NHRA, not hospitals, probe medical errors

Hospitals have no say in Medical error cases, says Ministry

● NHRA panels follow international standards

● Panels are supervised by NHRA's chief executive

● Committees may seek input from hospital staff, experts

Hospitals in the Kingdom have no role in medical error investigations, Health Ministry has confirmed. The Health Ministry has clarified that hospitals have no say in how medical error cases are examined. The National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA) alone holds discretion through its investigation committees, which operate independently of government hospitals.

In a written reply to MP Jameel Mulla Hassan, who asked about the role of public hospitals and health centres, the ministry explained that NHRA panels follow international standards rather than internal hospital policies when issuing findings.

Medical-error files are handled by NHRA's technical committees on professional and ethical errors. These committees review patient complaints, inspection reports, employer notifications, and court referrals. Each committee is supervised by NHRA's chief executive and includes NHRA specialists as well as practising health professionals with relevant experience. Outside experts may also be invited, and temporary sub-committees can be formed for specialised investigations.

The committees operate under the oversight of the Supreme Council of Health but retain full independence.

While they may seek input from staff at any health institution, such experts serve in a personal capacity, not as hospital representatives. Government hospitals cannot remove committee members or influence the investigation process.

The ministry emphasized that NHRA committees apply internationally recognised medical standards rather than internal hospital rules. Their findings are issued impartially and transparently, with the aim of protecting all parties involved.

Step in for a spin

Human washing machine on sale in Japan

After wowing World Expo visitors, a human washing machine is now on sale in Japan, a company spokeswoman said yesterday.

Users lie down in the pod, close the lid and get cleaned like clothes in a washing machine -- but without the spin -- while music plays.

A prototype of the device, called the human washer of the future, attracted long queues at the six-month Expo that

wrapped up in Osaka in October after welcoming over 27 million people.

Made by Japanese firm Science, the device is an update of a product displayed the last time Osaka hosted the event, in 1970.

"Our (company) president was inspired by that as a 10-year-old boy at the time," Science spokeswoman Sachiko Maekura told AFP.

The machine "not only washes your body but also your soul," she added, while also monitoring users' heartbeats and other vital signs.

After a US resort company contacted Science to see if the prototype would be commercialised, the firm decided to produce it for real.

A hotel in Osaka bought the

first machine and is preparing to offer the service to hotel guests, the spokeswoman said.

Other customers include Yamada Denki, a major consumer electronics retail chain in Japan, which hopes the machine will draw people to visit its outlets, she said.

"Because part of the appeal of this machine is rarity, we plan to produce only about 50 units," Maekura said.

Local media reported that the retail price will be 60 million yen (\$385,000)

Bid to boost maternity leave to **70** days gains committee backing

Move comes as MPs cite regional benchmarks and growing support

Women working in the public sector could soon receive 70 days of paid maternity leave, up from the current 60, if a new draft law wins parliamentary approval.

The proposal — submitted by MPs Hanan Fardan, Jaleela Alawi, Basema Mubarak and Maryam Al Saegh — goes before Parliament on Tuesday with the

support of the Legislative and Legal Affairs Committee.

At present, maternity leave begins from the delivery date stated in a medical certificate, with the option for an employee to start up to 15 days before her due date. After returning to work, Bahraini mothers are

entitled to two paid nursing hours daily until their child turns two, and may request unpaid childcare

leave for children under six for up to two years at a time, up to three times during their service.

Regional comparisons provided in Parliament show that Saudi Arabia grants working women ten weeks of fully paid maternity leave, while Egypt offers 90 days on full pay, covering pre- and post-delivery periods upon presentation of a medical certificate.

Parliament's Financial and Economic Affairs Committee said the proposal would not directly affect the state budget but could have indirect consequences, including reduced work output and a widening gap between benefits in the public and private sectors. The committee warned that more generous leave in government jobs could draw women away from private employment and highlighted additional concerns raised by its economic advisers.

The Civil Service Bureau took a more cautious stance, stating that extending maternity leave would directly affect productivity and the smooth functioning of ministries, as longer employee absences would require additional staffing or workload adjustments. With women making up 57.5 per cent of the civil service, the Bureau argued that extending the leave period would increase costs at a time when the government is seeking to curb expenditure.

The Supreme Council for Women noted that parliamentary recommendations must be processed by the government in line with its programme of work, emphasising that implementing the proposal would require a legislative amendment rather than an internal administrative decision.

The Bahraini Women's Union expressed support for the proposal.

Parliament has previously approved a separate recommendation from MP Dr Ali Al Nuaimi to extend maternity leave under terms aimed at balancing family needs with workplace efficiency.

A chair for every woman? MPs say it's only fair

Seats for female staff would become mandatory across all workplaces if a draft law goes through Parliament on Tuesday, after the Services Committee backed an amendment to Article 36 of the Labour Law.

The proposal by MP Hanan Fardan would require employers who hire women to provide seating "in all places where they work, to ensure they can rest", alongside the existing duty to display regulations on women's employment. Fardan said allowing women to sit improves comfort, safety and productivity.

The memorandum cites health problems linked to long hours standing, such as varicose veins and back and joint pain, and argues that providing seats would improve both wellbeing and work performance.

During its review, the committee sought written comments from the Labour Ministry, the Supreme Council for Women, the Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry, and the two main labour union groupings.

