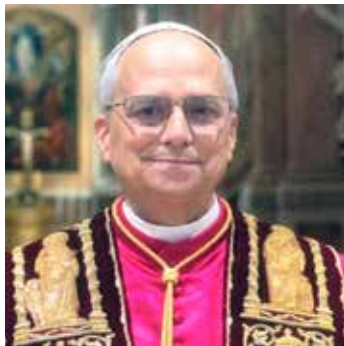

Shared vision

The Court of the Crown Prince said the visit underscores His Royal Highness's unwavering commitment to strengthening Bahrain's longstanding partnership with the Vatican City State and enhancing relations in support of shared aspirations and interests.

The meeting between HRH the Crown Prince and the Pope represents a new step in advancing bilateral cooperation founded on humanitarian values that promote coexistence, tolerance, and dialogue among religions

Relations between Bahrain and the Vatican have flourished under the leadership of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, supported by His Royal Highness the Crown Prince and Prime Minister. Their shared vision has positioned Bahrain as a regional and international centre for peace and mutual understanding.

Bahrain's record of protecting all religions and beliefs has earned it deep respect from the Vatican. The Kingdom's alignment with the Holy See on promoting noble humanitarian goals continues to elevate the relationship to advanced levels.

In November 1999, His Majesty visited the Vatican in the first year of his reign and met with the late Pope John Paul II, reflecting a vision of bridging East

and West. His Majesty's subsequent visit in May 2014, at the invitation of His Holiness Pope Francis, expanded dialogue and cooperation.

His Royal Highness visited the Vatican in February 2020, meeting Pope Francis and expressing Bahrain's appreciation for the Pontiff's efforts to advance mutual understanding and universal human values. These exchanges built the foundation for today's strong relations.

Vatican leaders have also strengthened ties through reciprocal visits, including that of Cardinal Pietro Parolin, the Vatican Secretary of State, in 2014, and Archbishop Francisco Montecillo Padilla, Apostolic Nuncio to Bahrain, in 2016. Both visits reaffirmed a shared commitment to peace and fraternity among peoples.

Better together

Bahrain calls for peaceful solutions and stronger multilateralism at UN General Assembly

New York

The Minister of Foreign Affairs, His Excellency Dr. Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani, delivered Bahrain's address before the United Nations General Assembly, reaffirming the Kingdom's commitment to peace, multilateral cooperation, and international law as guiding principles of its foreign policy.

Dr. Al Zayani underscored that Bahrain's election as a non-permanent member of the UN Security Council for 2026-2027 represents "a precious international trust that we appreciate and cherish," adding that the Kingdom is determined to play a constructive role in promoting global peace and security.

Central to his speech was the situation in the Middle East, particularly the war in Gaza.

Ceasefire

He called for "a comprehensive and permanent ceasefire in the Gaza Strip, the protection of civilians, the release of hostages and detainees, and the sustainable delivery of humanitarian aid."

He warned of the repercussions of the conflict on regional and global stability, reiterating Bahrain's support for diplomatic solutions.

Dr. Al Zayani urged the inter-

national community to back the initiative adopted by the 33rd Arab Summit, held in Bahrain earlier this year, to convene an international peace conference.

"We firmly believe in peace and that any conflict can only find a lasting solution through direct negotiations, political will, and a spirit of compromise," he said.

Priorities

Beyond the Palestinian issue, the minister highlighted Bahrain's broader foreign policy priorities.

The Minister stressed the importance of dialogue, coexistence, and tolerance, citing the "Kingdom of Bahrain Declaration" on freedom of religion and belief.

He also emphasised the need for global action to counter extremism and hate speech, calling for an international agreement to prevent the misuse of digital platforms for incitement.

Turning to security challenges, Dr. Al Zayani underlined Bahrain's call for a Middle East free of weapons of mass destruction and urged a return to US-Iran negotiations on the nuclear issue.

She commended the outcomes of Bahrain's ongoing collaboration with the UN, noting that joint programmes have improved the skills and competitiveness of Bahraini youth, equipping them to meet future challenges and opportunities.

