m our}$ Bahrainis died yesterday from coronavirus (COVID-19), along with 278 new cases, the Health Ministry reported.

The casualties were two men, aged 54 and 65, and two women, 36 and 64, bringing the death toll in the Kingdom to 316.

The Ministry offered condolences to the family of the deceased.


There were also 356 new recoveries, increasing total survivors to 77,132.

As of yesterday, 67 were receiving treatment at various facilities, of which 24 people were in a critical condition and 3,061 stable.

Six-kilogram cancerous ovarian tumour removed

team of doctors at the King Hamad University Hospital removed a cancerous tumour weighing six kilograms from the ovaries of a female patient.

Medics from the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology headed by consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist Professor Mahmoud Sami performed the successful surgery.
