The Coast Guard announced that a 52-year-old man who went missing while practising diving was found dead in the Fasht Al-Adham area following intensive search operations. The necessary legal procedures have been taken, according to the Coast Guard.

Israeli Strikes in Gaza

Three people were killed in Israeli strikes across the Gaza Strip on Thursday, according to the territory's civil defence agency, while the Israeli military said it had targeted Hamas militants.

The latest violence comes despite a US-backed ceasefire that took effect in October 2025. Israel has continued carrying out strikes against Palestinians it says are members of Hamas.

The civil defence agency said a man died from injuries sustained in an Israeli drone strike on a house in the Al-Shati refugee camp, west of Gaza City.

Bahrain Rallies the Gulf Around a Unified Cyber Defence

In a era where digital threats evolve faster than borders can contain them, Bahrain stepped forward as the Gulf's cybersecurity convenor — bringing together the region's top digital defence minds under one roof.

Shaikh Salman bin Mohammed Al Khalifa, Chief Executive of Bahrain's National Cybersecurity Centre, chaired the fifth meeting of the GCC Ministerial Committee for Cybersecurity in Manama — a high-stakes gathering held under the Kingdom's presidency of the 46th GCC session, and attended by GCC Secretary-General Jassem



Mohammed Al Budaiwi.

Shaikh Salman framed the committee not as a routine forum, but as a strategic nerve centre for Gulf digital unity. The meetings, he stressed, serve as a platform for aligning visions, synchronising approaches, and building a cyber-ready Gulf ca-

pable of confronting tomorrow's threats today.

With the technological landscape shifting at breakneck speed, Shaikh Salman called for a unified Gulf position — one that transforms shared values into shared defences, and national interests into collective resilience.

Delegates reviewed joint GCC cybersecurity initiatives, examined coordination mechanisms, and charted pathways toward a trusted, secure Gulf cyberspace that protects common interests and underpins the region's sustainable development ambitions.

Held at the landmark Kazan Expo International Exhibition Centre from August 26 to 28, the forum drew global energy leaders to debate the sector's most pressing challeng-

Taking the floor during a high-level panel discussion, Dr. Bin Daina delivered a pointed message: oil and gas remain the backbone of global energy security and economic growth, but the industry must evolve. He called for bold investment in operational efficiency, national talent, and cutting-edge technologies — singling out artificial intelligence



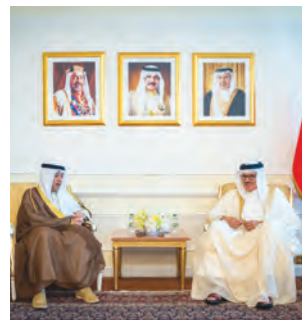
and data analytics as game-changers in driving resource efficiency and building a more resilient, sustainable

The visit also carried a diplomatic dimension — the minister held talks with Rustam Minnikhanov, Rais of the Republic of Tatarstan, exploring new avenues of cooperation between Bahrain and Tatarstan, with energy collaboration firmly at the top of the agenda.

Bahrain, GCC Discuss Regional Issues

Al Fateh Highway closure



The Ministry of Works announced that resurfacing work on Al Fateh Highway will require closing the fast and middle lanes at the junction with Tarafa Bin Al Abd Avenue for southbound traffic towards Mina Salman. One lane will remain open to traffic during the closure.

The closure will be in effect from today until 5:00 am on Sunday, August 30. The ministry urged all road users to follow traffic rules and instructions and exercise caution to ensure everyone's safety.

US says 90 citizens missing in Nepal

The US State Department on Thursday said 90 Americans were missing after the Nepal floods, adding that no US deaths had been reported.

"We're currently tracking 90 Americans who may be impacted by the flood, currently unaccounted for," a spokesperson said.

The State Department confirmed it had rescued three Americans and was not aware of any US deaths.



Bahrain backs Yemen’s efforts for peace and stability

Minister of Foreign Affairs Dr. Abdulatif bin Rashid Al Zayani met with Yemen’s Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriate Affairs Dr. Afrah Al Zouba during her visit to the Kingdom of Bahrain.

Dr. Al Zayani congratulated Dr. Al Zouba on assuming her new post and wished her success in leading Yemeni diplomacy during what he described as a pivotal period in Yemen’s history.

He affirmed Bahrain’s support for the Yemeni government in its efforts to achieve

security and stability and fulfil the aspirations of the Yemeni people for development and prosperity.

Dr. Al Zouba highlighted the longstanding historical ties between Bahrain and Yemen and the continued growth of relations between the two countries at various levels. She stressed the two countries’ commitment to further strengthening cooperation in ways that serve their common interests.

The Yemeni Foreign Minister also expressed her government’s appreciation for Bahrain’s supportive position towards efforts to reach a peaceful settlement in Yemen,

achieve peace and stability, and preserve freedom of navigation in the Bab Al Mandab Strait.

The meeting reviewed bilateral cooperation and ways to enhance it across areas of mutual interest, including economic, trade and development cooperation.

