the media's role in national development.

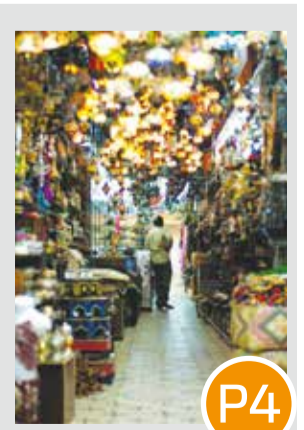

While the world watches, Bahrain acts

Iran's aggression and Hormuz closure top the regional agenda at UN

The Foreign Minister Dr. Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani took centre stage at the United Nations in New York, representing the Kingdom at a high-level Security Council debate on upholding the founding purposes and principles of the UN Charter. China's Foreign Minister Wang Yi chaired the session, as his country holds the Council's rotating presidency this month.

Speaking before UN Secretary-General António Guterres and a gathering of world leaders and foreign ministers, Dr. Al Zayani reaffirmed Bahrain's unwavering commitment to the pillars on which the United Nations was built 80 years ago — state sovereignty, non-interference, the rejection of force, and the peaceful resolution of disputes. He called on the Security Council to live up to its Charter obligations in ways that rebuild global confidence in multilateralism at a time when that system faces its sharpest test in decades.

The minister painted a stark

picture of today's world: humanitarian crises and armed conflicts colliding with terrorism, extremism, climate threats, health emergencies, and cyber risks — all demanding collective responsibility, not unilateral action.

On the sidelines, Dr. Al Zayani held a bilateral meeting with Secretary-General Guterres, where the two discussed mounting regional tensions, includ-

ing Iranian aggression against Bahrain and Gulf Cooperation Council states, and Iran's continued closure of the Strait of Hormuz — a move with grave consequences for global energy security, trade, and the world economy. Both sides backed Pakistani-mediated peace efforts between Washington and Tehran as a path toward restoring regional stability and reopening the vital waterway.

The Foreign Minister also met separately with Wang Yi, reaffirming the deep historic ties between Bahrain and China and aligning on key regional and international issues before the Security Council, under the guidance of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and President Xi Jinping.

Other meetings

On the sidelines of the UN Security Council meetings in New York, Foreign Minister Dr. Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani held bilateral talks on May 27 with his counterparts from Cambodia, Czech Republic, Argentina, and Pakistan.

All meetings addressed the fallout from Iranian aggression against Bahrain and Gulf states, and Iran's closure of the Strait of Hormuz — threatening global energy supplies, trade, and food security. Discussions also covered Pakistani-mediated US-Iran peace negotiations and regional stability efforts.

With Pakistan, the two sides additionally affirmed their brotherly ties and coordination as fellow non-permanent Security Council members.

Fast-track residency services go digital

Fast-track nationality, passport and residence services in Bahrain can now be accessed through online platforms and all service centres, under a new decision aimed at widening access to urgent government transactions.

The move was introduced under Decision No. 60 of 2026 issued by Interior Minister General Rashid bin Abdullah

Applicants can continue to obtain expedited services for a BD10 fee per transaction.

Al Khalifa, amending item 68 in the fees schedule attached to Decision No. 196 of 2014 governing services provided by the General Directorate of Nationality, Passports and Residence.

Applicants can continue to obtain expedited services for a

BD10 fee per transaction. Previously, under a 2022 amendment, the fast-track service was limited to the main headquarters service centre. The latest decision broadens access by extending the service to all centres as well as elec-

tronic channels, while retaining the same fee.

The decision followed a proposal submitted by the Undersecretary for Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs and received Cabinet approval.

The Undersecretary for Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs has been tasked with implementing the decision, which takes effect the day after publication in the Official Gazette.

FROM THE COURT

Five jailed in BD50,000 Tamkeen-SIO fraud case

Five people have been convicted in a public funds embezzlement and electronic forgery case involving Bahrain's Labour Fund "Tamkeen" and the Social Insurance Organization (SIO).

The High Criminal Court heard that the group fraudulently obtained more than BD50,000 by manipulating official records and insurance data.

According to the Financial Crimes and Money Laundering Prosecution, three defendants were sentenced to 10 years in prison, while the remaining two received jail terms of varying lengths. The court also imposed fines ranging from BD1,000 to BD20,000

and ordered the confiscation of seized items.

Investigations found that the defendants forged official electronic records and submitted false information through the electronic systems of Tamkeen and SIO to illegally secure funds.

Authorities said the group also tampered with insurance records by unlawfully adding and removing insured individuals and creating fictitious employment periods to obtain pensions, end-of-service benefits and other compensations.

The case came to light after Tamkeen and SIO submitted reports flagging suspected fraud, prompting an investigation by prosecutors. The suspects were later referred to trial, where the court found them guilty.

Driver jailed 7 years over fatal drunk-driving crash

A drunk driver who sped through a red light and caused a crash that killed one person and seriously injured another has been jailed for seven years by the High Criminal Court.

The court also ordered the deportation of the Asian defendant after he completes his prison sentence.

According to court documents, the accident happened around 2:25am while the defendant was driving his employer's pickup truck at more than 30 per cent above the speed limit and under the influence of alcohol.

Investigators said he ignored a red traffic signal be-

fore crashing into a vehicle carrying two victims. The force of the collision sent the vehicle into the central divider, a traffic signal pole and another stationary vehicle.

One victim died from severe skull injuries, while the other suffered multiple fractures and underwent surgery. The crash also caused heavy damage to vehicles and public property.

