His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, has ordered the inclusion of 500 additional beneficiaries in the "Mazaya" housing programme, bringing the total number of recipients to 2,500.

This comes as the Cabinet yesterday reviewed a memorandum submitted by the Minister of Finance and National Economy, Chairman of the Ministerial Committee for Financial and Economic Affairs and Fiscal Balance, on the achievements of various housing programmes provided to Bahraini citizens, including the "Mazaya" housing programme, which has supported 10,629 beneficiaries.

HRH Prince Salman, who chaired the weekly meeting, called on the Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning to offer additional financing schemes for

Education sector

The Cabinet highlighted His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa's continued support to the Kingdom's education sector, and commended the winners of the Unesco King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa Prize for the use of information and communication technologies (ICT) in the field of education.



Mazaya scheme allows mid-income Bahrainis to get a finance up to BD81,000 in collaboration with a local bank to buy a house ready for habitation, while paying only a quarter of their monthly salary.

The Cabinet noted the important role of the award in the Kingdom's commitment to advancing UNESCO's objectives by encouraging the use of ICT to further develop education and its outputs.

Jordan port tragedy

12 dead, 250 injured in Jordan toxic gas explosion

Amman

At least 12 people died and more than 250 were injured yesterday when a tank of toxic chlorine gas plunged from a crane and exploded at Aqaba port in Jordan.

Eight of the casualties were Jordanian, with the other four

coming from other nations.

The force of the blast sent a truck rolling down the harbor-side, while clouds of yellow gas billowed overhead and dock workers ran for their lives.

Nearby areas were evacuated and residents told to close and seal doors and windows and to

avoid going out.

Public Security Department spokesman Amer Sartawy said "specialists and the hazardous substances team in the civil defense" were dealing with the incident.

Prime Minister Bishr Khasawneh and Interior Minister

Mazen Al-Faraya immediately headed to the scene, visited a hospital where some of the injured were being treated, and formed an investigation team into the incident.

The accident happened when a tank filled with 25 tons of chlorine gas being exported to

Djibouti fell while being transported. Video footage showed a crane hoisting the tank from a truck, and then the tank falling on to the deck of a ship and exploding.

The injured were transported to two state hospitals, one private facility and a field hospital.

UK announcement to exempt Bahrainis from visa hailed

The Kingdom of Bahrain has welcomed the announcement by the British Home Office to launch the United Kingdom Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) in early 2023, that would fully exempt Bahrain and GCC citizens from visa requirements.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs said that the launch of ETA next year, complements the British government's decision to implement the electronic visa exemption system, starting from June.

"The mover will contribute to facilitating travel procedures for Bahrain and GCC citizens to the United Kingdom," it said.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs noted that the new system requires those wishing to travel to Britain to apply for permission to travel once every two years, as it is valid for the aforementioned period, and for multiple visits.

The Kingdom yesterday hosted the first Negev Summit Steering Committee meeting at Sofitel Hotel Bahrain.

The meeting is the first in a long series of events planned, following the Negev Summit on March 28, 2022, in which Israel hosted the foreign ministers of Bahrain, the UAE, Egypt, Morocco

and the US.

Speaking to members of the media following the meeting, Foreign Ministry Undersecretary Dr Shaikh Abdulla bin Ahmed Al Khalifa said the meeting focused on a view for the future and next generation.

"The unified core objectives discussed include deepening relations, expanding interdependence, promoting joint ventures and strategic cooperation."

Dr Shaikh Abdulla said that working groups will be constituted for major areas including clean energy, education and coexistence, food and water security, health, regional security and tourism.

Terming the meeting as a 'proactive engagement', Dr Shaikh Abdulla said the presidency of the meeting will be rotated between the participating nations. "The ministerial meeting will be held on an annual basis. We are all determined to build on the success of all people, who call the Middle East their home."

Israeli Foreign Ministry Director-General Alon Ushpiz read out the joint statement before the media members after the meeting.