The two sides also discussed the latest regional developments, including the repercussions of developments affecting the freedom and safety of maritime navigation in the Strait of Hormuz and the Bab Al Mandab Strait on international trade, energy and food supplies, as well as the global economy.

New Digital Upgrade Speeds Storage Site Requests

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As part of ongoing government efforts to improve service quality and re-engineer government procedures, the Supreme Council for Environment has developed its service for requesting the addition of a storage site.

The upgraded digital service enables establishments to register storage sites for chemicals and refrigerant gases, as well as refrigeration and air-conditioning units. Registering a storage site is a mandatory requirement before any product can be registered for import, strengthening compliance with approved safety and environmental storage requirements.

Under the upgraded service,



processing time has been reduced from 20 working days to just seven. This was achieved by reducing required documents and information, automating application submission and review procedures, streamlining the application process, and providing the service fully online.

The service also facilitates data access, supporting greater efficiency in inspection and regulatory activities.

Supreme Council for Environment Chief Executive Officer Amina Hamad Al Rumaihi said the service is part of the council’s efforts to adopt innovative digital solutions that enhance the effi-

ciency of government procedures supporting investment, improve compliance with legislative and regulatory requirements, and facilitate the business environment.

She added that developing the service reflects the council’s commitment to enhancing its services to reduce the time and effort required from institutions and investors while strengthening the effectiveness of the overall work system.

As part of the government’s continued efforts to develop and re-engineer government services, more than 1,300 government services have been documented, translated and published, while 800 services have undergone development and re-engineering across various government sectors.

Police, LMRA Move to Strengthen Inspections

Chief of Public Security Lt. Gen. Tariq bin Hassan Al Hassan received Nibras Mohammed Taleb, Chief Executive Officer of the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA), in the presence of several directors and officials from the Ministry of Interior and LMRA.

At the beginning of the meeting, the Chief of Public Security welcomed the LMRA CEO and praised the level of cooperation between the Ministry of Interior and the authority, highlighting the ongoing coordination in implementing joint initiatives and procedures that strengthen compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

The meeting reviewed the latest



statistics and data related to the labour situation in Bahrain, as well as key field challenges and mechanisms for addressing them to enhance efforts to regulate the labour market and reduce violations.

The two sides also discussed ways to further develop joint cooperation, particularly by intensifying joint inspection campaigns, strengthening field coordination and information exchange to ensure the swift detection of viola-

tions and the taking of legal measures, while continuing efforts to regularise the status of violating workers in accordance with approved laws and procedures.

At the conclusion of the meeting, both sides stressed the importance of continued coordination and integration among relevant authorities to enhance the efficiency of inspection campaigns and support national efforts to regulate the labour market.

Hidd School Closure Sparks Row Over Timing

MP BuAnaq says existing law already gives ministry powers to act after ACA Bahrain shutdown

A private school in Hidd has been shut before a single lesson was taught after its investors ran into financial trouble, with MP Khalid BuAnaq defending the timing of the closure and rejecting a councillor's call for a set notice period before schools close.

Mr BuAnaq said closing the school before the 2026-27 academic year began had spared nearly 200 students and their families from being left without places once term was under way.

The councillor had called for a clear law requiring advance notice before a closure and laying down how students, fees and Bahraini staff should be dealt with. He argued that families and workers should not be faced with a sudden shutdown. Mr BuAnaq disagreed.

'There is no need for any further legislation on this,' he said, arguing that Parliament had al-

ready passed the Private Educational Institutions Law during the last legislative session.

He said the law gave the Education Ministry the powers it needed to examine schools' finances and act in cases such as ACA Bahrain.

The Education Ministry cancelled the educational licence of American Creativity Academy (ACA Bahrain), which offered the American and International Baccalaureate (IB) curricula, at the investors' request due to financial difficulties.

The Industry and Commerce Ministry has said the academy's commercial registration remains active pending an application to liquidate it.

Mr BuAnaq praised the Education Ministry's handling of the case, saying it acted before families were left searching for school places after term had begun.

'The ministry's decision was right and came to protect the interests of pupils and their parents,' he told The Daily Tribune.

The school was still being established and had yet to open its doors when a dispute broke out between its private investors over money, according to Mr BuAnaq.

The investors asked for the school to close, but the ministry first required every fee collected from registered students to be returned.

It also required the closure to take place before the school year began and stepped in to move pupils to other private schools.

Around 80 pc of those registered have now been placed elsewhere, Mr BuAnaq said,

with work continuing to find places for the rest.

Staff will be dealt with under Bahrain's Labour Law rather than education law, using the rules that apply to private-sector workers in such cases.

Mr BuAnaq said the existing law also allowed the Education Ministry to obtain detailed reports on ACA Bahrain's finances before cancelling its licence.

He thanked Education Minister Dr Mohammed bin Mubarak Juma for putting pupils and their families first.

Civil Defence Urges Motorists to Prioritise Safety



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The General Directorate of Civil Defence has launched an awareness campaign targeting motorists to promote a culture of prevention and safety, raise awareness of vehicle safety measures, and reduce risks and accidents associated with vehicles.

