Saudi energy minister warns oil speculators to 'watch out'

Saudi Arabia's top energy official issued another warning to oil short-sellers, just over a week before the OPEC+ alliance is due to meet.

"I keep advising them that they will be ouching — they did ouch in April," Saudi Energy Minister Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman said at the Qatar Economic Forum in Doha on Tuesday. "I don't have to show them my cards and I'm not a poker player. But I'd tell them: 'Watch out!'"

Battles rage in Sudan's Darfur on fourth day of truce

Fighting between forces loyal to Sudan's rival generals yesterday rocked the western region of Darfur, witnesses said, on the fourth day of a fragile US- and Saudi-brokered ceasefire.

The one-week truce, the latest in a series of agreements that have all been systematically violated, was breached only minutes after it took effect on Monday night.

There have since been further violations of the ceasefire, which is meant to allow for much-needed humanitarian aid to reach war-ravaged parts of the country, with the warring sides blaming each other.

In El Fasher, the capital of North Darfur, residents reported "battles with all types of weapons", six weeks into a war between the regular army, led by Abdel Fattah al-Burhan, and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF).

Since it erupted on April 15, the fighting has killed more than 1,800 people, according to the Armed Conflict Location and Event Data Project.

Nord Stream sabotage clues point to Ukraine

Links to Ukraine follow assessments by multiple intelligence service

Investigators looking at the explosions on the Nord Stream gas pipelines from Russia have evidence that could link the attack to Ukraine, according to German media reports.

Metadata from the emails used to rent a sailboat suspected to have been used in the attack tie them to Ukraine, Spiegel weekly reported yesterday.

The president of the presumed shell company through which the "Andromeda" yacht was hired also lives in Kyiv, according to research by broadcasters NDR and WDR, daily Sueddeutsche Zeitung and international media partners.

German investigators had also identified a Ukrainian man in his mid-twenties with ties to the military who they believe may

have been part of the six-person team manning the yacht, according to the joint report.

The links to Ukraine corresponded with assessments by multiple intelligence services, according to Spiegel.

The agencies were examining whether the attack could have been carried out by an independent Ukrainian commando group or if a government-backed unit was more likely, the weekly said.

A potential false flag operation, used by the Russians to pin the blame on someone else, has also not been completely ruled out.

Separate reports have pointed out that a Russian navy vessel specialised in submarine operations was photographed near the sabotaged Nord Stream gas pipelines just prior to the mysterious blasts in September.

German, Swedish and Danish authorities have been investigating the blasts that sparked the leaks.



The pipelines had been at the centre of geopolitical tensions as Russia dwindled gas supplies to Europe in suspected retaliation to sanctions over Moscow's attack of Ukraine.

Forbidden act

FBI files uncover plot to kill Queen Elizabeth II

A newly released cache of FBI files has revealed a potential plot to assassinate Queen Elizabeth II during her 1983 visit to California.

The possible threat followed a phone call made by "a man who claimed that his daughter had been killed in Northern Ireland

by a rubber bullet", according to the document that also refers to a bar frequented by Irish Republican Army (IRA) sympathisers.

The queen and her husband Prince Philip visited the west coast of the United States in February and March 1983, and the trip passed off without incident.

Four years earlier in 1979, IRA paramilitaries opposed to British rule in Northern Ireland killed Louis Mountbatten, the last colonial governor of India and an uncle of Philip, in a bomb attack.

The file states that the man claimed he was going to attempt to harm the queen "by dropping some object off the Golden

Gate Bridge onto the royal yacht Britannia when it sails underneath".

Alternatively he "would attempt to kill Queen Elizabeth when she visited Yosemite National Park", they added.

A separate file among the documents, dated 1989, pointed out that while the FBI was unaware

of any specific threats against the queen, "the possibility of threats against the British monarchy is ever present from the Irish Republican Army".

The queen, who died last September aged 96, has previously been reported to have been the target of other assassination plots.

Stranger hugs Germany's Scholz in airport security breach

German Chancellor Olaf Scholz yesterday sought to play down a security failure that allowed an unknown man to embrace the Social Democrat leader on the tarmac at Frankfurt airport.

