Israel seals off Palestine village

Israeli forces imposed a lockdown on a Palestinian village in the occupied West Bank yesterday, their second day of operations there after a local resident killed two people in Israel.

Bilal Hunaisha, a resident of Qabatiya, south of Jenin in the northern West Bank, said the town “is being subjected to collective punishment by the Israeli occupation”.

“As you can see, they blocked the way to my house and I am no longer able to move around,” he said, pointing to a pile of rubble obstructing the road.

Russia ‘captured’ two Ukraine towns

Russia claimed yesterday to have captured two more towns in eastern Ukraine, Myrnohrad and Guliaipole, a day ahead of Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky’s meeting with US President Donald Trump.

A Kremlin statement said Russian President Vladimir Putin had received a report from military command on “the liberation of Dimitrov (the Russian name for Myrnohrad) and of Guliaipole”.

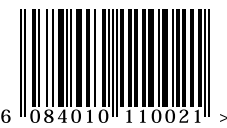
131 migrants rescued at sea

Bahrain moves to bolster safeguards against money laundering and financial crime

Parliament to vote on 72-hour freeze power on suspicious money transactions

A 72-hour window to pause suspicious transactions is due to be written into Bahrain’s anti-money laundering law on Tuesday, when Parliament votes on Decree-Law No. 36 of 2025.

The changes name the Financial Intelligence National Centre (FINC) as the “executing unit”, give it a wider role in receiving suspicious transaction reports and carrying out financial tracing, and spell out new rules for sharing information with overseas counterparts.

The government says the package is needed to match global standards and the National Risk Assessment, while the Ministry of Justice, Islamic Affairs and Waqf has warned that delays could harm Bahrain’s standing and raise the risk of “grey list” scrutiny.

Decision

MPS will decide on the decree-law amending Decree-Law No. 4 of 2001 on the prohibition

and combating of money laundering and terrorist financing.

The Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee, which studied the text and prepared the report for the chamber, recommended approval with the agreement of members present.

The Ministry of Interior said it agreed with the decree-law as issued.

Under the amended provisions, FINC can order the stopping or deferral of a suspected transaction for up to 72 hours to complete enquiries.

Action

A matching step is also provided for when a peer unit abroad

asks for action, within the same time limit.

The decree-law also widens the scope for work with other states, including joint enquiries, asset tracing and recovery, and the exchange of material linked to suspicious transactions and related cases.

It places limits on how shared material, and the results of joint analysis, can be used and passed on.

Alongside the new powers, the legal text updates core terms in the 2001 law.

It replaces the earlier wording on the proceeds of crime with a definition covering funds gained directly or indirectly, in whole or part, from criminal

activity, including any profit, interest, yield or other return, even where the funds are converted into other property or investment returns.

Approach

Two new definitions are added: a “risk-based approach”, described as steps aimed at spotting, judging, tracking, managing and reducing the risks of money laundering, terrorist financing and the financing of the proliferation of armaments; and ‘good faith’, aimed at protecting natural or legal persons who gained rights in the funds through a lawful act without knowing their true nature or source, and without grounds for

suspicion.

The amended text restates the acts that make up money laundering, covering transactions involving criminal proceeds, concealment of their nature or source, acquiring or moving them, and holding them, where there is knowledge, belief, or grounds to believe the funds stem from crime.

It also strengthens confiscation rules while requiring the courts to deal with the rights of bona fide third parties before ordering confiscation.

Evidence

The amended provisions allow confiscation where a criminal case ends because the accused has died, when the evidence shows the funds were gained from crime, and require the court to act if other suspect assets come to light.

Institutions would face clearer duties to report suspicious activity to FINC and the competent bodies, and to put in place internal checks and management-level responsibility for compliance, along with audit rules to test those steps.

The decree-law also reinforces the duty on natural and legal persons to apply, without delay, relevant United Nations Security Council decisions issued under Chapter VII on terrorism, and its financing.

Public safety advisory

Alert: Brace for cold weather and strong winds!

Bahrain is set to experience cold weather starting this evening, with conditions expected to persist until Thursday, January 1, 2026.

The Meteorological Directorate at the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications has forecast the return of northerly winds across the country.

Winds are expected to be moderate to active, intensify-

ing at times on Tuesday and Wednesday, December 30–31.

The directorate warned that these winds may cause blowing dust in some areas and create unsettled sea conditions.