Enhancing collaboration



Professor Marike Patrani Paulsson, Secretary-General of the Council for International Dispute Resolution of the Kingdom of Bahrain and head of the Bahrain delegation for UNCITRAL's Working Groups, met with Mr. Rashed Abdulrahman Mohamed Almuraikhi, the Head of the Gulf Cooperation Council Mission, in Vienna, Austria, to discuss avenues for enhanced collaboration among GCC countries in the field of international dispute resolution. During the meeting, the parties explored joint initiatives to support the ongoing work of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL) Working Group III, particularly focusing on investor-State dispute settlement reform. The discussion highlighted the leadership of GCC countries in contributing to the translation of the Working Group's outcomes and procedural documents into Arabic, ensuring broader accessibility and impact in the region.

Verdict set for drug money laundering case

The First High Criminal Court has set 14 October for the verdict in the case of a 26-year-old Asian defendant accused of laundering more than BD38,000 by turning drug-sale profits into cryptocurrencies and reselling them. The inquiry began when the Financial Intelligence National Centre (FINC), acting on a request from the Public Prosecution, examined his suspected role in an international drug network. He is said to have taken cash from sales and pushed it back through the system to make it look lawful. The method involved transfers at exchange houses, cash withdrawals from ATMs followed by bank re-deposits, and buying digital currencies that were sold on through a third party.

'Harvest session'

Parliament committees set agenda for final session of sixth term in two weeks

Parliament will meet for its final session of the sixth term in two weeks, with committees preparing early for debates on unfinished laws and oversight of state spending. MPs describe it as the harvest session, the point where pending measures are either carried through or left behind. The Financial and Economic Affairs Committee, chaired by Ahmed Al Salloom, has already begun laying out a roadmap. He said the panel's first task is to move forward with economic decree-laws issued during the recess, among them changes to the Commercial Companies Law, the Central Bank and Financial Institutions Law, and the Anti-Money Laundering and Counter-Terrorism Financing Law. The second task is to scrutinise the 2025-2026 budget, testing how far the government keeps within the limits set for income and spending, studying reports from the Finance Ministry and the Central Bank, and auditing the 2024 final accounts.




MPs brace for crucial debate on key issues




MPs describe the meeting as the harvest session, the point where pending measures are either carried through or left behind. Al Salloom added that his committee will continue to follow the country's main economic indicators such as growth, inflation, joblessness and public debt to judge their fit with Bahrain's long-term plan. He said speeding the pace of debate on economic bills will be one of the harder challenges, particularly those aimed at sharpening investment rules, easing trade laws and backing small and mid-sized firms. He called for closer work with the Cabinet on funding, paperwork and fair competition. Jaleela Al Sayed, head of the Services Committee, said the fourth session will bring forward key social files: pensions, unemployment, jobs and welfare. The long-awaited Press Law, now before the Shura Council, is also on the agenda. She said her committee has not yet met but will do so soon. Early agreement within the committee and with the government, she said, is needed for a strong start. The lawmaker pressed for long-term answers on pensions and unemployment, new labour laws to close gaps, and a revised minimum living standard. The present figure of BD336, she argued, is outdated, and a new sum should be set each year.

Bahrain–Italy ties shift up a gear as HRH Prince Salman’s Rome visit targets green growth, culture, and trade

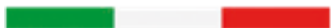
Q: How does the upcoming visit of His Royal Highness the Crown Prince and Prime Minister to Italy reflect the depth and direction of Bahrain–Italy relations?

A: The bilateral relationship is witnessing a remarkable upswing, driven by a series of high-level engagements that signal renewed commitment to co-operation and shared prosperity. Earlier this year, Italy’s Prime Minister visited Bahrain for productive talks with His Majesty the King and His Royal Highness the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, underscoring support for Bahrain’s Vision 2030 and highlighting opportunities in energy transition, cultural diplomacy, and economic diversification. His Majesty also made an unofficial summer visit to Italy, reflecting personal warmth between leaders and paving the way for deeper cultural and diplomatic dialogue. The forthcoming official visit by His Royal Highness is expected to mark a major milestone, focusing on investments, trade, defense, education, tourism, and green technology. These exchanges reflect a shared vision rooted in trust and innovation, and a commitment to a more interconnected, resilient future.

