The Bahrain Basketball Association confirmed his death in a statement, expressing its "deepest condolences and sympathy" to his family and praying for strength and patience for his loved

Hayki was regarded as one of Bahrain's most promising young players, having represented the kingdom at youth international level in several competitions. His sudden passing has left team-mates, officials and fans in shock, with tributes highlighting his talent, dedication and exemplary character.

enus Williams battled bravely before bowing out of the US Open on her return to Grand Slam tennis on Monday as Spanish ace Carlos Alcaraz stormed into the second round with a dominant opening win.

The second full day of action in New York saw all eyes turn to the Arthur Ashe Stadium's night session, where the 45-year-old Williams lost in three sets to 11th seed Karolina Muchova.

Williams only returned to competitive tennis in July following a 16-month absence from the sport and had been granted a wild card into the main draw at Flushing Meadows.

But hopes of a fairytale run -- 28 years after her debut in the tournament -- ended in a 6-3, 2-6, 6-1 loss to Muchova, who was not even born when Williams turned professional in 1994.

"I didn't win today but I'm very proud of the way I played," Williams, the US Open champion in 2000 and 2001, said.