"People saying hello and greeting me is never something that particularly affects me," Scholz said when quizzed on the incident at a press conference in Estonian capital Tallinn.

"That's very normal and I didn't find this situation dramatic either," Scholz said of the surprising encounter on Wednesday evening. Driving a dark-coloured Audi, the man was able to join Scholz's convoy on its way to Frankfurt airport, following an event at the European Central Bank celebrating its 25-year anniversary.

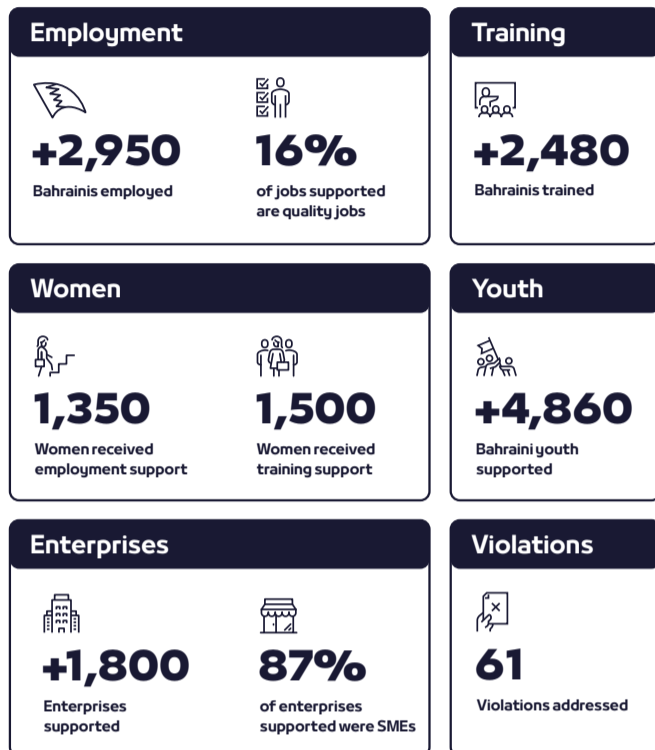

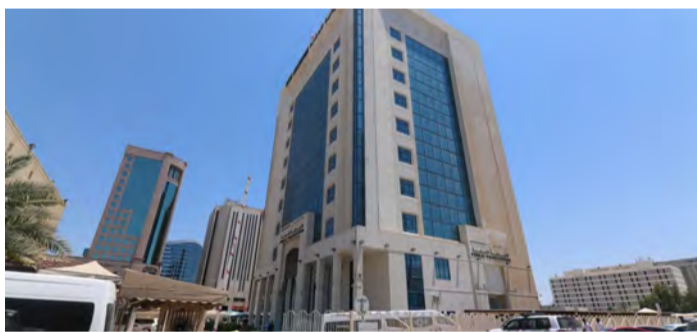

Mother, two-year-old win exit tickets after court battle for birth certificate

Thanks to the efforts of the Indian Embassy and social workers, a divorced mother and her two-year-old child have finally secured their exit tickets to their native in India after winning a protracted court battle for securing the child a birth certificate.

Authorities had denied them exist passes as the child was lacking a government issued birth certificate.

Pravasi Legal Cell (PLC) said they managed to secure exist documents for Malak, the two-year-old daughter of Yasmeen Ansary, through the collaborative efforts of Immigration, Health, and Ministry of Information authorities.

Sudheer Thirunilath, the Country head of PLC, explained to The Daily Tribune the challenging journey, which involved filing three cases after receiving Power of Attorney through Adv Tariq Alowin.

He said that despite receiving setbacks in two cases related to DNA testing and the issuance of a birth certificate, the court granted the amendment

of the marriage date based on evidence and witness testimonies. However, the request was ultimately rejected due to the absence of parents during the marriage and non-payment of Mehr. "In the absence of a birth certificate through government authorities, the Ministry of Information was approached with comprehensive evidence, including marriage and divorce records, hospital documentation, and court judgments.