During the Public Prosecution investigation, the defendant admitted that speeding, reckless driving and alcohol consumption led to the fatal accident. In its ruling, the court said the offences were closely linked and warranted the maximum penalty under the law, with no grounds for leniency.

No walk-ins, only bookings as Eid rush hits Bahrain barbers

Barbershops across Bahrain are witnessing a pre-Eid rush, with salons staying open into the early hours of the morning as men and boys scramble for last-minute haircuts and grooming sessions ahead of Eid Al Adha prayers.

The busiest period comes in the final two days before Eid, when barber chairs rarely stay empty and appointment lists fill up rapidly to manage the crowds.

Many salons have shifted to advance bookings to cope with soaring demand, with barbers describing the Eid season as one of the most hectic times of the year.

Pakistani barber Moeen Naseem said the rush usually

continues until the second day of Eid, although the biggest crowds arrive on Eid eve.

He said some salons need more than five barbers working simultaneously to keep up with requests for haircuts, beard trims, facials and skin-care treatments.

A complete grooming session generally costs between BD5 and BD7, he added.

Turkish barber Nadeem Osman said shops have not increased prices during Eid despite the heavy rush.

Instead, most salons are relying on timed appointments to reduce waiting periods and maintain a steady flow of customers. He added that many barbershops are operating far beyond normal closing hours, with some remaining open until dawn on Eid morning.

Bahrain's municipal councils are stepping up efforts to expand parks, protect coastlines and boost urban greenery as part of the Kingdom's push to translate local environmental action into global impact, Northern Municipal Council chairman Sayed Shubbar Ibrahim Al Wadaei said.

Marking the International Day for Biological Diversity, Dr. Al Wadaei said Bahrain's environmental direction reflects the 2026 theme, "Acting

locally for global impact," through coordinated laws, municipal programmes and national projects aimed at protecting marine, coastal and urban ecosystems.

Dr. Al Wadaei highlighted the role of municipal councils in managing public parks, gardens, walkways, recreational spaces and coastal protection projects.

He pointed to provisions in the Municipalities Law No.

35 of 2001, which empower councils to help develop public green spaces and coordinate with relevant authorities to protect beaches from erosion and pollution.

According to him, the Northern Municipal Council has put this mandate into action through recommendations supporting new parks, walkways and public gardens, along with tree-planting campaigns and the distribution of seedlings to residents.



No licence, no trade under new market rules

Bahrain introduces unified licensing system for municipal markets

Bahrain traders and craftsmen will soon need both a municipal licence and an officially assigned site to operate in public and popular markets under sweeping new rules introduced across all four municipal areas.

The matching decisions, issued as Decision No. 1 of 2026 by the Capital, Muharraq, Northern and Southern municipal councils, give those covered six months from the date the rules take effect to regularise

The regulations apply to public, central and popular markets established by municipalities, including the Capital Municipality, and classify them as public facilities designated for trading specific goods.

Under the new framework, no one may sell, buy, run a commercial activity or practise a craft inside these markets unless licensed to use a site allocated by the municipality.

Each municipality will form a markets committee chaired by its director-general. The

committee will also include a municipal council member nominated by the council chairman, along with heads of the property and markets, legal affairs, revenue, building licences and regulation, and purchasing departments.

The committees will oversee licences, site allocations, withdrawals and reallocations in accordance with tender, auction, government purchasing and sales laws, as well as applicable financial regulations, after approval from the Undersecretary

for Municipalities Affairs.

Applicants must be Bahraini nationals, must not be employed in the public sector and, where required, must be registered in the Commercial Register. They must also submit a certificate confirming they have no outstanding dues owed to the relevant municipality, the Capital Municipality or any other municipality.

The rules also prevent traders from holding more than one site in the same market unless they submit the highest bid and

satisfy economic conditions set out in auction terms.

Applications must be submitted to the director-general of the relevant municipality, who will forward them to the markets committee. The committee must issue a decision within 15 days of receiving a complete application. Rejections must be justified, while no response within the period will be treated as an implied refusal.

Licensed traders and craftsmen will be required to personally operate their sites, although they may employ registered

workers. They must pay all fees, taxes and public charges, maintain licence and worker records, and avoid subletting, exchanging or relinquishing sites either wholly or partially.

They must also remain within the allocated boundaries, make no unauthorised changes to the site and begin operations within 30 days of receiving the licence. Failure to do so will result in cancellation unless an excuse is submitted at least 15 days before the deadline and approved by the committee, after which operations must begin within a further 15 days.

The decisions were signed by Saleh Tarada, Abdulaziz Al Naar, Sayed Shubbar Al Wadaei and Abdulla Abdul Latif, and will come into force the day after publication in the Official Gazette.

A fantasy world born in Bahrain: Eva Shafiee publishes debut novel

At just 13 years old, young Bahraini writer Eva Mohammed Shafiee began working on what she assumed would become another unfinished childhood story. Instead, years later, that imagination turned into *Mystical Realms* - her first published fantasy novel in English.

Now 18 and a university student, Eva is part of a growing wave of young Bahraini creatives finding their voice through storytelling. Published by Austin Macauley Publishers, 'Mystical

Realms reflects not only fantasy and adventure but also the thoughts, emotions and experiences that shaped her upbringing.

The story follows a ragtag team of five who join forces to stop a magical corruption spreading across their land, fac-

ing unexpected challenges and twists throughout their journey. "When I first wrote *Mystical Realms*, I didn't really expect it to go anywhere," Eva said in an exclusive interview with *The Daily Tribune*.

"Seeing it now being published is like a dream come true for me."