Q: What specific outcomes or agreements do you expect from this high-level visit, particularly in trade, investment, and innovation?

A: Discussions are likely to expand cooperation across investments and trade, with new horizons already opening in renewable energy and sustainable infrastructure. There is strong potential in agri-tech and food security, in luxury and lifestyle partnerships, and in tourism and heritage initiatives. We also see education and innovation high on the agenda, with universities and research institutions seeking partnerships to foster exchange, vocational training, and entrepreneurship. Health-

care and medical technology are emerging areas that can support Bahrain’s modernization with advanced solutions.

Q: Italy has a strong reputation in design, technology, and green energy. How do these areas align with Bahrain’s Vision 2030 priorities?

A: Italy’s expertise in solar power, smart grids, and policy innovation aligns with Bahrain’s goals to diversify energy sources and reduce emissions. Our advanced engineering firms and track record in deploying solar technologies position Italy to support Bahrain’s clean energy ambitions, while Italian design and technology naturally complement the Kingdom’s diversification agenda.

Q: From your perspective, what makes Bahrain a unique partner for Italy compared to other countries in the region?

A: Our partnership is grounded in trust, shared outlook, and complementary strengths. Bahrain offers an evolving economic landscape open to innovation and strategic investment, while Italy brings deep industrial capabilities in energy, agri-tech, luxury, tourism, education, and healthcare. Together, that creates a high-trust platform for practical, future-oriented collaboration.

Q: Can you share examples of ongoing collaborations that could be elevated during this visit?

A: We already cooperate strongly in energy. The Bapco Modernisation Programme is the largest industrial investment in Bahrain’s history, with an Italian engineering firm playing a key role to expand capacity, enhance product quality, and improve efficiency. A memorandum between Bahrain’s Sustainable Energy Authority and Technip Energies paves the way for collaborative projects in deepwater exploration, coastal wind development, and green hydrogen. At the policy level, ministerial engagements have strengthened efforts to cut

emissions, boost efficiency, and support national sustainability goals.

Q: Many in Bahrain are eager to see cultural and educational ties strengthened. What initiatives might we expect?

A: The partnership between La Sapienza University of Rome and the King Hamad Global Centre for Coexistence advances interfaith dialogue through the King Hamad Chair. Bahrain Polytechnic has a landmark agreement with Fondazione Links, affiliated with Politecnico di Torino, to enhance innovation in digital transformation and smart technologies. More academic mobility is coming, with exchange MoUs by Bahraini universities and scholarships that reflect Italy’s commitment to scientific talent. On language and culture, the Centre for Italian Language and Culture at RUW has been active since 2019, complemented by creative exchanges like RUW students’ textile design immersion at Lyr-ia Academy and their fashion show in Bahrain. The embassy also runs a vibrant annual cultural program. Upcoming highlights include an October concert by Eugenio Bennato, a photography exhibition at the Bahrain National Museum, an opera evening with Cristiana Arcani and Andrea Vigna-Taglianti, and the Week of Italian Cuisine, preceded by a hands-on pasta workshop with Youth City 2030. Looking ahead, we are exploring archaeological research partnerships to support Bahrain’s ancient sites through joint excavations and scholarly exchange.

Q: How is Italy positioning itself to support Bahrain’s diversification goals in tourism, food security, and renewables?

A: In tourism, we see joint initiatives in hospitality, heritage conservation, and curated travel experi-

ences leveraging Italy’s cultural depth and Bahrain’s growing infrastructure. For food security, Italian innovation in hydroponics and processing can help enhance local production and resilience, while bringing premium Italian products to Gulf markets. In renewables, Italy offers proven solar expertise, smart integration, and policy know-how to help meet Bahrain’s goals.