The Labour Ministry said the current legal framework

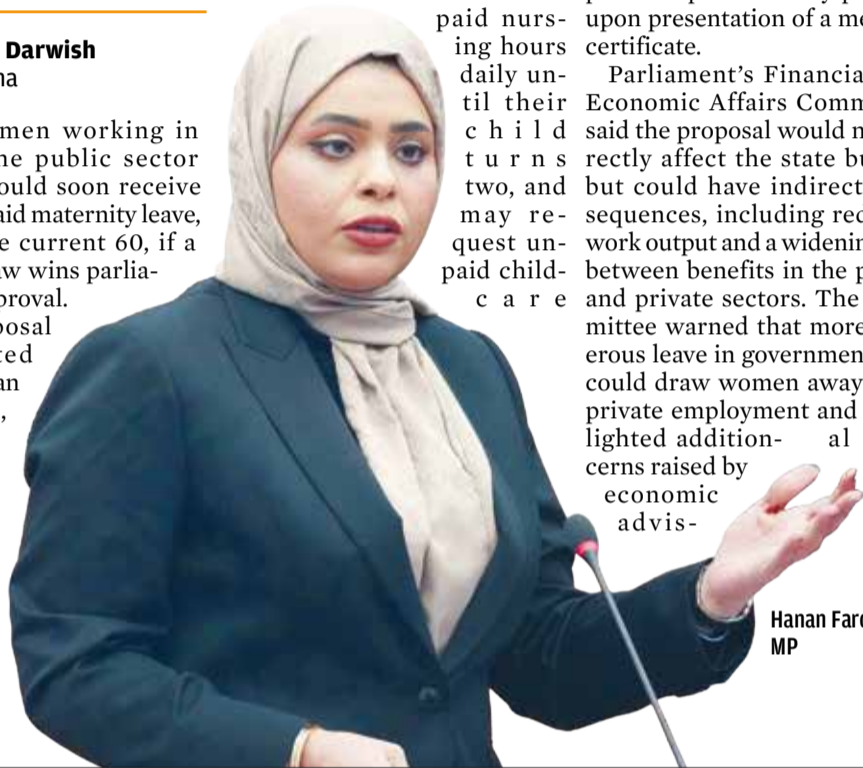
already offers strong protection for women workers, pointing to provisions on discrimination, maternity leave, protection from dismissal and paid childcare breaks. It argued that these rules ensure women's welfare more comprehensively than the proposed amendment. It also noted that issues related to workplace harassment and safety are already addressed under Decree-Law 59 of 2018 and international obligations, including ILO Convention 190.

The Supreme Council for Women added that rest facilities and seating fall under occupational safety requirements already covered by Article 166, and could be handled through ministerial decisions rather than amending the law.

The Chamber of Commerce opposed the change, warning of burdens on sectors where the nature of work may not require seating and cautioning against unnecessary statutory obligations.

Both trade union blocs supported the proposal, saying mandatory seating would protect women's health, reduce physical strain and align with international standards.

The Services Committee has urged MPs to approve the amended draft, saying it supports women's rights and strengthens their role in the labour market.

One **job**, one location?

That could change for foreign workers

Parliament considers easing rules that tie employees to a single job and location

● Workers could move between outlets, as long as the work is of a similar nature

● LMRA insists transfers must respect work permits and cannot give employers unlimited freedom

their outlets, as long as the work is of a similar nature.

The change comes through an amendment tabled before Parliament, up for debate this Tuesday. The Services Committee has urged lawmakers to ease the rules that currently tie each worker to a single job at a single workplace.

The proposal was first put forward by MPs Mohammed Al Ma'arafi, Ahmed Al Salloom, Abdullah Al Dhaen, Basema Mubarak, and Mamdouh Al Saleh.

Under Act 19 of 2006 on the regulation of the labour market and Decision 76 of 2008 on foreign work permits, employers must apply to the Labour Market Regulatory Authority for each

foreign worker. The worker is then tied to the job and location on the permit, limiting them in practice to one task at one place.

MP Al Ma'arafi says this system holds back growth for startups and small to medium-sized firms with multiple branches. Allowing rotation would give employers more flexibility, help new projects grow, and make better use of foreign workers' skills and experience.

Talks between the Services Committee and the MPs led to an amended version. The new wording limits rotations to work of a homogeneous nature in establishments and branches owned by the same employer, provid-

The Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry supports the proposal. Chairman Samir Abdulla Nass said allowing rotation across branches and activities would strengthen the labour market and benefit the Kingdom's economy.

The General Federation of Bahrain Trade Unions, however, opposed the move, warning that some employers could misuse transfers to punish staff under the guise of permit flexibility.

MPs push for autism training programme at teachers' college

A proposal to introduce an autism spectrum disorders specialisation at Bahrain Teachers College will be debated in Parliament on Tuesday, aiming to train national teachers to support more than 2,400 autistic people and reduce care costs that can exceed BD 900 a month.

The motion requires the government, through the Education Ministry, to launch a dedicated academic programme at the college. It has been submitted by MPs Hisham Al Awadhi, Jaleela Alawi, Second Deputy Speaker Ahmed Qarata, Jameel Mulla Hassan and Mohammed Mousa. MP Al Awadhi, the main sponsor, said rising autism cases and the high fees charged by specialist centres highlight the need for

qualified local staff able to provide long-term support.

According to the explanatory memorandum, autism cases in Bahrain now exceed 2,400, while many families struggle with high monthly bills for specialist care. A dedicated specialisation would train Bahraini teachers to work in schools and centres, expand public-sector services and open new employment pathways for citizens.

In its written response, the Education Ministry said it is already working with Bahrain Teachers College to design new programmes aligned with labour-market needs.

The Service Committee has recommended approving the proposal in the form of a wish, citing strong public-interest grounds.

Master's degree rule for expat hires back before MPs

MPs will again debate a proposal on Tuesday that would allow the government to hire expatriates only if they hold at least a master's degree and have ten years' experience — rules the Shura Council has rejected but Parliament wants to keep.

The changes, which amend Article 11 of the Civil Service Law, were previously ap-

proved by the Council of Representatives. However, the Shura Council refused the draft in principle. Despite this, Parliament's Legislative and Legal Affairs Committee has advised MPs to stick to their earlier decision and uphold the original wording.

Under the proposal, ministries and state bodies could only recruit an

expat if no Bahraini candidate meets the job requirements. Any non-Bahraini hire must have a master's degree (or equivalent) in the relevant field and at least a decade of experience. Contracts would be limited to two years and could be renewed once for another two years, but only after rechecking that no qualified Bahraini is available. A Civil Service Bureau committee would also need to approve any renewal.