"The meeting decided to fur-

ther coordinate collective efforts for the development of the region. While demonstrating the strength of relations, we will be able to accomplish common goals that can be achieved by working together. The participating nations will continue to exert efforts to achieve comprehensive peace."

He said the working groups will meet on a regular basis for the benefit of the people and the region. "There will also be great focus on improving the life and quality of Palestinian people."

Earlier in the Negev Summit, Foreign Ministers of Bahrain, Israel, the UAE, Egypt, Morocco and the US worked on ways to address their shared challenges and interests.

Israel 'to join hands with Arab countries to address food crisis'

Israel will join hands with Arab countries to address the food crisis in the region, said Oded Joseph, Deputy Director-General of Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Head of Middle East and Peace Process Division.

Exclusively speaking to The Daily Tribune, Mr Oded, who was here in the Kingdom yesterday to take part in the first Negev Summit Steering Committee meeting at Sofitel Hotel Bahrain, said on the sidelines of the event, that global food crisis is going to have a big impact on the region and Israel along with the US is putting the best efforts to address the issue.

nerstones of the bilateral ties. "As we speak, we have an academic delegation coming to the Kingdom, which will see many researchers and academicians interacting with their counterparts and students in the Kingdom. We will also see cultural figures from Israel including musicians and artists coming to the Kingdom. So, people-to-people relations

and human connections will be enhanced encompassing the entire spectrum."

When asked about bringing more Arab nations under the diplomatic umbrella, Mr Oded said one of the major objectives of Israeli Foreign Policy is to expand the circle of normalization of ties with more nations in the region.

Highlighting on the need to have joint strategies to address security threats, Mr Oded said: "Another issue the participants have agreed on is creating a regional security architecture to address all kinds of security threats including the ones from Iranian regime. What we must understand is that this is not a coalition against a particular nation or regime, but it is a gathering to address many issues including the security threats faced by the region."

Mr Oded is a senior member of the Israeli diplomatic team. Formerly, he led many successful diplomatic missions during the tenures as the envoy to Kenya and many other African countries.

Fulad commends Bahrain Alternative Penalties and Open Prisons programme

The Bahrain Human Rights Watch Society (BHRWS) organised a seminar entitled "Kingdom of Bahrain: The Alternative Penalties and Open Prisons in Bahrain" yesterday in Geneva.

Experts and human rights activists as well as international non-government organisations (NGOs) took part in the seminar which is held from 13 June to 8 July at the Palais des Nations.

BHRWS Secretary General Faisal Fulad presented a paper at the event where he discussed about the Alternative Penalties and Open Prisons programme in the Kingdom.

According to Fulad, the people, families as well as families of convicts in Bahrain pay tribute and support the programme.

Around 3,836 individuals in Bahrain have benefited from the alternative penalties based on the latest statistics. The rate of recommitting crimes after the end of the penalty has reached 4%.

Fulad commended the directives of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, to put in place the necessary executive and legislative mechanisms for the programme.

He described the move as a reflection of the kingdom's keenness to protect and promote the human rights system and a model to emulate

according to international standards.

The top BHRWS official also noted that Bahrain's efforts and tireless endeavour to develop the criminal justice system and foster human rights is an extension of the success of the alternative penalties programme as a national, civilisational and humanitarian project.

The Interior Ministry has taken several steps to expand the implementation of the alternative penalties, including following up the cases of convicts after they served their alternative penalties.

The expansion also covers online training and rehabilitation, community service work in cooperation with the private section and a computer system to link all concerned authorities to get daily reports on the beneficiaries.

Likewise, Fulad stressed the importance of the move in rehabilitating the wrongdoers and reintegrate them in the community according to well-defined regulations.

Credit Suisse found guilty in cocaine cash laundering case

Credit Suisse (CSGN.S) was convicted by Switzerland's Federal Criminal Court of failing to prevent money-laundering in the country's first criminal trial of one of its major banks.