Q: In the current global climate, stability and partnerships are key. How do you view Bahrain’s role as a bridge between Europe, the GCC, and beyond?

A: Italy champions dialogue, multilateralism, and regional stability, principles that resonate with Bahrain’s diplomatic approach. Through our role in the European Union, Italy can serve as a bridge between Bahrain and European institutions to

deepen cooperation in energy transition, maritime security, cultural diplomacy, and interfaith dialogue. We aim to elevate Bahraini initiatives, including the King Hamad Global Centre, within European forums and ensure Bahrain’s perspectives are heard on trade, climate action, and security.

Q: What message would you like to send to Bahraini businesses and investors about opportunities in Italy as this visit unfolds?

A: This is a prime moment to build partnerships in sectors where our strengths align. From green technologies and smart industry to luxury, tourism, education, and healthcare, there is substantial room for joint ventures, franchising, applied research, and technology transfer. The momentum of leader-level engagement is translating into practical, investable opportunities.

Q: Over the next decade, how do you envision Bahrain–Italy relations evolving, and what role will this visit play?

A: With shared ambition and strategic investment, the partnership is poised to enter a new era of prosperity. This visit consolidates the trust built through recent exchanges and sets a roadmap across energy, industry, culture, education, healthcare, and tourism. We also look forward to Bahrain’s upcoming presidency of the GCC and to the EU–GCC Summit next year, as additional platforms to advance joint priorities and inclusive, forward-looking alliances.

News in brief

◆ **Ukraine received a** US-made Patriot air defence system from Israel a month ago, with two more expected in coming months, President Volodymyr Zelensky said yesterday. Kyiv is scrambling to beef up its air defences to repel daily Russian barrages of drones and missiles, especially ahead of winter, with heating infrastructure a frequent target of the attacks. “The Israeli (Patriot) system is operating in Ukraine. It has been operating for a month. We will receive two Patriot systems in the fall,” Zelensky told journalists during a briefing. Zelensky spoke following his return from New York, where he addressed the United Nations and met with US President Donald Trump and other senior US officials. After Russia invaded Ukraine in 2022, Israel adopted a neutral position by not sanctioning Russia, unlike the Western allies. But its ties with Moscow cooled as Russia drifted closer to Iran, which the West says supplies drones that attack Ukraine, and as the Kremlin condemned Israel’s war in Gaza.

◆ **More than 150 tonnes** of counterfeit cigarettes were seized from the largest illegal factory ever discovered in Italy, customs police said in a statement yesterday. An underground bunker housed the 1,600-square-metre (17,000 square feet) factory near the town of Cassino southeast of Rome, which produced more than seven million cigarettes a day -- around 2.7 billion a year -- the police estimated. The illegal factory was accessed via “a sophisticated hydraulic mechanism that perfectly concealed the bunker where the machines were installed and tonnes of counterfeit cigarettes stored,” the statement said. Officers discovered electric switches concealed in a cardboard box when searching an “almost completely empty” logistics warehouse that “showed no sign of suspicious activity”.

◆ **Unidentified drones** were observed during the night over Denmark’s biggest military base, police said Saturday, the latest in a slew of sightings that Danish officials have called a “hybrid attack”. The mystery drone observations have prompted the closure of several airports across the Scandinavian country since Monday, when the first drones appeared. “I can confirm that we had an incident around 8:15 pm (1815 GMT Friday) that lasted for some hours. One to two drones were observed outside and over the airbase,” duty officer Simon Skelsjaer told AFP, referring to the Karup military base. He said police could not comment on where the drones came from, adding: “We didn’t take them down.” Police were cooperating with the military in their investigation, he said. The Karup base shares its runways with the Midtjylland civilian airport, which was briefly closed though no flights were affected as no commercial flights were scheduled at that hour, Skelsjaer said.