During their contract, expat employees would be required to train a Bahraini staff member so that locals gain the skills needed to eventually take over these roles.

The draft also states that foreign staff hired through contracts must follow the Civil Service Law whenever their contracts do not cover a matter. The Civil Service Bureau would issue the detailed rules for hiring non-Bahrainis, including the training obligation.

Supporters say the goal is to reduce unemployment and ensure Bahrainis come first in public recruitment. The government argues that setting fixed qualifications in law is too restrictive because staffing needs change. Despite this, the committee has recommended that MPs reaffirm their earlier approval of the draft.

Ads move in? Public buildings could open to marketing

MPs will discuss a government bill on Tuesday to amend Article 12 of Decree-Law 14 of 1973 on the Regulation of Advertisements, allowing controlled advertising in parts of public buildings.

The draft, linked to Decree 27 of 2025, has been reviewed by the Public Utilities and Environment Committee, which



recommended approval. The aim is to give government bodies legal authority to rent out vacant areas in public buildings for advertising, generating additional revenue for the state.

Currently, the law bans ad-

vertising on public buildings used for services, monuments, places of worship, historic sites, recreation areas, pavements, road surfaces, roundabouts, and trees. The amendment modifies paragraph (b) of Ar-

ticle 12, retaining the general ban but permitting advertising under conditions set by the minister.

The committee supported the bill's title, preamble, amended Article 12, and enforcement clause, all drafted by the government. The change is intended to allow public entities to turn unused spaces into commercial advertising areas while maintaining oversight and protecting public interests.

Help firms overcome credit **red tape**

MPs urge Tamkeen to launch new programmes supporting businesses

Lawmakers are urging the Labour Fund (Tamkeen) to roll out new programmes for commercial establishments, pointing to the difficulties companies face in accessing trade credit from banks' tightly controlled "approved lists."

The proposal, tabled by MPs Jaleela Alawi, Dr Hisham Al Ashiri, Najeeb Al Kuwari, Mohsen Al Asboul and Mohammed

Janahi, aims to introduce new Tamkeen schemes to help registered businesses continue operations and expand. Main proposer Jaleela Alawi said commercial banks maintain short approved lists, making it difficult for new firms to obtain credit. "This reluctance delays growth and holds back progress," she said, adding that Tamkeen could fill the gap by supporting

all registered commercial enterprises.

In response, the Labour Fund said it is keen to assist Bahraini businesses that meet programme requirements, in line with its existing support across the Kingdom's economic sectors. Tamkeen noted that its schemes are designed to help enterprises at every stage of development – from launching new ideas to expanding locally and regionally.

Tamkeen highlighted several key programmes:

- **Start Your Business:** Grants of up to 50% to support start-ups and create growth

pathways.

- **Business Growth:** Grants of up to 50% to cover resources and services, helping businesses expand in Bahrain, enter overseas markets, and boost exports.

- **Tayseer:** Funding solutions run with local banks, covering up to 50% of profit costs to help enterprises establish, grow, and expand.

Parliament's Services Committee has recommended approval, with all members present backing the proposal, citing public-interest grounds as a reason to move forward.

Sixty-four unlicensed health operators referred to prosecutors

Eight unlicensed premises and 56 unlicensed individuals were found offering health services in Bahrain over the past two years, with all cases referred to the Public Prosecution, according to a written reply from health authorities to Parliament.

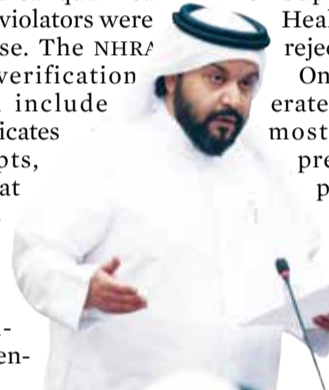
The National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA), responding to MP Ali Saqer Al Dosari through the Health Ministry, said no harm or medi-

cal errors were reported in connection with these violations. It clarified that while there are no "unlicensed clinics" in the formal sense, inspectors identified premises being used without approval to provide health-related services, along with individuals working without the required permits.

Complaints involving licensed practitioners, meanwhile, go through NHRA's standard disciplinary process and are reviewed by specialist technical committees that assess professional and ethical

breaches.

Mr Al Dosari had sought figures on unlicensed operators, checks on medical qualifications and how violators were able to practise. The NHRA outlined its verification steps, which include checking certificates and transcripts, confirming that universities appear on approved lists, and using accredited companies to authen-



ticate qualifications. If a certificate fails to meet standards set by the Education Ministry or Supreme Council of Health, the licence is rejected.

On how violators operated, the NHRA said most worked inside premises never approved by the Authority, enabling them to offer services until inspections uncovered the breaches.

Bahrain Post to stamp its mark on banking

MPs back proposal to let the postal service provide entry-level banking support

Not just postal service, soon Bahrain Post will also start offering Banking service.

The idea isn't to turn the postal service into a full-fledged bank, but to provide simple, accessible financial services without the usual hurdles like minimum balance requirements. The goal: reach low-income citizens and

pensioners who often find traditional banking rules too restrictive.

A draft law enabling this shift has cleared its first hurdle, winning support "in principle" from Parliament's Financial and Economic Affairs Committee. Lawmakers see the move as a practical way to bring financial access to people who routinely struggle with conditions such as minimum deposits or salary thresholds.

The proposal was introduced by MP Basema Mubarak. Her original version granted Bahrain Post wide powers — accepting deposits, granting loans, and managing funds. After committee discussions, the draft was streamlined to a single, clearer clause allowing Bahrain Post to offer financial services under Central Bank of Bahrain regulations.

Supporters say the change

could create a new revenue stream for Bahrain Post, ultimately feeding into the state budget. But the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications, which oversees the postal sector, says more coordination with other government agencies is needed before it can issue a final position.