Wave heights are anticipated to range from one to three feet along the coast and three to six feet offshore.

Temperatures are also expected to drop, with maximum daytime temperatures ranging between 17–19°C and minimum

nighttime temperatures between 11–13°C.

Due to the winds, felt temperatures may be lower, particularly during the night and early morning hours.

According to the Meteorological Directorate, these temperatures fall below the January average, which typically stands at 21°C for highs and 15°C for lows.

The directorate urged the public, especially those heading to sea, to exercise caution.

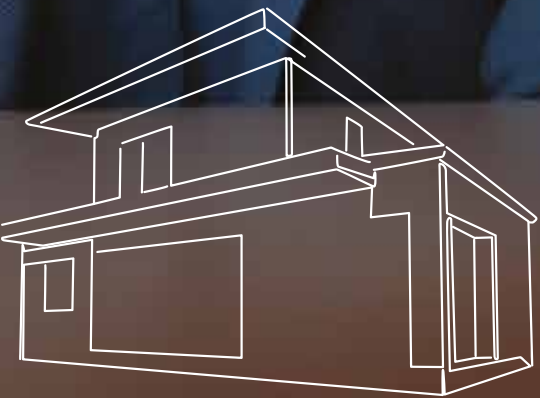

Driver to learn fate after pram crash kills mother, injures baby

● Ruling set for 10 Feb

A woman pushing a pram was killed and her baby injured after a car struck them as they crossed a road, with the High Criminal Court setting 10 February for judgment and ordering that the defendant remain in custody.

The Public Prosecution says the crash happened at about 3.05pm as the woman, described in the case papers as the first pedestrian, began crossing from north to south at a pedestrian crossing while pushing her son, aged one year and 11 months, in a pram.

She had crossed the first and second lanes when the vehicle involved approached in the third, left-hand lane, travelling from east to west.

Prosecutors allege the driver, an Asian national, was not paying attention and failed to take due care, striking the woman and the pram with the front left side of his car.

Impact

The impact sent her onto the bonnet and windscreen before she was thrown onto the road.

She came to rest around 34 metres from the point of impact, in the right-hand lane ahead of the vehicle, according to the case file.

The pram also fell, and the child landed on the road. The car sustained moderate damage.

The woman died while being taken by ambulance to hospital. Her son was taken to hospital by ambulance with injuries described as minor.

In his statement to traffic police, the defendant said he was driving in the left lane at between 60 and 70 kilometres

per hour, with no vehicle in front of him and clear visibility.

He said he was surprised to see a woman pushing a pram in the right lane and crossing diagonally from north to south towards the left lane.

He said he braked and steered right to avoid a collision but could not, and that the woman and the pram were thrown onto the road. He added that he saw the child in the pram after it was thrown, and claimed the woman did not use the pedestrian crossing.

Motive

A forensic report said there was no suspicion of a criminal motive and that the cause of death was skull fractures.

It stated the woman suffered blunt and friction injuries after a collision with a solid object in the traffic crash, which led to her death.

The child suffered a liver bruise and cuts and bruises, was treated, and discharged from hospital, the report said.

The defendant is charged with causing a fatal traffic accident through error, causing injury to the child, damaging others' property, driving without due care and caution, and driving in a way that endangered pedestrians in the carriageway.

Hiring progress

9,685 jobseekers offered 'three interviews' each, says Labour Ministry

The Ministry of Labour says it has completed offering "three job opportunities" to 9,685 registered jobseekers by 7 December 2025, under a directive issued on 28 September that ordered three opportunities for each jobseeker by the end of the year.

The ministry defined the "three opportunities" as "three or more interviews with an employer at the ministry building".

In a written response to MP Hassan Ebrahim, the ministry said 3,685 jobseekers had been hired through the opportunities offered under the directive by 7 December, adding that it only counts a hire once the person is recorded as an insured worker with the Social Insurance Organisation (SIO).

It said the number is expected to rise as companies complete contracts and other hiring steps.

The ministry said 2,516 establishments had posted vacancies on the National Employment Platform since the directive, and referred to an annex listing job titles and the average salary for each vacancy during the period covered.

Roles

The annex tables show the mix of roles being posted, with large blocks of openings in front-line work such as service roles, sales, cashiers and drivers, alongside smaller numbers of higher-skilled roles including accountants, lawyers and programming posts.