"Understanding the urgency and sensitivity of the situation, they agreed to assist. With their support and cooperation from health authorities, a certificate of delivery and birth notification was obtained, enabling the repatriation of the mother and child to India."

Tirunilath further thanked Adv Tariq, Immigration Authorities, Salmaniya Health Authorities, Ministry of Information, and officials from the Embassy of India, particularly Priyanka Tyagi, for their support. Ravisankar Shukhla, Sugna, Chethana, and Suren Lal from the Indian Embassy in Bahrain were also thanked for their assistance.

21,000 tons of meat imported in three months

Bahrain imported a total of 21,000 tons of red and white meat between February and April of this year, according to Dr. Ibrahim Youssef, the Acting Assistant Undersecretary for Livestock.

Dr Youssef further disclosed that among the imports, 52,000 heads of sheep were included, comprising 2,000 cows and 120 camels.

In addition, the Kingdom received 6,600 tons of cooled and frozen red meat, along with 14,300 tons of poultry meat (cooled and frozen).

He said the authority issued 522 permits for the import of red meat and poultry meat from various regions. Each shipment required two certificates: a health certificate and a halal certificate issued by an

accredited Islamic centre in the exporting country.

Dr. Youssef also stressed the importance of Livestock traders consulting with relevant veterinary authorities before entering into contracts for the import of live animals and meat. This step allows them to be aware of the epidemiological situation in the exporting country and obtain the necessary approvals and licenses.

Furthermore, he highlighted the need to avoid random slaughter places as they pose a significant risk to public health.

LMRA conducts joint inspection campaign in Northern Governorate



The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) yesterday conducted a joint inspection campaign in the Northern Governorate, in coordination with the Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs (NPRA) and the Governorate's respective Police Directorate of the Ministry of Interior. The campaign resulted in reporting a number of violations related to the Labour Market and Residency laws. The cases were referred for legal action.

Mol invites bids for FM radio channel 104.2

The Ministry of Information has opened a tender inviting bids for the operation and management of an FM Radio Channel in the Kingdom. This opportunity, specifically for the Indian Entertainment Radio FM Channel at 104.2 MHz, offers a five-year contract to the successful bidder.

Interested parties are required to have a minimum of three years of experience in radio channel and radio studio operation in order to be eligible to apply.

Additionally, the ministry requires bidders to have minimum auction's proposed value of not less than BHD 10,000 per month to qualify. Bids failing to meet this requirement will be disqualified.

In order to participate, bidders must comply with the general terms and technical specifica-

tions outlined in the Request for Tender (RFT). A comprehensive understanding of the primary technical requirements is also expected.

The tender documents are available for download from the official website of the tender board at www.tenderboard.gov.bh.

To ensure commitment, bidders are required to submit a BD4,000 bond with a validity period of 180 days. The tender board will stop receiving bids on July 12, 2023, and the received bids will be opened on July 13, 2023.

The ministry has also clarified that it reserves the right to reject

any of the bids that do not meet the Mandatory Criteria Requirements and fail to comply with the General Terms and Instructions of this RFT.

Micro, small and medium enterprises are eligible to obtain 10% preference in the financial evaluation stage. To avail this preference, SMEs must submit

the "SMEs Classification Certificate" during the bidding process.

Vendors who are not registered in the Tender Board's e-tendering system will be required to register to participate in the bidding process.

In a previous auction conducted by the Ministry of Information in 2019 for FM Radio frequency 104.2, according to the tender board, had bids from Go Alive Media (BHD 1,326,000,000) and Al Tamimi & Company Bureau of Attorney and Legal Consultant (BHD 1,253,000,000).

Unconfirmed reports also say that the transmission on this frequency was discontinued in 2019 by the operator due to financial difficulties resulting from low revenue and higher fees.

Later, during the initial months of the COVID-19 pandemic, Go Alive Media was tasked with operating the channel as part of an initiative aimed at addressing the needs of the expatriate community.

