Formula 1 and the Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) confirmed that Malaysia will host the Formula 1 Gulf Air Bahrain Grand Prix at the iconic Sepang International Circuit from October 2 to 4, 2026, under a unique agreement between Bahrain and Malaysia.

The race, subject to final agreements and approval by the FIA World Motor Sport Council, will take place between the Azerbaijan and Singapore Grands Prix on the 2026 Formula 1 calendar. The remainder of

the championship schedule will remain unchanged.

Formula 1, the FIA, and the governments of Bahrain and Malaysia reached the agreement to ensure the Bahrain Grand Prix remains on the 2026 calendar despite regional challenges.

His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince and Prime Minister, said the initiative was made possible with the blessings of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim of Malaysia, reflecting the close ties between the two countries.

"This will be a wonderful

experience for fans around the world and reflects Bahrain's enduring commitment to, and passion for, the sport," HRH Prince Salman said, adding that Bahrain would continue to support the success of Formula 1 despite ongoing regional challenges.

Malaysian Prime Minister Dato' Seri Anwar Ibrahim welcomed the collaboration, describing it as a symbol of the enduring friendship and mutual trust between the two nations. He said Malaysia was ready to welcome Formula 1, the FIA, teams and fans back to Sepang and showcase the country's world-class facilities and hospitality.

FIA President Mohammed Ben Sulayem praised the cooperation

between all parties, saying the return of Formula 1 to Sepang highlights the strength of international collaboration and Malaysia's important place in the sport's history.

Formula 1 President and CEO Stefano Domenicali said the decision demonstrates the sport's ability to adapt and deliver solutions while ensuring fans continue to enjoy a full championship calendar.

Sepang International Circuit last hosted a Formula 1 race in 2017 and is widely regarded as one of the championship's most challenging and popular venues. Ticket details for the 2026 Bahrain Grand Prix in Malaysia will be announced at a later date.

HM King Hamad, Herzog Discuss Regional Issues

Trump Gives Iran Talks 'Little Bit of Room,' US Envoy Says

Strikes paused as Washington and Tehran signal a fragile truce

US President Donald Trump halted military strikes against Iran to create room for diplomatic talks, US Ambassador to the United Nations Mike Waltz said Sunday, as Washington and Tehran signaled a temporary halt in hostilities.

Speaking to Fox News, Waltz said Trump was "giving talks some space" and "a little bit of room," though he offered no further details on ongoing diplomatic contacts.

His remarks followed a week-end lull in fighting. The Pentagon

tagon suspended its bombing campaign after 13 straight nights



of strikes, and no new Iranian attacks on neighboring countries were reported over the weekend.

A senior Trump administration official said Saturday that despite recent escalation, the president still favors a diplomatic solution, noting Trump "has

shown Iran what will happen if they fail to come to the table."

A senior Iranian source told Reuters Tehran would maintain the pause if Washington halts attacks first, calling the policy "attack for attack." However, the source said Iranian officials remain deeply skeptical, viewing the pause as "tactical rather than genuine."

The near two-week escalation had raised fears of wider regional conflict, disrupting shipping and air travel across the Middle East. Diplomatic channels remain open, though mistrust runs deep on both sides.

Price Check Platform to Track 30 Basic Foods

New online tool will allow shoppers to compare daily prices across Bahrain stores

Food shops will have nowhere to hide their prices under a new government website that will let families compare the cost of 30 basic goods each morning.

The Industry and Commerce Ministry plans to publish prices from supermarkets, hypermarkets and other stores across Bahrain, allowing shoppers to see which outlet sells each item for less.

The first batch will be chosen from basic foods charged at a zero rate of value added tax.

Stores covered by the scheme will have to register, enter their prices and renew them every morning. Shoppers can then search for an item and check its cost at several outlets in seconds.

The move is meant to spare families from visiting shops or scouring separate offers before deciding where to buy.

It will also expose sharp price gaps, old listings and unexplained rises, while putting pressure on sellers to keep costs in check.

Ministry staff will use the figures to track changes in food prices, watch for gaps between shops and ensure sellers publish clear and up-to-date figures.

The scheme comes as the ministry makes greater use of online tools to help households spend less and monitor the supply and cost of basic food.

Folk Shows, Catering Get Digital Licence Access

Meanwhile, Traditional catering and Bahraini folk performances can now operate without a shop or office under an expansion of the kingdom's virtual business registration system.

This addition brings the number of activities allowed through virtual commercial premises to 73, letting eligible operators offer Bahraini hospitality services, local food for events and traditional live shows without leasing commercial space.

The businesses will be able to operate through the Sijili virtual registration system, subject to its licensing rules.

Don't Let AC Drain Cash

Simple changes can slash cooling costs without sacrificing comfort

Air conditioning swallows around 60 per cent of household electricity consumption in Bahrain, according to the Electricity and Water Authority, which says simply choosing a higher-rated unit can cut that figure by about 20 per cent.

EWA said the key figure to look for when buying is the Energy Efficiency Ratio, or EER, which indicates how efficiently a unit converts electricity into cooling. The higher the number, the lower the consumption over the life of the machine.