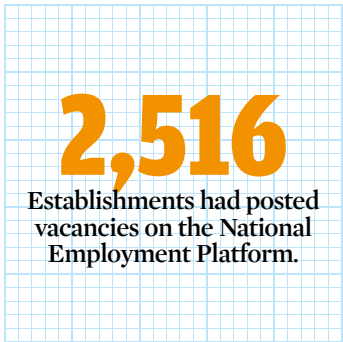

and government notifications.

On how vacancies are handled, the ministry said it checks roles before they appear on the platform, including pay level, qualification and specialisation.

Platform

It said jobseekers apply themselves through the platform and that the system does not allow applications that do not match the employer's stated qualification or specialisation.

It said interview invitations are sent through government notifications via multiple channels, and that interviews are held at the ministry with a staff member present.

Jobseekers can also view a record of the jobs they applied for through their platform account, it added.

On job retention, the ministry said wage support falls to 30 per cent in the third year and labour-supply tenders are excluded from wage support.

It also said it does not open new vacancies on the platform for establishments that dismiss Bahrainis for reasons linked to wage support.

The tables also include a limited number of senior jobs, including a single director-general for finance vacancy listed with a monthly salary of BD3,000.

The reply also set out the size of the jobseeker pool.

The ministry put the total number of registered jobseekers in 2024 at 17,402, including 12,196 women and 5,206 men.

Degrees

It said 10,325 were listed as holding a bachelor's degree or higher, 924 held diplomas, and 6,153 had secondary education or below.

To meet the year-end deadline, the ministry said it extended working hours from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, prepared extra interview space, added parking, and increased staffing to guide jobseekers.

It also said it coordinated with the Information and eGovernment Authority (IGA) to support capacity for services linked to the platform, including the eKey

Asians held for theft of BD60,000 electrical cables

Upon receiving reports of these incidents, CID immediately launched searches and investigations, collected information and evidence, and identified the suspects.

Man arrested over vehicle embezzlement case

The head of the Northern Governorate Prosecution said the Public Prosecution had received a report from the Khamis (A) Police Station, under the Northern Governorate Police Directorate, regarding a case of alleged embezzlement and vehicle seizure.

According to the report, a woman stated that she had handed her vehicle to an individual for repair and paid him a cash amount for the service, but the suspect allegedly embezzled the money and seized the vehicle.

Police immediately launched investigations upon receiving the complaint, which confirmed the incident.

The suspect was subsequently arrested and the vehicle recovered.

The head of the prosecution added that the Public Prosecution began its investigation as soon as it was notified of the case.

Evidence, including video recordings and financial transfer records, was reviewed, and the accused was interrogated.

Stronger oversight

Shura Council set to revisit bill placing private schools under new regulatory law

● Education Ministry to gain wider powers over licensing and governance

The Shura Council will return today to a bill that would place private educational institutions under a new law, after the Services Committee backed giving the Ministry of Education stronger powers over licensing, governance and oversight.

The draft, accompanying Decree No. 60 of 2025, would issue a Private Educational Institutions Law made up of six provisions and seven chapters containing 36 articles.

It is pitched as a way to regulate education in private providers so it matches national education policy, while supporting a high-quality system that helps develop children and students in a well-rounded way.

Rules

The Services Committee said the bill would update the legal rules for the private education sector and keep pace with changes in the market.

It would also separate the regulation of private educational institutions from private training institutions, expand the range of bodies that fall under ministry supervision, and add to the ministry's powers of inspection and follow-up.

Committee members said the proposed law aims to improve the quality and continuity of education outcomes and tighten governance through rules on licensing, management and monitoring.

Investment

It also seeks to encourage responsible investment in education, with a stated aim of balancing the public interest

with investors' rights.

The committee said the interests of children, students and parents sit at the centre of the system set out in the bill.

In the same sitting, the council is due to look at a separate proposal linked to Parliament's internal rules, after the Legislative and Legal Affairs Committee

backed a change to allow more time for Parliament's final accounts and audited financial statements to be prepared.

The amendment would revise Article 219 of Decree-Law No. 54 of 2002 on Parliament's rules of procedure.

Account

The proposal would give the General Secretariat a longer window to prepare the final account, bring the timetable into line with the period used for other government bodies, and reduce the strain caused by the current 30-day deadline.

The committee said this would also give the National Audit Office time to finish checking

the figures and hand over the audited statements on schedule.

The agenda also includes a traffic-law proposal that has again run into committee opposition.

The Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee has stuck to its earlier recommendation to reject a draft amendment linked to settlement payments for traffic offences.

Fine

The proposal would replace the third paragraph of Article 56 of the Traffic Law (Law No. 23 of 2014) so that an accused person who agrees to settle must pay an amount equal to half the minimum fine for the offence within 30 days from the date the settlement is offered.

The committee said the change conflicts with Decree-Law No. 30 of 2025, which raised the fines set for traffic violations in pursuit of general and special deterrence.

It said the amendment also raises questions about proportionality between the offence and the penalty, a core constitutional principle in criminal policy, adding that the recent rise in financial penalties came in response to the danger posed by traffic violations and their impact on lives, property and public order.

US air traffic snarled as New York braces for **deep snow**

● New York City received around 4 inches (10 centimeters) of snow overnight. Airlines canceled 1,500 US flights during the peak holiday travel period Friday, with severe winter storm warnings and heavy snow forecast across parts of the Midwest and northeast

Airlines canceled 1,500 US flights during the peak holiday travel period Friday, with

severe winter storm warnings and heavy snow forecast across parts of the Midwest and northeast. More than 40 million Americans were under winter storm warnings or weather advisories one day after Christmas, plus another 30 million under flood or storm advisories in California, where a so-called atmospheric river has brought a deluge of rain. New York, the country’s largest city, was bracing for up to 10 inches (25 centimeters) of snow overnight -- the most in four years. Temperatures were forecast to drop and remain chilly into the weekend, when an Arctic blast swoops down from Canada. At least 1,490 flights had been

canceled, with more than 5,900 delays, as of 4:00 pm US Eastern time (2100 GMT) Friday, the FlightAware website said. The National Weather Service (NWS) predicted snowfall across the upper Great Lakes region would move towards the US northeast. “Difficult travel conditions are ongoing for the area and those traveling from the holiday should exercise caution if you have to be on the road,” it warned. New York Mayor Eric Adams said a winter storm warning was in effect, and that city crews were deployed to plow roads. Airports in New York and Chicago were near the top of FlightAware’s rankings on its “Misery Map,” which tracks the spread of flight delays and can-

celations. New York’s three area airports have accounted for 850 flight cancellations, according to the website. Weather warnings were also issued for the states of Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Connecticut, as well as parts of Michigan, Massachusetts and Rhode Island. Meanwhile California, on the US West coast, endured heavy rain this week but the NWS forecast it will begin drying out over the weekend. The fierce weather and related flooding forced the Santa Barbara Airport northwest of Los Angeles to close, but by Friday morning, after crews spent all night clearing water from runways, authorities announced it had reopened.

China sanctions 20 US firms over Taiwan arms sales

China has announced fresh sanctions on 20 US defence firms, including a Boeing branch, over Washington’s latest arms sales to Taiwan, the island Beijing claims. Taipei said this month that Washington had approved \$11 billion in defence sales in what would be one of the largest weapons packages for the island. China criticised the deal and announced new sanctions on Friday against Boeing’s defence manufacturing outpost in St. Louis, aerospace giant Northrop Grumman and others. The companies appear to have little or no business in China and some have been previously sanctioned by Beijing. Chinese entities will be banned from working with the firms, and their assets in the country will be frozen. The arms sales “violate the one-China principle... seriously damaging China’s sovereign-

ty and territorial integrity”, Beijing’s foreign ministry said. Boeing and Northrop Grumman did not respond to AFP’s requests for comment. China also sanctioned 10 industry executives, banning them from entering the country, including Hong Kong and Macau.



The United States has long been Taiwan’s biggest arms supplier despite China viewing the democratic island as part of its territory and refusing to rule out using force to bring it under control.

Lebanon’s cabinet approves draft law on financial crisis losses

Lebanon’s government on Friday approved a draft law to distribute financial losses from the 2019 economic crisis that deprived many Lebanese of their deposits despite strong opposition from political and banking officials. The draft law is a key demand from the international community, which has conditioned economic aid to Lebanon on financial reforms. It will be submitted to the country’s divided parliament for approval before it can be-

come effective. The cabinet passed the draft bill with 13 ministers in favour and nine against. It stipulates that each of the state, the central bank, commercial banks and depositors will share the losses accrued as a result of the financial crisis. Prime Minister Nawaf Salam told journalists after the session that the bill “is not ideal... and may not meet everyone’s aspirations” but is “a realistic and fair step on the path to restoring rights, stopping the collapse... and healing the banking sector”.