Reportedly, in 2021, Mirchi Bahrain, a subsidiary of Entertainment Network India Limited, took over the operations of this FM radio channel, acquiring the rights from the previous operator.



Strategic Publicity and Advertising Company W.L.L. pioneered the first privately-owned Asian Radio Station at 104.2 on November 1, 2006.

In 2012, the Ministry of Information announced an open tender for the frequency. The frequency was ultimately awarded to the highest bidder, who offered 1.1 million for five years.

As of now, Radio Mirchi has been operating the station for the past three years.

New sewerage scheme in Malkiya to serve 345 properties

A project to connect 345 properties in Block number 1034 in Malkiya is on the way, according to Works Ministry.

The Ministry had also launched a tender for the project, which is now in its third phase.

The scope of work includes the construction of a new uPVC sewer main pipeline with three different diameters: 150mm for the lateral line, 200mm, and 300mm. The total lengths of these pipelines are 4630m,

2986m, and 674m, respectively.

Additionally, the project involves the construction of various types of manholes, namely Type "C," "E," Type "F," and Type "H." The total numbers of these manholes are 20, 644, 127, and 47, respectively.

These manholes will be equipped with heavy-duty and medium covers, and the necessary asphalt reinstatement works will also be carried out.

Busaiten Link project attracts four bids

Four companies are competing for a project to create new road corridors to support the rapidly expanding economy of the Kingdom, according to the Tender Board.

The bidding companies include Almoayed Contracting, Haji Hassan Group, Alghanim International General Trading and Contracting Co. Bahrain, and Nass Contracting.

Currently, the tender board is in the process of evaluating the technical bids submitted by these companies.

The proposed project 'Busaiten Link package 3', funded

by Saudi Fund, focuses on constructing roads for Muharrag ring road Phase 2, stretching from junction 1 to junction 4.

The project entails the construction of an 8.3km dual 4-lane main highway, along with 2.4km of associated dual carriageway.

Additionally, the works include the establishment of three storm surface water lifting stations and adjustments to the airport runway approach lights, along with all the necessary associated tasks.

The Ministry of Works is offering a 64-week contract duration for this project.

Edamah awards Reef Mall renovation contract to Dheya Tawfiqi

Bahrain Real Estate Investment (Edamah) has recently announced the awarding of a contract for post-consultancy services (supervision) for the renovation works of Reef Mall in Malkiya.

The contract has been granted to Dheya Tawfiqi Engineering Consultancy Bureau, selected from a pool of eight

bidders.

Valued at BD89,720,000, the contract entails a comprehensive refurbishment of the mall, including the revamping of MEP (Mechanical, Electrical, and Plumbing) systems and civil works.

Edamah said it aims to transform Reef Mall into a modern and appealing destination for visitors.

OpenAI chief seeks to calm fears on job losses

The boss of OpenAI, the firm behind the massively popular ChatGPT bot, said yesterday that his firm's technology would not destroy the job market as he sought to calm fears about the march of artificial intelligence (AI).

Sam Altman, on a global tour to charm national leaders and powerbrokers, said in Paris that AI would not -- as some have warned -- wipe out whole sectors of the workforce through automation.

"This idea that AI is going to progress to a point where humans don't have any work to do or don't have any purpose has never resonated with me," he said.

Asked about the media industry, where several outlets already use AI to generate stories, Altman said ChatGPT should instead be like giving a journalist 100 assistants to help them research and come up with ideas.

ChatGPT burst into the spotlight late last year, demonstrating an ability to generate essays, poems and conversations from the briefest of prompts.

Microsoft later laid out billions of dollars to support Ope-

nAI and now uses the firm's technology in several of its products -- sparking a race with Google, which has made a slew of similar announcements.

Altman, a 38-year-old emerging star of Silicon Valley, has received rapturous welcomes from leaders everywhere from Lagos to London.

Though earlier this week, he seemed to annoy the European Union by hinting that his firm could leave the bloc if they regulate too severely.

He insisted to a group of journalists on the sidelines of the Paris event that the headlines were not fair and he had

no intention of leaving the bloc -- rather, OpenAI was likely to open an office in Europe in the future.