Brigadier Pilot Ali Mohamed Al Qubaisi, Director General of the General Directorate of Civil Defence, said the campaign included advice and guidance on the importance of conducting regular vehicle inspections, ensuring the safety of tyres and essential systems, and instructions on the proper use of fire extinguishers.

He explained that the campaign also focused on how to respond to emergencies, particularly when smoke emerges from or a fire breaks out in a vehicle. Motorists are advised to stop in a safe location,

switch off the engine, evacuate the vehicle immediately and call the emergency services on 999. A fire extinguisher may be used if the fire is minor and doing so is safe.

Al Qubaisi said the campaign forms part of the Civil Defence Directorate's ongoing efforts to strengthen prevention, promote community partnership and spread safe practices that help protect lives and property.

He stressed that safety is a shared responsibility that begins with awareness and is reinforced through commitment.

School Bus Driver Faces Trial

Driver accused of travelling against traffic after the incident was captured on video and circulated online.



The Public Prosecution referred a school bus driver to criminal trial after accusing him of driving against the direction of traffic on a public road.

The Traffic Prosecution opened an investigation after a video showed the driver

travelling in the wrong direction in a way that could have endangered other road users. The driver was identified, arrested, questioned, and admitted to the offence after being shown the footage. He was detained pending trial.

Fraud Case Ends in Jail Term

Court upholds prison sentence and fine over forged records used to obtain government support.

The Fifth High Criminal Appeals Court upheld a one-year prison sentence and BD1,000 fine against a defendant convicted of forging electronic and private documents to unlawfully obtain more than BD50,000 from Tamkeen and the Social Insurance Organisation.

The case followed complaints that forged documents and false information were submitted through electronic



systems to obtain wage support and social insurance benefits. The court had sentenced five defendants to prison terms ranging from 10 years to one year, while acquitting another defendant for lack of conclusive evidence.

BD143,606 Money Laundering

Appeals Court upholds five-year sentence, BD50,000 fine and confiscation of laundered funds.

The Fifth High Criminal Appeals Court upheld a five-year prison sentence and BD50,000 fine against a defendant convicted of laundering BD143,606. The court also ordered the confiscation of the same amount from his funds and assets.

The case involved proceeds from offences including electronic fraud, forgery and unauthorised access to information systems. The defendant was accused of withdrawing and transferring the proceeds through various bank accounts and transactions to give the funds an appearance



of legitimacy. The ruling was reconsidered after the Court of Cassation found that the defence had not been given an adequate opportunity to present its case.

Subsidised Flour Sentence Reduced

Prison term replaced with community service while BD250 fine and confiscation order remain in place.

The Fifth High Criminal Appeals Court replaced a three-month prison sentence with community service for a bakery worker convicted of unlawfully disposing of government-subsidised flour.

The Court of First Instance had also imposed a BD250 fine and ordered the confiscation of the seized items. The court found that subsidised flour had been used to produce bread before the required approval was obtained from the Consumer Protection Di-



rectorate. The Appeals Court applied leniency under Article 74 of the Penal Code while maintaining the fine and confiscation order

Powers Up Sustainable Mobility

New EV Charging Station Signals Bahrain's Push for Greener Transport



The Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications launched an electric vehicle charging station at its headquarters as part of a joint initiative with Zayani Investments and Al Salam Bank to support sustainable mobility and encourage electric vehicle adoption.

The initiative included installing the charging station, allocating a dedicated parking space for electric vehicles and placing relevant signage.

Fatima Abdulla Al Dhaen, Undersecretary for Land Transport and Postal Affairs at the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications, said the initiative supports developing sustainable transport and adopting environmentally friendly technologies and solutions.

She emphasised the importance of developing infrastructure for sustainable mobility and strengthening partnerships with the private sector to support practical sustain-



ability initiatives and reduce carbon emissions.

A number of electric vehicles were also displayed at the ministry's headquarters to familiarise employees with available technologies and models and highlight the benefits of electric vehicles.

Zayani Investments and Al Salam Bank underscored the importance of public-private sector cooperation in expanding electric vehicle infrastructure, promoting sustainable transport options and reducing environmental impact.

The initiative seeks to transform neighbourhoods and local areas into interactive community spaces that bring together young people and families through programmes centred on talent, creativity, heritage, technology and entertainment.

The first festival stop is being organised in cooperation with the Popular Heritage Committee and will combine Bahraini her-



itage with contemporary youth interests. The programme will feature activities celebrating national heritage while providing young people opportunities to showcase their talents, creative work and projects.

The festival forms part of the Ministry of Youth Affairs’ efforts to strengthen youth participation in their local communities by creating interactive platforms where young people can contribute to event design and implementation. The initiative also aims to

encourage community engagement, initiative and a sense of belonging while strengthening ties among residents.

Built around the concept of “from the community to the community,” the festival will move throughout the year between four locations across Bahrain’s governorates in cooperation with youth empowerment centres. The approach is designed to bring renewed activities closer to residents and turn neighbourhoods into community destinations for different age groups.

Al Fereej Festival primarily targets young people aged 15 to 35, while its programmes are also open to young people and families, creating an inclusive environment that encourages interaction and active participation rather than attendance alone.