Trump targets more opponents after ‘dirty cop’ Comey

US President Donald Trump called Friday for more of his political opponents to face criminal charges as he cheered the indictment of former FBI director James Comey and branded him a “dirty cop.” The Republican’s comments step up an extraordinary, undisguised campaign of retribution against those who oppose him that defies decades of norms in US politics. “Frankly I hope there are others,” Trump told reporters at the White House when asked about Comey’s indictment on Thursday, describing his opponents as “corrupt, radical-left Democrats.” “It’s not revenge. It’s also about the fact that you can’t let this go on.” Presidents have historically striven to show clear separation between the White House and the Justice Department. Trump has smashed that precedent, making clear he intends to influence Comey’s case -- and others. Comey was charged with making false

statements and obstruction of justice in connection with the probe he conducted into whether Trump colluded with Russia to win the 2016 election. “He’s a dirty cop, he’s always been a dirty cop,” Trump told reporters about Comey. Asked who would be next for prosecution, Trump said: “It’s not a list, but I think there will be others.” The charges against the former FBI chief came days after Trump publicly urged Attorney General Pam Bondi to take action against Comey and others he sees as enemies. They included Leticia James, who as New York’s state prosecutor brought a civil fraud case against Trump, and current California Senator Adam Schiff, who led the prosecution at the president’s first impeachment in 2019. The New York Times reported Friday that the Trump Justice Department was also seeking information about Fani Willis, the Georgia district attorney who brought an election interference case against Trump.



Sweeping UN sanctions loom for Iran after nuclear talks fail

● **An 11th-hour effort by Iran allies Russia and China to postpone the sanctions until April failed to win enough votes**

● **European powers triggered the “snapback” mechanism a month ago**

Sweeping UN sanctions loomed for Iran late Saturday for the first time in a decade, after last ditch nuclear talks with Western powers failed to produce a breakthrough. President Masoud Pezeshkian said the United States had offered Iran only a short reprieve in return for handing over its whole stockpile of enriched uranium, an offer he described as unacceptable. An 11th-hour effort by Iran allies Russia and China to postpone the sanctions until April failed to win enough votes on the Security Council on Friday, meaning they will go into effect at midnight GMT on Saturday. Though Iran allowed inspectors back into some of its nuclear facilities, Western governments said they saw insufficient progress to justify delaying sanctions, after a week of high-level diplomacy. European powers triggered the “snapback” mechanism a month ago, accusing Iran of failing to comply with its obligations under a 2015 deal with major powers that saw the UN sanctions frozen in return for restrictions on its nuclear activities. Pezeshkian told reporters in

What do the sanctions target?

The sanctions target companies, organizations and individuals that contribute directly or indirectly to Iran’s nuclear program or the development of its ballistic missiles. Providing necessary equipment, expertise, or funding are all grounds for sanctions.

Swath of the economy affected

The sanctions that will be reinstated include an embargo on conventional weapons with the prohibition of any sale or transfer of arms to Iran. Imports, exports or transfers of parts and technologies related to the nuclear and ballistic program will be prohibited. The assets of entities and individuals abroad belonging to Iranian persons or groups linked to the nuclear program will be frozen. Individuals designated as participating in prohibited nuclear activities may be banned from traveling to UN member states. UN member states will be required to restrict access to banking and financial facilities that could help Iran’s nuclear or ballistic programs.

Anyone violating the sanctions regime could see their assets frozen worldwide.

The EU had its own sanctions

Separate measures by the European Union could now be re-imposed alongside the core, global sanctions. Their goal was to hit the Iranian economy, not only to hamper nuclear activity but also to inflict fiscal pain to force Tehran to comply. Western nations fear that Iran will acquire nuclear weapons, which Tehran vehemently denies while defending its right to develop a nuclear program for civilian purposes.

The United States already imposes its own sanctions, including ones to prohibit other countries from buying Iranian oil, after President Donald Trump withdrew from the nuclear deal in his first term.

How does ‘snapback’ take effect?

The “snapback” process reactivates UN resolutions, but their practical implementation requires UN member states to update their laws to comply. It will be down to the EU and Britain to pass legislation so that the sanctions can be enforced, but neither has given details on that process.