Creative Roots

Eva's love for storytelling began early, fuelled by books, films and TV shows - especially *The Land of Stories* series by Chris Colfer, which she says deeply inspired her as a child. Togeth-

er with her younger sister, Eva often created characters and unfinished plots, unknowingly laying the foundations for her future as a writer.

Many of the characters in *Mystical Realms* were shaped by real life emotions and relationships, she explained.

"Whether it's on purpose or not, the people you know and the experiences you've gone through are always going to bleed through into the things you create," Eva told TDT.

"For example, Gabriella was based on the kind of person I wanted to be when I grew

up - someone kind and caring, but willing to stand up for what she believed in."

"Molly and her brother were inspired by my relationship with my own siblings at the time. We used to fight a lot growing up, but eventually became much closer," she added.

Next Chapter

Beyond publishing a novel at a young age, Eva hopes her journey sends a larger message: fantasy stories and imaginative worlds can also emerge

from Bahrain and the Gulf region.

"Most of the creators I grew up watching or reading were from places like the US or the UK," she explained. "I wanted other young people from Bahrain to see that someone from here can create something special too."

Eva is already working on her next project, a fantasy series blended with sci-fi elements - proving that for this young Bahraini author, *Mystical Realms* is only the beginning.

India says 10 sailors released by Iran

Ten Indian sailors, detained in Iran in July 2025 on an oil tanker, have been released after "sustained diplomatic engagement", India's shipping authorities said late on Tuesday.

The sailors on the MV Harbour Phoenix were "detained, arrested and imprisoned in Iran following the vessel's interception near Jask Port in July 2025", the Directorate-General of Shipping said in a statement.

"The seafarers have now been released and reunited safely," the shipping authority said. "Necessary arrangements are being coordinated for the earliest return of the crew members to India."

India did not give further details on the reason for their arrest or about the vessel.

Oil falls, stocks waver as investors eye US-Iran talks

Oil prices fell yesterday while stock markets diverged over conflicting headlines on talks between Iran and the US to reopen the Strait of Hormuz to Gulf crude shipments.

Hopes of an imminent deal to avoid further hostilities in the Mideast war had bolstered optimism earlier in the session, with benchmark oil contracts falling more than 5%.

But a White House statement rejecting an Iranian report about a framework deal prompted caution, even though analysts say most investors still expect the negotiations to bear fruit.

"The hope will be that this is finally the week when a real breakthrough is achieved, but should negotiations fail then we could see market patience wear thin," said AJ Bell investment director Russ Mould.

He noted, however, that "Even if an agreement is reached, it will take time to get

energy infrastructure fully back online and shipments flowing through the Strait of Hormuz at anywhere near pre-war levels."

Investors appeared willing to look past the conflicting headlines, buoyed also by another surge for tech stocks on expectations the AI rollout will

continue to propel earnings in the sector.

In Asia, South Korean chipmaker SK hynix jumped 11% to hit a \$1-trillion market capitalisation, placing it alongside regional tech heavyweights Samsung Electronics and TSMC.

YouTube says will flag AI-generated content

YouTube will in future automatically detect AI-generated content and flag the information to viewers on its platform, the Google-owned company said Wednesday.

The move reverses a previous policy of relying on video creators to self-report if they had used generative AI tools.

"If a creator doesn't specify whether or not they used AI, but our systems detect significant photorealistic AI use, we will now automatically apply a label," Youtube said in a blog post.

The video platform's last steps on generative AI date back to 2024, when it requested that creators flag content where they had used the technology.

Since then there have been major strides in producing

photorealistic images and video, with widely available AI models including Google's Veo 3.1 and Seedance from Tiktok's parent company Bytedance.

Creators will be able to challenge the new flags if they think their content has been unfairly labelled as AI, Youtube said.

The platform added that the flags would have no impact on its algorithm for recommending videos to users.

Other platforms and social networks to introduce automatic flagging of AI content recently include music streamer Spotify.

Many online spaces are flooded with AI-generated images, video or audio, which is growing increasingly difficult to tell apart from human creations as the tools become more capable.

Air India slashes domestic flights amid fuel price spike

Air India said yesterday it will temporarily reduce or cut several domestic routes after announcing similar cuts to international routes

"In continuation of our previously announced adjustments to select international services between June and August 2026, we have temporarily rationalised operations on certain domestic routes," Air India said yesterday.

"These adjustments are driven by the sustained impact of



high fuel prices on overall operations," it added.

Air India did say which routes or how many flights would be af-

ected. The Press Trust of India news agency, citing sources, suggested more than a fifth of the airline's domestic flights could be impacted.

The airline said that the passengers hit by changes will be rebooked on alternative flights or offered full refunds.

"Air India will continue to monitor demand and operating conditions closely, with a view to restoring frequencies as conditions stabilise," it said.

Air India announced earlier



Air India operated the world's longest commercial flight for several years – its Bengaluru-to-San Francisco route often took a longer path over the Pacific Ocean to avoid strong headwinds, making the journey stretch beyond 17 hours.

in May that it was suspending routes to Chicago, Shanghai, Male and Singapore from Indian cities including New Delhi, Mumbai and Chennai between June and August.

It also announced a cut in the frequency of flights to San Francisco, Paris, Milan and Sydney.

Since taking over Air India in 2022, the Tata conglomerate has embarked on an ambitious overhaul, ordering hundreds of aircraft and upgrading its ageing fleet.

Hezbollah says clashed with Israeli troops north of Lebanon's Litani river

Hezbollah said its fighters clashed with Israeli forces in a town north of the Litani river yesterday, a day after Israel's military said it was expanding its ground operations.