Royal Humanitarian Foundation Children Participate in the “Smart Learner” Programme

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A number of children of the Royal Humanitarian Foundation from the intermediate school level participated in the “Smart Learner” Programme, organized by Kerne – a Bahraini youth community – over a period of three weeks, with the participation of 30 male and female students.

utilize AI tools in their studies. It also sought to develop their innovation and teamwork skills through practical activities, applications, and a final project.

The GCC Common Market was launched in January 2008 under the GCC Economic



Agreement. It provides for GCC citizens to be treated equally with citizens of any GCC member state, without discrimination, across various economic

sectors.

These areas include mobility, employment, investment, real estate ownership, company establishment, education, health-

care and social services, among other fields aimed at advancing Gulf economic integration and meeting the aspirations of GCC citizens.

Nvidia earnings lift tech stocks as investors await Fed outlook

AI chip giant reports stronger-than-expected revenue, while inflation concerns keep broader markets cautious

Technology stocks moved higher on Thursday after Nvidia reported stronger-than-expected earnings, although gains across wider markets remained limited as investors awaited signals on the future direction of US interest rates.

Nvidia, the world's largest company by market value, reported second-quarter revenue of around \$96 billion, more than double its revenue from a year earlier. The company also issued a strong forecast for the current quarter, sending



its shares sharply higher and boosting investor confidence in continued demand for artificial intelligence technology.

The gains spread to Asian semiconductor companies, with SK hynix, Samsung and Kioxia also recording advances.

However, persistent inflation and rising government bond yields continued to limit market optimism. The Federal Reserve's preferred inflation gauge remained elevated in July, raising concerns that in-

terest rates could remain higher for longer.

Investors are now focused on the Federal Reserve chairman's speech at the annual central bankers' conference in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, where markets are looking for clues about monetary policy.

Oil prices also recovered after recent declines as investors monitored diplomatic efforts surrounding the Strait of Hormuz. Shipping traffic through the strategic waterway remains significantly below normal levels, keeping supply concerns in focus.

On Wall Street, the Nasdaq led gains, while the S&P 500 rose modestly and the Dow was broadly unchanged. European markets were mixed.

Death toll **rises** after Nepal-Tibet floods, 1,400 missing

Hundreds of foreign tourists and Hindu pilgrims stranded near Chinese border

- Death toll reaches 362
- Glacial collapse triggers disaster
- Risk of further flooding remains high

Rescue teams waded through mud yesterday searching for more than 1,400 people missing after flash floods and landslides struck the Nepal-Tibet border, as the death toll rose sharply to at least 362, with entire villages swept away.

Experts warned of the risk of further floods a day after the devastating tsunami-like wall of freezing water and mud wiped out towns under a torrent of sludge, engulfing homes, smashing bridges and dams, and sweeping vehicles away like toys.

Many of the missing are foreign tourists, including scores of Hindu pilgrims to Tibet's sacred snow-capped Mount Kailash.

According to the US Geological Survey (USGS), the disaster was caused by a glacial collapse that triggered a vast flow of icy debris.

Emergency teams were racing to pluck survivors from affected zones, while Nepali soldiers used sniffer dogs to search for bodies buried under the suffocating dirt.

"Everything is finished," Omkar Joshi, a 35-year-old Nepali customs agent rescued from a hilltop in the border town of Timure, told AFP.

"It is a giant graveyard. All that is left are sand and pebbles, soaked red by human blood."

Nepali police said they had recovered 359 bodies.

Another 910 people, including 517 foreign tourists, were out of contact in the country. Beijing said 100 Chinese citizens are missing in Nepal.

In China, state media said the "mudslide disaster" at the Gyirong Port in Tibet killed three people, while 558 people, including 260 foreigners, are missing.

Chinese Premier Li Qiang visited the area yesterday, state media said, to oversee "emergency rescue and relief work, and to visit rescue workers and affected people".

Li Qipu, a member of China's paramilitary People's Armed Police, cited "the instability of a reservoir lake upstream" and "the narrow mountain road" as elements complicating rescue efforts.

China's Tibet Autonomous Region is largely inaccessible to foreign journalists.

'Inland tsunami'

Prime Minister Balendra Shah, who urged the Himalayan nation to "stand together" hours after the disaster, visited some of the hardest-hit areas yesterday.

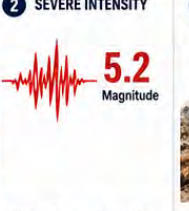

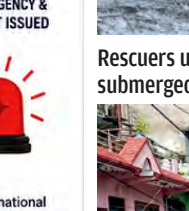

States, Nepal's tourism board said.

The sudden rush of mud and debris was "like an inland tsunami", travelling nearly 170 kilometres (105 miles) south into Nepal, said environmental historian Ruth Gamble, of Australia's La Trobe University.

Rasuwa, in the north of Nepal, was the first district to be affected, but deaths were reported as far south as Chitwan, on the border with India.

Buddhist spiritual leader the Dalai Lama, who lives in exile in India, said he would "pray for all those who have lost their lives".