How are sanctions enforced?

The UN Security Council resolutions and the associated sanctions are binding -- but are regularly violated. The big question is whether countries like China and Russia, which consider the triggering of the “snapback” illegal, might decide not to comply.

The United States “wants us to hand over all our enriched uranium to them, and in return they would give us three months” exemption from sanctions, Pezeshkian told reporters in New York before flying home. “This is by no means acceptable,” he said. He previously said France had made a similar proposal, offering only a one-month delay. “Why would we put ourselves in such a trap and have a noose around our neck each month?” he asked, accusing the United States of pressuring Europeans not to compromise.

Faced with Russian threat, NATO flexes military muscle in North Sea

NATO flexed its muscles in the North Sea this week in a display of military might, as Russia allegedly tested the alliance’s defences on its eastern flank. F-18 fighter jets lined up on the world’s largest aircraft carrier, flanked by 20 ships and with some 10,000 military personnel from 13 countries. US destroyers and French and Danish frigates escorted the giant USS Gerald R. Ford on the high seas as part of NATO’s Neptune

Strike 25-3 exercise.

F-35 and F-18 jets flew overhead in a diamond formation behind an E-2 Hawkeye, in a demonstration of their capabilities and to test their coordination at a time of high tension with Moscow. One day before the exercise, a Russian reconnaissance aircraft flew three times over the German frigate Hamburg at “very low altitude” in the Baltic Sea on September 21, according to the German defence ministry.

“We consider this behaviour unprofessional and uncooperative,” said a ministry spokesperson. The NATO exercise began the same day that, a few hundred kilometres away, “three or four large drones” flew over Copenhagen Airport, disrupting air traffic. These “hybrid attacks” could increase, warned Denmark’s Prime Minister Mette Frederiksen. “We reassure our allies, and with our adversaries or others...

we establish a strategic deterrent as a group, as a team,” said US Rear Admiral Paul Lanzilotta, commander of Carrier Strike Group Twelve, in the vast hangar of the carrier. France participated in Neptune Strike with its frigate Bretagne, which can carry out anti-submarine and anti-air warfare missions.

Gaza mourners express anger at Israel, Hamas as family killed in strike

Palestinian women wept and wailed yesterday as they mourned a family killed in an Israeli strike on Gaza City, expressing anger at Israel and Hamas for the bloodshed engulfing the city.

Seven members of the Bakr family were killed overnight in the strike on Al-Shati refugee camp in Gaza City, where Israeli forces have stepped up a ground and air assault.

The dead included children and women, according to the Gaza civil defence agency, a rescue force operating under Hamas authority, which said several others were also wounded in the Israeli strike.

"What is happening are massacres, massacres that are condemned internationally," said Umm Khaleel, who survived when the family home was hit.

AFP footage showed women in black abayas crying out in grief, one clutching the small

body of her child tightly to her chest.

"We cannot sleep because of the bombing and shelling on Al-Shati... the children were sleeping when suddenly a missile landed on us," said Salwa Subhi Bakr.

"What does the world want from us? What does (Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin) Netanyahu want? What does Hamas want?"

The bodies, wrapped in white shrouds, some stained with blood, were then taken for burial.

Gaza's main Al-Shifa hospital confirmed receiving six bodies of victims killed in the strike.

The Israeli military did not offer an immediate response.

Bakr, displaced by the nearly two-year-long war, said families had nowhere safe to flee.

"They tell us go there, then come back here. Where do we get the money for trucks?" she said.

"People are in the streets, in the south scattered every-

where. Where should we go? Find us a solution."

Since launching its air assault on Gaza City late last month, which preceded a ground offensive, the Israeli military has repeatedly ordered Palestinians to head south.

Some 700,000 people have already fled since then, according to the Israeli military.



Yesterday, Gaza's civil defence agency reported that Israeli fire killed at least 70 people across the territory, including 38 in Gaza City according to hospitals in the territory's largest urban area.