The authority has been reminding households of the link between cooling and bills as summer temperatures peak, a period when Bahrain's electricity demand runs at its highest of the year.

Retailers and maintenance specialists say the fastest savings come from settings rather than spending. Keeping the thermostat between 23 and 25 degrees Celsius gives a workable balance between comfort and consumption, since the smaller the gap between indoor and outdoor temperature, the less strain is placed on the compressor. Setting a unit to 16 or 18 degrees does not cool a room any faster, as the machine works at the same capacity ei-

ther way, it simply runs for longer and sometimes never reaches the target at all.

That also settles the argument over whether to switch the unit off between uses. Leaving an air conditioner running continuously at a moderate temperature, such as 24 or 25 degrees, uses less energy than repeatedly turning it off and on, because each restart demands significant power and effort from the compressor to cool the room from scratch.

Filters are the other common culprit. Dust builds up and restricts airflow, forcing the unit to work harder for less cooling, so washing filters every fortnight and letting them dry fully before refitting makes a measurable difference. Specialists recommend replacing air filters roughly every six months, a step they say can reduce consumption by between five and 15 per cent, alongside regular servicing of both the indoor unit and the outdoor condenser, which expels heat and loses efficiency when clogged with dust or debris.

Households with older machines may find the biggest saving comes from replacing them altogether. Inverter units run at higher efficiency and consume noticeably less over time, while a unit poorly matched to the size of a room—whether too small or too large—will either run for hours or cycle on and off repeatedly, wearing out the compressor in the process.

Plant Within Your Property

Municipality issues rules on planting near house fronts to protect pavements

Residents planting in front of their homes must keep every tree, shrub, planter and bed inside their own property boundary, Muharraq Municipality has said, warning that spilling onto pavements or public roads breaches the law governing the occupation of public roads.

The municipality said planting in front of homes helps improve the appearance of residential areas and enhances the quality of the environment, but that it must be carried out in line with regulatory requirements that safeguard road users, protect public facilities and prevent the unlawful occupation of public roads.

Under the rules set out by the municipality, planting must remain within the boundaries of the property and must not occupy pavements or public roads, obstruct pedestrian movement, or block sightlines at vehicle entrances and exits. Trees and plants must be pruned regularly, must not damage pavements, public facilities or

infrastructure networks, and must not obscure guidance boards or traffic signs.

The municipality also urged residents to keep pedestrian walkways clear, safe and easy to use at all times, and to avoid any damage that might result from planting work or tree roots.

“The front of your home reflects your taste, and planting it responsibly reflects your awareness,” the municipality said in its message to residents, urging them to plant responsibly and preserve the public road.



Violations involving the occupation of public roads are punishable under Legislative Decree No. (2) of 1996, its implementing regulations, and relevant municipal by-laws.

Two Face Trial Over Expired Cleaning Products

Store worker and supplier employee accused of erasing expiry dates from household items

Two Asian nationals, currently in custody, have been referred to the Criminal Court after removing expiry dates from cleaning products in an attempt to return them to supermarket shelves.

According to the Public Prosecution, the case came to light after a major supermarket reported that one of its employees had conspired with an employee of a supplying company to erase expiry dates from cleaning product containers.

CCTV footage reportedly captured the incident, while investigators seized several tampered products, additional expired items, and the tool allegedly used to remove the dates.

During questioning, both defendants admitted the allegations. The supermarket employee said he erased the expiry dates to avoid salary deductions linked to expired stock, while the supplier’s employee admitted assisting him to avoid disciplinary action.

A forensic expert confirmed that the expiry information had been deliberately scraped off, making the original dates impossible to recover.

Prosecutors have ordered both men to stand trial while remaining in custody, stressing that commercial fraud and product tampering pose a serious threat to consumer safety and will be prosecuted.

Businessman Tried Over Court Notice Fraud

Prosecutors say false contact details prevented defendants from receiving legal notices

The First High Criminal Court has opened the trial of a businessman and a retired man accused of falsifying electronic court records by entering incorrect contact details for 12 defendants, allegedly preventing them from receiving court notices.

Prosecutors allege the 53-year-old businessman entered false phone numbers and addresses into the Ministry of Justice’s electronic systems between 2021 and 2024, while the second defendant allegedly assisted in the scheme.

Authorities claim the businessman used the retired man’s phone number and an address under his control in multiple civil cases, causing court notifications to be sent to the wrong

recipient and preventing several defendants from learning about the lawsuits.

Officials from the Ministry of Justice testified that records showed the same phone number and address had been used for 12 different individuals, with all entries made using the businessman’s electronic credentials.

Investigators also found that the address was linked to companies owned by the businessman, while forensic analysis of the second defendant’s phone uncovered numerous court notifications intended for different defendants.

Several alleged victims told investigators the listed contact details did not belong to them. The trial is continuing before the First High Criminal Court.

MPs approve plan for nursing college at Bahrain Polytechnic

Parliament’s services committee approved a proposal to establish a college of nursing and midwifery within Bahrain Polytechnic. This aims to increase the number of qualified Bahraini staff in the health sector and reduce reliance on foreign labour.