News in brief

◆ **Iranian President** Masoud Pezeshkian said in an interview published on Saturday that the United States, Israel and Europe were waging “total war” against his country. “In my opinion, we are at total war with the United States, Israel and Europe. They want to bring our country to its knees,” Pezeshkian told the official site of supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, six months after Israel and the US launched strikes on Iran. France, Britain and Germany were behind the reimposition of UN sanctions on Iran in September connected to its nuclear programme. “This war is worse than the one launched against us by Iraq. On closer inspection, it is far more complex and difficult,” he added, referring to the 1980-88 conflict between the neighbouring countries that claimed hundreds of thousands of lives.

Netanyahu to meet Trump in US on Monday

◆ **Israeli Prime Minister** Benjamin Netanyahu is due to meet US President Donald Trump in Florida tomorrow, an Israeli official told AFP, in what is seen as a crucial visit for the next steps of the fragile Gaza truce plan. It will be Netanyahu's fifth visit to see key ally Trump in the United States this year. His trip comes as the Trump administration and regional mediators push to proceed to the second stage of the ceasefire between Israel and Hamas in the Gaza Strip. An Israeli official on Saturday said Netanyahu would leave for the US on December 28 and meet with Trump a day later in Florida, without providing a specific location. Trump told reporters in mid-December that Netanyahu would probably visit him in Florida during the Christmas holidays. “He would like to see me. We haven't set it up formally, but he'd like to see me,” Trump said before leaving for his Mar-a-Lago resort.

◆ **A 6.6-magnitude** earthquake struck off Taiwan's northeastern coast on Saturday, the US Geological Survey (USGS) said, the second major tremor to hit the island within days. Taiwan's weather agency, which put the magnitude at 7.0, said the quake hit at 23:05 pm (1505 GMT) at a depth of 73 kilometres (45 miles) in the sea off Yilan county, southwest of Taipei. The Yilan County Fire Bureau told AFP there were no immediate reports of casualties or damage. Local media said the quake caused buildings in the capital Taipei to sway and was felt across Taiwan. Taiwan is frequently hit by earthquakes due to its location on the edge of two tectonic plates near the Pacific Ring of Fire, which the USGS says is the most seismically active zone in the world. On Wednesday, a 6.0-magnitude tremor struck the island's southeast. In April 2024, a 7.4-magnitude earthquake killed 17 people as it triggered landslides and severely damaged buildings around Hualien city.

Thailand and Cambodia declare truce after weeks of clashes

Thailand and Cambodia agreed to an “immediate” ceasefire yesterday, the two countries said in a joint statement, pledging to end border clashes that killed dozens of people.

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres welcomed the announcement “as a positive step towards alleviating the suffering of civilians... and creating an environment conducive to achieving lasting peace”, spokesman Stephane Dujarric said.

At least 47 people were killed and more than a million displaced in three weeks of fighting with artillery, tanks, drones and jets, according to official tallies.

The conflict spread to nearly every border province on both sides, shattering an earlier truce for which US President Donald Trump took credit.

Cambodia and Thailand agreed to the ceasefire that took effect at 12 pm (0500 GMT), said the declaration signed by the Southeast Asian neighbours' defence ministers at a border checkpoint on the Thai side.

The truce applies to “all types of weapons, including attacks on civilians, civilian objects and infrastructures, and military objectives of either side, in all cases and all areas”.

Both sides agreed to freeze all troop movements and allow civilians living in border areas to return home as soon as possible, the statement said. They also agreed to cooperate on demining efforts and combatting cybercrime, while Thailand was to return 18 captured Cambodian soldiers within 72 hours.

Thai Defence Minister Nattaphon Narkphanit said the initial three-day window would be an “observation period to confirm that the ceasefire is real”.

He called the truce “a door to a peaceful resolution” in a speech earlier on Saturday.

Displaced Cambodian Oeum Raksmei told AFP she was “very happy that people can return home” if the fighting stops.

“But I dare not return home yet. I am still scared,” said the 22-year-old, who has sheltered with her family in Cambodia's Siem Reap province.

Withdraw forces

Saudi-led coalition warns Yemen separatists

The Saudi-led coalition warned yesterday it would back Yemen's government in any military confrontation with separatist forces and urged them to withdraw “peacefully” from recently-seized provinces.

The statements came a day after reported Saudi air strikes on separatist positions in Yemen's Hadramawt province -- and after Washington called for restraint in the rapidly escalating conflict.