The Central Bank of Bahrain has also urged caution, noting that banking services come with significant regulatory, operational and technological respon-

sibilities. International models, it pointed out, show that post-offices often act as intermediaries for banks rather than becoming full financial institutions themselves — a structure that lowers risk and simplifies oversight.

The government's formal stance will be confirmed once the Cabinet issues its detailed response.

Parliament's Committee on Public Utilities and the Environment has also recommended approving the proposal.

MP Basema Mubarak, in her supporting statement, noted that postal services around the world have expanded far beyond mail delivery. "As economies have evolved, post offices in many countries now offer accounts, loans, deposits, withdrawals and postal cheques — helping low-income individuals access essential financial services," she said.

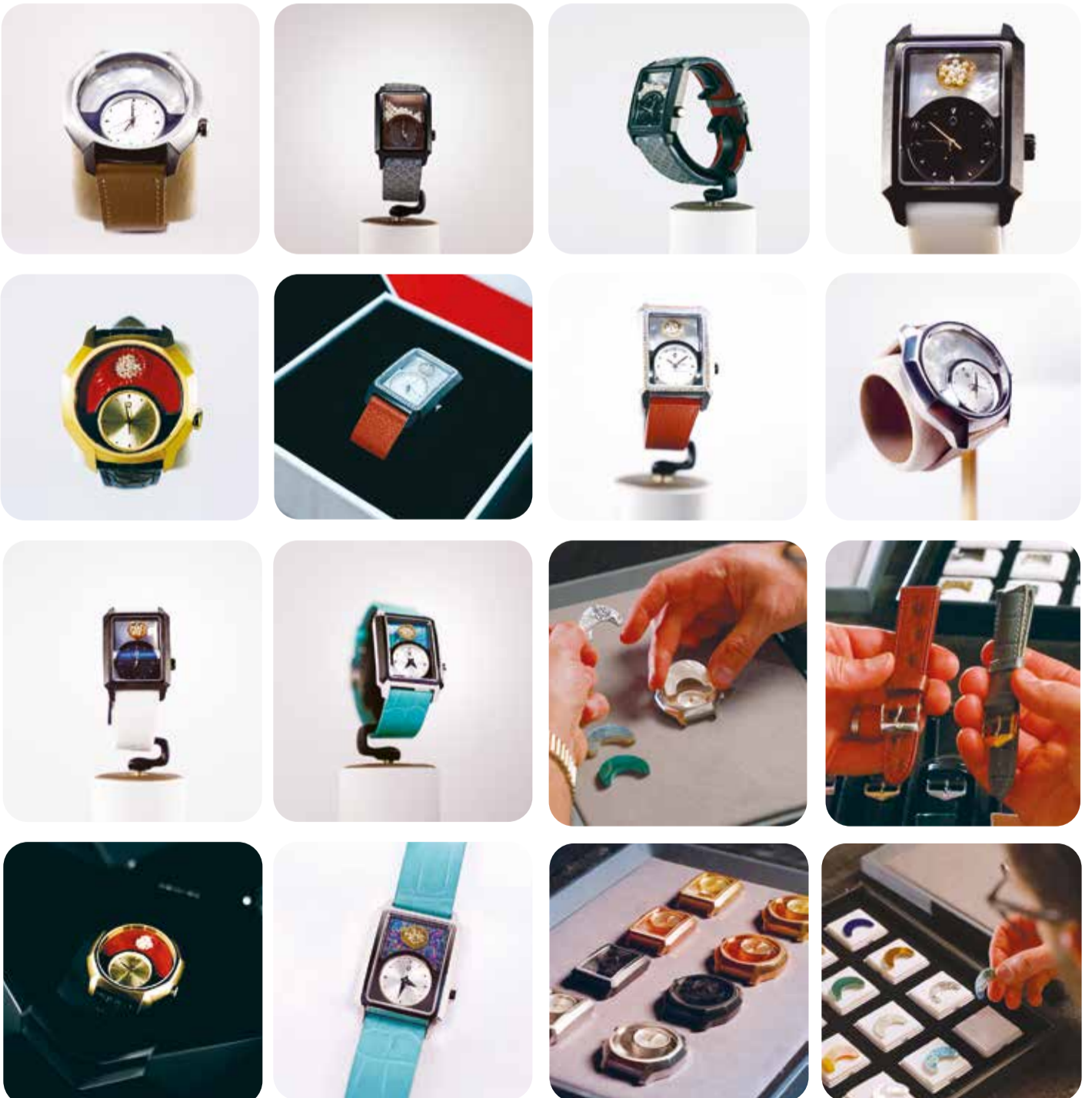

Israeli forces kill 13 in southern Syria operation ♦ Israeli forces killed 13 people yesterday in an operation in southern Syria, the deadliest since Bashar al-Assad's fall from power nearly a year ago, which they said was targeting an Islamist group. Since an Islamist coalition overthrew longtime ruler Assad in December of last year, Israel has conducted hundreds of strikes on Syria's military arsenal as well as incursions into the country. The Israeli army said an exchange of fire in the operation to detain militants in the Syrian village of Beit Jin left six Israeli soldiers wounded, with three of them in a serious condition.

Russian President Vladimir Putin will make a state visit to India on December 4 and 5 at the invitation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Kremlin said yesterday. The two leaders will sign trade deals, "discuss all aspects" of Russian-Indian ties and also touch on regional and international issues, it said in a statement.

ICC rejects release for Philippines ex-president Duterte ♦ The International Criminal Court yesterday rejected a request by former Philippines president Rodrigo Duterte to be released from detention ahead of his trial on crimes against humanity during his war on drugs. Presiding judge Luz del Carmen Ibanez Carranza told a hearing that lawyers for the 80-year-old had not laid out strong enough precautions to warrant a temporary release from custody in The Hague, where the court is based. Duterte's lawyers, appealing against an earlier refusal, had called for a "humanitarian" parole because of the state of his health..