The proposal, submitted by MP Jaleela Al Sayed alongside four other members, calls for a specialised college offering academic and applied programmes in nursing, midwifery and community care, helping meet rising demand for Bahraini talent in healthcare.

The committee said the proposal comes against a shortage of qualified national staff compared with growing needs, compounded by the absence of an independent nursing college able to develop its

own programmes and curricula in step with changes in healthcare and the demands of the labour market.

The Bahrain Nursing and Midwifery Society backed expanding capacity in existing nursing programmes, calling for new or expanded higher diploma, mas-

ter’s and doctoral programmes to prepare specialists for the sector. The society said the need extends well beyond general nursing into intensive care, emergency, dialysis, community health, midwifery, paediatric and neonatal nursing, oncology, mental health, and nursing management and education.

Some of those programmes already exist, the society noted, but the number of places allocated

to them does not match demand. It stressed that any increase in graduate numbers must be tied to actual job openings in the health sector.

The proposal drew on local and international reports pointing to rising demand for nursing staff. Tamkeen’s 2024 healthcare sector skills report listed nursing among the essential occupations required in Bahrain. A Gulf study cited in the proposal put average nursing density across GCC states at 6.5 nurses per 1,000 people, with shortages persisting in several specialisms, chiefly intensive care and emergency.

The society sounded a note of caution, however, warning that increasing student places without expanding clinical training opportunities could put additional pressure on hospitals, particularly emergency and intensive care departments.

Bahrain Bond Draws BD568m in Bids

Strong investor demand pushes two-year development bond coverage to 284pc

Investors poured BD568 million into Bahrain’s latest government bond as the kingdom offered its highest development bond yield of the year.

The BD200 million, two-year issue carried a 7pc annual return and was covered 284pc, the strongest take-up for a development bond since January. Only Sukuk Al-Salam drew greater demand, reaching 300 pc.

The rush came even as Gulf borrowing costs rose to their highest level in four years. The average sovereign risk premium on GCC bonds climbed to 402 basis points above US Treasury yields, according to JP Morgan.

Bahrain has paid more to raise funds as that gap has widened.

The yield on two-year development bonds rose from 5.50 pc in issue 43 to 5.625 pc in issue 44, then jumped to 7pc in issue 47. That was an increase of 1.5 percentage points, or 27 pc, from the start of the year.

Demand, however, moved unevenly. Coverage fell from 172 pc in issue 43 to 114 pc in issue 44. It then rose to 210 pc for the three-year issue 45, which paid 6.25 pc, before surging to 284 pc for issue 47.

The same rise in yields was seen across other state debt.

Returns on Ijara and Murabaha Sukuk climbed from 4.68 pc to 5.52 pc, while Sukuk Al-Salam yields rose from 4.84 pc



to 5.22 pc.

The yield on 91-day Treasury bills increased from 4.82 pc in the first sale of the year to 5.20 pc in July. One-year Treasury bill yields rose from 4.68 pc to 5.52 pc.

Across all state debt tools, yields rose by an average of about 0.8 percentage points, or close to 16 pc.

Yet higher costs did little to sap demand.

During the first seven months of the year, bids for development bonds reached about 209 pc of the sums offered. Sukuk Al-Salam were covered 213 pc, while Ijara and Murabaha Sukuk reached 192 pc. Treasury bills trailed at 131pc.

The split was clearest among debt carrying almost the same yield and term.

In July, 91-day Sukuk Al-Salam

paid 5.22 pc, against 5.20 pc for Treasury bills of the same length. The Sukuk were covered 300 pc, compared with 178 pc for the bills.

One-year Ijara and Murabaha Sukuk, paying 5.52 pc, drew bids equal to 180 pc of the sum on sale. One-year Treasury bills at almost the same rate managed coverage of just 101 pc.

The gap points to stronger demand for Sharia-compliant state debt among both retail and institutional investors, even when the yield and maturity are almost identical.



Geopolitical Tensions Keep Oil Market on Edge

Brent crude has retreated below the US\$100 per barrel mark after briefly surging past the psychological threshold, though prices remain elevated amid escalating Middle East tensions. Concerns over potential disruptions to shipping through the Strait of Hormuz and the Red Sea continue to support the market,

while profit-taking and fears of weaker global fuel demand have limited further gains. Analysts warn that any escalation threatening key energy transit routes could push prices higher again. Despite the recent pullback, oil remains on track for a strong weekly gain as geopolitical risks continue to dominate market sentiment.



Modi to reform exam system, as education minister resigns

India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced Sunday a special task force to reform the country's exam system, a day after his administration's education minister resigned.

Modi said in a video posted to X his administration "decided to set up a high-powered task force" led by Nandan Nilekani -- the co-founder of In-

dia's IT giant Infosys -- "which will focus on examination reform".

"Our examination system must be reliable. Our examination system must be transparent. Our examination system must make maximum use of technology," Modi added in the video statement.

Modi said the government "will work to ensure the credibility of upcoming examinations as quickly as possible."

Strong winds and rain lash China after Typhoon Noul makes landfall

Typhoon Noul lashed a stretch of southern China with strong winds and rain yesterday, prompting emergency relief in the fiercest storm to hit the country this year, state media reported.