Chinese government officials in Tibet mobilised nearly 800 emergency workers, as well as sniffer dogs and speed boats to help the rescue efforts, the official Xinhua news agency said.

Promises of aid and assistance came in soon after reports of the scale of the disaster.

The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies said it was sending emergency supplies including blankets, first aid kits, stretchers and body bags.

Glacial collapse

The USGS said the flood was sparked by a glacial collapse, which caused seismic activity and the "catastrophic" downstream impacts in Nepal and Tibet.

"This event was initially reported as a magnitude 4.4 earthquake," it said, but the seismic recordings were analysed and it was found instead to be a "glacial collapse and debris flow".

Climate change is causing glaciers to melt worldwide, increasing the risks of glacial lake floods and glacial collapses.

Fears of more potential floods remain, with water trapped by the immense piles of debris blocking the valley.

"With a blockage still lodged upstream on the Nepal-China border river, authorities warn a second flood may occur," said Qianggong Zhang, head of climate and environmental risks at the Kathmandu-based International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development.

Katmandu's Flood Forecasting Division issued a "special notice" yesterday, warning of a growing lake behind debris left by the landslide.

"Residents of downstream areas of the Bhothe Koshi River, travellers, rescue personnel, and all concerned are requested to exercise extreme caution," it said. Scores of Hindu devotees from across the world are among the hundreds missing on the border, Indian spiritual leader Sadhguru said yesterday.

They were returning from a holy pilgrimage to Mount Kailash, on the Chinese side of the frontier, when they were caught in the floods at an immigration post.

"The entire group was there in the building," Sadhguru said in a video message to his millions of followers, weeping as he spoke from Tibet, with the anguished wails of other pilgrims heard in the background.

"This is a terrible and extraordinary event."



Iran, Qatar hold Hormuz talks

Talks focus on navigation and de-escalation

Iran's top diplomat met his Qatari counterpart yesterday in Tehran for talks on the strategic Strait of Hormuz, as a US naval blockade squeezes oil supplies to Iran amid a domestic shortfall.

The visit by Qatar's Foreign Minister Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani follows a week of intense diplomacy in Iran involving separate meetings with Oman's top diplomat and senior Pakistani officials seeking ways to end the Middle East war and reopen Hormuz.

It also comes as Washington threatens wider secondary sanctions against countries, banks and companies that continue doing business with Iran, part of a broader campaign it has called "economic asphyxiation".

Iranian state television said Al Thani, who is also Qatar's prime minister, had met with Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi, without providing details.

Qatar's foreign ministry said they discussed de-escalation efforts as well as the proposed framework for Hormuz between Iran and Oman.

Al Thani "emphasised the necessity of respecting the sovereignty of neighbouring states and freedom of navigation", and pursuing dialogue, the ministry said.

Alongside mediator Pakistan, Qatar had played a key role in securing an April ceasefire and June deal between Iran and the

Iran and Oman have agreed in principle on a temporary joint shipping corridor through Hormuz and a joint mine-clearing project

United States, but those deals have since collapsed.

Fuel shortage

Since war with the United States broke out on February 28, Iran has maintained tight control over Hormuz, a vital global energy conduit, with Washington imposing a naval counter-blockade on Iranian ports.

On Wednesday, Iran's Vice President Mohammad Jafar Ghaempanah said the blockade had prevented his country from importing enough petrol to cover a shortfall in domestic production.

"Petrol production is insufficient, and because of the US naval blockade, we cannot import it," he was quoted by the official IRNA news agency as saying.

In recent days, many Iranians have been seen queueing outside petrol stations. Presidential chief of staff Mohsen Haji-Mirzaei meanwhile said petrol quotas would be reviewed, without elaborating.

Iran, a major oil producer with some of the world's cheapest fuel, has for years heavily subsidised petrol, making changes to pricing politically sensitive.

As the United States seeks to strangle Iran's economy, Iranian officials have dismissed the

measures as "failed policies" that will not force Tehran to change course.

"The country is in an all-out economic war," said Iran's top negotiator Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf in a statement carried by local media.

"We will see that the government... will defeat the enemy on this ground as well," he added.

Even before the war, Iran's economy was battered by decades of international sanctions, and has long suffered from chronic inflation and a weakening currency.

Talks on Hormuz

Iran has for weeks been in talks with Oman, which also overlooks the Hormuz strait, over a framework agreement that would establish a "temporary corridor" for shipping and provide for clearing mines Tehran says were laid during the war.

Iran's Revolutionary Guards on Wednesday said the two countries had agreed on each country's share of the waters and any revenues collected from managing the waterway.

Tehran has nonetheless insisted that the strait will not be reopened unless Washington meets its demands, including lifting its naval blockade, unfreezing Iranian assets abroad and removing oil sanctions.

Since the war broke out, Iranian forces have required vessels to obtain permission to transit the waterway and struck ships that failed to comply.

Tehran has also sought to impose service fees on ships using the strait -- a move strongly opposed by Washington and regional countries.

Yesterday, the United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations said an "unknown projectile" had struck a tanker in Hormuz this week, causing a fire that was later extinguished.