NASA rover records first evidence of lightning on Mars

NASA rover has recorded evidence of lightning on Mars for the first time, its microphone picking up the sounds of tiny "zaps" whipped up by the dust storms constantly sweeping across the planet. Scientists have long debated whether electrical discharges could be sparking in the dusty and little-known Martian climate -- but proof has been hard to come by. It turns out that NASA's Perseverance rover, which has been roaming the red planet since 2021, was inadvertently recording the sounds of lightning, according to a study published in Nature this week. These are far from the thundering, kilometre-long lightning bolts we see on Earth. Instead, they are "little zaps" similar to "what you might feel in dry weather when you touch your car door and there's a bit of static electricity," lead author Baptiste Chide of France's CNRS research centre told AFP. While low in energy, these discharges are happening "absolutely all the time -- and

everywhere" on Mars, the planetary scientist said. The process starts when tiny grains of dust rub against each other. They become charged with electrons and release this energy in electrical arcs a few centimetres (inches) -- or even millimetres -- long, sending off an audible shock wave. Here on Earth, dust storms and dust devils in desert areas also create electrical fields. But they rarely build up into electrical discharges. However on Mars, "because of the very low pressure and the composition of the atmosphere, the amount of charge that needs to accumulate to generate a discharge is much smaller," Chide explained. This phenomenon has been theorised since Mars first started to be explored -- and has been reproduced in the laboratory. Chide said it had been "such an important issue for Martian science" that an instrument on the European Space Agency's Schiaparelli lander was dedicated to searching for it. Unfortunately the spacecraft crashed while trying to land on Mars in 2016.

Death toll in Southeast Asia floods tops 300

Rescuers struggle to reach isolated areas as the death toll continues to climb

- Over 300 killed in Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia
- Monsoon rains, tropical storm drive severe flooding
- Rescuers struggle to reach isolated areas

Days of devastating flooding across Southeast Asia have killed more than 300 people in Indonesia, Thailand and Malaysia, authorities said yesterday. Heavy monsoon season rains paired with a tropical storm system inundated areas across the three countries, stranding residents on rooftops and cutting off entire communities. Authorities in Indonesia were struggling to reach the worst-affected areas on Sumatra island, while authorities at a southern Thailand hospital brought in refrigerated trucks to store bodies after the morgue exceeded capacity. In Indonesia's West Sumatra province, 53-year-old Misniati described a terrifying battle against rising floodwaters to reach her husband at home. She said that, returning from early morning prayers at a mosque, "I noticed the street was flooded." "I tried to run back to my house to tell my husband, and the water was already reaching my waist," she said, adding that

it was up to her chest by the time she reached home. "We didn't sleep at all last night, we just monitored the water," said Misniati, who only uses one name. Officials on Sumatra said flooding and landslides this week had killed at least 174 people, with nearly 80 more missing. National Disaster Mitigation Agency (BNPB) chief Suharyanto said the toll could grow as rescuers reach isolated areas. "There are locations that still cannot be reached... where it is indicated that there may be human victims in those areas that are unreachable," Suharyanto said. North Sumatra police spokesman Ferry Walintukan said au-

though access to some areas and communication was still cut. "Hopefully, the weather will clear up so we can move the helicopter to the (worst-hit) locations," he said. In Aceh province in Sumatra's north, receding water left behind cars buried in mud almost up to their windows. An AFP journalist saw a truck carrying timber abandoned in the mud, with no sign of the driver. More rain is forecast for much of Sumatra island, although the intensity was expected to ease, officials said. Among the hardest-hit areas in the region is southern Thailand, where residents of Hat Yai were left clinging to rooftops awaiting rescue by boat. authorities were focused on "evacuation and providing assistance",

Sri Lanka deploys troops as floodwaters rise, death toll hits 69

Sri Lankan troops were racing to rescue hundreds of people marooned by rising floodwaters on Friday as weather-related deaths rose to 69, with another 34 people declared missing. Helicopters and navy boats carried out multiple rescue operations, plucking residents from tree tops, roofs and villages cut off by floodwaters. The Disaster Management Centre (DMC) said the toll had climbed with the recovery of more bodies in the worst affected central region, where most victims had been buried alive as mudslides hit this week. Rain was falling across the island with some regions receiving 360 millimetres in the past 24 hours, the DMC said. The Kelani River, which flows into the Indian Ocean near the capital Colombo, breached its banks on Friday. V. S. A. Ratnayake, 56, said he had to leave his flooded home in Kaduwela, just outside Colombo.

"I think this could be the worst flood in our area for three decades," Ratnayake told AFP. "I remember a flood in the 1990s when my house was under seven feet of water." Another Kaduwela resident, Kalyani, 48, who uses only one name, said she was sheltering two families whose homes were flooded. At least 3,000 homes were damaged in mudslides and floods, and over 18,000 people

had been moved to temporary shelters. In Anuradhapura district in the north, an Air Force Bell 212 helicopter airlifted a man who had climbed a coconut tree to escape rising waters. The DMC said more rain was forecast, with Cyclone Ditwah likely to move away from the north towards the south Indian state of Tamil Nadu by Sunday. "Nowhere to go" Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed his condolences over the loss of life in Sri Lanka and said New Delhi was rushing aid. "We stand ready to provide more aid and assistance as the situation evolves," Modi said on X. DMC officials said they expected flood levels to be worse than in 2016, when 71 people were killed nationwide. The Sirasa TV network broadcast an appeal for help from a desperate woman.