General Turki al-Malki, the spokesman for the coalition, said they would act “directly and at the appropriate moment... to protect civilian life”, according to the Saudi news agency SPA.

Saudi Defence Minister Khalid bin Salman posted on X that troops from the separatist South-ern Transitional Council (STC) should “peacefully hand over” two regional governorates to the government. “It's time,” he posted, “at this sensitive moment, to let reason prevail by withdrawing from the two provinces and doing so peacefully.”

The STC had warned on Friday that they were undeterred after strikes blamed on Saudi Arabia hit their positions, in the latest escalation since they seized large swathes of territory in the Hadramawt and Mahrah provinces. There were no immediate reports of casualties in the strikes.

In recent weeks, separatists backed by the United Arab Emirates and seeking to revive the formerly independent state of South Yemen have made territorial gains. On Saturday, hundreds of Yemeni tribesmen gathered in Aden to ask the STC's leaders to announce the independence of South Yemen, according to the separatist-affiliated Aden Independent Channel.

The channel aired footage of a large crowd marching and waving the South Yemen independent-ence flag alongside the UAE's flag. Farea al-Muslimi, from the Chatham House think tank in London, told AFP that the STC had crossed Riyadh's “red lines” and that the situation could quickly get worse.

“It is one bad thing to humiliate Saudi Arabia. And it is another much worse thing to humiliate Saudi Arabia publicly. And that's exactly what they did,” he said.

US urges restraint

In Washington, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio said: “We urge restraint and continued diplomacy, with a view to reaching a lasting solution.”

Following Friday's raids, Yemen's government urged the Saudi-led coalition to support its forces in Hadramawt, after separatists seized most of the country's largest province. The government asked the coalition to “take all necessary military measures to protect innocent Yemeni civilians in Hadramawt province and support the armed forces”, the official Yemeni news agency said.

A Yemeni military official said on Friday that around 15,000 Saudi-backed fighters were amassed near the Saudi border but had not been given orders to advance on separatist-held territory. The areas where they were deployed are located at the edges of territory seized in recent weeks by the UAE-backed STC.

Russia pummels Kyiv ahead of Zelensky's US visit

Russia pummelled Ukraine's capital with drones and missiles yesterday, killing a woman and cutting power to hundreds of thousands, ahead of President Volodymyr Zelensky's latest talks with US leader Donald Trump.

Zelensky said the attack showed Russia did not want to end its invasion launched in February 2022 that has left tens of thousands dead.

Ahead of the Ukrainian president's talks in Florida with Trump on Sunday, Russia said Kyiv and its EU backers were trying to “torpedo” a US-brokered plan to stop the fighting.

On top of the fatality, the barrage of drones and missiles wounded dozens and cut power and heating to hundreds of thousands of Kyiv region residents during freezing temperatures, Ukraine authorities said.

US strikes targeted IS militants, Lakurawa jihadists, Nigeria says

Exact targets of the strikes had been unclear

US strikes in Nigeria this week targeted Islamic State militants from the Sahel who were in the country to work with the Lakurawa jihadist group and "bandit" gangs, a spokesman for the Nigerian president told AFP yesterday.

The exact targets of the strikes, launched overnight Thursday into Friday, had been unclear.

Washington and Abuja previously said they targeted IS-

linked militants, without providing details on which of Nigeria's myriad armed groups were attacked.

"ISIS, Lakurawa and bandits were targeted," Daniel Bwala, a spokesman for President Bola Tinubu, told AFP on Saturday.

"ISIS found their way through the Sahel to go and assist the Lakurawa and the bandits with supplies and with training," he said.

The Islamic State Sahel Province (ISSP) group is active in neighbouring Niger, as well as Burkina Faso and Mali, where it is fighting a bloody insurgency against the governments of those countries.

While Nigeria has long battled its own, separate jihadist conflict, analysts have been worried about the spread of armed groups from the Sahel into the west African country.

"The strike was conducted at a location where, historically,

you have the bandits and the Lakurawa parading around that axis," Bwala said.

"The intelligence the US government gathered, also, is that there is a mass movement of ISIS from the Sahel to that part."

There were casualties, but it was unclear who among those targeted were killed, Bwala added.

The site of the strikes -- in Nigeria's northwest state of Sokoto -- has puzzled analysts, since Nigeria's jihadist insurgency is mostly concentrated in the northeast.