In a statement, the Iran-backed group said its fighters "clashed with the enemy forces at point-blank range" with light and medium weapons in the town of Zawtar Al-Sharqiyah, on the edge of an Israeli-declared "yellow line" in south Lebanon where its troops have been operating.

Since early Tuesday, the group had said its fighters had faced Israeli troops entering the town, which holds strategic importance due to its proximity to the major southern city of Nabatieh, just six kilometers (four miles) away.

Israel's army yesterday renewed an evacuation warning for Nabatieh city after issuing a similar order a day earlier, saying it would act "forcefully" against Hezbollah which it accuses of violating the ceasefire.

Iran says 'low' possibility of return to war with US

Revolutionary Guards says forces on alert as supreme leader warns against hosting US bases

Modi warns of dangers as heatwave grips India

AFP | New Delhi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi warned of the dangers of "extreme heat" gripping the world's most populous country yesterday, with troops battling forest fires and local authorities reporting deaths from heatstroke.

International air-quality monitoring platform AQI recorded that the top 45 hottest cities in the world were all in India at midday yesterday, all above 43°C.

"Different parts of India are witnessing soaring temperatures, and the challenges that come with it," Modi said.

"This heat is harsh on all of us, and I urge you all to take as many precautions as possible," he said in a statement issued by his office.

Extreme heat can lead to dehydration that thickens the blood and, in particularly severe cases, causes organs to shut down.

Ignoring warning signs "can quickly turn dangerous and may even lead to heatstroke," Modi added.

"Children, the elderly and those working outdoors are especially vulnerable during extreme heat."

Iran's Revolutionary Guards said yesterday that a return to war with the United States was unlikely, while warning that the Islamic republic was prepared to respond to any further military action.

The statement came a day after Iran accused the United States of violating the ceasefire in place since April and said it was prepared to respond following recent exchanges of fire since the truce took effect.

In Lebanon, where a truce has done little to halt hostilities between Israel and Hezbollah, Israeli strikes killed 31 people on Tuesday, according to Lebanon's

health ministry.

The regional conflict escalated in late February following US and Israeli strikes on Iran, expanding across multiple fronts and contributing to volatility in global energy markets.

Mohammad Akbarzadeh, deputy political chief of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps Navy, said that while the likelihood of renewed conflict was low, Iranian armed forces remained on alert.

He warned that Iran's military would respond forcefully to any attack, according to remarks carried by the Tasnim news agency.

Tehran's intelligence ministry said the United States and Israel continued efforts to undermine the Islamic republic and destabilise the country.

The ministry said it believed weapons, ammunition and communication devices, including Starlink satellite internet terminals, could be smuggled into Iran to support sabotage activities and fuel unrest.

Oil prices fall

Iran and the United States have for weeks exchanged warnings and diplomatic messages while negotiations continued through mediation efforts led by Pakistan.

With no agreement reached, major points of contention remain, including the Strait of Hormuz and Iran's nuclear programme.

Iran imposed restrictions on shipping through the strait during the conflict, while the United States responded with measures targeting Iranian ports.

Yesterday, the Revolutionary Guards navy said vessels would be required to comply with Iranian maritime directives while transiting the waterway.

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio said on Tuesday that a peace agreement remained possible and that the Strait of Hormuz would eventually reopen.

Oil prices, which remain above pre-conflict levels, fell yesterday amid renewed expectations of progress in US-Iran talks, with Brent crude dropping five percent to \$94.61 a barrel.

Concerns over renewed fighting

Iranian authorities partially restored global internet access

on Tuesday after a three-month shutdown.

"I do feel better now because I finally can use my favourite applications," said Hana, a 20-year-old student in Tehran who gave only her first name.

"At the same time, I have this concern that war might resume any minute and just cut me off again from my friends."

Amir, a 27-year-old software developer in Tehran, also said he remained concerned about renewed fighting.

"I feel like nothing is certain yet, even though the ceasefire is still ongoing and there is news of a possible agreement. But the daily question is, will there be missile strikes tonight?"

There have been incidents during the ceasefire, including overnight Monday to Tuesday, when the US military said it carried out what it described as self-defence strikes while providing limited details. Iran's foreign ministry accused Washington of violating the ceasefire.

Duterte's ICC trial to start November 30: judge

AFP | The Hague

Former Philippines president Rodrigo Duterte will face a crimes against humanity trial at the International Criminal Court from November 30, the presiding judge said yesterday.

Duterte faces three counts of

crimes against humanity, with prosecutors alleging his involvement in at least 76 murders during his so-called "war on drugs".

The 81-year-old will be the first Asian former head of state to face trial at the ICC, which prosecutes individuals for the world's worst crimes such as

war crimes and crimes against humanity.

Prosecutors had sought the November 30 start and they expect to call between 60 and 70 witnesses during the trial.

"I am prepared to accede to the prosecution's request" said presiding judge Joanna Korner.

She did however order a further assessment of Duterte's fitness to stand trial before proceedings begin.

The defence, led by British barrister Peter Haynes after a reshuffle, had urged judges not to set a date for trial, arguing that Duterte's health needed to be assessed.

Israel says killed chief of Hamas armed wing in Gaza strike

Israel says Mohammed Odeh was killed in Gaza strike days after his predecessor

- Intensive airstrikes targeted western Gaza City positions
- Odeh's wife and children reportedly killed
- Ceasefire violence continues in Gaza

Israel said yesterday it had killed the new head of Hamas's armed wing in Gaza, Mohammed Odeh, after killing his predecessor earlier this month despite an ongoing ceasefire.