'Exhausting'

The success of ChatGPT -- which has been used by politicians to write speeches and proved itself capable of passing tough exams -- has thrust Altman into a global spotlight.

"Years from now, reflecting on this will feel very special... but it is also quite exhausting and I hope life calms down," he said.

OpenAI was formed in 2015 with investors including Altman and billionaire Twitter owner

Elon Musk, who left the firm in 2018 and has repeatedly bashed it in recent months.

Musk, who has his own AI ambitions, said he came up with the name OpenAI, invested \$100 million in it, was betrayed when the company turned itself from non-profit to profit-making in 2018, and has said Microsoft now effectively runs the company.

"I disagree with almost all of that, but I will try to avoid a food fight here," said Altman. "There's got to be more important things than whatever he's going on about."

Instead, he wanted to focus on the mission of OpenAI, which he said was to "maximise the benefits" to society of AI and particularly Artificial General Intelligence (AGI) -- the much-vaunted future where machines will master all sorts of tasks, not just one.

He conceded that definitions of AGI were "fuzzy" and there was no agreement, but said his definition was when machines could make major scientific breakthroughs.

"For me, if you can go figure out the fundamental theory of physics and answer it all, I'll call you AGI," he said.

A major criticism of his products is that the firm does not publish the sources it uses to train its models.

As well as copyright issues, critics argue that users should know who is responsible for answering their questions, and if those replies used material from offensive or racist webpages.

From this humble beginning, his entrepreneurial prowess led to the rapid expansion of his business empire across the Middle East, Africa, and India. Today, his visionary leadership has resulted in a vast network of over 2,200 stores spanning across 24 countries.

The Dubai-headquartered group now operates brands including Babyshop, Centrepoint, Home Centre, Lifestyle, Splash, Shoemart and Emax.

In 1999, Landmark Group made its entry into the Indian market, marking a significant expansion of its operations. Since then, the group has successfully established a diverse range of retail formats in India.

Reportedly, his remarkable success has amassed him a net worth of \$5.2 billion.

The group is also well known for its unwavering social commitment. Landmark had promptly addressed the situation when Donald Trump made offensive remarks about Muslims, which sparked substantial criticism in the region. In response, the group took a decisive step by announcing the suspension of sales for the Trump Home Decor range.

The passing of Jagtiani has been met with deep condolences. Sheikh Hamdan expressed his sorrow and acknowledged Jagtiani's contributions to the UAE's economy and society.

IMF slightly lifts US 2023 growth forecast

The International Monetary Fund slightly raised its forecast for 2023 US economic growth yesterday, while noting that a slowing economy will likely lead to a small increase in unemployment next year.

Real GDP growth in the United States is expected to rise by 1.7 percent this year, up from 1.6 percent forecast earlier this year, before slowing to 1.0 percent in 2024, the IMF said in a statement.

BA cancels dozens of Heathrow flights

London, United Kingdom

London's Heathrow airport was hit by disruptions yesterday as UK's flag carrier airline British Airways cancelled dozens of flights over the course of two days following a technical issue.

The cancellations come ahead of a long weekend with a public holiday on Monday and half-term school holiday.

Musk's Neuralink says cleared for human test of brain implants

San Francisco

Elon Musk's start-up Neuralink on Thursday said it has gotten approval from US regulators to test its brain implants in people.

Neuralink said clearance from the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for its first in-human clinical study is "an important first step" for its technology, which is intended to let brains interface directly with computers.

"We are excited to share that we have received the FDA's approval to launch our first-in-human clinical study," Neuralink said in a post on Musk-run Twitter.

"This is the result of incredible work by the Neuralink team in close collaboration with the FDA."

Recruitment for a clinical trial is not yet open, according to Neuralink.

The aim of Neuralink implants is to enable human brains to communicate directly with computers, Musk said during a presentation by the start-up in December.

"We've been working hard to be ready for our first human (implant), and obviously we want to be extremely careful and certain that it will work

well before putting a device in a human," he said at the time.