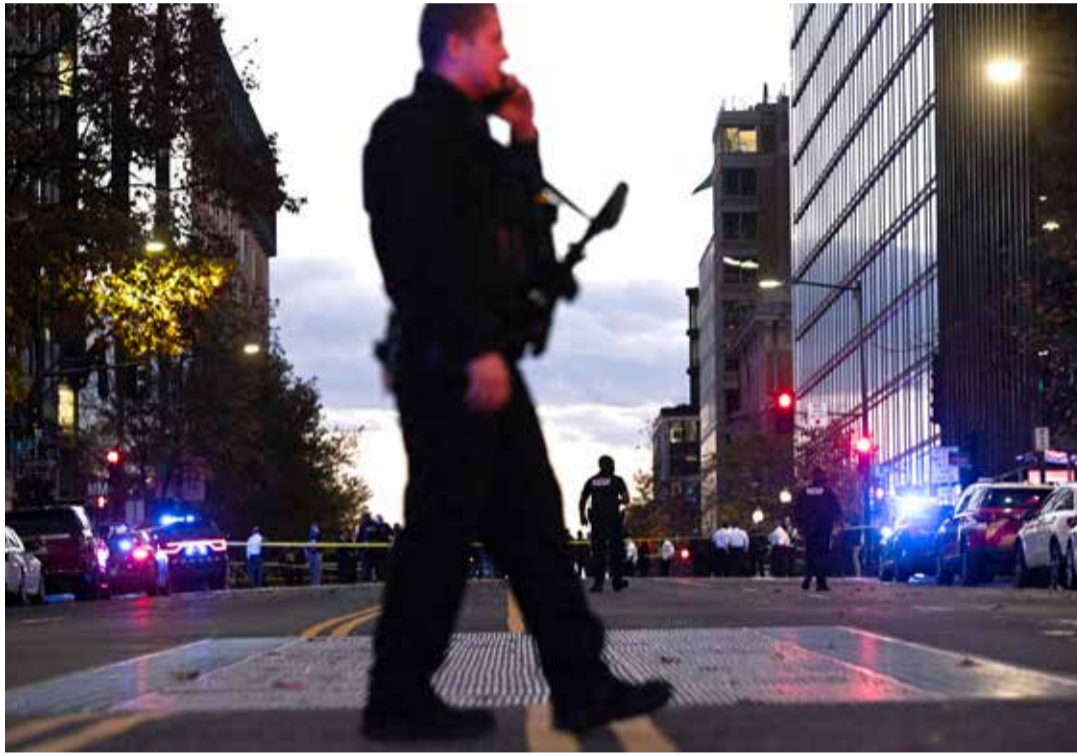
US President Donald Trump said on Thursday he would suspend migration from what he called "third world countries", a day after an Afghan national allegedly shot two National Guard soldiers in Washington, killing one.

His social media post, which also threatened to reverse "millions" of admissions granted under his predecessor Joe Biden, marked a new escalation in the anti-migration stance.

Trump said earlier that Sarah Beckstrom, a 20-year-old West Virginia National Guard member deployed in Washington as part of his crackdown on crime, had died from her wounds.

The FBI has launched an international terror investigation as new details emerged about the alleged gunman, a 29-year-old Afghan national who was a member of the "Zero Units" -- a CIA-backed counterterrorism group, according to multiple US media reports.

The shooting on Wednesday, which officials described as an "ambush-style" attack, has

brought together three politically explosive issues: Trump's controversial use of the military at home, immigration, and the legacy of the US war in Afghanistan.

"I will permanently pause migration from all Third World Countries to allow the U.S. system to fully recover," Trump wrote on social media.

He linked the shooting and his decision to send hundreds of National Guard troops to the city. "If they weren't effective, you probably wouldn't have had this done," Trump said. "Maybe this man was upset because he couldn't practice crime."

Joseph Edlow, Trump's director of US Citizenship and Immigration Services, said on Thursday he had ordered a "full-scale,

rigorous reexamination of every Green Card for every alien from every country of concern."

His agency later pointed to a list of 19 countries -- including Afghanistan, Cuba, Haiti, Iran and Myanmar -- facing US travel restrictions under a previous order from Trump in June.

More than 1.6 million US green

card holders, roughly 12 percent of the total permanent resident population, were born in the countries listed, according to the latest immigration data available on the agency's "Eligible to Naturalize Dashboard" analyzed by AFP.

Cuba accounts for the largest share, with about 560,000 green card holders, followed by Haiti (235,000) and Venezuela (153,000).

Afghanistan, which has over 116,000 green card holders, is also affected by a total halt of immigration application processing, ordered by the Trump administration after the shooting.

'Brazen, targeted' attack

The other soldier wounded in Wednesday's attack, 24-year-

old Andrew Wolfe, was "fighting for his life", Trump said. The suspected shooter was also in serious condition.

The US attorney for Washington DC, Jeanine Pirro, said the suspected assailant, identified as Rahmanullah Lakanwal, had been living in the western state of Washington and had driven across the country to the capital.

In what she called a "brazen and targeted" attack, Pirro said the gunman opened fire with a .357 Smith and Wesson revolver on a group of guardsmen on patrol just a few blocks from the White House.

Officials said they still had no clear understanding of the motive behind the shooting.

CIA director John Ratcliffe said the suspect had been part of a CIA-backed "partner force" fighting the Taliban in Afghanistan, and had been brought to the US as part of a program to evacuate Afghans who had worked with the agency.

Hong Kong's deadliest blaze in decades kills at least 128, dozens missing

- Nearly 200 people still missing
- Alarms in buildings malfunctioned

The death toll from Hong Kong's worst blaze in decades rose to 128 yesterday, with dozens still missing, as authorities said fire alarms in the residential estate buildings had been malfunctioning.

Families scoured hospitals and victim identification stations hoping to find their loved ones, with around 200 people still listed as missing and 89 bodies as yet unidentified.

Flames moved quickly through the Wang Fuk Court housing estate in Tai Po district on Wednesday afternoon, spreading through seven of the eight high-rises and transforming the densely packed complex into an inferno.

The blaze was "largely extinguished" by yesterday morning after burning for more than 40 hours, the fire services said, announcing they had finished their search of over 1,800 flats for survivors.

Authorities are investigating what sparked the fire, including examining the bamboo scaffolding and netting wrapped around the complex as part of a major renovation.