Prior to the storm's early-morning landfall, severe weather forecasts had spurred authorities to evacuate more than 340,000 people and suspend work and rail services, with major flight disruptions continuing throughout Sunday morning.

The centre of the typhoon crossed over land at around 3:50 am (1950 GMT) near the town of Pinghai, Guangdong Province -- about 80 kilometres northeast of financial hub Hong Kong -- state broad-

caster CCTV reported.

Maximum sustained winds near the eye of the storm at the time of landfall were 162 kilometres (101 miles) an hour, the report said.

That made Noul the strongest typhoon to strike the country so far in 2026, CCTV added.

Before gaining intensity on Saturday over the South China Sea, Noul had already left a path of damage, clipping the extreme northern islands of the Philippines.

Three people were killed and one was missing due to the typhoon, the Philippine government's disaster agency said Sunday. More than 9,300 people had been evacuated and 235 houses had suffered damage, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council added.

London's Gatwick Airport suffers water outage

London's Gatwick Airport said Sunday it was suffering from "a water supply issue", with toilets reported to be out of order and restaurants closed at Britain's second busiest air hub.

The issue impacting both terminals at the airport south of the capital -- served by several no-frills carriers including EasyJet -- comes during the busy summer holiday period.

Flights were not reported to be affected, but passengers posted online that they were unable to flush toilets, get hot drinks, wash their hands or fill up water bottles.

"A water issue in the Horley area is causing disruption at the airport this morning," Gatwick Airport said on X.

"The problem is affecting water supply in both terminals



and is currently under investigation."

It added bottled water was being handed out to passengers and staff and "other contingency measures are being put in place to ensure the welfare of our passengers".

Otunnu stood as the presidential candidate for the opposition Uganda People's Congress in the 2011 election, losing to longtime leader Yoweri Museveni, in office

since 1986.

Chile's Michelle Bachelet, Ecuador's Maria Fernanda Espinosa, Rafael Grossi of Argentina, Costa Rican Rebeca Grynspan, Guyana's Carolyn Rodrigues-Birkett and Senegal's Macky Sall are all in the running to succeed outgoing Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, who leaves office on December 31.

France and Spain battle 'unpredictable' wildfires

Over 300,000 evacuated

France fought an "unpredictable" wildfire close to Bordeaux yesterday while Spain warned of "difficult hours" in its own fiery battle, with evacuations from danger zones in both countries mounting to well over 300,000 people.

The forest infernos, raging for days unchecked in France's southwest and in central Spain near Madrid, were among the worst each nation has seen in peacetime.

France's major fire remained unchecked and volatile -- driven by gusts that in some cases were generated by the turbulent blazes themselves.

Spanish officials, however, voiced optimism they were starting to get a grip on some fires -- though on the weekend they were confronted with a new fire front, near the eastern coastal city of Valencia, which forced 15,000 people to flee.

"Difficult hours lie ahead

admittedly," Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez said as he visited the fire zone in Avila province west of Madrid, though he pointed to some "positive" indications towards containment.

Other EU countries have been sending help to Spain and France in the form of aircraft, fire crews and vehicles.

Scientists say that such weather emergencies are being made more extreme and frequent by climate change.

The disasters, coming at the peak of the summer vacation period when tourists flock to both countries, were fuelled by woodlands parched to tinder by successive heatwaves and lack of rain since May.

"When we flew into Madrid we could see the fire very close to the airport," said Pilar, a 69-year-old New Zealand tourist. She said she was carrying a mask in case the smoke situation in the city became worse.

Letisha Lucas, a 33-year-old tourist from Canada -- which has its own wildfires happening -- said the smoke smell was immediately obvious on arrival in Madrid "and very irritating on the throat". She added that the proximity of the blaze left her "kind of nervous".

France's Interior Minister Laurent Nunez warned "the situation remains very unfavourable" for fires across the country, where 250,000 people had been evacuated.

The main fire in the southwest Gironde region, where Bordeaux is located, was "extremely intense and unpredictable... generating its own winds and advancing erratically toward the Bordeaux metropolitan area", he said on X.

Though the fire was 15 kilometres (nine miles) from Bordeaux's suburbs, it "is largely to the south. It is not advancing on the western side," said the mayor, Thomas Cazenave, adding that local officials remained "vigilant".

Some 2,500 firefighters, including a Swiss firefighting team, 1,500 military personnel and around 1,200 police have been deployed to the Gironde region.

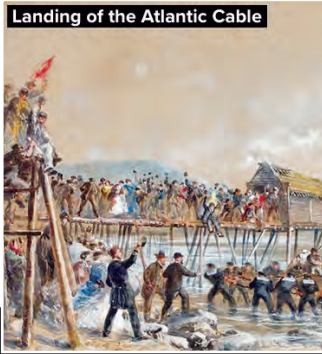

Trump faces midterm reckoning with 100 days to US vote

One hundred days before the US midterm elections, President Donald Trump's Republicans are staring down polling that points to the loss of the House of Representatives and a ferocious battle to retain the Senate.