Since Hamas's October 2023 attack, Israel has systematically targeted the group's leaders, both in Gaza and across the region.

Odeh is the fourth head of the Ezzedine Al-Qassam Brigades Israel claims to have killed since the start of the Gaza war.

In a joint statement, the Israeli military and the Shin Bet domestic security agency confirmed Odeh's death on Tuesday, saying he had been appointed head of the brigades after the May 15 killing of Ezzedine al-Haddad.

Katz said the "commander of the armed wing of the Hamas terrorist organisation in Gaza was eliminated yesterday and sent to meet his associates in the depths of hell".

A Hamas source said that Odeh's wife and two children were also killed in the airstrike, and that a funeral procession would take place yesterday in Gaza City.

The group never officially an-

nounced or confirmed Odeh as head of the brigades, but he had long been the head of its intelligence service and was one of the group's most senior surviving figures in the Gaza Strip.

On Tuesday evening, a security source in Gaza told AFP that there was intense Israeli bombardment in western Gaza City.

The source said he had "no information on the target", but that "the scale and intensity of

the attack fuelled speculation that the target was commander Mohammed Odeh, who succeeded the martyred commander Ezzedine al-Haddad".

'Marked for death'

"We committed ourselves to eliminating everyone who led the October 7 massacre, and that is what we will do: they are all marked for death, wherever they may be," Katz said in his post

Trump Board of Peace's official Gaza fund is empty

US President Donald Trump's Board of Peace has no cash in its official Gaza reconstruction fund, despite member countries pledging billions of dollars, a source familiar with the board said yesterday.

Trump first conceived of the board to rebuild Gaza, where Israel and Hamas agreed to a US-backed ceasefire in October in a bid to halt two years of devastating war.

But he quickly raised eyebrows by sending out wide invitations, including to Russian President Vladimir Putin and to countries far removed from traditional Middle East diplomacy.

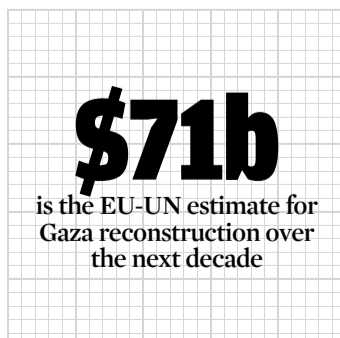
Since the board was set up, its fund -- administered by the World Bank and endorsed by the United Nations -- has received no money from donors, the source familiar with the Board of Peace told AFP.

The source said money had not been deposited because the fund was designed for the reconstruction and development phase, which has not yet been reached.

"We've found five people alive and all safe. There are still two people we are searching for," Laotian rescue group Rescue Volunteer for People said in a social media post.

"At 4.30pm, we found our target. We found five people. We are looking for the other two," added Thai rescuer

Kengkach Bangkawong in a Facebook post.

Rescuers had been "racing against time" on yesterday to extract the seven trapped people, a specialist diver involved in the operation said.

"We are racing against time as today marks the seventh day and the way in is full of challenges," Finnish diver Mikko Paasi said in a social media post. He was one of the rescuers who aided the dramatic 2018 retrieval of a youth football team from a flooded cave in Thailand.

EU Adopts 'Protect, Perform, Partner' Plan

Global humanitarian needs reach record levels amid funding shortfalls

● Focus on safer aid delivery

● New funding models aim to improve efficiency

● Cooperation with private sector and financial institutions

The European Union has announced a new set of measures to strengthen its humanitarian response globally, aiming to ensure aid remains principled, efficient, and impactful at a time when global needs have reached unprecedented levels.

A Joint Communication on Humanitarian Aid, adopted by the European Commission and the High Representative, outlines how the EU intends to maintain its role as a reliable global donor despite mounting pressure on the international aid system.

According to the EU, around 239 million people worldwide currently require humanitarian assistance, while existing funding mechanisms are only able to reach less than half of those in need. At the same time, the number and duration of global crises continue to rise, compounded by insecurity and shrinking financial resources.

European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said the EU remains committed to protecting human dignity and

improving the efficiency of life-saving assistance.

"As the leading humanitarian donor worldwide, the European Union continues to defend the dignity of those in need, as well as those who risk their lives to help them," she said. "With this package, we are ensuring life-saving aid is delivered more efficiently, even in the toughest environments. At the same time, we are building resilience to reduce dependency on aid."



Global Humanitarian Pressure Points

- Humanitarian system under strain due to conflicts in Gaza, Ukraine, and Sudan, plus funding cuts.
- Forcibly displaced people has doubled in a decade, reaching 117.3 million (2025).
- Around 500 million children are living in or fleeing conflict zones.

The new strategy is built around three core pillars: protect, perform, and partner.

Under the protect pillar, the EU plans to enhance humanitarian diplomacy and coordination through a broader "Team Europe" approach. This includes greater use of political dialogue, human rights advocacy, peace mediation, and multilateral engagement. The EU will also strengthen security measures for humanitarian workers and expand the role of local organisations in delivering aid, ensuring more inclusive and community-driven responses.

The perform pillar focuses on improving the efficiency of aid delivery. The EU aims to reform humanitarian supply chains to maximise cost-effectiveness, from procurement to final distribution. It will also expand funding approaches such as cash assistance, anticipatory action, multi-year financing, pooled funds, and greater support for local actors. Improved data sharing on humanitarian needs is also part of the plan to enhance coordination and effectiveness.