The Hong Kong government said yesterday it appeared the fire had started in protective netting on the lower floors of one of the towers and that foam boards and bamboo scaffolding had contributed to its spread.



Authorities say the fire likely ignited on bamboo scaffolding's protective netting, rapidly spreading through seven towers in less than 15 minutes, overwhelming emergency systems and trapping many residents

Fire services chief Andy Yeung said earlier they had discovered that alarm systems in all eight blocks "were malfunctioning".

"We will take enforcement actions against the contractors responsible," Yeung told a press conference.

Residents had recounted hav-

ing to run door-to-door to alert neighbours to the danger.

At the charred apartment blocks yesterday morning, workers brought out bodies in black bags, with an AFP reporter counting four in one 15-minute period.

Vehicles unloaded corpses at a mortuary in nearby Sha Tin, another reporter saw, with families arriving in the afternoon for identification.

At one hospital in Sha Tin, a woman surnamed Wong was looking for her sister-in-law and her sister-in-law's twin, with no luck.

"We still cannot find them. So we are going to different hospitals to ask if they have good news," the 38-year-old told AFP in tears.

"We were already waiting at the Prince of Wales Hospital on the first day but there was no news. We also came here yesterday."

The last contact anyone had with the twins was on Wednesday afternoon, said Wong, around the time the fire was reported.

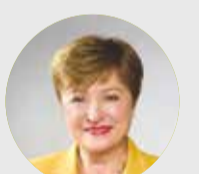

Emma - who married the *Die Hard* actor in a gorgeous beachfront ceremony in the Turks and Caicos Islands in 2009 - says Bruce's humble nature is a reason she fell in love with him after they met at a gym shared by their personal trainer in 2007.

being an entertainer: “He really loved it. It was a passion of his. That's why I love him. He's just always so humble. You would never know.”

Bruce shot to global stardom in the 1980s when he was cast in the ABC comedy-drama series, *Moonlighting*, as David Addison Jr.

The award-winning star then went on to appear in major blockbusters, including the 1994 crime-thriller *Pulp Fiction*, the 1998 sci-fi-action movie *Armageddon*, and the 1999 horror-mystery film *The Sixth Sense*.

Bruce retired from acting in 2022, after he was diagnosed with aphasia, which later progressed to frontotemporal dementia (FTD) - a group of brain disorders affecting personality, behavior, and language.

Sadie Sink wasn't allowed to listen to pop music as a child.

The *Stranger Things* star - who is reprising her role as Max Mayfield in the fifth and final season of the Netflix juggernaut - has recalled her parents Lori and Casey's strict rules for Sadie and her four siblings when they were growing up.

She told *ELLE Australia*: “We weren't really allowed to listen to a lot of pop music, but our loophole was musical theatre songs.”

Instead, she and her siblings turned to the

likes of *The Sound of Music* and *Hairspray*, and Sadie secretly watched *Grease* even though her parents didn't approve.

The 23-year-old actress - whose most iconic scene from *Stranger Things* was set to Kate Bush's classic *Running Up That Hill* - and her brother Mitchell

used to perform renditions of songs from *High School Musical* as kids, which led to her mother and father signing them up for acting, singing and dance classes.

She recalled: “It became this outlet of expression”

for the two of us that was different from the sports we were raised on.

“It gradually built over the years until you couldn't get me back into softball.”

When she was just 10 years old, Sadie landed a role in the 2012 Broadway revival of *Annie*, and four years later she secured her first film role in *Chuck*.

Cast in a Broadway revival of *Annie* in 2012, when Sadie was 10, mainly theatre experience before landing role in *Chuck* at 14.

She said: “The training I had done at that point was just for theatre; I'd never taken a class on acting for the screen.”

Benedict portrays a dad struggling to cope with his wife's death in the new drama movie, which is a big screen adaptation of Max Porter's novel *Grief Is the Thing with Feathers*.

In real life, the *Sherlock* actor has children Christopher, 10, Hal, eight, and Finn, six, with his wife Sophie Hunter, and Benedict admits he tries to remain calm while parenting, but one simple thing

can send him “over the edge”.

Asked what “petty things” can tip him, he joked: “My immediate family have got a long list, I think. I tip quite easily.”

“I tend to be someone who stays calm, stays calm and then it's like, ‘Will you put that sock on!’”

“It's just one thing that drives me over the edge.”

Earlier this month, Benedict admitted his emotions have become “paper thin” since he became a father.

He told *The Times* newspa-

per: “[Fatherhood made my] emotions paper thin. That's what changes how you act, when you become a father.”

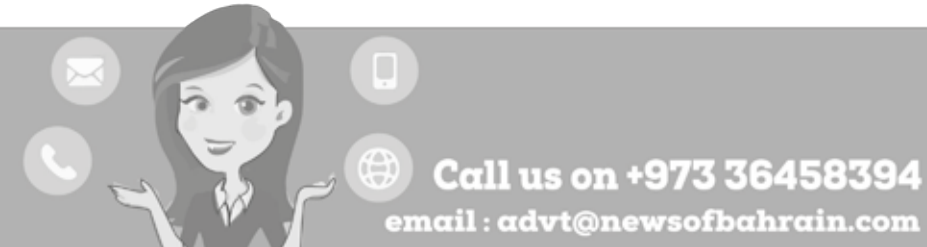

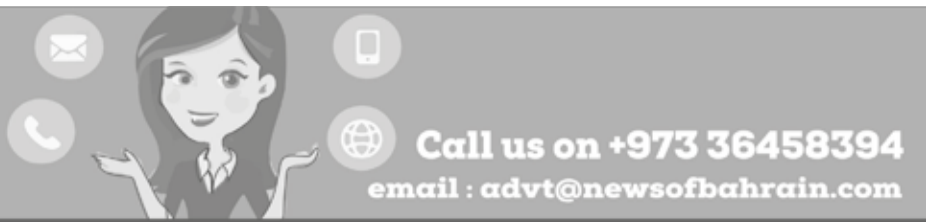

Rumble rings true

Gloves Fly for Charity at Royal Rumble IV

Royal Rumble IV, the fourth edition of Bahrain's premier charity boxing event, stormed into Crowne Plaza Bahrain on Thursday night with the energy that separates a routine amateur card from a true fight-night spectacle. Eight bouts featuring Bahrain's Royal Guard, national standouts, Saudi rivals, and the UK Armed Forces (UKAF) delivered rising intensity, framed by the event's charity-driven purpose under the patronage of HH Shaikh Khalid bin Hamad Al Khalifa.