Researchers have recently linked some members of the armed group known as Lakurawa -- the main jihadist group located in Sokoto State -- to the ISSP. Other analysts have disputed those links, however, and research on Lakurawa is complicated as the term has been used to describe various armed fighters in the northwest.

The NAS model of inter-ministry co-operation

In the critical minutes following a tomedical emergency, the boundary between tragedy and recovery is often measured by the speed and precision of a system. For decades, Bahrain's emergency response relied on a decentralized network of hospital-based fleets. However, the maturation of the National Ambulance Service (NAS)—a flagship collaboration between the Ministry of Interior (MOI) and the Ministry of Health (MOH)—has redefined the Kingdom's commitment to public health and safety, positioning it as a regional leader in pre-hospital care.

The genius of the NAS lies in its structural synergy. By placing the National Ambulance Centre under the operational command of the MOI while maintaining the clinical standards of the MOH, Bahrain has effectively bridged the gap between security and healthcare. This unified command, accessible through the 999 emergency line, eliminates the confusion of the past. It ensures that whether a call originates from a bustling Manama street or a quiet suburb in the Southern Governorate, the response is governed by a singular, high-standard protocol.

The progress witnessed by late 2025 is a testament to this vision. The expansion toward 21 strategically placed centers ensures that life-saving intervention is never more than a few minutes away. Perhaps the most innovative leap in recent months has been the deployment of motorcycle first-responder units. By bypassing the gridlock of urban traffic to deliver immediate stabilization for cardiac or trauma patients, the NAS has demonstrated an agile, "patient-first" philosophy that transcends traditional logistics.

Furthermore, the integration of real-time electronic data sharing between ambulances and major institutions like Salmaniya Medical Complex and the BDF Hospital ensures that emergency departments are prepared before the wheels even stop. No longer is an ambulance merely a transport vehicle; it is a mobile intensive care unit.

As we look toward the goals of Bahrain's Vision 2030, the NAS stands as a blueprint for inter-ministerial success. It proves that when the state's security apparatus and healthcare experts align their goals, the result is a safer, more resilient society.

Gaza hospital says receives fuel but only for about two days

A major Gaza hospital that had suspended several services due to diesel shortages said it resumed some operations on Friday after receiving fuel but warned the supplies would only last about two days.

Ravaged by more than two years of war, the Al-Awda Hospital in central Gaza's Nuseirat district cares for around 60 in-patients and receives nearly 1,000 people seeking medical treatment each day.

Earlier Friday, a senior official involved in managing the hospital, Ahmed Mehanna, said "most services have been temporarily stopped due to a shortage of the fuel needed for the generators".

"Only essential departments remain operational: the emergency unit, maternity ward and paediatrics," he had told AFP, adding that the hospital rented a small generator to keep those services running.

He had warned that a prolonged fuel shortage "would pose a direct threat to the hos-

pital's ability to deliver basic services".

Under normal conditions, Al-Awda Hospital consumes between 1,000 and 1,200 litres of diesel per day, but it only had some 800 litres available.

Later Friday, Mehanna said that "this evening, 2,500 litres of fuel arrived from the World Health Organisation, and we immediately resumed operations." "This quantity of fuel will last only two and a half days, but we have been promised an additional delivery next Sunday."

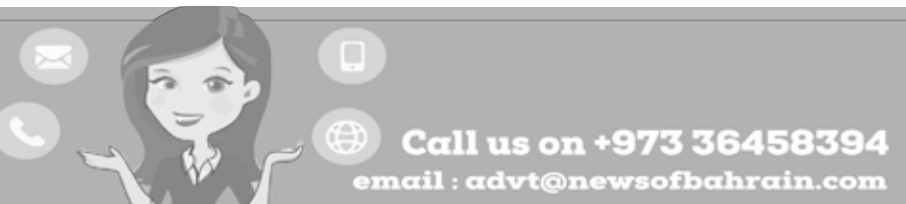

England snap 15-year losing streak to win chaotic fourth Ashes Test

Tourists clinch first Test win in Australia since 2011 after two-day classic

- England win fourth Test by four wickets
- Australia dismissed for 132 in second innings
- England chases 175 for victory

A fighting England won their first Test on Australian soil in 15 years yesterday, restoring their battered pride with a gutsy four-wicket victory to clinch a chaotic fourth Ashes clash that was all over inside two days.