Trump urges Microsoft to fire ex-Biden administration official

US President Donald Trump called on Microsoft on Friday to fire its head of global affairs, Lisa Monaco, a former senior official in Democratic administrations.

“It is my opinion that Microsoft should immediately terminate the employment of Lisa Monaco,” Trump said in a post on Truth Social.

Since taking office in January, the Republican president has taken a number of punitive measures against his perceived enemies and political opponents.

Former FBI director James Comey, a prominent Trump critic, was indicted on two criminal counts on Thursday and Trump said Friday he hopes “there are others.”

Trump, in his

call for Microsoft to fire Monaco, noted that she served as deputy attorney general in the Joe Biden administration, when criminal cases were brought against him.

“Monaco has been shockingly hired as the President of Global Affairs for Microsoft, in a very senior role with access to Highly Sensitive Information,” he wrote. “Monaco’s having that kind of access is unacceptable, and cannot be allowed to stand.”

“She is a menace to US National Security, especially given the major contracts that Microsoft has with the United States Government,” he added. “The US Government recently stripped her of all Security Clearances, took away all of her access to National Security Intelligence, and banned her from all Federal Properties.”

Trump was the target of several investigations after leaving the White House in 2021.

“This is Kai, by the way,” he told the Washington press corps, introducing his 18-year-old granddaughter who had given a short speech at last year’s Republican National Convention.

The pair, both keen golfers, then boarded a helicopter as they headed off to attend the sport’s Ryder Cup competition.

The eldest of the US president’s grandchildren, who is expected to join the golf team

Kai’s parents are divorced, and her mother is reportedly dating golf legend Tiger Woods.

Unlike previous officeholders, the current president of the United States is known for selling a wide variety of self-branded merchandise.

The billionaire is regularly accused of using his position to promote the Trump family’s fi-

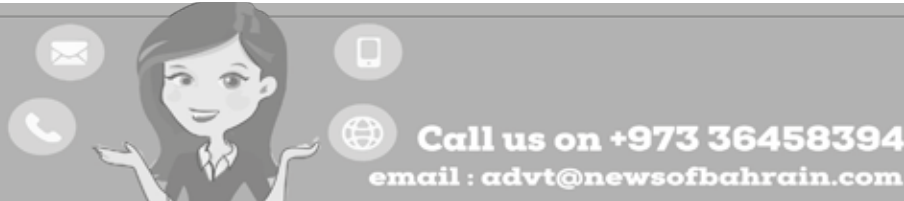

Manama outplayed by Tripoli in heavy defeat

Al Manama's struggles at the Arab Clubs Basketball Championship continued yesterday as they lost 103-78 to Libya's Al Ahli Tripoli at Rashid bin Hamdan Hall

In Dubai. The loss was their second straight setback in Group B of the tournament, after a 79-73 defeat to Lebanon's Antonine. The championship runs until October 6.

Al Ahli Tripoli stunned Manama with a blistering start, racing to an 11-0 lead and taking the first quarter 43-8. The Libyan side's accuracy from long range, including six three-pointers, combined with fast breaks, exposed gaps in Manama's defense and forced coach Salman Ramadan into an early timeout.

The Bahraini side responded in the second quarter with a more disciplined

defensive approach and a 23-10 run, cutting the deficit to 22 at halftime. Manama carried that momentum into the third period, powered by Hassan Nowrooz and Sabah Hussain from beyond the arc, and trimmed the gap to 14. But Tripoli steadied themselves, rebuilding a cushion before closing strong in the final quarter.

Daniel Hamilton was Manama's top scorer with 19 points, supported by Nowrooz with 17 and Hussain with 13. Marcus Knight was decisive for Ahli Tripoli in the last period, drawing fouls and punishing defensive lapses to stretch the lead beyond reach.

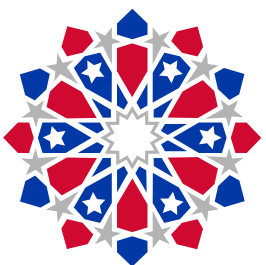