A former employee was found guilty of money-laundering in the trial, which included testimony on murders and cash stuffed into suitcases and is seen as a test case for prosecutors taking a tougher line against the country's banks.

It marks another headache for Switzerland's second-biggest bank, which has been

reeling from billions in losses racked up via risk-management and compliance blunders.

Credit Suisse said it would appeal against the conviction.

The judges looked at whether Credit Suisse and the former employee did enough to prevent a Bulgarian cocaine trafficking gang from laundering profits through the bank from 2004 to 2008.

The court said on Monday it found deficiencies within Credit Suisse both with regard to the management of client relations with the criminal organisation and with regard to the monitoring of the implementation anti-money laundering rules.

Oil prices edge higher ahead of G7 talks

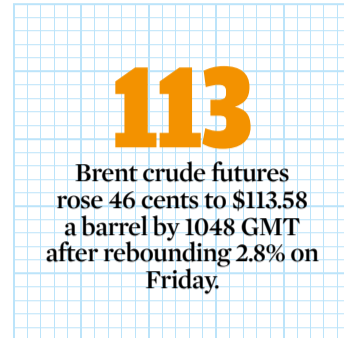

Oil prices edged higher yesterday in a volatile session as investors waited for any moves against Russian oil and gas exports that might come out of a meeting of leaders of the Group of Seven (G7) nations in Germany.

The prospect of even tighter supplies loomed over the market as western governments sought ways to cut Russia's ability to fund its war in Ukraine, even though G7 leaders were also expected to discuss a revival of the Iran nuclear deal, which might lead to more Iranian oil exports.

Members of the Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and their allies including Russia, known as OPEC+, will likely stick to a plan for accelerated oil output increases in August when they meet on Thursday, sources said.

But for now, pressing supply worries outweighed growing concerns over the potential for a global recession following a string of downbeat economic data from the United



States, the world's biggest oil consumer.

OPEC member Libya's national oil company said on Monday it might have to halt exports in the Gulf of Sirte area within 72 hours amid unrest that has restricted production.

Brent crude futures rose 46 cents to \$113.58 a barrel by 1048 GMT after rebounding 2.8% on Friday. US West Texas Intermediate crude was at \$107.82 a barrel, up 20 cents, or 0.19%, following a 3.2% gain in the previous session.

Both contracts fell last week for the second week in a row as interest rate hikes in key economies strengthened the dollar and fanned recession fears. G7 leaders,

who began their meeting on Sunday, are expected to discuss options for tackling rising energy prices and replacing Russian oil and gas imports, as well as further sanctions that do not exacerbate inflation.

These measures include a possible price cap on Russian oil exports to reduce Moscow's revenues while limiting the damage to other economies.

"It's unclear whether a price cap will achieve this outcome," Commonwealth Bank of Australia analyst Vivek Dhar said in a note.

"There's still nothing stopping Russia from banning oil and refined product exports to G7 economies in response to a price cap, exacerbating shortage conditions in global oil and refined product markets."

The G7 will also discuss the prospect of reviving the Iran nuclear talks after the European Union's foreign policy chief met senior officials in Tehran to try to unblock the stalled negotiations, a French presidency official said on Sunday.

