 ${f B}$ ahrain's Manama Club suffered their third defeat at the 37th Arab Basketball Championship for Men's Clubs, losing 76-65 to Kuwait SC yesterday in Dubai. After previous heavy losses to Lebanon's Antonine (79-73) and Libya's Al Ahly Tripoli (103-78), Manama entered the Group B match hoping to rebound.

Early Tight Battle

The first quarter ended tied at 20-20 after Kuwait SC briefly led by six points. Coach Salman Ramadan unusually started both foreign players, Daniel Hamilton and Carl Jones, together from the beginning. In the second quarter, Manama edged ahead 12-13, highlighted by Hassan Nowrooz's quick three-pointer, which prompted a timeout from Kuwait's coach. Mohamed Buallay added another three-pointer, temporarily extending the lead to four points. Kuwait quickly