US sounds out NATO allies over Europe force review

A senior Pentagon official pressed NATO allies yesterday to explain how they were stepping up to meet US demands to take responsibility for Europe's defence as Washington reviews its forces on the continent.

President Donald Trump's administration has raised fears among allies that it could cut back its forces in Europe after launching a six-month review in July of its deployments.

"The spirit that we come in is obviously one... of consultation, of engagement. We want to hear from our allies,"

US Defense Under Secretary Elbridge Colby said on a visit for talks with NATO's headquarters in Brussels.

Washington has sent out a questionnaire asking European countries to show how they are making strides towards taking the lead on protecting their continent after agreeing to ramp up military budgets massively.

"We're actually having a kind of down-to-business conversation about how we go forward together in a world in which Europe, which is obviously a very wealthy continent, can and is taking primary responsibility for its own conventional defence," Colby said.

CIA director warned Russia not to attack NATO members: US media

A highly unusual trip by the CIA director to Moscow this week was to warn Russia against any attack on NATO member states, US media reported Wednesday, after President Donald Trump sought to downplay the visit.

The Wall Street Journal and CBS News reported CIA Director John Ratcliffe aimed to dissuade Russia from attacking NATO members amid US intelligence assessments that Moscow could seek to test the alliance.

The Journal specified that

Putin could test the North Atlantic Treaty Organization with a "limited assault" in the next few years.

The White House did not respond to requests for comment on the matter, and Trump said Ratcliffe's visit to Moscow on Tuesday was "semi-routine," implying that the intelligence chief was in the Russian capital to discuss the Ukraine war.

"He's there, very sort of semi-routine. I hate to disappoint people. We would like to see the war with Ukraine end," Trump said in an interview with conservative radio host Glenn Beck.

Norway holds its breath as King Harald's health deteriorates

Norway's royal family gathered yesterday at King Harald V's bedside in hospital after the palace announced that the health condition of the 89-year-old monarch, who is suffering from a blood disease, was "extremely serious".

Queen Sonja and 53-year-old Crown Prince Haakon, who is acting as regent during his father's illness, have cancelled all royal engagements and were with him at Oslo University Hospital, along with other family members.

Europe's oldest reigning monarch has been in hospital in Oslo since August 17 suffer-

ing from haemolytic anaemia, a condition caused by an abnormally rapid destruction of red blood cells which leads to fatigue and shortness of breath.

"His Majesty the King's health condition is extremely serious," the palace said, providing no specific details.

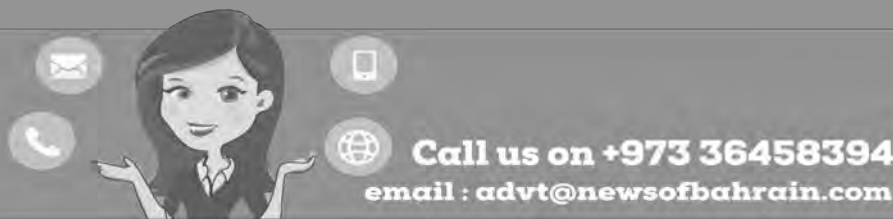

Visa and Mastercard process first international card payments in Syria in years

Move follows US removal of Syria from terrorism list and signals a step towards financial reintegration

Visa and Mastercard have processed international card payments in Syria for the first time in more than a decade, marking a significant development for the country's financial sector.

Mastercard said it worked with Qatar National Bank (QNB) Group to process Syria's first international card payment in more than 15 years. Visa separately confirmed that it had tested its first live international transaction in the country.

The developments come days after the United States removed Syria from its list of state sponsors of terrorism, a move that could help ease the country's long-standing economic isolation.

Visa said the transaction was carried out with Leba-

non-based Fransabank and Syrian electronic payments compa-

ny Paymera. Paymera later said it completed the first electronic payment using a Visa card.

The move comes as Syria seeks to reconnect with the global financial system following years of sanctions imposed during the country's civil war.

Syrian Central Bank Governor Safwat Raslan also highlighted the significance of the development after a Visa card was used to pay for coffee at a café in Damascus.

The return of international card services could improve payment options for visitors, support businesses and help Syria attract investment as it works towards economic recovery and reconstruction.

UAE presidential adviser calls for accurate and balanced reporting amid regional tensions

Credible and balanced media coverage is essential to protecting the truth from misinformation and manipulation amid heightened tensions in the region, Dr Anwar Mohammed Gargash, Diplomatic Adviser to the UAE President, has said.

In a post on X, Gargash highlighted the important role of the media during sensitive periods, saying competing narratives can influence the course and perception of regional conflicts.

He stressed that accuracy, fairness and professional responsibility should remain central to media coverage, particu-



larly when tensions are high.

Gargash said the media must understand the wider environment in which regional confrontations take place while avoiding misinformation and misleading narratives.

He also emphasised the im-

portance of protecting public awareness by providing audiences with reliable information and balanced reporting.

His comments come amid continuing regional tensions and an increasingly crowded information environment, where conflicting claims and narratives can spread rapidly across traditional and social media platforms.