The pumped-up tourists dismissed Australia for 132 soon after lunch in front of a bumper 92,045 crowd at the Melbourne Cricket Ground, following the 20 wickets that tumbled on day one.

It left them chasing 175 to win, with Harry Brook unbeaten on 18 and Jamie Smith on three seeing them home for the loss of six wickets to huge roars from their travelling “Barmy Army” of fans.

Jacob Bethell contributed 40 and Zak Crawley 37.

“A good feeling, a tough tour up to now,” said England skipper Ben Stokes.

“After the build-up to the Test, a lot thrown our way, to put in a performance on the back of all that, and beat a very good Australian team, a lot of credit has to go to players, staff and management for keeping the focus on cricket.

“Very proud. We showed bravery and were courageous.”

England crashed in the first three Tests and came to Melbourne under enormous pressure amid questions about their limited preparations and allegations of excessive drinking during a mid-series beach break.

But they finally came good and will head to Sydney for the fifth and final Test brimming with confidence.

England had not won a Test in Australia since January 2011 at Sydney, losing 16 and drawing two since, and openers Crawley and Ben Duckett had a clear objective to snap the streak -- play ultra-aggressive “Bazball” style.

Duckett hit a boundary off Mitchell Starc in his first over while Crawley slammed Michael Nesar for a six and a four in successive balls.

They brought up a whirlwind fifty opening partnership but next ball Duckett was bowled

by a Starc yorker for 34.

Fast bowler Brydon Carse then strode to the middle as a surprise number three in place of Bethell.

But England's pinch-hitting experiment failed as Carse lasted only eight balls before skying Jhye Richardson to Cameron Green.

Crawley fell lbw to Scott Boland after a gritty knock and Bethell was caught by Usman Khawaja from the same bowler.

Richardson trapped Joe Root lbw for 15 and Starc accounted for Ben Stokes for two, but by then only 10 runs were needed and Brook and Smith completed the job.

“It was a tricky one, a quick game,” said Australia captain Steve Smith.

“If we had got 50-60 more in both innings then things might have been different. The wicket played as expected, but once the ball softened, it didn't quite behave the way I'd hoped.

“When you see 36 wickets fall in two days, that probably tells you it did a bit more than intended,” he added of the MCG pitch.

Pitch criticised

Australia resumed on 4-0 in their second innings after an explosive opening day of searing pace saw 20 wickets fall with the hosts dismissed for 152 and England just 110.

It was the most wickets to tumble on the first day of an Ashes Test since 1909, and eclipsed the 19 on day one of the series opener in Perth.

With 10 millimetres of grass on the track it was a bowler's dream, but a host of former greats criticised the pitch for “doing too much” and being “unfair for the batters”.

Nightwatchman Boland edged Gus Atkinson to wicketkeeper Smith but the bowler left the field soon after clutching his left hamstring.

Josh Tongue came into the attack on a hat-trick after bagging the last two Australia wickets on day one, but Jake Weatherald whipped his full ball for three.

Weatherald needed a decent knock to cement his spot at the top of the order, but he failed again, bowled by Stokes for five leaving a delivery that nipped back.

Travis Head was joined by Marnus Labuschagne but he only made eight, caught by Root in the slips off Tongue.

Head was in good touch before being bowled on 46 by a peach of a delivery from Carse that beat the outside edge, and when Khawaja (0) and Alex Carey (4) departed in the space of nine balls the momentum was back with England.

Man Utd made to ‘suffer’ for Newcastle win, says Amorim

Missing injured captain Bruno Fernandes plus the absent Bryan Mbeumo and Amad Diallo due to the Africa Cup of Nations, Amorim was forced to adapt.

Patrick Dorgu started in an unfamiliar role on the right side of attack and the Dane scored his first United goal to secure a first home win in two months for Amorim's men.

After a promising first half, the Red Devils were forced to defend for almost the entirety of the second period.

But they held on for just a second clean sheet of the season

despite Newcastle having 67 percent possession and 16 shots on goal.

“We had to suffer all together in the stadium,” said Amorim.

“We did a good first half and then the second half we just had to defend and try to do some-

thing (going forward).

“It was a good win but I had so many games here saying we played really well and didn't get the three points. Today was the opposite, we suffered together and managed to win the game.”

Victory lifts United up to fifth in the Premier League and level on points with fourth-placed Chelsea.

A top-five finish is likely to be enough to secure a place in the Champions League next year due to English sides' strong start
