New Fishing Law takes effect today

Bahrain's new Fishing Law takes effect today, requiring the presence of a Bahraini fisherman on all vessels engaged in commercial sea fishing.

The legislation also links crew sizes to vessel length and imposes fines and jail terms for violations.