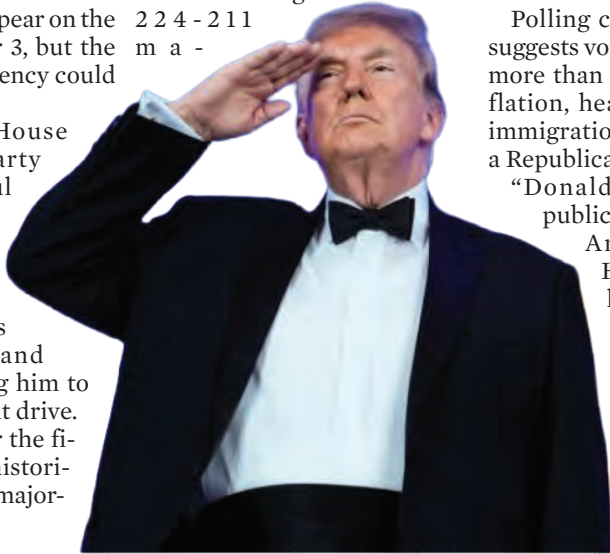
Trump will not appear on the ballot on November 3, but the stakes for his presidency could hardly be higher.

A Democratic House would give the party control of powerful committees and subpoena authority, likely subjecting Trump's administration to two years of investigations and potentially exposing him to a third impeachment drive.

Republicans enter the final stretch with a historically narrow House major-

ity, weak presidential approval ratings and an electorate increasingly unhappy about living costs and the grinding war with Iran.

US elections website Decision Desk HQ predicts that the Democratic Party has a 59-percent chance of winning the House, forecasting a 224-211 margin.

The president's party usually loses ground in midterm elections, and only a handful of seats need to change hands.

Gasoline prices have climbed above \$4 a gallon as the Iran war disrupts energy markets, inflation remains elevated and interest rates are high.

Polling cited by Democrats suggests voters now trust them more than Republicans on inflation, health care and even immigration, long considered a Republican strength.

"Donald Trump and Republicans have failed the American people," House Democratic leader Hakeem Jeffries said Thursday, announcing an affordability campaign built around groceries, gasoline, housing and health care.

Hundreds flee by boat as wildfire hits southern Italy

Hundreds of people in Italy were evacuated by sea on Sunday as a wildfire swept through parts of the southern Adriatic coast, with many more expected to be rescued, the coastguard said.

"More than 400 tourists and beachgoers have been evacuated by sea,

the only viable evacuation route," the coastguard said on its WhatsApp channel, adding that operations were ongoing.

Evacuees were being rescued from the area around the town of Peschici in the southern Puglia region.

A coastguard spokesman told AFP that around 300 more people were expected to be evacuated.

Six coastguard vessels, three boats from Italy's financial police and around 10 private vessels were involved in the operation, the coastguard said.

Images showed firefighters and a Canadair waterbomber battling the blaze, which was not immediately threatening homes in the town.

A huge plume of smoke could be seen from dozens of kilometres away.

From Orbit to Office: Bahrain's Quiet Revolution

We often recognize major shifts when they unfold dramatically before our eyes. The launch of Bahrain's industrial satellite, or the arrival of advanced technologies in factories, are milestones impossible to miss. Yet another transformation is happening daily, quietly, within our offices—one that rarely commands headlines but is no less profound.

It is automation. But not as we once knew it.

For decades, automation was synonymous with factories, production lines, and heavy machinery—a technology confined to industrial environments. That image was never false, but it is now incomplete. Today, Bahrain's Al Munther satellite—the first designed, developed, and assembled entirely by Bahraini hands—circles the Earth. It carries cutting-edge imaging systems and onboard artificial intelligence, a symbol of the Kingdom's leap from adopting technologies to shaping them. This achievement reflects Bahrain's confident strides toward a future built on innovation, AI, and automation.

Yet what is striking is that this journey is no longer limited to national projects or industrial facilities. Automation has quietly migrated to a less noisy arena: the office. Walk into a marketing agency, accounting firm, or financial consultancy in Bahrain today, and you will witness this silent revolution. Reports that once consumed hours of manual effort are now generated in minutes. Spreadsheets once reviewed line by line are processed automatically, with fewer errors. Employees no longer spend evenings reconciling data; instead, they devote their time to analysis and decision-making, while smart systems handle the repetitive work.

What makes this shift remarkable is its subtlety. Most employees do not perceive themselves as "working with AI" in the grand sense discussed at conferences. To them, it is simply a better way to work—an escape from routine tasks. But viewed collectively, these small daily changes form part of a broader national pathway toward digital transformation.

The Kingdom's AI Readiness Assessment Methodology (RAM) report, published by the Information & eGovernment Authority (IGA) in partnership with UNESCO, underscores that successful AI adoption depends not only on technology but on readiness across legislation, governance, infrastructure, education, research, and human capacity. This integrated ecosystem enables institutions to deploy AI responsibly and sustainably, enhancing efficiency and service quality.

