Dakistan's ousted prime min-👤 ister Imran Khan disbanded a protest march by supporters yesterday after clashes with police outside parliament, but threatened that they would return unless an election was called within six days. Khan had rallied thousands

of supporters to Islamabad, with plans to occupy sensitive parts of the capital until Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif gave in to his demand for new polls, but Khan told his followers yesterday morning to step back, while delivering a fresh ultimatum.

"I'm giving you six days. You announce elections in six days," Khan said from atop a truck after he and thousands of his supporters reached the city.

He said parliament should be dissolved to hold elections in June, and warned the government that he will lead a march on the capital again if it didn't meet his demands.