Contactless transactions top weekly point of sale, eCommerce data

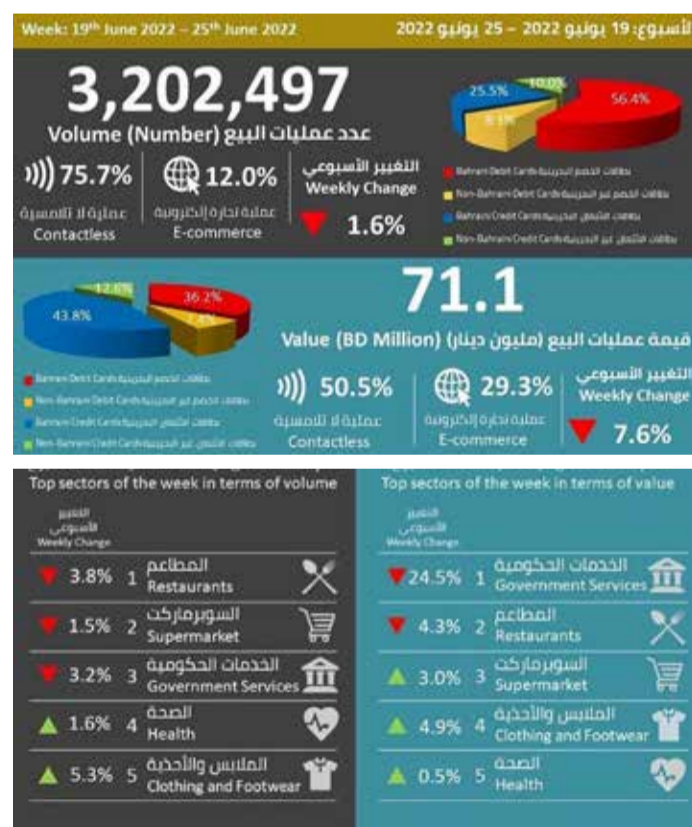
Bahrain announced weekly statistics of points of sale and e-commerce operations yesterday, reporting a 1.6% decline in the 19th to the 25th of June 2022 period.

Transaction volume touched 3,202,497, of which 75.7% are contactless and 12.0% are e-commerce.

Bahraini Debit cards account for 56.4% of the weekly transactions, non-Bahraini debit cards 8.1%, Bahraini credit cards 25.5%, and non-Bahraini credit cards 10.0%. In terms of value, transaction value touched BD71.1 million, which was a weekly decline of 7.6%. 50.5% of the transaction value accounts for contactless and 29.3% for e-commerce.

Sector-wise, restaurants topped the list for volume and government services for the value of transactions.

The top sectors of the week in terms of volume are restaurants (down 3.8%), supermarkets (down 1.5%), Government services (3.2%), Health (up 1.6%) and Clothing and footwear (up



5.3%).

Top sectors in terms of value are Government services (down 24.5%), restaurants

(down 4.3%), supermarket (up 3.0%), clothing and footwear (up 4.9%) and health (up 0.5%).

US Supreme Court won't hear Apple's bid to revive Qualcomm patent challenges

The US Supreme Court on Monday declined to hear Apple Inc's (AAPL.O) bid to revive an effort to cancel two Qualcomm Inc (QCOM.O) smartphone patents despite the global settlement of the underlying dispute between the two tech giants.

The justices turned away Apple's appeal of a lower court's ruling that the Cupertino, California-based company lacked standing to pursue the matter because of the settlement. Apple had argued that it should be allowed to appeal because San Diego-based Qualcomm could sue again after the settlement ends.

Qualcomm sued Apple in San Diego federal court in 2017, arguing that its iPhones, iPads and Apple Watches infringed a variety of Qualcomm mobile-technology patents. That case was one element of a broader dispute between the rivals. Apple challenged the validity of the two patents at issue at the Patent and Trademark Office's Patent Trial and Appeal Board.

The parties settled their litigation in 2019, signing an agreement worth billions of dollars that allowed Apple to continue using Qualcomm chips in iPhones. The settlement also featured a license to tens of thousands of Qualcomm patents, including the two at issue, but allowed the patent board case to continue.

India shares close at over 2-week high as tech, metal stocks gain

Indian shares joined a rally in global stock markets to close at a more than two-week high yesterday, led by technology and metal stocks, as easing oil prices tempered inflation fears.

The NSE Nifty 50 index (.NSEI) rose 0.85% to 15,832.05, and the S&P BSE Sensex (.BSESN) climbed 0.82% to 53,161.28, with both the indexes gaining for a third straight session.

Yesterday, the Nifty IT (.NIFTYIT) was the best performing sub-index in Mumbai, jumping 2.3% to its highest since June 10, boosted by a 2.8% rise in heavyweight Infosys (INFY.NS).