From this perspective, what we see in offices is not just new tools at work, but an extension of a national effort to raise institutional performance and harness modern technologies. The marketer preparing campaigns, the accountant reviewing transactions, the financial officer reconciling data—are all now participants in this transformation, even if they do not consciously recognize it.

Perhaps the most inspiring aspect of this shift is its accessibility. It does not begin with corporations alone, but often with a single employee noticing repetitive, error-prone tasks and seeking a smarter solution. They need not be an AI researcher or programmer; it is enough to believe that their time should be invested in higher-value work, not consumed by routine. That is the essence of true transformation.

Automation, once confined to factories and ports, now sits at the neighbouring desk. It thrives in small companies, marketing agencies, and accounting offices—places unlikely to make headlines, yet vital in making business faster, more accurate, and more efficient. The heroes of this phase may be marketers, accountants, or financial officers who never imagined AI as a partner in their daily work. Their contributions—refining a process, automating a task—are part of a national movement toward institutions more ready, and an economy better equipped for the future.

If the first chapter of automation was written in factories and national projects, the next is being drafted on office screens, by employees seeking to work smarter. The measure of this phase will not be the tools alone, but the ideas turned into solutions, and the employees who realize that AI is not a replacement for humans, but a tool that frees them to think, innovate, and create impact.

Kuwait Approves Defence Cooperation Pact with Pakistan

Agreement Strengthens Military Training, Intelligence and Security Collaboration



Kuwait has officially approved a defence cooperation agreement with Pakistan, establishing a formal framework to expand military and security collaboration between the two countries.

The approval came through a decree-law published in the latest edition of the official gazette, endorsing the agreement signed in Kuwait on June 11, 2023.

The agreement aims to strengthen bilateral defence relations by promoting cooperation in military training, education and armed forces coordination, in line with the laws and regulations of both countries as well as their international commitments.

The pact covers a wide range of areas, including military training and education, logistical support, exchanges of military personnel, technical experts and specialists, scientific and technological cooperation, military intelligence, and other defence-related fields that may be agreed upon in the future.

To implement the agreement, both countries will develop annual cooperation

plans through executive protocols and programmes. The framework also encourages greater collaboration through the exchange of official visits at different levels.

A joint military committee will be established to oversee and coordinate the agreement's implementation. The committee, chaired by representatives appointed by the defence ministers of Kuwait and Pakistan, will meet annually.

The agreement includes strict provisions to safeguard confidential information exchanged between the two sides. Classified documents, materials and information cannot be shared with any third party without the originating country's written consent, and confidentiality obligations will remain in effect even after the agreement expires.

Under the financial arrangements, the agreement is based on the principle of reciprocity. The host country will cover the costs of domestic official travel, accommodation and emergency medical treatment for visiting delegations during agreed official visits.

Iraq, Lebanon Hold High-Level Talks to Strengthen Bilateral Ties

Prime ministers discuss economic partnerships, regional security and development cooperation

Prime Minister Al-Zaidi reaffirmed the deep-rooted ties between Iraq and Lebanon,

Hashim Khalaifat chases Spanish football dream

Bahraini star opens up on European football adventure

● Recorded 3 goals, 2 assists last season

Since leaving Bahrain as a teenager, Hashim Luay Khalaifat has continued to carve out a path few Bahraini footballers have taken.

The 22-year-old midfielder is preparing for his fifth season with Córdoba CF B, having progressed through Bahrain's youth football system before taking his career abroad and chasing his ambitions in Spain.

Khalaifat first began playing at Arsenal Academy Bahrain at the age of four before continuing his development with Tekkerz Academy. At 13, he joined Al Najma, where his performances earned him opportunities with Bahrain's national teams, progressing through the youth ranks before eventually reaching the Under-23 Olympic team.

After making his mark at youth level, Hashim felt ready to test himself in a new environment.

At 18, Córdoba B offered him the chance to trial with the club. He impressed during his opportunity in Spain and secured a move that marked the beginning of a new chapter in his career.

"I was with the Under-20 national team at the time and felt that I was ready to take the next step and challenge myself by playing abroad," Khalaifat told The Daily Tribune.

"I saw the club's plans and that gave me the confidence to sign with them."

Spain Calling

The move to Spain brought challenges beyond football.

Living abroad for the first time, Hashim had to adapt to a different culture, learn a new language and build a life away from home in Córdoba.

"The biggest challenge for me was living abroad and being

alone in a different country for the first time, especially with a culture so different from ours," he said.

"Adjusting wasn't easy, and being in Córdoba, where not many people speak English, forced me to learn the language."

Higher Standards

Four years into his experience, Hashim believes the move has given him a greater understanding of the standards required to succeed in Spanish football.

"The level of technical ability each player has, regardless of their position on the pitch, and their overall understanding of football really stood out to me,"

he said.

"The basics are done at a higher level. Off the pitch, players pay close attention to their nutrition, recovery and overall preparation. Everyone has their own individual goals, and that dedication is clear."

Senior Ambition

Now part of Córdoba B, Khalaifat is focused on continuing his development and earning an opportunity with the club's senior squad.

"It's definitely a big goal," he said.

"Right now, I'm with Córdoba B, and my aim is to work my way into the first team. I'm extremely

determined because that is the level of football I want to experience one day."