Through the partner pillar, the EU seeks to reduce long-term dependence on humanitarian aid by strengthening resilience and promoting durable solutions. This includes deeper cooperation with international financial institutions, private sector partners, and philanthropic organisations to develop innovative financing models for fragile regions and crisis-affected communities.

Officials noted that the international humanitarian system is under severe strain due to

ongoing conflicts in regions such as Gaza, Ukraine, and Sudan, alongside widespread funding cuts. The number of forcibly displaced people has doubled over the past decade, reaching 117.3 million in 2025, while around half a billion children are living in or fleeing conflict zones.

The EU and its member states currently provide around 35 percent of global humanitarian funding, with the European Commission allocating nearly 2 billion this year alone. The bloc reaffirmed its commitment to needs-based, inclusive, and non-discriminatory aid delivery aimed at saving lives and preserving dignity worldwide.

Qatar reiterated that the United Nations must remain the central pillar of the global system and called for accelerating reforms to make the

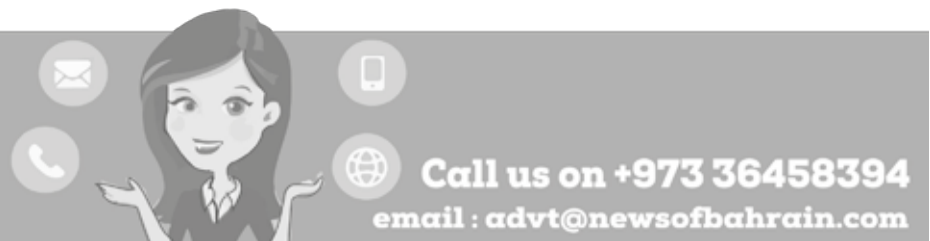

Miserly Arsenal face PSG firepower in Champions League style clash

Arsenal's disciplined, set-piece-heavy game meets PSG's explosive transition attack

Arsenal's immovable object meets the unstoppable force of Paris Saint-Germain in Saturday's Champions League final offering a pronounced clash of styles. Holders PSG's flowing attack is arguably the continent's most exhilarating, while Mikel Arteta's Arsenal are wedded to a pragmatic approach which ended their 22-year wait to win the Premier League.

The Gunners' football this season has not won over many neutrals but after years of nearlys and almos, Arteta's strategy has paid dividends.

Arsenal's consistency beat out Pep Guardiola's Manchester City to be crowned champions of England and led them back to Europe's summit two decades after reaching the 2006 final.

In the Champions League Arsenal have conceded only six goals in 14 matches and are unbeaten -- by contrast PSG let in 22 through the tournament.

"Without the ball, they are the best team in the world," said PSG coach Luis Enrique of the north London side.

Arteta's side depends on structure and discipline, seeking to control opponents by stopping them reaching dangerous



areas, limiting their shots in the box -- no Premier League team has conceded fewer.

The Gunners aggressively press opponents high, seeking to dominate territory, and hate giving the ball away themselves, avoiding risk in their passing.

They possess imposing, physical players, from impressive centre-back pairing Gabriel and William Saliba, through the spine of the team, in Declan Rice and imposing strikers Viktor Gyokeres and Kai Havertz.

That aids their dead ball mastery, under the cunning eye of set piece coach Nicolas Jover, whom they signed from Manchester City in 2021.

Swiss newspaper Blick pondered whether Jover was "ruining football", with the Frenchman reportedly paid a bonus per goal scored via a set piece.

"We want to be the best and the most dominant team in every aspect of the game," said Arteta, imploring his team to score even more from dead balls.

With 27 Premier League goals scored this season from dead ball situations, 38 percent of their total, some have labelled Arsenal 'Set Piece FC'.

"Every time they get a corner, my head is in my hands," former Liverpool defender Jamie Carragher told Sky Sports.

"I've never seen anything like this before in football."

After three consecutive second place finishes, Arsenal recognise winning ugly is better than not winning at all.

"I don't know how you celebrate one goal different to another -- maybe for YouTube one is nicer than another," said Arteta unperturbed by criticism.

Arsenal won seven games 1-0 this season in the Premier League, keeping 19 clean sheets.

If teams do penetrate the backline, they must beat David Raya, enjoying a superb season in goal.

The Spaniard has matched the record of nine clean sheets in the Champions League. A 10th could secure the trophy.

Their struggles from open play, particularly when star winger Bukayo Saka was out injured, frustrated even their own supporters at times.

Yet as tens of thousands turned up to celebrate the Premier League title, nobody was complaining.

Those joyous scenes outside the Emirates stadium, with some players joining the fans until past five in the morning, allow Arsenal to double down on their approach, particularly against a team as lethal as PSG.

Thriving in chaos

While Arsenal have some-

times lacked star power in attack, opponents PSG boast several electric forwards who thrive in organised chaos and will back themselves to break down the competition's toughest defence.

Coach Luis Enrique may have weeded his team of superstars but Ousmane Dembele, Khvicha Kvaratskhelia and Desire Doue are some of the most dynamic attackers on the planet.

The French champions demolish teams in transition with searing pace, helping top scorers PSG net 44 goals in the Champions League, one short of the all-time record of 45.

PSG showed their attacking prowess in the first leg of their semi-final tussle with Bayern Munich, edging the German giants 5-4 in an all-timer. Arsenal seek to reduce risk, PSG encourage it.

"When we can keep the ball and create space, it makes the match easier," said Luis Enrique after his team put five past Chelsea in the last 16 first leg.

"We showed that we are a real team, unpredictable."

They racked up eight goals against the Blues on aggregate, plus six against Bayern Munich and four against Liverpool in the other knockout games.