The Nifty Metal index (.NIFTYMET), which has fallen sharply this month, rose 1.5%.

Airlines cancel nearly 700 US flights as labour crunch weighs

Airlines canceled nearly 700 flights in the United States early yesterday, as they struggled to keep up with a surge in summer travel demand due to a

shortage of staff ranging from pilots to crew members.

Total flight cancellations within, into, or out of the United States as of 6.07 am ET were 669, as per flight-tracking website

Flightaware.com. Nearly 860 flights were canceled on Sunday.

Delta Air Lines (DAL.N), United Airlines Holdings Inc (UAL.O) and Republic Airlines Inc had over 100 cancellations

each, while American Airlines Group Inc (AAL.O) canceled 51 flights as of early Monday. In Europe, recent airport snarls have been blamed on a shortage of employees, as many workers,

who were laid off during the pandemic, desert airport work for flexible working practices and other occupations. Even the US regulator Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) faces staff

shortages. The FAA last week granted United approval to temporarily cut Newark flights after the carrier petitioned for a waiver, citing airport construction and air traffic control staffing.

◆ **An Afghan aid agency** appealed yesterday for cash for survivors of a deadly earthquake, saying it had no room to store food and had enough tents and money for villagers to meet their particular needs would be most useful now. Afghanistan's most destructive earthquake in decades struck a remote southeastern region near the Pakistani border on Wednesday last week, killing at least 1,000 people, injuring 2,000 and destroying 10,000 homes. Among the dead were 155 children, with nearly 250 children injured and 65 orphaned, the U.N. humanitarian office (OCHA) said.



Afghan agency says earthquake survivors need cash; enough aid for now

"People ask for cash in the areas, they say they've received enough aid," the deputy head of the Afghan Red Crescent Society (ARCS), Mullah Noordden Turaby, told a news conference in Kabul.

◆ **US likely to announce this week purchase of missile defense system for Ukraine**

◆ **The United States** is likely to announce this week the purchase of an advanced medium to long range surface-to-air missile defence system for Ukraine, a source familiar with the matter told Reuters on Sunday.

Washington is also expected to announce other security assistance for Ukraine, including additional artillery ammunition and counter-battery radars to address needs expressed by the Ukrainian military, the source added. The weaponry is the latest assistance to be offered to Ukraine by the United States since Russia invaded its eastern European neighbor in February. This month, President Joe Biden agreed to provide Ukraine with \$700 million in military aid, including advanced rocket systems that can strike with precision at long-range targets.

◆ **NATO will increase** the number of its forces at high readiness massively to over 300,000, Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg said yesterday. "We will transform the NATO response force and increase the number of our high readiness forces to well over 300,000," he told reporters ahead of a NATO summit in Madrid later this week in Madrid. NATO's quick reaction force, the NATO response force, so far has some 40,000 troops.

◆ **France wants Iran, Venezuela return to oil markets**

◆ **France wants sanctions-hit** Iran and Venezuela to return to the oil markets to alleviate a Russian squeeze of energy supplies that has spiked prices, a French presidency official said yesterday. It also wants a planned mechanism to cap the price of oil to be as broad as possible and not be limited to Russian output.



The French official also said Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy told G7 leaders on Monday morning that the conditions were not right to negotiate with Russia and wanted to be in a position of strength before began any negotiations.

Russia defaulted on its international bonds for the first time in more than a century, the White House said, as sweeping sanctions have effectively cut the country off from the global financial system, rendering its assets untouchable.

The Kremlin, which has the money to make payments thanks to oil and gas revenues, swiftly rejected the claims, and has accused the West of driving it into an artificial default.

Earlier, some bondholders said they had not received overdue interest on Monday following the

expiry of a key payment deadline on Sunday. Russia has struggled to keep up payments on \$40 billion of outstanding bonds since its invasion of Ukraine on Feb. 24.

"This morning's news around the finding of Russia's default, for the first time in more than a century, situates just how strong the actions are that the U.S., along with allies and partners have taken, as well as how dramatic the impact has been on Russia's economy," the U.S. official said on the sidelines of a G7 summit in Germany.