Gargash has previously stressed the need for credible journalism and factual reporting as tools to counter misinformation, particularly during periods of political and security uncertainty.

Saudi Arabia reaffirms support for Palestine at OIC meeting

Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan has stressed the importance of Islamic solidarity amid the challenging circumstances facing the region, calling for stronger cooperation among Muslim countries.

Addressing the extraordinary meeting of the Council of Foreign Ministers of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), Prince Faisal reaffirmed Saudi Arabia's firm and long-standing support for the Palestinian cause.



He also condemned the repeated incursions into Al-Aqsa Mosque, stressing the King-

dom's position in support of protecting the holy site and safeguarding Palestinian rights.

Prince Faisal's remarks come as the region continues to face heightened political and security tensions, underscoring the need for coordinated positions and collective efforts among Islamic countries.

Saudi Arabia has consistently called for international efforts to support peace, protect civilians and advance a just and lasting solution to the Palestinian issue.

Kuwait and Pakistan sign defence and military cooperation agreement

Kuwait and Pakistan have signed a new defence and joint military cooperation agreement, strengthening the longstanding partnership between the two countries.

The agreement was signed by Pakistani Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif and Kuwaiti Defence Minister Sheikh Abdullah Ali Abdullah Al-Salem Al-Sabah during a meeting in Islamabad.

The two ministers discussed prospects for expanding co-operation in the defence and military sectors, as well as regional and international developments and issues of mutual interest.



Kuwait's Ministry of Defence described the agreement as an important milestone in bilateral military cooperation. The framework is expected to support greater operational coordination, exchange of expertise, military readiness and integration between the two countries' armed forces.

The discussions also focused

on efforts to contribute to security and stability in the region while strengthening the strategic partnership between Kuwait and Pakistan.

The agreement comes as both countries seek to further develop cooperation in areas of mutual interest and enhance their ability to respond to evolving regional security challenges.

“And I sent them back a video and I was like, ‘It means we get free tickets to Disney for life.’”

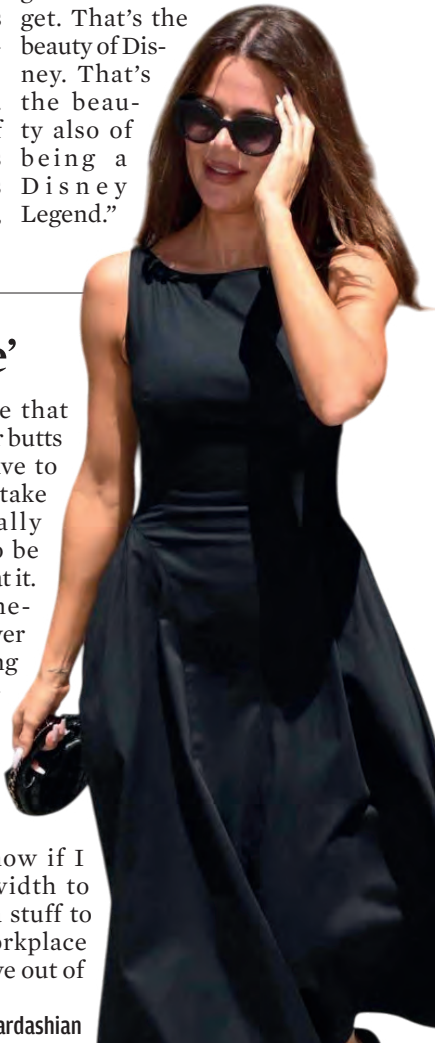
Dwayne noted it has been a “great year” for Jasmine and Tiana because they have cameos in the live-action version of Moana.

He added: “Knowing her ways, I’m sure she will stipulate all sorts of things and I think she is capable of putting all sorts of boundaries up.

“On the other hand, supposing she decides to go ahead, mean, actors are meant to do what they’re told to, frankly, in these series.

“If it demands something more, I don’t know how to put it, more sort of inappropriate, perhaps that’s the right word, appearance by her, then I

guess that will possibly happen.

“But I don’t think it will. I think she’ll be putting all sorts of clauses and boundaries in, because that’s the way she operates.”

Meghan became internationally known playing paralegal Rachel Zane in the US legal drama Suits, appearing in the series for seven seasons before leaving ahead of her marriage to Harry in 2018.

Her previous screen credits also include CSI: NY, 90210, Horrible Bosses, Anti-Social, When Sparks Fly and Dater’s Handbook.

She has since returned to acting with a cameo as herself in the forthcoming comedy Close Personal Friends, which also stars Brie Larson, Lily Collins, Jack Quaid and Henry Golding.

The Gentlemen stars Theo James as Eddie Horniman, an aristocratic former soldier who inherits his family estate before discovering that it forms part of an underground cannabis operation.