Musk -- who bought Twitter late last year and also owns SpaceX, Tesla and several other companies -- has been known to make ambitious predictions about his companies, with several such forecasts ultimately failing to pan out.

In July 2019, he vowed that Neuralink would be able to perform its first tests on humans in 2020.

Product prototypes, which are the size of a coin, have been implanted in the skulls of monkeys, demonstrations by the startup showed.

At the Neuralink presentation, the company showed several monkeys "playing" basic

video games or moving a cursor on a screen through their Neuralink implant.

Musk said the company would try to use the implants to restore vision and mobility in humans who had lost such abilities.

"We would initially enable someone who has almost no ability to operate their muscles... and enable them to operate their phone faster than someone who has working hands," he said.

"As miraculous as it may sound, we are confident that it is possible to restore full body functionality to someone who has a severed spinal cord," he said.

Washington inches closer to debt deal

Washington

Democrats and Republicans inched towards a deal yesterday, ahead of a long weekend, to extend the US debt ceiling and avoid a crippling default that could hit the world's biggest economy within days.

As the Treasury's estimated deadline of next Thursday for the government running out of money loomed, there were glimmers of optimism in Washington that the two sides will finally compromise.

According to unconfirmed US media reports, this would include agreement to cover the \$31 trillion -- and growing -- US debt for two years, meaning no

repeat of the current drama before the 2024 presidential election.

Democrats would offer concessions on demands for sweeping spending limits on social safety and other domestic programs passed in the Republican "Limit, Save, Grow Act" in April, but dismissed by leaders in the Democratic-majority Senate as "extreme."

According to the Treasury, next Thursday is when the government coffers could run dry -- leaving some domestic bills, and international creditors, unpaid. On Thursday, Biden had also tried to reassure the country, saying: "There will be no default."

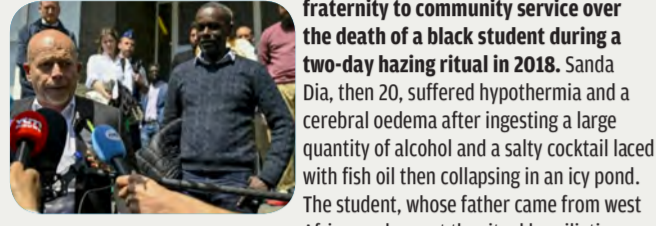

A passenger opened an emergency exit on an Asiana Airlines flight as it was preparing to land yesterday, the carrier said, adding that the plane landed safely but several people were hospitalised.

The plane was carrying nearly 200 passengers as it approached the runway at Daegu International Airport in South Korea, about 240 kilometres (149 miles) south-east of Seoul, on a domestic flight.



The unexpected opening of the door caused some passengers to have breathing difficulties, and some people were taken to a hospital after the landing, Asiana said, adding that there were no major injuries or damage

"I thought the plane was blowing up. I thought I was going to die like this." A transport ministry official on the aviation safety team told AFP that this was "the first such incident" they were aware of in Korean aviation history.

Protecting India's tigers also good for climate: study

India's efforts to protect its endangered tigers have inadvertently helped avoid a large amount of climate change-causing carbon emissions, a study said on Thursday.

Since the beginning of 2023, more than 7,600 sea lions, 1,186 Humboldt penguins -- an endangered species that breeds only in Chile and Peru -- and several otters, porpoises and dolphins have been found dead along the coast, the Sernapesca service said in a statement.

The disease was present in 12 of Chile's 16 regions, it added, and announced the activation of "surveillance protocols" along the coast, including burying affected animals in a bid to prevent further virus spread.

Boston poured in 16 three-pointers in a dominant 110-97 victory over the Miami Heat on Thursday that kept the Celtics alive in the NBA championship chase.

For the second straight game, the Celtics fended off elimination, cutting the deficit in the best-of-seven Eastern Conference finals to 3-2 with the wire-to-wire triumph.

Miami will get another chance to close it out when they host game six on Saturday. The Celtics will be trying to take one more step toward becoming the first NBA team to rally from a 3-0 deficit to win a best-of-seven playoff series.