Russia's efforts to avoid what would be its first major default on international bonds since the Bolshevik revolution more than a century ago hit a roadblock in late May when the US Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) effectively blocked Moscow from making payments.

"Since March we thought that a Russian default is probably inevitable, and the question was just when," Dennis Hranitzky, head of sovereign litigation at law firm Quinn Emanuel, told Reuters ahead of the Sunday deadline.

"OFAC has intervened to answer that question for us, and the default is now upon us."

Pledging new sanctions, G7 to stand 'for as long as it takes'

The Group of Seven club of wealthy nations yesterday vowed to stand with Ukraine "for as long as it takes", promising to tighten the squeeze on Russia's finances with new sanctions that include a proposal to cap the price of Russian oil.

The announcement came after Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskiy, addressing G7 leaders at their summit in the Bavarian Alps via a video

link, asked for weapons and air defences to gain the upper hand in the war against Russia within months.

The G7 statement aimed to signal that its members were ready to back Ukraine for the long haul, at a time when soaring inflation and energy shortages - fuelled by Russia's invasion - have tested the West's sanctions resolve.

"We will continue to provide financial, humanitarian, military and diplomatic support

Magnificent ancient mosaic found near Tel Aviv

An exceptionally well-preserved Roman floor mosaic, showing a rich variety of fish, animals, birds and ships, has returned to the site where it was first found in a Tel Aviv suburb after a decade-long tour of some of the world's top museums.

The 1,700 year-old mosaic, from the late Roman period, was discovered in 1996 during highway construction work, but was not put on display until 2009, when sufficient funding to preserve it was donated.

The design of the mosaic was influenced by North African mosaics and lacks any depiction of people, suggesting it may have belonged to a Christian or a Jew who wanted to avoid pagan attributes such as depiction of Roman gods, said archaeologist Amir Gorzalczany from the Israel Antiquities Authority.

The mosaic will now be exhibited at an archaeological centre built where it was found, in Lod.

The payments in question are \$100 million in interest on two bonds, one denominated in US dollars and another in euros, that Russia was due to pay on May 27. The payments had a grace period of 30 days, which expired on Sunday. Russia rejected claims that it had defaulted on its external debt for the first time in more than a century, telling investors to go to Western financial agents for the cash which was sent but bondholders did not receive. "Statements of a default are absolutely unjustified," Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said. Russia's finance ministry said it made the payments to its onshore National Settlement Depository (NSD) in euros and dollars, adding it had fulfilled obligations. In a call with reporters, Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said the fact that payments had been blocked by Euroclear because of Western sanctions on Russia was "not our problem".

Cannabis use has risen with legalisation and COVID lockdowns, UN report says

- Legalizing drug appears to increase regular use, UNODC says
- Cannabis on market getting stronger in terms of THC content
- Cocaine production, US opioid overdose deaths hit records

Places including US states that have legalised cannabis appear to have increased its regular use, while COVID lockdowns had a similar effect, raising the risk of depression and suicide, a UN report said yesterday. Cannabis has long been the world's most widely used drug and that use is increasing while the cannabis on the market is getting stronger in terms of its tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) content, the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) said in its annual World Drug Report. Various US states have legal-

ised non-medical use of cannabis, starting with Washington and Colorado in 2012. Uruguay legalised it in 2013, as did Canada in 2018. Others have taken similar steps but the report focused on those three countries. "Cannabis legalisation appears to have accelerated the upwards trends in reported daily use of the drug," the Vienna-based UNODC's report said. While the prevalence of can-

nabis use among teenagers "has not changed much", there had been "a pronounced increase in reported frequent use of high-potency products among young adults", it said. "The proportion of people with psychiatric disorders and suicides associated with regular cannabis use has increased." The report said roughly 284 million people, or 5.6% of the world's population, had used a drug such as heroin, cocaine, amphetamines or ecstasy in 2020, the most recent data available. Of those, 209 million used cannabis. "Periods of lockdown during the COVID-19 pandemic drove increases in the use of cannabis ... in 2020," it said. Cocaine production hit a record in 2020 and trafficking by sea is growing, it added, with 2021 seizure data suggesting an expansion outside the two main markets of North America and Europe into Africa and Asia.