While his club ambitions continue to drive him, Hashim also has his sights set on representing Bahrain at senior international level.

"I've had that dream ever since I was a child," he said.

"Whenever I attended Bahrain's games, I always told myself that I wanted to represent my country at the highest level. I feel ready for that opportunity now."

The opportunity to wear Bahrain's senior national team shirt would be a significant milestone for the midfielder.

"It would mean so much, not only to me, but also to everyone who believed in me and supported me throughout my journey."

Khalaifat also dreams of helping the Kingdom achieve greater success on the international stage, including reaching the FIFA World Cup for the first time.

Inspiring Others

As one of the few Bahraini players developing professionally in Spain, Hashim hopes his experience encourages more young footballers to pursue opportunities beyond their comfort zone.

"If you have the support of your family, I would say go for it without hesitation," he said.

"If it's your dream, why not chase it and embrace the opportunity if it comes?"

For now, Khalaifat remains focused on continuing his development, breaking into Córdoba's senior squad and pushing towards the highest levels of the game.

"I hope I can be an example to people and encourage them to push themselves, regardless of what others say or think about them," he said.

"Keep going no matter what, always move forward and work towards what you want. I want to give people that mentality, not only in football but in life."

Bahrain's junior men's handball national team will be aiming to finish their continental campaign on a high when they take on Saudi Arabia in the bronze medal match of the 19th Asian Men's Junior Handball Championship today in Chuzhou, China.

Saudi Arabia also suffered heartbreak in the other semi-final after falling 31-30 to the UAE in another closely fought contest.

Elsewhere today, Chinese Taipei will take on Kuwait in the fifth-place play-off, while Iran face hosts China in the

match for seventh place.

Coached by veteran Bahraini tactician Hussam Madan, Bahrain will now be hoping to end the tournament with another podium finish and continue their strong recent record at the continental championship.

The top three sides will qualify for the FIBA U18 Asia Cup in Ahmedabad, India, from August 13 to 23. Bahrain face Oman on Monday before meeting hosts Qatar in their last game on Thursday.

Messi-less Miami win on Casemiro debut, Berterame suffers head blow

"His family has been informed of everything. We didn't know what to do -- it was a very desperate situation." Suarez converted the ensuing penalty and held up Berterame's jersey to mark the goal. The Uruguayan former Liverpool and Barcelona forward extended his scoring streak to six goals in his last three matches, taking his total for the season to nine.

Joshua survives knockdowns, stops Prenga

Two-time heavyweight world champion Anthony Joshua survived two early knockdowns on the way to a second-round knockout of Kristian Prenga yesterday, his triumphant ring return paving the way for a blockbuster all-British bout with Tyson Fury. The fight at the Jeddah Superdome was Joshua's first since he was involved in a car crash in Nigeria in December that killed two of his close friends, Sina Ghami and Latif Ayodele. The 36-year-old choked up when asked in the ring about his friends and the emotions of the past seven months, but said his second-round revival was down to more than pure punching power. "That was spirit, that was Latz, that was Sina. That was family," he said. The devastating accident occurred little more than a week after Joshua demolished YouTuber-turned-boxer Jake

Paul in a controversial Netflix-backed bout in December. Joshua's last prior competitive appearance in the ring was his fifth-round knockout loss to IBF world champion Daniel Dubois at Wembley Stadium in September 2024. He improved to 30-4, with 27 wins by knockout, but not without drama. Albania's Prenga, a knockout artist who had 20 wins inside the distance in 21 prior fights, sent Joshua to the canvas with a right uppercut just 20 seconds into the bout. He had Joshua on the ropes again, his legs shaky, before sending him down a second time late in the first round. But Joshua steadied in the second, backing Prenga into the corner behind his jab, shrugging off more heavy blows from the Albanian before inflicting damage of his own with his left hand. A brutal combination capped by a big right finally sent Prenga crashing through the ropes to end it at 2:43 of the second round.

Sooryavanshi's 81 steers India to Zimbabwe T20 series sweep

Fifteen-year-old hits second T20I half-century on tour

Teenage cricket sensation Vaibhav Sooryavanshi scored his second half century in four days for India, who beat Zimbabwe by 35 runs yesterday for a 3-0 Twenty20 international series sweep. India won the toss and posted 192-5 at Harare Sports Club, led by a quickfire 81 from Sooryavanshi. He faced 49 balls and his innings included four sixes and eight fours. Zimbabwe, 10 places below second-placed India in the world T20I rankings, reached 157-7 in reply thanks mainly to an unbeaten 54 from lower-order batter Ryan Burl. Victory marked an Indian turnaround after a 2-0 T20I series loss in Ireland, then a 4-0 drubbing in England. It was the second straight series loss for Zimbabwe after going down 2-1 to Bangladesh. At 15, Sooryavanshi is the youngest cricketer to represent India. He has sparked in southern Africa after debuting in the England series and amassing 42 runs over three innings. Sooryavanshi has had a memorable tour of Zimbabwe. He scored his maiden T20I half-century off just 18 balls in the first match and followed it up with 20 off nine deliveries

McLaren driver overcomes poor start to beat Verstappen by 15 seconds in Hungary

World champion Lando Norris claimed his first win of the season and 12th of his career with a resounding triumph for McLaren ahead of Red Bull's Max Verstappen in yesterday's helter-skelter Hungarian Grand Prix.