Before the bouts began, a number of former world champions graced the ring to inspire the fighters, including two-time world champion and Athens 2004 Olympics silver-medallist Amir Khan. WBA super-middleweight world champion Rocky Fielding, middleweight world champion Darren Barker, super featherweight world champion Barry Jones, and British, Commonwealth, and inter-continental heavyweight champion Scott Welch were also present. Barker, Jones, and Welch reflected on their careers fondly, with Welch recalling sharing the ring with Brad Pitt in the movie "Snatch".

Fielding went on to call out his fellow Scouser and MMA star Darren Till, for a potential boxing showdown. Meanwhile, Khan said he would only come out of retirement for a fight against Manny Pacquiao and praised Bahrain boxing coach Tony Davis, alongside Shaikh Khalid, for developing the sport in the kingdom.

The early bouts set the tone with razor-thin decisions. Saudi's Rayan Altayaar edged Bahrain's Abdulrahman Al Mudahki in a split decision, followed by Royal Guard's Isaac Zaman nar-

rowly defeating UKAF's Dylan Swales. Bahrain's Mehdi Sahak then claimed a third-round stoppage of Omar Ali Mshnawi. Speaking to TDT after his win — his 30th in 31 amateur bouts — Sahak said, "Representing Bahrain is an honor, and staying smart and composed got me that stoppage. I aim to win the major belts like WBA and WBO, but only with the right team. Tonight I wanted to entertain with the Mohammed Ali-style movement rather than finishing too quickly."

Israel Davis added a split-decision win over UKAF's Dominik Zieba, while Bahrain's Maryam Khamis delivered a unanimous victory over Saudi's Khaltoum Hantoul, keeping her unbeaten home record intact. An elated Maryam Khamis, speaking after her win, said, "I really enjoyed the fight. I could've finished it early, but I wanted to take it all in. I fought with heart, the crowd lifted me, and at one point I laughed and said, 'easy, guys'."

Momentum shifted as the evening progressed. UKAF's Kieran Cooper claimed a unanimous decision over Isaac Augustine, followed by Blaine Lambert narrowly defeating Abdulla Al-abdullah in a split decision.

In the main event, Leon

Moulds defeated Prakash Limbu via split decision, moving the series to 3-2. The result was seen as controversial by many, as Limbu had unleashed a flurry that got the crowd on its feet and seemed likely to sway the judges. He was later consoled by teammate Ali Alaradi, who was unavailable to fight for the Royal Guard that night.

A dejected Limbu told TDT, "I felt the judges didn't reward what I did. Losing to the same opponent three times affects how people see me, but I gave everything and I'll come back faster, sharper, and strong-

er. With that, UKAF's late surge ended the Royal Guard's three-year winning streak in Bahrain. The night's charitable spirit was evident throughout, with a charity auction held during the event that raised funds for the Royal Humanitarian Foundation.

Items included a Rio Ferdinand-signed Manchester United shirt that sold for 900 BD, Joe Calzaghe-signed gloves for 500 BD, a Steven Gerrard-signed Liverpool shirt for 500 BD, and Amir Khan-presented gloves for 550 BD, all contributing to the event's focus on giving back.

Piastrì edges Norris as McLaren dominate Qatar practice

Oscar Piastri rediscovered his form to top the times ahead of McLaren team-mate and title favourite Lando Norris in yesterday's opening practice session at the Qatar Grand Prix.

The 24-year-old Australian, who led the championship for much of the season until he lost form and consistency, clocked a fastest lap in one minute and 20.924 seconds.

Norris, who leads him and Max Verstappen by 24 points in the title race, was outpaced by 0.058 seconds in the final minutes.

Fernando Alonso was third for Aston Martin ahead of Carlos Sainz of Williams, Racing Bulls' rookie Isack Hadjar and Verstappen, who was half a second off the McLaren's pace for Red Bull.

Alex Albon was seventh in the second Williams ahead of Ferrari's Charles Leclerc, Lance Stroll in the second Aston Martin and teenage Italian rookie Kimi Antonelli for Mercedes.

Seven-time champion Lewis Hamilton was 12th, eight-tenths off the top, in the second Ferrari and like most drivers endured a series of 'offs' in a difficult afternoon session at the Lusail International Circuit.

Norris made a leisurely start to proceedings and after 25 minutes had run only six laps, the McLaren team

having delayed both cars' entry into practice to run various safety and mechanical checks.

As a result, Norris was 20th and last as the circuit floodlights came on and he began his climb through the standings reaching 11th, two places below Piastri, after half an hour.

He was still eight-tenths off the pace after running wide twice and had asked his race engineer "where can I find 1.6 seconds?"

Like McLaren, Ferrari were also struggling for balance and pure pace with Leclerc 14th and Hamilton 12th after 40 minutes and several off-track excursions as they battled the dusty and bumpy conditions. Norris's perseverance began to pay off as he climbed to fourth, Piastri remained 10th.

Verstappen was clearly unhappy with his car and spent much of the session complaining about his set-up.

"Every time I'm off the throttle, the car is jumping a lot," he said before later adding that the "clipping out of turn six is a disaster".

With 12 minutes remaining, Oliver Bearman switched to softs in his Haas as teams began evaluating their tyre options ahead of sprint qualifying later yesterday and a Grand Prix, on Sunday, in which all tyres have been restricted to a maximum of 25 laps — a rule designed for safety that will ensure a two-stop race.