If the final does not follow the script, it will be because Luis Enrique tears it up.

In the second leg against Bayern he shifted strategy and denied Vincent Kompany the end-to-end contest he expected in a 1-1 draw.

"We can't always win with magic or extraordinary play," said Doue.

However for the most part PSG, who put five goals past Inter Milan in last season's final, have done just that.

Whichever style emerges triumphant will determine who leaves Budapest with the European crown.

Nicholas Hwende ready to defy limits in quest for second world title at BRAVE CF 105

Nicholas Hwende is poised to step into the most defining night of his career when he headlines BRAVE CF 105 on Sunday, May 31.

There, the former BRAVE CF Bantamweight World Champion ventures into deeper waters, chasing the vacant undisputed featherweight crown against interim titleholder Omar Solomanov in a high-stakes five-round clash at the Baluan Sholak Sports Palace in Almaty, Kazakhstan.

The Zimbabwean star has the opportunity to etch his name into the record books by becoming only the second athlete in the promotion's history to win a World Title in two separate weight classes.

Hwende is fully aware that the moment in Almaty could reshape his legacy, but he insists that the pursuit of history is only part of the mission.

"Moments like this are what every fighter dreams of. To



become a two-division World Champion in BRAVE CF would be historic, but I am not just chasing history, I am chasing proof that I belong among the very best who have ever stepped into this sport," he said.

Across from him stands a

proven force in Solomanov, a featherweight mainstay with a professional record of 14-3, including eight knockouts and three submission wins.

The Ukrainian dynamo captured interim gold at BRAVE CF 98 in September 2025 after a

commanding five-round performance against Kazakh rival Rauan "Shymyr" Bekbolat in a highly anticipated rematch, walking away with a clear-cut unanimous decision.

Hwende acknowledges the danger Solomanov brings, but refuses to be swayed by reputation or momentum.

To him, his Ukrainian opponent is simply another obstacle on a path he fully intends to dominate.

"I respect what Omar Solomanov has achieved, but respect does not mean hesitation. He is just another man standing in the way of what I want, and I have never been the type to step aside for anyone," Hwende said.

With a win-loss card of 10-2, Hwende has already proven himself under the bright lights of BRAVE CF, collecting four wins in six appearances.

One of his most recent statement-making exploits came at BRAVE CF 98, where he made a successful featherweight debut against China's "The Stalker"



Xie Bin, silencing the home crowd with a composed, technical display that earned him a unanimous decision victory.

Now, with championship gold within reach once again, Hwende believes BRAVE CF 105 will serve as the ultimate valida-

tion of his mindset and skill set. "This is not about prediction or promise. This is a warning. I am coming to impose myself, to break resistance, and to show that no challenge is too great when I step into that cage," he declared.

Swiatek, Svitolina cruise into French Open third round

Four-time champion Iga Swiatek and Elina Svitolina both eased into the French Open third round with straight-sets wins yesterday.

Swiatek, looking to regain the title she last won in 2024, saw off battling Czech youngster Sara Bejlek 6-2, 6-3 on Court Philippe Chatrier.

The third-seeded Pole will next face either former winner Jelena Ostapenko or compatriot Magda Linette as she bids to preserve her record of having always reached the second week at Roland Garros.

"Usually the weather is quite different here, but it doesn't matter," said Swiatek after spending 93 minutes on court on another boiling hot day in Paris.

"It's going to change, I feel, in the second part of the tournament.

"So I guess this tournament is really about: whoever will cope with both of these conditions will win."

Swiatek is playing at a first

Grand Slam tournament since linking up with Rafael Nadal's former coach Francisco Roig.

She is among the favourites for a seventh major title after impressing in a run to the Italian Open semi-finals earlier this month.

But she could next be facing a serious test in Latvian Ostapenko, against whom she has lost in all six of their previous meetings.

Svitolina, who beat Swiatek en route to the Rome title, beat world number 126 Kaitlin Quevedo 6-0, 6-4.

The Ukrainian seventh seed ended an eight-year wait for her fifth WTA 1000 trophy at the Italian Open to underline her credentials as a contender in Paris.

She struggled through her first-round tie, edging out Hungary's Anna Bondar in a decid-

ing-set tie-break on Monday, before watching her husband Gael Monfils' final French Open match in the night session.

But Svitolina raced out of the blocks this time, quickly taking control against Quevedo.

The Spaniard competed better in the second set until a break in the ninth game helped Svitolina wrap up victory.

Svitolina, who reached her fourth career Slam semi-final earlier this year at the Australian Open, will next play Germany's Tamara Korpatsch, who made a major third round for the first time at the age of 31 by beating Chinese 32nd seed Wang Xinyu.

Former Olympic champion Belinda Bencic eased into the last 32 for the third time, brushing aside Caty McNally 6-4, 6-0.

Russian 13th seed Karen Khachanov came through a gruelling battle with Marco Trungelliti 7-6 (7/5), 5-7, 6-1, 7-6 (7/4).

He will play Dutch lucky loser Jesper de Jong, who backed up his win over Stan Wawrinka by defeating Federico Cina, for a last-16 berth on Friday.

Argentina coach Scaloni encouraged by news on Messi injury

Argentina coach Lionel Scaloni said the initial news regarding superstar Lionel Messi's fitness "is not that bad" and hopes further examinations will confirm that diagnosis with the World Cup just a fortnight away.

Messi has been diagnosed with muscle fatigue in his left hamstring by his Major League Soccer club Inter Miami after he made an abrupt exit from Miami's 6-4 victory over Philadelphia in the 73rd minute

Even at 38 and eyeing a sixth World Cup finals appearance, Messi remains the side's talisman for the defence of the title they won in Qatar four years ago.

