called it "one of the most highly anticipated summers of cricket in memory".

"Fittingly, the Border-Gavaskar Trophy has been

put on the same footing as the (men's) Ashes with a five-Test series for the first time since 1991-92," he said.

Australia have not beaten India in a home series since 2014-2015.

The hosts have, however, won all four previous Tests at Perth Stadium.

"We're confident the schedule will maximise viewership and attendances and there will be a tremendous atmosphere in stadiums across the country," said Hockley.

Also released yesterday were dates for Australia's home one-day and Twenty20 series against Pakistan in November that will precede the India Test series, and the Women's Ashes against old rivals England.

The final match of the Women's Ashes, starting January 30, 2025, will be the first women's Test at the MCG since 1949.

Ravindra, Dube help Chennai thrash Gujarat in IPL

● **Rachin Ravindra's explosive 46 off 20 balls leads Chennai's dominant performance**

New Zealand's Rachin Ravindra hit an explosive 46 and took three catches to help holders Chennai Super Kings to their second straight IPL win with a 63-run thrashing of Gujarat Titans yesterday.

The left-handed Ravindra, in his debut IPL season, made his runs off 20 balls while captain Rituraj Gaikwad also hit 46 as Chennai posted 206-6 at their home M.A. Chidambaram Stadium.

Seam bowlers Mustafizur Rahman, Deepak Chahar and Tushar Deshpande took two wickets each to help restrict Gujarat, led by Shubman Gill, to 143-8 and go down to their biggest IPL loss by runs.

Chennai's Shivam Dube top-

scored with his 51 off 23 deliveries to boost the total after Ravindra and Gaikwad gave the team a quick start in their opening stand of 62.

Old warhorse M.S. Dhoni shocked his fans ahead of the T20 tournament when he passed on the Chennai captaincy to Gaikwad after he had led

the team to its fifth IPL title last year.

Gaikwad, who led the team to a win over Royal Challengers Bengaluru in the IPL opener last week, survived an early reprieve on one and made use of the spill.

The left-handed Ravindra remained defiant and clubbed three sixes and six fours.

Gujarat's Afghanistan spin wizard Rashid Khan denied Ravindra his fifty as the leg-spinner had the batsman stumped while Gaikwad fell caught behind off Australia's Spencer Johnson.

Dube reached his fifty in 22 balls before he fell in the 19th over to Rashid, who took two wickets but leaked 49 runs.

Gujarat, who won a title in their debut IPL season in 2022, were never in the chase after they lost Gill lbw off Chahar.

Gill took charge of the team and won his opening match on Sunday after Hardik Pandya switched to Mumbai Indians for another captain's role.

The final of the lucrative T20 tournament will be played in Chennai on May 26.
