n individual convicted of Aterrorist charges including the killing of three policemen has been extradited from Serbia following an Interpol Red Notice

According to the Interior Ministry, fugitive Ahmed Jaffar Mohammed Ali, 49, was returned following efforts by the International and Interpol Affairs Directorate of the General Directorate of Anti-Corruption and Economic and Electronic Security.