"Obviously we would have preferred that nothing had happened," Scaloni told Argentinian TV station DSports on Tuesday.

"Now one has to wait and see how it evolves and above all the new tests they are going to conduct in order to see if it confirms their original diagnosis."

Valgren wins Giro 17th stage, Vingegaard stays in pink

Danish rider Michael Valgren won the 17th stage of the Giro d'Italia yesterday as Jonas Vingegaard continued his march to a first overall victory on the Grand Tour.

Valgren took the honours in Andalo after attacking from a small group with a kilometre remaining of the undulating 202km ride from Cassano d'Adda in which riders suffered both from punishing heat and also sudden downpours.

The 34-year-old EF Education-EasyPost rider claimed his second win of the season, with his other also coming in Italy at

which pulled away from the break on the final categorised Andalo-Lever climb.

Former heavyweight champion Fury announces August return in Dublin

Tyson Fury has said he plans to return to the ring in Dublin on August 1 -- one week after fellow former world heavyweight champion Anthony Joshua makes his comeback.

The pair are heading for a long-awaited 'Battle of Britain', probably in November, although it appears that both boxers will first have a warm-up fight.

Joshua will face unheralded Albanian Kristian Prenga in Riyadh on July 25 in his first bout since being involved in a car crash in Nigeria in December which killed two of his close friends.

Fury posted a video in an Instagram story showing him back in training in Thailand alongside the caption: "Let's go August 1, Dublin, Ireland."

Fury could take a place on a card being put together by veteran promoter Frank Warren in the Republic of Ireland capital on that date.

No opponent has yet been

named, although Warren has ruled out Fury fighting Andy Ruiz Jr, who dethroned Joshua as world champion in 2019 before losing the rematch later that year.

Fury marked his return from a 16-month retirement with a dominant points win over Russia's Arslanbek Makhmudov in April, after which he immediately called out Joshua, who was present at ringside.

Rather than face-off at the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium, a verbal exchange followed in which Joshua taunted Fury by declaring: "I'm the landlord, remember that. You work for me."

Arteta adamant English title can inspire Arsenal to Champions League glory

Mikel Arteta is "fully convinced" Arsenal can be crowned champions of Europe for the first time this weekend after ending their 22-year wait for a Premier League title.

The Gunners face reigning European kings Paris Saint-Germain in Saturday's Champions League final in Budapest after wrapping up their first Premier League title since 2004.

A star-studded Paris Saint-Germain, who thrashed Inter Milan 5-0 in last season's final, are widely regarded as favourites to lift the European Cup once again.

But Arsenal manager Arteta believes the confidence gained by winning the Premier League will inspire the Gunners to upset the odds.

"You could sense the energy,

you can sense the positivity and the confidence in the players and everybody around the club," he said.

"We have an amazing opportunity to write new history in our football club, and we are convinced that we're going to do it.

"We will fly to Budapest on Thursday fully convinced that in a few days' time we can be champions of Europe."

The 44-year-old Spaniard was speaking at the League Managers Association's annual awards dinner in central London on Tuesday, where he was named Premier League manager of the year.

"First of all, thank you so much for giving me this award," said former Everton and Arsenal midfielder Arteta. "It's an immense honour. You're related to some of the great managers and all the leagues that are in this room.

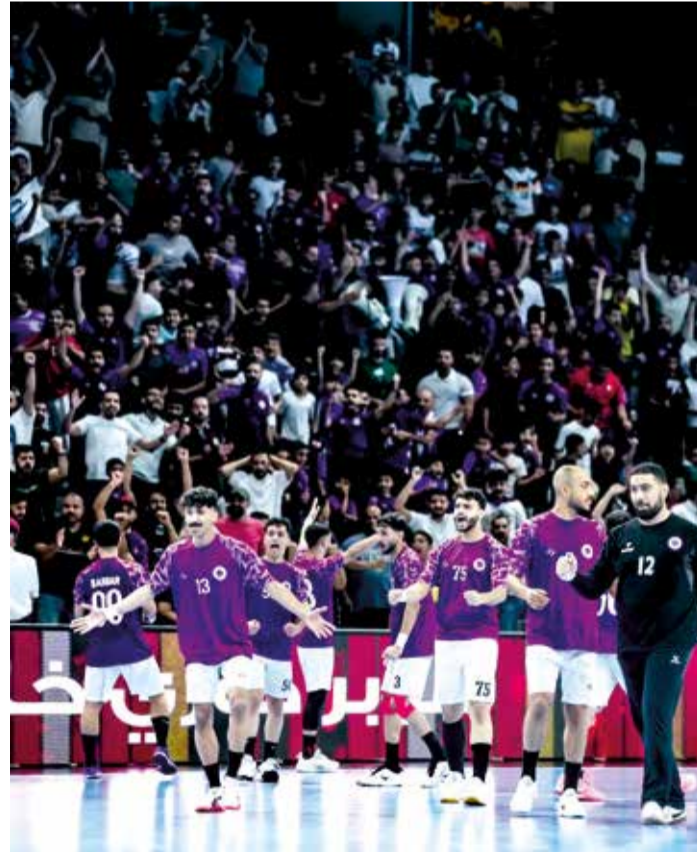
Handball League: Golden square semi-finals continue

"Nuno made it very clear that he is highly motivated for the challenge of guiding West Ham United back to the top flight at the first time of asking. That must be the unquestionable goal for next season.
