• A suicide car bomber struck an army base in **Afghanistan on Sunday** killing at least 26 security personnel. officials said. in one of the bloodiest attacks in recent months. The attack occurred on the outskirts of Ghazni city, capital of the eastern province of Ghazni, which has seen regular fighting

between the Taliban and government forces. **bomb kills 26** "We have received 26 bodies and 17 wounded so far. All of them are security personnel," Baz Mohammad Hemat, director of Ghazni hospital, told AFP.

and its rival Barrio 18 made up the bulk of the detentions that were announced on Friday, following a one-week U.S.-backed round-up of Central American gangs that also netted arrests in neighboring Guatemala and Honduras.

Militants have killed at least 40 ٠ people on a farm in Borno state in northeast Nigeria, three sources told Reuters on Saturday. The attack, at Kwashebe Zamarmari in the Jere local government area, happened late morning local time as the workers were harvesting rice,

according to a village leader, a local fighter with the Zamarmari group and a police source. A search by the authorities for the attackers has been mounted. The military and police did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

#### • British Foreign **Minister Dominic Raab** said yesterday he was concerned about the

situation in Iran and wider region after the killing of a top Iranian nuclear scientist. "We are concerned about the situation in Iran and the wider region we do want to see de-escalation of tensions," Raab told Sky News, after Iranian scientist Mohsen Fakhrizadeh was killed in an ambush near Tehran on Friday. "We're still waiting to see the full facts to address the full facts of what's happened in Iran but I would say that we stick to the rule of international humanitarian law which is very clear against targeting civilians."

A Singaporean woman, who was infected with the novel coronavirus in March when she was pregnant, has given birth to a baby with antibodies against the virus, offering a new clue as to whether the infection can be transferred from mother to child.

The baby was born this month without COVID-19 but with the virus antibodies, the Straits Times newspaper reported yesterday, citing the mother. https://bit. ly/33I0liL

"My doctor suspects I have transferred my COVID-19 antibodies to him during my pregnancy," Celine Ng-Chan told the paper.

0VID-19 Ng-Chan had been mildly ill from the disease and was discharged with from hospital after two-and-ahalf weeks, the Straits Times said.

Ng-Chan and the National University Hospital (NUH), born where she gave birth, did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

The World Health Organisation says it is not yet known Baby whether a pregnant woman with COVID-19 can pass the virus to her foetus or baby during pregnancy or delivery.
