Israel seals off **Palestine village**

Tsraeli forces imposed a Llockdown on a Palestinian village in the occupied West Bank yesterday, their second day of operations there after a local resident killed two people in Israel.

Bilal Hunaisha, a resident of Qabatiya, south of Jenin in the northern West Bank, said the town "is being subjected to collective punishment by the Israeli occupation".

"As you can see, they blocked the way to my house and I am no longer able to move around," he said, pointing to a pile of rubble obstructing the road.

The amended text restates the acts that make up money laundering, covering transactions involving criminal proceeds, concealment of their nature or source, acquiring or moving them, and holding them, where there is knowledge, belief, or grounds to believe the funds stem from crime.

It also strengthens confiscation rules while requiring the courts to deal with the rights of bona fide third parties before ordering confiscation.