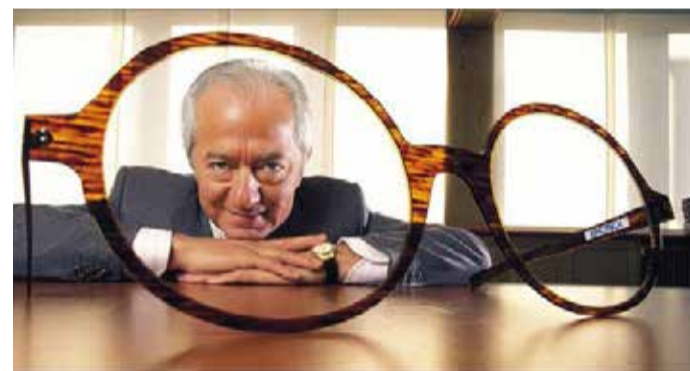

Italian eyewear tycoon Leonardo Del Vecchio dies at 87

Italy's Leonardo Del Vecchio, who rose from childhood poverty to build the eyewear empire that owns brands such as Ray-Ban and Oakley, has died at the age of 87, his company said yesterday. Del Vecchio added a dash of Italian style to spectacles and became one of Europe's wealthiest men, investing some of his riches to build influential stakes in Italian financial companies Mediobanca and Generali. The billionaire founded the Luxottica business in 1961, initially to supply components for glasses, and remained the chairman and major shareholder in the world's biggest eyewear group after it combined forces with France's Essilor in 2018. Fashion designer Giorgio Armani was among those to pay tribute to Del Vecchio with whom he had worked since the



1980s. "Together, we invented a phenomenon that did not exist: we immediately realised that glasses, from simple functional objects would become indispensable fashion accessories," Armani said. Partly raised in an orphanage, Del Vecchio's rags-to-riches story mirrored Italy's own recovery after World War Two. "Leonardo Del Vecchio was a great Italian. His story, from or-

phanage to leadership of a business empire, seems like a story from another time. But it is an example for today and tomorrow. RIP," European Economy Commissioner Paolo Gentiloni said on Twitter. Del Vecchio's influence extended beyond his own business and at the end of 2021, he was Italy's second richest man behind Giovanni Ferrero of the Nutella-making group, according to Forbes.

Qatar to host indirect Iran-US talks on reviving 2015 nuclear deal

Qatar will host indirect talks between Iran and the United States in the coming days, Iranian media reported yesterday, amid a push by the European Union to break a months-long impasse in the negotiations to reinstate a 2015 nuclear pact. "Iran has chosen Qatar to host the talks because of Do-

ha's friendly ties with Tehran," Mohammad Marandi, a media adviser to Iran's top nuclear negotiator, told the ISNA news agency on Monday. In March, the pact appeared close to being secured when the EU - which is coordinating negotiations - invited foreign ministers representing the accord's parties to Vienna to finalise an agreement after 11 months of indirect talks between Tehran and President Joe Biden's administration. But the talks have since been suspended, chiefly over Tehran's insistence that Washington remove the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), its elite security force, from the US Foreign Terrorist Organization list. The European Union's foreign policy chief Josep Borrell, who traveled to Iran last week, said on Saturday the indirect talks were expected to resume in the coming days in a Gulf country.

WFP cuts Yemen food rations further due to funding gap, inflation

Reuters | Aden

The World Food Programme said it has further reduced rations in Yemen, where millions face hunger, due to critical funding gaps, global inflation and knock-on effects of the Ukraine conflict.

The United Nations body feeds 13 million people a month in Yemen, where the economy has been wrecked by seven years of war. The country of some 30 million people imports most of its food.