Bahrain will look to extend their unbeaten run at the 11th Asian Men's Youth Handball Championship when they face Saudi Arabia in a crucial quarter-final clash in Amman tonight. The Kingdom's under-19 side take on their Gulf rivals at Princess Sumaya Hall at 6pm, with victory securing both a place in the semi-finals and qualification for next year's IHF Men's Youth Handball World Championship. The youngsters head into the contest in impressive form after sweeping through the preliminary round with four wins from four to top Group A. They opened with a 51-20 victory over India before comfortably beating hosts Jordan 41-19. A 36-28 success against Uzbekistan secured their knockout-stage place, before a 35-27 triumph over South Korea on Wednesday completed their perfect group campaign. Ahmed Abdulla starred in the latter victory with a game-high eight goals. The Bahrainis

recovered from an 8-9 deficit to lead 15-11 at the break before pulling clear in the second half. Topping the group earned them a meeting with Saudi Arabia, who finished fourth in Group B and closed their preliminary campaign with a 30-28 defeat to Kuwait. A win tonight would also guarantee the Kingdom a return to the global stage, with all four semi-finalists qualifying for the 12th IHF Men's Youth Handball World Championship, scheduled for July 29 to August 9 next year. The national youth side have twice been crowned Asian champions, lifting the title in 2016 and 2018, while they also claimed bronze in 2010. Elsewhere in today's quarter-finals, South Korea face Kuwait at 2pm, Iran take on Uzbekistan at 4pm and Group B winners Qatar meet hosts Jordan at 8pm. Should Bahrain advance, they will face the winners of the Iran-Uzbekistan tie in Saturday's semi-finals. The medal matches will bring the championship to a close on Monday.

Volleyball squad prepare for Asian test

They followed that success with a run to the semi-finals of the AVC Men's Cup in Ahmedabad, where they entered as defending champions.

Their title defence ended with a 3-1 defeat to eventual champions Indonesia, before hosts India prevailed by the same scoreline in the third-place play-off to leave Bahrain fourth overall. Attention now turns to Japan, with the Korea camp providing a final opportunity to sharpen preparations ahead of the continental challenge.

The event also offers valuable UCI ranking points towards qualification for the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games.

Bahrain cagers off to flying Asian Cup start

Kingdom side launch pre-qualifying campaign in style against Oman

Bahrain made a flying start to their FIBA Asia Cup 2029 Pre-Qualifiers campaign last night, routing Oman 106-62 in their Group A opener in Dubai.

The kingdom's senior men's basketball national team took control early at Sheikh Saeed bin Maktoum Sports Hall in the UAE, leading 24-13 after the first quarter and 56-31 at half-time.

The Bahrainis, coached by Greek-Slovenian tactician Slobodan Subotic, continued to dominate after the break, taking an 80-46 advantage into the final period before completing a 44-point victory.

Mustafa Rashed led the national cagers with 21 points in just under 22 minutes, shooting eight-of-13 from the field, while Jakarr Sampson finished with 19 points and nine rebounds.

Ahmed Alderazi and Ahmed Bindaayneh added 13 points apiece, with Alderazi also handing out a game-high nine assists.

Bahrain are one of 18 national teams, 17 from Asia along with Fiji from Oceania, divided into four groups being hosted at separate locations in the pre-qualifiers' first round.

The top three from each group advance to the second round, giving Bahrain plenty to play for during their four-game Group A campaign in Dubai.

They made their intentions clear from the outset yesterday.

Rashed scored the opening four points before Mohamed

Buallay completed a three-point play for a 7-0 lead, with Oman not getting on the board until Ahmed Al-Halhali struck with 6:17 remaining.

Sampson was the standout of the opening quarter, scoring 15 points, including three three-pointers, as he remarkably outscored Oman 15-13 by himself during the period.

Bahrain then blew the game open in the second quarter.

After Ahmed Al-Sinani cut the deficit to 24-15, Subotic's men reeled off 17 unanswered points through Mohamed Juma, Mahmood Khalifa, Alderazi, Buallay and Bindaayneh to surge 41-15 ahead.

Oman responded with a 9-0 run, but Bahrain quickly restored control and Ali Rashed scored the final basket of the half to send his side into the interval 56-31 ahead.

There was no way back for Oman after the restart.

Rashed opened the second half with five straight points, and although Abdul-Rahman Al-Shaabi helped Oman briefly reduce the deficit, Bahrain responded immediately.

Bindaayneh's three-pointer with two seconds remaining made it 80-46 at the end of the third, before the Bahrainis outscored their opponents 26-16 in the fourth to complete the rout.

per cent from the field, including 41.9 per cent from three-point range, while converting 15 of their 17 free throws. They also outrebounded Oman 44-34 and registered 27 assists.

Hadid Bait Bakhit led Oman with 21 points and nine rebounds, while Al-Shaabi added 16 points.

Bahrain return to action today against hosts the UAE at 7pm, Bahrain time, before a rest day for all teams on Saturday.

They face Nepal on Sunday at 4pm and conclude their Group A campaign against Kuwait on Monday at 7pm.

The 12 teams progressing from the first round will be divided into two groups of six for the second round, to be played in a round-robin format between November 23 and December 1.

The top four from each group will then advance to the FIBA Asia Cup 2029 Qualifiers, joining the 16 teams that competed at the 2025 continental championship in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia.