The 26-year-old Briton, who started from pole position but had to recover after a poor opening lap, came home 15 seconds clear of four-time world champion Verstappen with world championship leader Kimi Antonelli finishing third for Mercedes.

The Ferraris of Charles Leclerc and seven-time champion Lewis Hamilton ended up fourth and fifth ahead of Isack Hadjar in the second Red Bull, George Russell in the second Mercedes and Racing Bulls' Liam Lawson. Nico Huelkenberg scored his first points of the season in ninth place for Audi ahead of rookie Arvid Lindblad in the second Racing Bulls.

Norris repeated his success last season at the Hungaroring where McLaren have won for the last three years.

Antonelli's determined drive, in a frantic race of divergent tyre strategies, lifted him 50 points clear of Hamilton in the championship.

"Beautiful," said Norris on team radio. "The car was unbelievable today! Flying!"

"It's probably the best pace I've ever had," he said "This track is good for us."

Verstappen was critical of his car, but happy to claim another podium finish.

"I didn't expect it today - we had to work very hard for this," he said.

Antonelli said it had been a hard race.

"It was so tough to overtake, but it is the best result for me to go into the break and now we can keep pushing."

The race bescorching heat with the highest temperatures of the weekend - 31 Celsius (air) and 51 (track).

Ferrari gambling on soft tyres for the start while all the started on mediums.

Oscar Piastri made a fast start to pass Leclerc. When Norris went wide at Turn Two and Piastri took the lead while Hamilton passed Leclerc for fourth behind Verstappen.

When the Italian pitted, he returned in sixth.

Piastri led folowed by team-mate Norris. The Briton requested a stop but McLaren brought in Paistri first.

Gearbox problems

At halfway, Norris led Verstappen by five seconds.

The Briton then pitted from the lead on lap 40 and returned in third, ahead of Piastri, the Australian having narrowly avoided a heavy collision with Carlos Sainz's Williams at Turn

Two where

they clashed. Sainz was given a five-seconds penalty.

After Verstappen pitted again, Antonelli led with Norris in pursuit.

Norris, on fresher tyres, regained the lead on lap 46 with a dive inside the young Italian at Turn One and built his advantage before Antonelli stopped again.

Hopes of a McLaren 1-2 ended when Piastri slowed and retired with gearbox problems and a Virtual Safety Car (VSC) was deployed. Norris, Hamilton and Leclerc pitted for softs immediately.

In a final flurry, Norris led Verstappen with Antonelli third, fending off Hamilton - penalised five seconds for speeding in the pit lane.

Gomez injury mars start of Iraola era at Liverpool

Andoni Iraola said Joe Gomez's injury in Liverpool's friendly win against Sunderland was the "worst news" at the start of his reign.

Iraola was taking charge of his first match since arriving from Bournemouth in the close season to replace the sacked Arne Slot.

The Spaniard watched as goals from Kieran Morrison, Dominik Szoboszlai, Federico Chiesa and Lewis Koumas gave Liverpool a 4-2 victory on Saturday in the opener of their United States tour in Nashville.

But Gomez, who started the game as centre-back and captained Liverpool, was forced off in the eighth minute.

Gomez's premature exit added to Iraola's defensive issues, with new signing Jeremy Jacquet still being eased back after his own fitness problems

and Giovanni Leoni recovering following a long-term absence.

Iraola said earlier this week that his squad is "very thin" defensively.

"Probably the worst news has been straight away the injury of Joe," Iraola said.

"We were happy because we were kind of going through all the training without losing any player. Unluckily for us, straight away we've lost Joe.

"With Jeremy, we decided to take it easy with him. He has been a lot of months without playing with a shoulder injury.

"So, I think we are going to take it easy with him. He will play probably the last game of this US tour and he will have time to have minutes."

Despite the injury woes, Iraola hopes the win will give Liverpool a platform to improve when they meet Wrexham in New York and Leeds in Chicago.

"A lot of things to correct, obviously, it's the first day. You could feel the heavy legs, the players have been training," he said.

"So, we lacked some freshness. But it will give us a good starting point to improve things."

Virgil van Dijk has been given extra time off following the Netherlands' World Cup campaign.

But Iraola confirmed that Alexander Isak, Florian Wirtz and Ryan Gravenberch are in Chicago after their post-World Cup breaks and will soon rejoin the squad.

The 31-year-old Korpatsch beat her Hungarian opponent 6-3, 6-3, adding to the trophy she won in Romania three years ago.

Bondar, 29, suffered a second straight defeat in the Hamburg final after finishing runner-up to Lois Boisson in 2025, leaving her still in pursuit of a maiden WTA title.

Barbora Krejickova spoiled the party as she beat hometown favourite Maria Sakkari 7-6 (7/5), 6-3 in the final of the WTA hard-court tournament in Athens yesterday.