"We are now being driven to scale back that support for 5 million of those people to less than 50% of the daily requirement, and for the other 8 million to around 25% of the daily requirement," WFP said in a Twitter post on Sunday.

"Resilience and livelihood activities, and school feeding and nutrition programs, will cease for 4 million people, leaving assistance available for only 1.8 million people."

The WFP had since January reduced rations for 8 million people and warned in May that it could soon have to make further cuts after raising only a quarter of the \$2 billion it needs for Yem-

en this year from international donors. The number of people living in near-famine conditions in the Arabian Peninsula country is expected to rise to seven million in the second half of 2022 from

around five million. Disruption to global wheat supplies due to the Ukraine war and a wheat export ban by India risk deepening Yemen's hunger crisis and pushing up food price inflation, which had al-

ready doubled in just two years in some parts of the country. The planning minister in the Saudi-backed government warned on Friday that Yemen's wheat stockpile could be depleted by mid-July and urged

European Union states to help secure new markets to replace Ukrainian and Russian wheat. Yemen is facing a foreign reserves shortage and a serious devaluation of the currency in some regions.

Local traders are also struggling to import flour, rice, sugar and petroleum products due to high prices, the vice-chairman of the Federation of Yemen Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Abu Baker Baobaid, told Reuters.

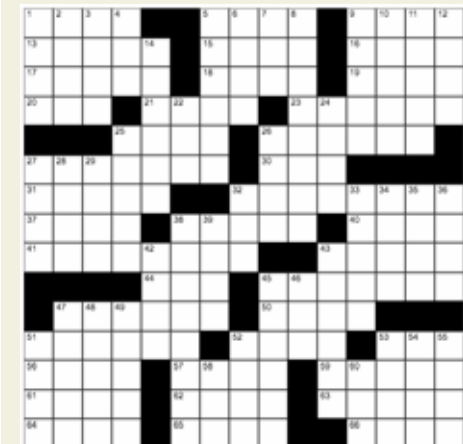

Bairstow seals England clean sweep of New Zealand

Jonny Bairstow led England to a whitewash of Test world champions New Zealand with a stunning fifty on his Headingley home ground yesterday.

England, set a target of 296 for victory, finished on 296-3 to win the third Test by seven wickets.

Bairstow was 71 not out, having compiled England's second-fastest Test fifty of all time by reaching the landmark in just 30 balls.

Former England captain Joe Root was 86 not out, having started the day on an unbeaten 55 before sharing a partnership of 111 with Yorkshire team-mate Bairstow.

Rain washed out the morning session to leave England, 183-2 overnight, with a nominal 78 overs in which to score the 113 more runs they needed for victory.

But they required just 15.2 overs, with Bairstow ending the match after just over an hour's play yesterday with a six over deep midwicket off spinner Michael Bracewell.

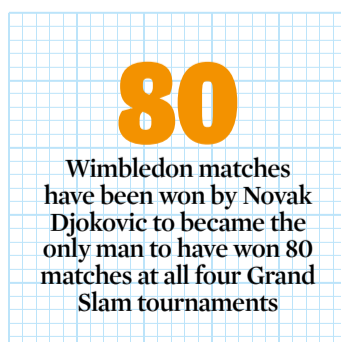

Djokovic had not played a grasscourt warm-up tournament and he admitted that did not help his game against a



tough opponent, 11 years his junior.

"I didn't have any lead-up or preparation tournaments prior to this so you're always going to feel a bit less comfortable than

you would like, particularly if you're playing against someone as talented as Kwon who stays close to the line and hits really clean," he said.

"It wasn't easy. I had to put some variety in the game. The serve helped but at this level one or two shots decide a winner."

The 24-year-old Korean broke Djokovic's serve in the fourth game of the second set and went on to win it with a drop-shot and a big serve.

But the Serb, aiming to win a 21st Grand Slam title, recovered enough of his trademark consistency to see off the challenge.