"The only thing that can stop us is us," Celtics forward Jaylen Brown said in an on-court interview.

Before a rapturous, raucous crowd at TD Garden in Boston, the Celtics looked every inch the favourites they were before the series started -- before the upstart eighth-seeded Heat grabbed the first two games in Boston, then embarrassed the second seeds in game three.

Four Celtics starters scored more than 20 points, with Derrick White leading the way with 24 on a night when he made six of eight attempts from three-point range.

"Got some good looks and was able to knock them down, and just kind of rolled with it," said White, who said the Heat's defensive focus on Brown and fellow star wing Jayson Tatum gave him more room to operate.

Marcus Smart added 23 and had five steals while Brown and Tatum scored 21 apiece.

More importantly, the energetic Celtics harried the Heat into 16 turnovers that led to 27 Boston points.

Verstappen back on top in Monaco but demands more from Red Bull

Max Verstappen leads Charles Leclerc while Carlos Sainz crashes during ultra-close second practice

Max Verstappen resumed normal service yesterday when he topped the times for Red Bull and then demanded more performance from his team ahead of Saturday's crucial qualifying session at the Monaco Grand Prix.

The defending double world champion struggled with his car in the opening practice, as he complained of "bottoming out" on his way to sixth, but he bounced back in the afternoon to go fastest ahead of Charles Leclerc's Ferrari.

"The second practice was much better," said Verstappen, who leads team-mate Sergio Perez by 14 points in this year's title race. "The car felt much more competitive."

"Compared to Ferrari, we are still a bit short in terms of how the car behaves on the kerbs and over the bumps and that's something we have to work on for tomorrow because they are very close."

"The Aston Martins are also close and we need something

more to stay ahead. The car is better so then you can push more and go closer to the guardrails."

Verstappen was quickest in a best lap of one minute 12.462 seconds, 0.065 clear of the Monegasque local hero who is bidding for a third successive 'home' pole position.

Carlos Sainz, who was fastest in the first session, was third in the second Ferrari, despite a late crash into the barriers in the Swimming Pool complex, ahead of Aston Martin's two-time champion Fernando Alonso, Lando Norris of McLaren and seven-time champion Lewis

Hamilton of Mercedes.

Last year's winner Sergio Perez was seventh in the second Red Bull ahead of a resurgent Valtteri Bottas of Alfa Romeo and the two Alpines of French duo Pierre Gasly and Esteban Ocon.

The session was run in near-perfect conditions, a warm afternoon sun touching 27 degrees as it shone from a wide blue sky over the Mediterranean principality. The track temperature was 45 degrees.

with his day's action.

He was soon outpaced by team-mate George Russell in 1:15.482 before, in a flurry of

pace, Alonso, Verstappen and Hamilton took top spot.

Verstappen improved again in 1:13.857 to set the pace while the two Ferraris narrowly avoided a collision in the 'Swimming Pool complex' before the Dutchman trimmed his time down to 1:13.312.

After 24 minutes, Alonso swapped his mediums for a set of softs and the serious stuff began with him blasting to a best time of 1:12.786, an improvement of nine-tenths on his previous fastest lap.

Fellow-Spaniard Sainz also switched to softs and delivered a lap in 1:12.569 to go top again.

With 20 minutes remaining, Verstappen and Leclerc, who had fine-tuned their cars after first practice, surged clear of the field, the Red Bull fastest in 1:12.462, shortly before Sainz crashed as he came out of the Swimming Pool complex.

The session was red-flagged as Sainz climbed out of his Ferrari, having hit the unforgiving barriers with his right front section.

On resumption, Alex Albon, who had crashed in the first session, re-joined the fray in his repaired Williams as the shadows began to stretch across the circuit.

Premier League title tilt only getting harder for Arsenal, says Arteta

Klopp, whose team are guaranteed to finish fifth, told his pre-match press conference yesterday he had expected United and Newcastle to get the points they needed this week after Liverpool's 1-1 draw against Aston Villa.
